The Society claims the right to retain samples of wool from each fleece for the purposes of future reference.

### NOTES.

Age of all pigs to be calculated to day of judging (20th September, 1923). The Society's veterinary surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age. Exhibitors may be disqualified and debarred from further competition for any breach of regulations regarding the age of exhibits.

In this Section all exhibits (except in Classes 408—410) over the age of four months must be registered in an approved Herd Book—the sires and dams of exhibits four months old or under must be registered, and in the classes for sow with litters, the sire of the litter must also be registered.

**The Registered Herd Book numbers of all exhibits and of the sires and dams of exhibits MUST be stated on entry form.**

For particulars of registration in the Berkshire and Yorkshire Herd Book of Australasia, apply to Mr. Arthur Beale, 436 Bourke-street, Melbourne.

Swine not registered prior to 31st July will only be permitted to be entered for the Show on payment of double entry fees.

Entries limited to 3 in each class from any one exhibitor in whose name the exhibits must be registered in the Herd Book. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding.

Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration on the back of their entry forms that their entries are true and correct in every particular, that their exhibits are eligible for entry according to the conditions specified and subject to the Rules, Regulations and By-laws of the Society, and that their exhibits, and the holding or holdings on which such exhibits were kept, have been free from swine fever for 12 months prior to the date of entry.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Swine Section. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge, 10/- each during currency of Show.

No Pig shall be transferred from its numbered pen without the sanction of the officer in charge.

