In each Class the prizes are:—First, 10/- and Card; second, 5/- and Card; third, Card. Ribbons will be awarded also—Blue for first, red for second, and white for third.

A Kennel Control Council Challenge Certificate, with Blue Ribbon, is offered in each breed, one for each sex. Challenge Certificates may be awarded to both sexes in classes which are for both dogs and bitches together, also to every breed entered in the "any other recognised breed" classes. The Judges may withhold awards if animals are not of sufficient merit.

Dogs entered in Division "A" in this Section must be benched by 9.30 a.m. on Saturday, 25th September. Dogs entered in Division "B" must be benched by 9.30 a.m. on Monday and Tuesday, 27th and 28th September. Dogs entered in Division "C" must be benched by 9.30 a.m. on Wednesday and Thursday, 29th and 30th September. Dogs entered in Division "D" must be benched by 9.30 a.m. on Friday and Saturday, 1st and 2nd October.

Judging will commence punctually at 10 a.m. on the first day on which each Division is exhibited. In the case of Special Prizes in which dogs from different Divisions are required to meet, the elimination awards will be made immediately judging is completed, and the final award will be made at 10 a.m. on the second day of the latest Division concerned.

Dogs will be received and benched, fed and attended to, and returned free of charge to Exhibitors, subject to the provisions of Regulations 43 and 45.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. Prior to entry all dogs must be registered or transferred or leased to present ownership direct with the Kennel Control Council, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne. The fees per dog are as follow:—

Dogs registered with a body recognised by the K.C.C. must nevertheless be registered on the usual form with the K.C.C., but no fees shall be charged for such registration.

2. Each dog must be provided with a suitable collar and chain or lead, but exhibits must be benched with a chain of metal. No cages may be used for dogs other than those provided or approved by the Society, and nothing which will affect the view of the public may be added to the cages. Not more than one exhibit may occupy any one bench or cage. A dog may not be so placed on the bench or in a cage as to be away from the view of the public. The position of exhibit numbers on benches or cages must not be altered.

3. A dog may be entered in more than one Class if eligible in accordance with the classification.

4. No dog may enter the judging ring wearing a collar on which the name of the dog or of its owner appears.

5. When being judged, dogs must wear exhibit numbers, which will be supplied by the Society.

6. On personal application to the Superintendent, exhibitors will be permitted to loose their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, by arrangement with the Superintendent; but they will on no account be permitted to remove their dogs from the yards without a written order from the Superintendent and without leaving a deposit. The deposit shall be 10/- per dog, provided that a maximum of £1 shall be sufficient to cover all the exhibits owned by any one person, otherwise no exhibit may be absent from its bench except for the purpose of being judged. Dogs will not be permitted on the lawns nor near the flower beds. To enable exhibitors to exercise their dogs, the entry tickets will admit exhibitors before 9.30 a.m. on the days the dogs are on exhibition. These tickets will also admit exhibitors, up to one hour before the time the parade is to commence, on the days of Parades in the Arena. (See note at head of each Section.)

7. Dogs will be subjected to veterinary inspection, and those considered by the Veterinary Surgeon to be unfit for exhibition, either from disease, the effects of disease, vice, or other cause, will not be received, and will be removed if found necessary.

8. Labels will be sent for each dog when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Two or more dogs may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided and labelled.

Note.—The Society's postal and telegraphic address at Show time is Show Grounds, Ascot Vale.

9. The Society will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs sent for exhibition, or any other property entrusted to them, but it must be distinctly understood by exhibitors, and all other persons, that the Society will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to, any dogs or other property, whether arising from accident or other cause whatever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants, or others.

10. The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to feed and take charge of the dogs during the day, and at night a watchman will be on duty.

11. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of dogs which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense and disarrangement of the Show benches, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of 10/- for each and every entry of dogs not exhibited, unless a certificate, under the hand of the exhibitor or his authorised agent, be lodged with the Secretary of the Society at least three days before the opening of the exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the dog or dogs; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by the dog or dogs becoming ineligible for the Class in which they have been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines shall debar all persons concerned from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

12. Should any dispute arise in this Section for which no specific rule has been laid down, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

13. After the judge's steward has given word to the judge to proceed with the judging of a competition, no other exhibit may enter the judging ring until after that competition has been completed. Exhibits which are not brought promptly to the assembly rings when called, and exhibits, the owners or handlers of which omit to obey the orders of the stewards, may be refused admission to the assembly and judging rings

DEFINITION OF CLASSES.

