General Regulations.

1. Entries will only be received subject to rules and regulations, and all exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor at time of entry, and produce, which must be the growth of the preceding 12 months, must be grown or made by the Exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being Exhibitors.

2. No exhibit will be allowed to enter in more than one class, except for a sweepstake or for a special or champion prize.

3. Applications for space for stands for manures, machinery, and implements, single exhibits, or goods for exhibition only (Sections 48 and 49), must be made (by ordinary letter) on or before Saturday, 27th June, 1908. Exhibitors having a seven years' tenure must lodge an application each year. After the applications close, positions will be allotted, and a charge per foot frontage will be made for the space granted. Entries of this description of exhibits must afterwards be duly made on the Society's forms, before the close of general entry, for insertion in the Catalogue.

4. General entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and (including those by post) must be in the hands of the Secretary, at the office, Equitable Building, Collins-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 25th July, 1908, at 12 o'clock noon. On payment of a double fee, double-fee entries will be received at the office after that hour till 12 o'clock noon on Saturday, 1st August, when all entries close. Entry fees must accompany each entry. Entries for competition are limited to three exhibits in Horses and Cattle (except in Classes for 2-year-old Bulls in Sections 12, 17, 18 and 19, where six exhibits are allowed), and two exhibits in Sheep and Swine, which exhibits must be brought before the Judges.

5. The Council reserve the right to reject at any time any entry submitted for this Exhibition. No disqualified animal shall be allowed to compete for a prize.

6. When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

7. The correct age of exhibits of live stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the exhibit.

8. No sheep to be entered or shown that have been shorn before 12th July in the preceding year. The date on which sheep were shorn to be stated on entry form, and the month and year of lambing of all sheep under 2½ years old must also be stated. No sheep will be allowed to compete that have their wool oiled or dressed with any foreign matter whatever.

9. The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year for horses, and 1st July in each year for cattle. Colonial-bred shall mean bred in any of the Australian States or New Zealand.

10. All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be visibly entire, and any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

11. Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit will state the number of its box, stall, pen, or stand, as the case may be, which will correspond with its number in the official catalogue. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Thursday, 27th August, 1908.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

12. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expenses, and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and 10s. for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at the future meetings of the Society.

13. All exhibits of Carriages, Buggies, &c. (Section 38), Manures (Section 48), and Machinery, Implements, and Miscellaneous Exhibits (Section 49), must be in their places in the yards on Thursday night, 27th August. All other exhibits, except Hunters, Ladies' Hunters, High Jumpers, Pony High Jumpers, Cavalry Horses, Carriage Pairs, Time Test Trotters, Poultry and Dogs, Wines, &c. (see foot of this regulation), must be in their places in the yards by 10 a.m. on Friday, 28th August, when the judges will begin adjudication. Hunters, Ladies' Hunters, High Jumpers, Pony High Jumpers, Cavalry Horses, Carriage Pairs, Time Test Trotters, and exhibits in Riding and Driving Competitions, will only be required to be in the yards on the day or days on which they perform. Except for Cavalry Horses, boxes will not be allotted to horses in these classes. Poultry and Dogs must be in their places in the yard before 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 2nd September. Wines, &c. (Section 45) must be lodged in the cellars of the Exhibition Building, Carlton Gardens, on or before Monday, 3rd August, 1908, at 5 p.m.

14. Exhibits will not be received in the yards after the date and hour specified. No animal or article, whether for competition or not, will be admitted to the Show Grounds unless duly entered.

15. All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation 33) must not be removed from their classes during the Exhibition.

16. The owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

17. As many men will be allowed into the yards free as the Council may deem necessary to take charge of exhibits, and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary.

18. Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public, and horse-boxes must not be locked during those hours, or the Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

19. Any Exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of his box, stall, or pen, after 8.30 a.m. on a Show day, shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

20. When ordered by the Stewards, all prize-taking horses and cattle must be taken out on parade in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of 10s. in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to their exhibit or exhibits.