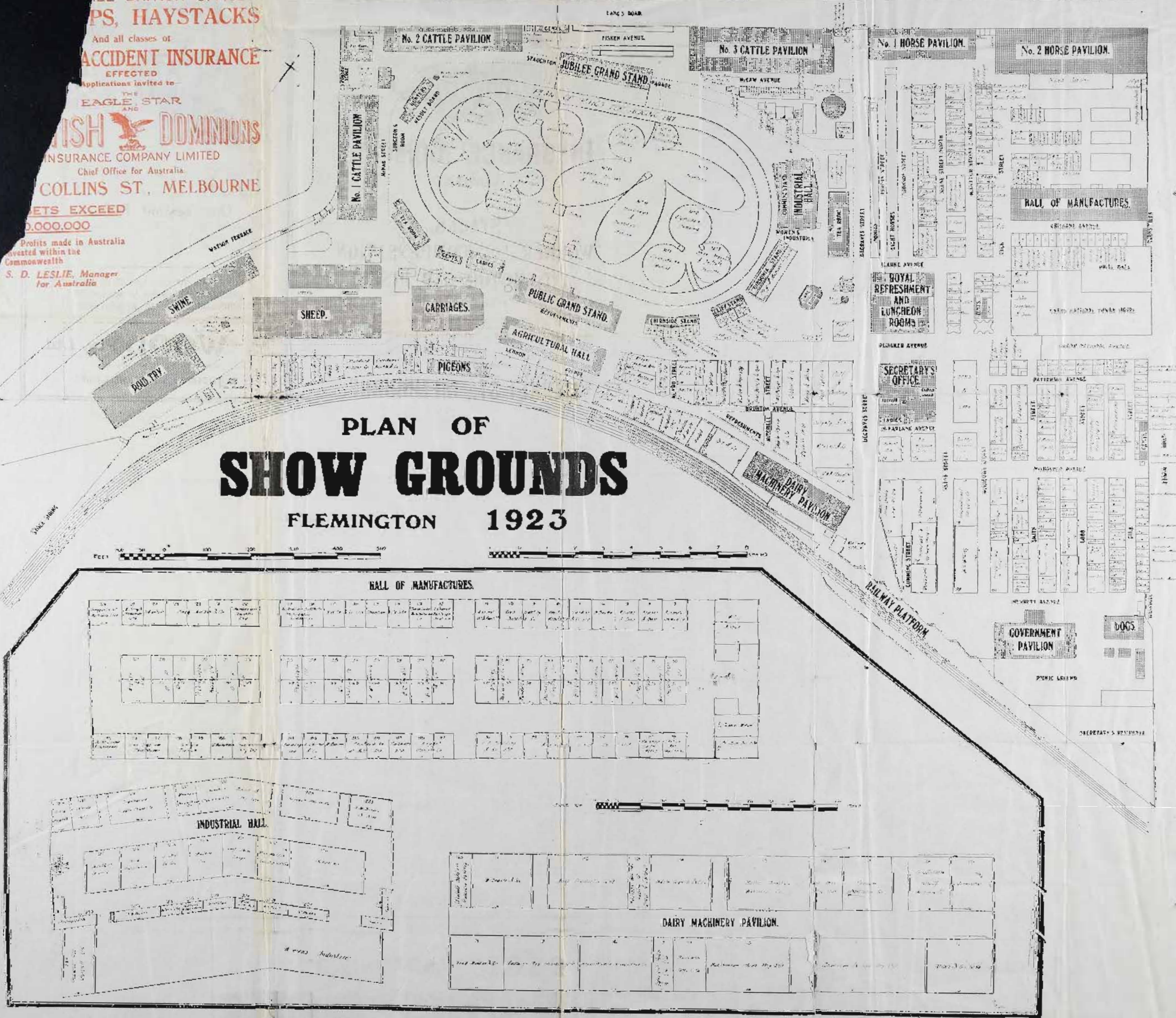

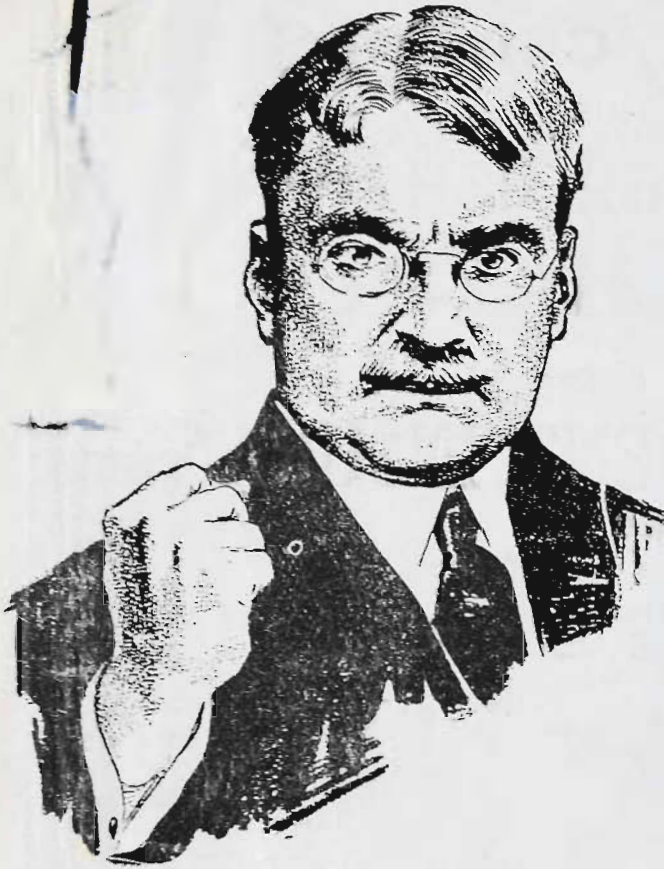

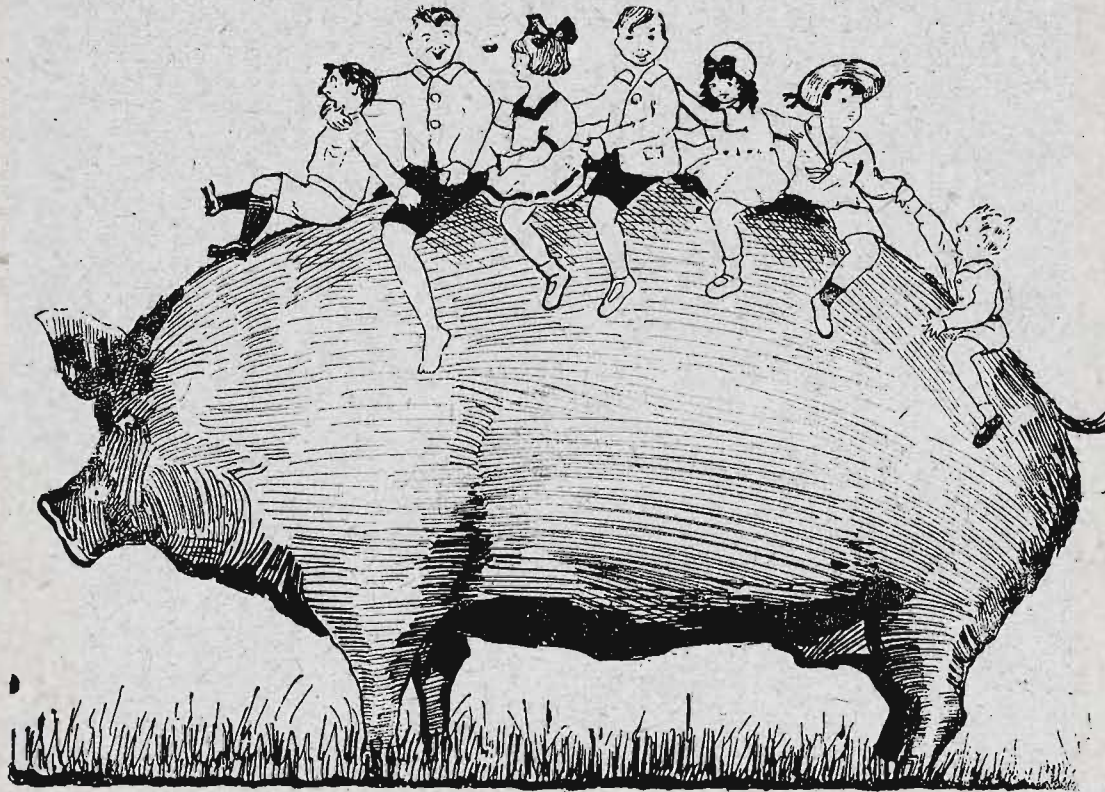

1. No certificate will be granted in any one of the above classes unless there are at least (6) competitors.
2. Any bird having previously been awarded a Government gold medal or champion certificate is not eligible to compete again.
3. Competition will be confined to birds which are the property of, and have been bred, by the competitor.
4. Societies under whose auspices the certificates are awarded shall obtain and forward to the Director of Agriculture when applying for the certificates to be prepared, statutory declarations from the exhibitors that the winning bird has not previously won a Government gold medal or champion certificate, and that the exhibitor is the breeder, as required in condition (3) above.
5. The bird winning the certificate in any class shall, immediately upon such award being made, have two holes punched in the inside web of the left foot. The marking shall be done by or under the supervision of the judge (in the presence of a member of the Committee of the Society) of the section in which the award is made, who shall not certify to such award unless and until such marking has been carried out.

