Age of all pigs to be calculated to day of judging (18th September, 1930. The Society's veterinary surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age. Exhibitors may be disqualified and debarred from further competition for any breach of regulations regarding the age of exhibits.

In this Section all exhibits (except Classes 519, 520 and 521) over the age of four months must be registered in an approved Herd Book, and pigs, in Classes 519, 520 and those in Classes other than 521, under the age of four months must be from litters notified in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society In the classes for sows with litters, the sire of the litter must also be registered, and the litter must have been duly recorded.

The Registered Herd Book numbers of all exhibits and of the sires

and dams of exhibits MUST be stated on entry form.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Stud Pig Herd Book, apply to the Secretary, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Swine not registered prior to 31st July will only be permitted to entered for the Show on payment of double entry fees.

Entries limited to 2 in each class from any one exhibitor in whose mame the exhibits must be registered in the Herd Book. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding.

Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration on the back of their entry forms that their entries are true and correct in every particular, that their exhibits are eligible for entry according to the conditions specified and subject to the Rules, Regulations and By-laws of the Society, and that their exhibits, and the holding or holdings on which such exhibits were kept, have been free from swine fever for 12 months prior to the date of entry.

2. Cockerel and Pullet shall mean a bird hatched on or after 1st July in previous year. Young Ducks or Young Drakes must be

twelve months old or under on the first day of the Show.

3. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram, of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. 

- 1. This section is conducted under the rules of the Canine Control Council. (A copy of the rules may be inspected at the office of this Society). All dogs must be registered with the Canine Control Council. Registration can be effected at the Society's office at time of entry for the Show. Registration fee, 1/6.
- 2. All dogs must have chains and collars, without names, attached, to enable them to be taken out if required.
- 3. Any dog wearing a collar with its owner's name thereon will be disqualified from receiving a prize.
- 4. When being judged, dogs must wear exhibit numbers, which will be supplied by the Society.
- 5. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards, be permitted to loose their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove their dogs from the yards without a written order from the Superintendent, and without leaving a deposit of £2. (See General Regulation 39).
- 6. Dogs will be subjected to veterinary inspection, and those considered by the Stewards or the Veterinary Surgeon unfit for exhibition. either from disease, the effects of disease, vice, or other causes, will not be received; or removed if found necessary.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of Dogs which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense and disarrangement of the Show benches, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of 10/- for each and every entry of Dogs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society at least three days before the opening of the exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the Dog or Dogs; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by the Dog or Dogs becoming ineligible for the Class in which they have been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

11. No dog shall be eligible to compete if it be proved to the satisfaction of the Council:—(a) That any dye, colouring, whitening or darkening matter has been used and remains on any part of the dog; (b) that any preparation, chemial or otherwise, has been used, which remains on the coat during the time of exhibition, for the purpose of altering its texture; (c) that any oil, grease or sticky substance has been used and remains on the coat during the time of exhibition; (d) that if any cutting, piercing, breaking by force, or any kind of operation or act which destroys the tissues of the ears or alters their natural formation or carriage, or shortens the tail, or alters the natural formation of the dog or any part thereof, has been practised, or any other thing done calculated to deceive, excepting cases of necessary operations certified to the satisfaction of the club; (e) that the lining membrane of the mouth has been cut or mutilated in any way.

EXCEPTIONS.—Shortening the tails of dogs of the following breeds will not render them liable to disqualification:—Spaniels (except Irish Water), Fox Terriers, Irish Terriers, Welsh Terriers, Airedale Terriers, Old English Sheepdogs, Poodles, Toy Spaniels, Yorkshire Terriers, Silky Terriers and Australian Terriers, and such varieties of foreign dogs as may from time to time be determined. Dogs of the following breeds may have their coats clipped:—Poodles. Pomeranians may have their ears and feet judiciously trimmed. Dewclaws may be

removed in any breed.

12. Should any dispute arise in this Section for which no specific rule has been laid down, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES.

The classes provided for are as follows:—

Novice Class" is one in which dogs of any breed or variety of breed therein provided for, which have not won a first prize in any class at any show, excepting puppy, brace and team classes, may compete. A dog having won a challenge award cannot compete in a "Novice Class."

"Puppy Class" is a class confined to dogs of six and not exceeding twelve months of age prior to midnight of the first day of the Show.

"Australasian Bred Class" is limited to dogs of any breed or variety of breed therein provided for, born in Australia or New Zealand.

"Limit Class" is limited to dogs of any breed or variety of breed therein provided for, which have not won four first prizes, puppy, brace and team classes excepted.

'Open Class' is one in which all dogs of any breed or variety of breed therein provided for, may compete, subject to cases in which the class is limited by height or weight.

(The first day of the Show in these definitions means the first day on which the breed is exhibited.)

SPECIAL NOTIFICATION.—No Dog will be allowed to be benched or be admitted to the Judging Ring unless in possession of the Society's Veterinary Certificate for the current year.

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon will be in attendance from 8 a.m. till 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, 18th September, and again on Thursday, 25th September, at the same time, for the purpose of examining the dogs.

In each Class the prizes are: - First prize, £1; second prize 10/-; third prize, Card.

A Blue Ribbon and Card will be awarded to all Challenge Prizewinners. The Judges may withhold Challenge Prizes if animals are not of sufficient merit.