**NOTE.**—Pigeons and Cage Birds will be received and penned fed and attended to, re-cooped and despatched, free of charge to exhibitors, subject to the provisions of Regulations 43 and 45.

Birds belonging to Interstate exhibitors will be returned on Monday, 1st October.

Only a limited number of exhibitors will be allowed into the Pigeon House at a time to remove their birds. No birds to be removed till 5 p.m. on Saturday, 29th September. Coupons giving order in which exhibitors may enter the Pigeon House for removing their birds on the Saturday afternoon may be secured from the Superintendent after 9 a.m. on Monday, 24th September, either by personal application or written order of the exhibitor.

2. Labels will be sent for each pen, when the Exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which the Exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate Exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box, if it be properly divided and pen numbers attached to each division. **SPECIAL REGULATIONS.**

1. All dogs must have double swivel chains and collars, without names, attached, to enable them to be taken out if required.

2. Any dog wearing a collar with its owner's name thereon will be disqualified from receiving a prize.

3. When being judged, dogs must wear exhibit numbers, which will be supplied by the Society.

4. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards, be permitted to loose their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove their dogs from the yards without a written order from the Superintendent, and without leaving a deposit of £2. (See General Regulation, 39).

5. Dogs will be subjected to veterinary inspection, and those considered by the Stewards or the Veterinary Surgeon unfit for exhibition, either from disease, the effects of disease, vice, or other causes, will not be received; or removed if found necessary.

6. Labels will be sent for each Dog when the Exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which Exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate Exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Two or more dogs may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided and labelled.

7. The Society will be most anxious for the care and safety of the Dogs sent for exhibition, or any other property entrusted to them, but it must be distinctly understood by Exhibitors, and all other persons, that the Society will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any Dogs or other property, whether arising from accident or other cause whatever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants, or others.

8. The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to feed and take charge of the dogs during the day, and also a night watchman.

**DEFINITION OF CLASSES.**

The classes provided for are as follows:—

**Novice Classes.**—For Dogs or Bitches over 6 months old on the first day of the Show which have not won a first prize at any Show or Championship Parade before the morning of the first day of the Show.

2. Exhibits entered for the Agricultural Societies' Competitions are not eligible to compete in the general classes. Exhibitors wishing to compete in open classes must forward a separate exhibit.

3. Each exhibit will be allowed from 850 to 1000 square feet of floor space.

4. All collections of exhibits must be in charge of a responsible member of the Society sending the same, who will have to arrange and display the exhibit to the best advantage.

5. On application to the Secretary, one approved attendant from each Society competing will be allowed to assist in locating the exhibits while the judging is taking place, but he will be removed from the building if he interferes with the judge in any way.

6. Exhibits must be produced or manufactured within a radius of 30 miles of the Show Grounds of the Society entering same, and, with the exception of wines, must have been produced within twelve months previous to date of entry. Wines may be of any age. No exhibits produced or manufactured in the capital cities of Australia or within a five-mile radius of the General Post Office of same will be allowed to compete.

7. Exhibitors are required, in arranging their exhibits, to place them in such a manner as to facilitate judging. The Judges shall have the right to sample all foods and preserves.

## 8. SCALE OF POINTS FOR JUDGING.

NOTE.—Provided the quality of exhibits in any section is equal, a greater number of points will be awarded to the collection in which the greater number of varieties is shown. Wheat and potatoes are limited to twenty varieties in each case.

1. Wine merchant shall mean any person, association, or company buying wine.

2. Wine-grower shall mean any wine-grower owning or occupying a vineyard, and manufacturing wine from grapes grown in such vineyard, or from grapes purchased for the purpose of wine-making, and although the wine-grower be also a wine merchant, he may exhibit in the wine-growers' section, provided his entry be accompanied by a statutory declaration to the effect that his exhibit was manufactured at his own vineyard.

3. Exhibitors must mark on bottles, in plain figures, the year of the Exhibition (1923), and the number of the class in which each sample is entered. **The bottles for wines must be wine bottles (reputed quarts)** and labelled with business labels or the name of the Exhibitor. Exhibitors must also mark their names and addresses on their cases or hampers.

4. The name, character, and vintage of the wines must be stated on the entry forms, which must be duly lodged with the Secretary. (See General Regulations.)

5. Wines, etc., forwarded by rail, to be addressed thus—

Wines must be delivered at the Show Grounds on or before Saturday, 25th August, 1923, at 12 noon (one month before the Show). They will be judged a fortnight before the Show opens.

6. In the 1923 Vintage Wines, the three bottles comprised in the entry will become the property of the Society, and in the other classes one half the number of bottles will become the property of the Society for purposes of adjudication, and for future reference and comparison. The remaining half will be kept at the Show Grounds, as the property of the exhibitors, for sale (retail only at 6d. per glass), by an arrangement between the Society and the Caterer. Additional Wines, same as exhibits, will be allowed into the Show Grounds for sale, if required, on Saturday before Show. Cider and Brandy left over after judging to become the property of the Society.

7. The Society will make special arrangements with the Caterer for the wines being retailed to the public in the Wine Kiosk on the Show Grounds. Spirits are not eligible for sale in the Wine Kiosk.

8. Should any exhibitor wish to dispose of wine entered for competition before the prizes are awarded, he shall give notice to the Secretary of the Society, who shall thereupon cause samples to be taken from the bulk for future verification.

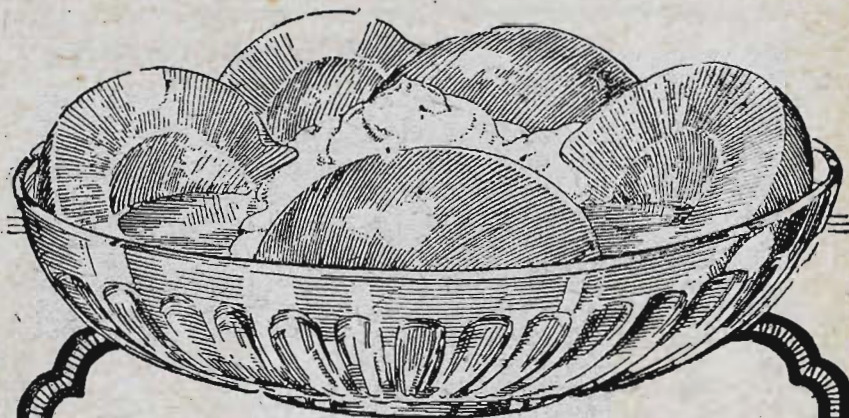

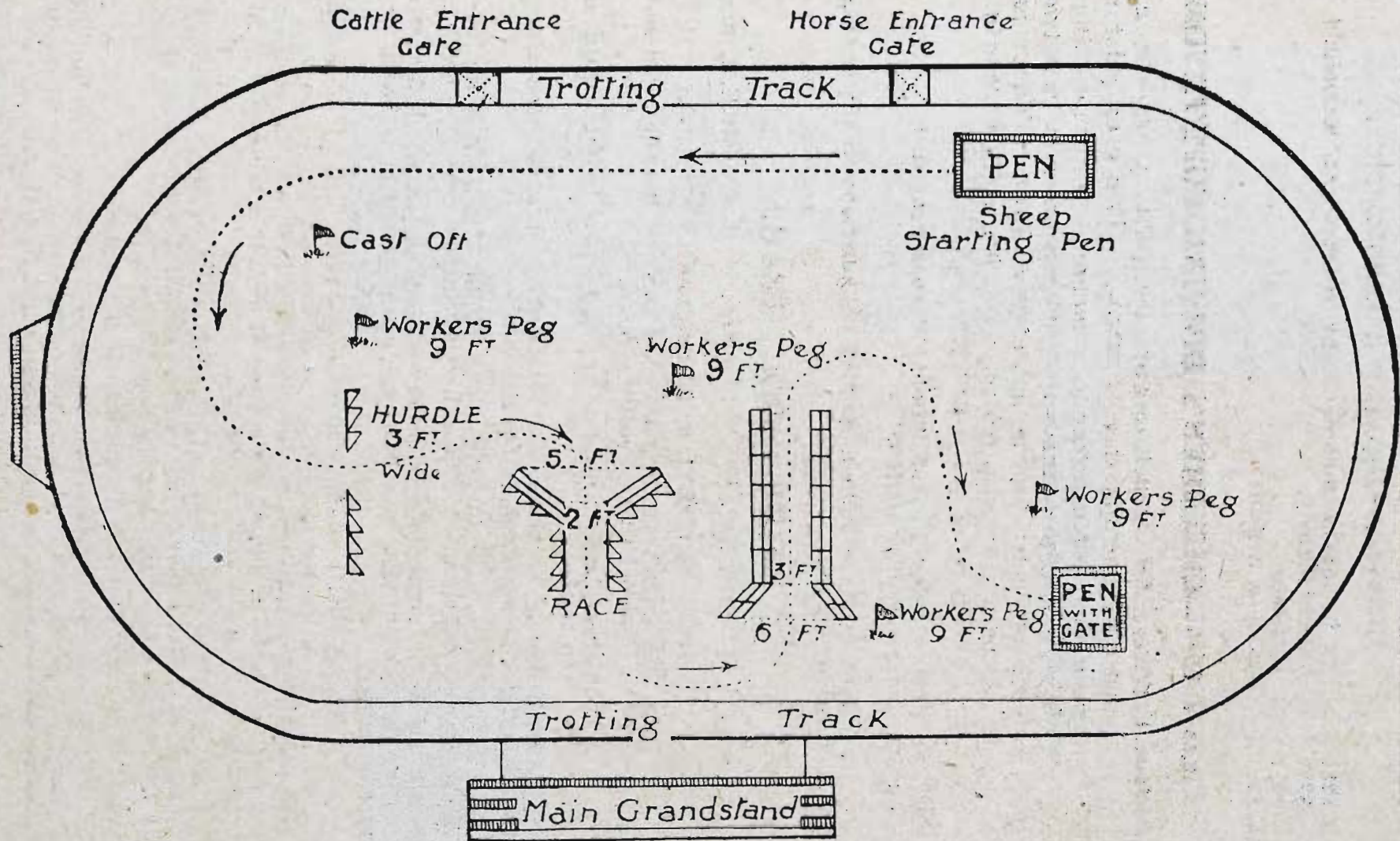

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. Each dog shall have three sheep in the first instance, and subsequently any number the Judge may appoint.
2. Should the Judge deem fit, he may order fresh sheep at any time during the trial.
3. Each dog to be allowed a maximum time of Fifteen minutes from ringing of bell after sheep have been turned out.
4. The owner, with his dog, shall stand at a flag indicated by the Stewards, and shall not release his dog until directed by them.
5. The owner shall not be allowed to assist his dog, either in driving, putting through hurdles, or yarding the sheep, except by signal or word of mouth.
6. During the trial, should owner or dog break any of these Rules, or should the work be so inferior as to demand such a course, the Judge shall cause a bell to be rung, which will note the expiration of the time of the trial, and at the ringing of such bell the owner shall at once take his sheep to the yarding pen.
7. Any person or persons bringing dogs on the ground and allowing them to run loose, either by mistake or otherwise, except when directed by the Stewards, may be fined the sum of £1.
8. If any owner ill-use his dog he will be fined £1.
9. In the event of any person or persons refusing to pay any fine or fines, they shall be turned off the ground, and shall be disqualified from working a dog at any future Show of this Society.

## Special Regulations *re* Champion Prizes of Australia.

(The Gift of the Government of Victoria through  
the Department of Agriculture).

1. All exhibits to be the *bona fide* property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the Exhibitor.
2. For Champion Awards to be made, three exhibits must be entered (at least two of which must be duly shown), unless the judge reports that an exhibit (even though alone) is of exceptional merit and worthy of such award. If, however, in the opinion of the judge, none of the exhibits are of sufficient merit, he may withhold the prize altogether.
3. Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1919.
4. The prizes to be awarded by judges appointed by the Society.
5. In any case where, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit the prize shall not be awarded.
6. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes of Australia.

---

## GENERAL REGULATIONS.

(Also see Special Notes in Each Section.)

### ENTRIES.

1. Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and all exhibits must be the *bona fide property* of the Exhibitor at time of entry, and produce, which must be the growth of the preceding 12 months, must be produced, grown or made by the Exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being exhibitors.
2. No exhibit may be entered in more than one class, except for a sweepstake and a special or champion prize. Where any exhibit has, through oversight, been allowed to compete in more than one class (not being one of the exceptions abovementioned), such exhibit shall, whether awarded a prize or not, be deemed to be ineligible to compete, or to have competed, in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.
3. The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry submitted for this Exhibition. No disqualified animal shall be allowed to compete for a prize.
4. When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

## CLOSING DATES OF ENTRIES.

5. Applications for stands for harness and saddlery, machinery, and implements, single exhibits, or goods for exhibition only (section 56), must be made (by ordinary letter) on or before Saturday, 14th July. After the applications close, positions will be allotted, and a charge will be made for the space granted. Entries of this description of exhibits must afterwards be duly made by letter before Saturday, 11th August, 1923, at 12 o'clock noon.

6. Entries (Contests Class 19 (Clydesdale Stallion Premium) excepted) must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and (including those by post) must be in the hands of the Secretary, at his Office, Collins House, 360 Collins-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, 18th August, 1923, at 12 o'clock noon. Entries for Arena Contests, and Judging Competitions will be received on or before Saturday, 1st September, at 12 o'clock noon. Entries for Class 19 (Clydesdale Stallion Premium) will be received on or before 5 p.m. Wednesday, 1st August. Entry fees must accompany each entry. Entries for competition are limited to three exhibits in Cattle and Swine, and two exhibits in Sheep (except where specified otherwise), which exhibits must be brought before the judge.

## AGE OF EXHIBITS.

7. The date of birth of live stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the exhibit. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age.

8. The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year for horses, and 1st July in each year for cattle. Australasian bred shall mean bred in any of the Australian States or New Zealand.

## QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTRY.

9. All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be visibly entire, and any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

10. All sheep over 18 months old, except where otherwise specified, must have been shorn since 1st July in the preceding year. The date on which sheep were shorn to be stated on entry form. Any sheep infested with ticks or lice are liable to disqualification. The month and year of lambing of all sheep under 2½ years old must also be stated.

## VETERINARY CERTIFICATES.

11. All Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1919. All Mares, 3 years old or over, entered in Sections 1 to 10 inclusive, must first have obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Officer. Government Veterinary Officer will stamp all Entry Tickets for Stallions and mares "Pass to Ring." These stamped tickets must be produced to the Steward before entering the Arena. Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Officers on the Show Grounds, on Wednesday, 19th September, commencing at 10 a.m. Judges are particularly requested to satisfy themselves, as far as possible, regarding the soundness of all other horses, before awarding the prizes, and to avoid giving prizes to animals showing symptoms of hereditary diseases. A Judge may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeon if he deem it expedient. No protests on veterinary grounds will be received.

## THE EXHIBITION.

12. The Exhibition will be open to the public daily from 9 a.m.; admission, 2/-. Admission to main grand stand, 3/- extra; "Chirnside" and "Cliff" grand stands, 2/- extra; and to the seated reserves, 1/- extra.

The charge for admission to the grounds for children is 6d.

13. Members, on presentation of their badges, and members' ladies, on presentation of their tickets, will be admitted free to the grounds and grandstands subject to such regulations as the Council may make.



## ENTRY TICKETS.

14. Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen, or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the Grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 19th September, 1923.

## PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION.

15. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and 10s. for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar entrants from taking part in any future meetings of the Society.

## EXHIBITS DUE AT SHOW GROUNDS.

16. Wheat exhibits must be lodged at the Show Grounds on or before Monday, 13th August, at 5 p.m. Wine exhibits must be lodged at the Show Grounds on or before Saturday, 25th August, 1923, at 5 p.m. Fleeces and Skins on or before Saturday, 8th September, 1923, at 5 p.m. Cows entered for the Butter Fat Tests must be in their places before 4 p.m. on Sunday, 16th September. Exhibits of Women's Work must be lodged at the Grounds before 2 p.m. on Tuesday, 18th September. Machinery, Implements and Miscellaneous Exhibits (Section 59) must be in their places before 6 p.m. on Wednesday, 19th September. Carriages, etc. (Section 46), must be in their places in the yards before 9 a.m. on Thursday, 20th September, 1923. Table Vegetables must be benched before 10 a.m. on Friday, 21st September. Business Turnouts to be in the grounds before 11 a.m. on Friday, 21st September. Horses entered for contests will only be required to be in the yards on the day or days on which they perform. (If a request be made on the entry form, the Society will endeavour to provide boxes for horses entered for contests.) Poultry, Pigeons and Cage Birds must be in their places in the yards before 10 p.m. on Tuesday, 25th September, 1923. Dogs entered in Division "A" must be benched before 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, 20th September; those entered in Division "B" before 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, 27th September. Cats must be benched before 9.30 a.m. on Tuesday, 25th September. All other exhibits must be in their places in the yards by 9 a.m. on Thursday, 20th September, 1923.

17. Exhibits will not be received in the yards after the date and hour specified. No exhibit, whether for competition or not, will be admitted to the Show Grounds unless duly entered as an exhibit.

18. All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) must not be removed from their classes during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Secretary being first obtained.

## REMOVAL OF DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS.

19. The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.



**PRECAUTIONS RE MACHINERY.**

20. All machinery in motion shall either be securely fenced or be in such position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.

**PASSES FOR ATTENDANTS.**

21. As many men as the Council may deem necessary will be allowed into the yards free to take charge of exhibits, and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary.

**RUGGING OF EXHIBITS.**

22. Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public, and horse-boxes must not be locked during those hours. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

**CLEANING OF STALLS.**

23. Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right through the Show.

Any Exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8.30 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

No advertisement or notice (except ordinary sale notice) is permitted on any stall or building.

**PARADES.**

24. When ordered by the Stewards, all prize-taking horses and cattle must be taken out on parade in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of ten shillings in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to their exhibit or exhibits. All horses and cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers. No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

**AWARDING OF PRIZES.**

25. No exhibitor or manager of an exhibiting company (except in the case of an owner riding, driving or leading his exhibit) will be allowed in that section of the yard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication of the Judge, and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judge, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective exhibits, or address the Judge, unless authorised by the Stewards of the section in which they are competing. Competitors not ready at the appointed time of adjudication will be liable to disqualification.

26. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

27. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

28. The Judge shall award Reserve Champion Rosettes in all Horse Cattle, Sheep and Swine Sections in which Champion awards are made, and the animal second in the class to the Champion shall be allowed to compete for the Reserve Championship.

29. Any Exhibitor or Attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and keep the same on the exhibit during the hours of exhibition, or any exhibitor or attendant altering a Prize Card in any way, will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and may be disqualified from again competing, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Ribbon or Prize Card on his exhibit, stall, or stand, in addition to those issued by the Society for the year. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.

30. Stock exhibits wearing bridles or head stalls with their names or the names of their owners displayed thereon are liable to disqualification.

31. The Council may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to Exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements in relation to any of their exhibits; and Exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements



may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors must, if required by the Council, make a statutory declaration regarding their entries.

32. Any person insulting or interfering with a Judge during the Show will be subject to removal from the yards; and the prizes, if any, awarded to such person may be forfeited.

33. Cheques for prizes at the Show will be passed for payment at the Council meeting on Tuesday, 23rd October, 1923, one week after which date they will be payable.

34. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

#### PROTESTS.

35. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

36. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the question.

37. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judge appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests, alleging infringement of the regulations, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

#### REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS.

38. No exhibit (except Live Stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) shall be removed from the Exhibition until 5 p.m. on Saturday, 29th September, when all exhibits may be removed. Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Swine may be removed from the grounds on Thursday, 27th September, after 5 p.m.

39. Any exhibit of Horses or Cattle may be removed from the yards each day of the Exhibition after 5 p.m. on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 (or for any exhibit of Dogs, £2), as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before 10 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned before the time specified, the deposit, together with all the prize money (if any) it has won, will be liable to forfeiture; but on the animal's return each day the cheque will be refunded to the Exhibitor.

#### WATER AND FORAGE.

40. Water will be provided in the yards for Live Stock and for the working of machinery, but exhibitors using gas engines, suction gas plants, and refrigerators must provide water storage tanks on their stands, and not permit water to run to waste. Exhibitors of stock will be required to provide their own forage (which can be purchased in the yards at Melbourne prices), but no feed must be stacked in any of the Stock Pavilions. Exhibitors of machinery will be required to provide their own fuel (which must be coke or wood, no coal being allowed), and materials necessary to enable them to comply with the regulations.

#### PRIVILEGES.

41. The successful tenderers for the privilege of photographing exhibits have the exclusive right thereto, with the reservation that the Council may allow the Press to take photographs of exhibits for the purposes of illustration.

42. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements, or other documents is restricted exclusively to Exhibitors at their respective stands. Any person infringing this regulation will incur expulsion from the yards. Any Exhibitor desiring to distribute trade lists, &c., must lodge a deposit of £1 with the Secretary before the Show opens, to be returned after the Show is closed if this regulation has been complied with, and to be forfeited if it has not.

#### CARE OF EXHIBITS.

43. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.



## USE OF PENS AND STALLS.

44. All exhibits of Live Stock, for which boxes, stalls, or pens are provided, have the use of such accommodation free for one week (and in the case of over-sea exhibits, for a fortnight) before the Show opens, but they must be removed from the grounds within one week after the last day of sales, or a charge will be made.

## EXHIBITS AT SHOW GROUNDS.

45. The Society's carter will receive competitive exhibits of produce, poultry, dogs, &c., that are addressed to the Show Grounds Siding, and place the entries in their respective sections. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits; but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. For the carting of stock feed and non-competitive exhibits, &c., to any part of the ground the following charges will be made, for which receipts will be given:—Up to 1 cwt., 6d.; up to 3 cwt., 1s.; up to 6 cwt., 1s. 6d.; up to 10 cwt., 2s.; up to 15 cwt., 2s. 6d.; and each additional 5 cwt., 6d.

46. In order to facilitate the unloading and loading of Stock at the Show Grounds Siding, the grounds will be lighted at night, and the Society will engage a corps of stock assistants, who will meet every stock train, and will assist Exhibitors with their stock, if required.

They will be permitted to charge Exhibitors not more than 9d. for each "lead" (one or more animals) of stock between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., nor more than 1s. for each "lead" between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.

## VEHICLES OTHER THAN EXHIBITS.

47. Vehicles and motors other than listed exhibits will not be permitted to enter the grounds.

A paddock for parking Motor Cars and other vehicles is provided.

Charges—Motors or Vehicles, 1/6.

Vehicles and motors are not permitted to be driven indiscriminately about the grounds, but must proceed directly to their destinations.

Prize-lists, entry forms, and every information on application to the Secretary, Collins House, 360 Collins-street, Melbourne; or Secretary of any Agricultural Society in Victoria.

Members' tickets, £1/5/- each (giving the member the privilege of admission, with two ladies, to the grounds and grand stand at all times, subject to such regulations as the Council may make, a vote for the election of office-bearers, reduced entry fees, Annual Report with list of Show awards, and free admission to the sale rings on the grounds, free copy of the Society's monthly journal, which is published with the Australian Farm and Home, &c., may be had on application to the Secretary. Extra Ladies' Tickets, 10/6 each.

Holiday tickets at excursion fares on all railway lines.

*Intending competitors are particularly requested to observe the date fixed for the reception of entries at the office, as the rule will be STRICTLY ENFORCED.*

Sales of exhibits (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility) will be held on the Show Grounds, and the Society reserves to itself the right to decide time and order of sales in all sections. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show.

# Railway Regulations.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE.**—Exhibitors desiring to have their stock conveyed by rail from the Show Grounds on Thursday evening must order their trucks through the Show Grounds Stationmaster before 4 p.m. on Wednesday, 26th September.

(Exhibits are consigned direct to Show Siding at Society's Grounds, and Exhibitors are particularly requested to send in their applications for trucks at once to the local Station-master, or to the Live Stock Agent, Railway Department, Melbourne, or through their own selling agents.)

1. The Undermentioned conditions shall be applicable in respect of agricultural machines and implements, machinery, produce, live stock (including dogs, poultry and other birds), buggies, motor cars, drays, waggons, and other goods of a like nature, sent for exhibition to Agricultural Shows.

They may also, by special arrangement with the General Passenger and Freight Agent, be made operative in respect of:—

Agricultural machinery, sent for field trials.

Ploughs, sent for ploughing matches.

Horses, sent for horse parades.

2. The exhibits will, in the ordinary course, be carried in goods or cattle trucks, by goods or mixed trains; but valuable animals may, if it be convenient to the Commissioners, be carried in horse boxes by passenger trains and charged the same as if loaded in cattle trucks and forwarded by goods trains. Each 3 stalls in 'F' or 'FF' to be regarded as equivalent to one full cattle truck.

3. When the exhibits are consigned on the forward journey, the consignor will require to declare, on the consignment note therefor, that they are for exhibition, specifying the Show for which they are intended, and the waybill must be indorsed accordingly.

The original freight charges shall be imposed and prepaid in respect of the forward journey in all cases, except that valuable animals carried by passenger trains in accordance with clause 2 will be charged goods train rates, whether loaded in horse boxes or cattle trucks.

4. On the return journey any exhibits, or portion thereof, which are certified by the Secretary of the Show as having been exhibited, and not sold, will be carried "free" to the station whence they were forwarded, provided the journey is completed at any time within one month from the date of despatch on the forward journey. A certificate in the approved form must be handed in when the exhibits are consigned, and such certificate must be attached to the waybill.

If a greater number of vehicles be used for the carriage of exhibits on the return journey than was used on the forward journey, ordinary freight charges will be imposed in respect of exhibits carried in the additional vehicles.

All exhibits, or part thereof, which have been sold, or are not accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, will be subject to the ordinary freight charges on the return journey, and such charges shall, in all cases, be made "to pay."

5. Exhibits, accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, may be forwarded on from one Show to another, subject to the freight charges, as prescribed in clause 3 of this division, being prepaid, and when the final destination is reached, they may be returned "free" to the original despatching station, conditionally on the observance of the provisions of clause 4 of this division. If, however, in proceeding to another Show, such exhibits be returned over any portion of the line in respect of which the full freight charges have been paid on the forward journey, the exhibits may be sent free over such portion of the line.

6. All exhibits are carried solely at the risk of the owner, and must be loaded and unloaded by or at the expense of the consignors or consignees.

7. Owners of stock going to or returning from Shows may be allowed free carriage of fodder, as specified hereunder, if it be loaded in the trucks with the animals:—

1 cwt. for each horse or head of cattle each way.

20 lbs. for each pig or sheep each way.

8. Exhibits from the Department of Agriculture—viz., wheat, straw in bulk, olive oil, wine, honey, &c., fruit (preserved), charts, &c., fibres, including flax, hemp (dressed and undressed), willows, manures, vegetable oil, eggs,



also the necessary marquees, poles, and pegs, tables, trestles, and fittings forwarded to the various Agricultural Shows in the State, shall be forwarded free.

9. Consignors should give not less than four (4) days' notice to the station-master of the number and description of live-stock trucks, and 48 hours for other trucks, &c., required to load exhibits.

10. Judges appointed to act at Agricultural Shows will, on production of an approved certificate, be granted return tickets at Holiday Excursion Fares.

11. If a full sheep-truck load of sheep, or a full cattle-truck load of horses, cattle, or pigs has been paid for on the forward journey, and the whole of the stock has been returned "free," in accordance with the provisions of clause 4 of this division, one stock attendant in respect of each truck will be granted a refund of the return fare paid by him. He must travel in the truck or in the van of a goods train with the stock, and must provide himself with a copy of form P69, duly completed by the station-masters at the forwarding and returning stations respectively. A receipt for the refund must be given on the certificate by the attendant, after which it must be forwarded to the Auditor of Receipts as a voucher.

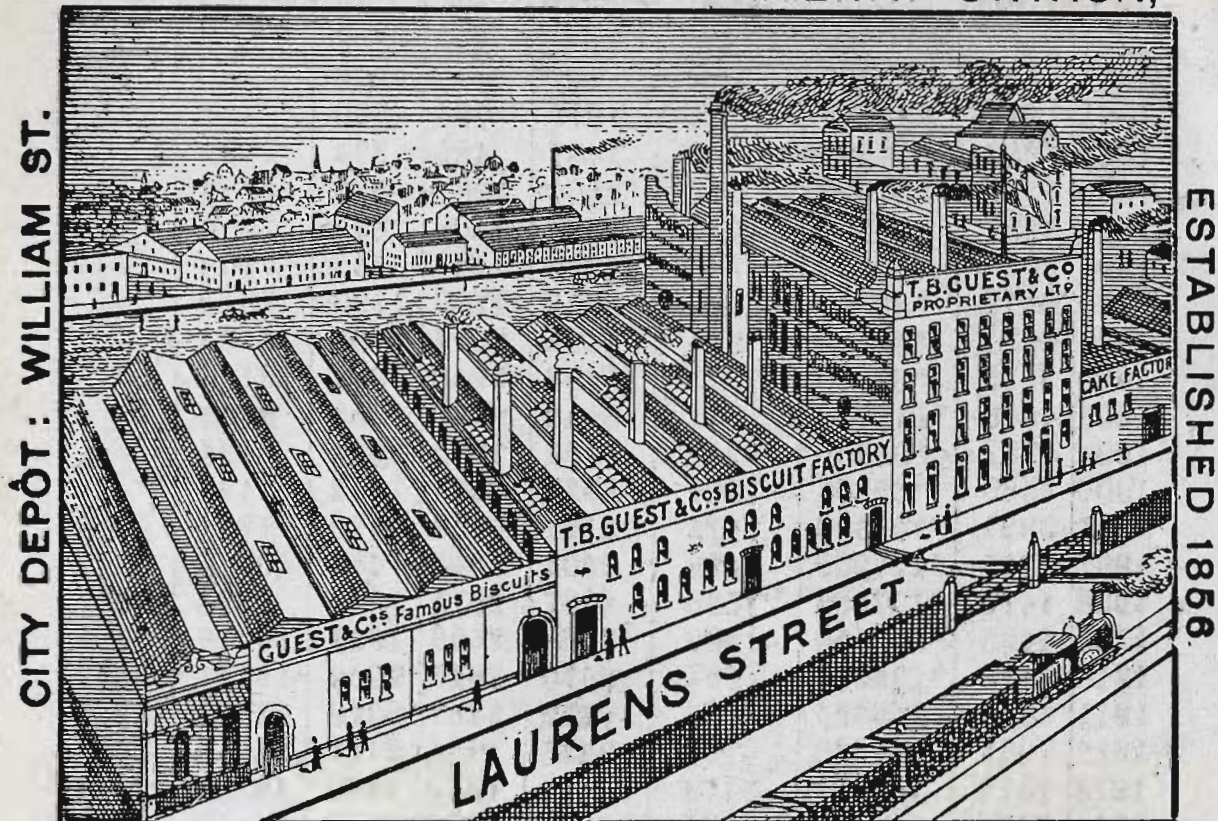