"Puppy Class" for dogs of six and not exceeding twelve months of age. (See note below.)

"Novice Class" for dogs six months of age or over, which have not won a first prize in any Class or a Challenge Certificate of any degree at any Show. Wins in Encouragement, Maiden, Brace, Team, Litter and all Puppy Classes do not count, nor do wins in any Classes whatsoever at parades or such other exhibitions distinct from Shows. (See note below.)

"Limit Class" for dogs six months of age or over which have not won a total of four first prizes in any Limit, Australasian-bred and/or Open Classes at any Show. No wins whatsoever at parades or such other exhibitions distinct from Shows shall count. (See note below.)

"Australasian-bred Class" for dogs six months of age or over, subject to any height and weight limitations and not deemed to be imported. (See note below.)

"Open Class" for all dogs six months of age or over. If confined to a breed or variety, for all dogs of that breed or variety. The word "variety" shall be taken as referring to the pure-bred varieties, for which a separate register is kept by the Kennel Club of England at the date of this Show. (See note below.)

N.B.—Only wins prior to midnight of the day preceding that on which the breed is exhibited shall count. Wins at Parades and such other exhibitions as distinct from Shows do not count at Shows. The age of all dogs is computed from and inclusive of the day of their birth to midnight of the first day on which the breed is exhibited.

SPECIAL NOTIFICATION.—No Dog will be allowed to be benched or be admitted to the Judging Ring unless he be examined by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, and the Ring Number Card stamped, "Pass to Ring."

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon will be in attendance from 8.30 a.m. till 9.30 a.m. on Saturday, 25th September; on Monday, 27th September; on Wednesday, 29th September, and again on Friday, 1st October, at the same time for the purpose of examining the dogs.



Plan of Jumps for Myer Emporium Olympian Hunting Contest

RULES OF THE CONTEST.

1. **Weighing.**—All horses entered for the competition shall be weighed on the weighbridge at the Show Grounds by a Steward appointed for the purpose. Each horse shall be weighed without harness, other than a halter or bridle. Withholding feed or water from horses to decrease their weight is prohibited. The Judges may require any horse to be fed and watered before weighing. Horses must be weighed prior to competing. **Each competitor will be notified of the day and time.**

2. **Harness.**—All horses competing must be equipped by the owners with suitable dray harness, in sound condition.

3. **Classing.**—A horse entered in a Class and found to be overweight will be transferred to its correct Class by the Weighing Steward.

4. **Type of Competition.**—Horses will be tested singly, and will be required to draw the dynamometer car described in Rule 7.

Each horse will first be required to draw an initial load, as determined by the Judge, over a measured distance of 27½ feet. Any horse which fails to do this is automatically eliminated. The amount of the pull will then be increased by an amount decided upon by the Judges, and each horse will then be required to draw this increased load over the same measured distance. Horses will pull in the same order as in the first round, so that they will have adequate periods of rest. Again, these horses which fail to pull the increased load the full distance will be eliminated. A third round will then be conducted, with a further increase in the pull, and so on until the winning horse is disclosed. The competition is thus on a "knockout" basis, and is judged solely on the pull exerted by the horse over a measured distance.

In the event of a tie, however, the Judges shall have the right to decide which is the winning horse from records of the time taken to pull the maximum load over the measured distance, or from measurements of the distance over which the tying horses can draw the maximum load without pause.

5. **Length of Pull.**—In every case each horse will be required to pull the dynamometer over a measured distance of 27½ feet without pause. Should any horse stop pulling before completing the full distance so that the dynamometer car comes to rest, it shall be deemed to have failed to complete the pull.

6. **Number of Attempts.**—Each horse shall have the right to two further attempts to pull any one load the full distance, should it fail on the first attempt. Movement of the dynamometer car through a distance of three feet or more shall be deemed to be an attempt at pulling the load. A false start by a horse before the driver gives it the word to commence pulling shall not

7. **Dynamometer Car.**—The dynamometer car takes the form of a waggon fitted with shafts and requiring a steady pull of constant value in order to move it along. Thus the starting pull and the pull during motion are equal and constant, and are determined by weights on the dynamometer car itself. The pull is independent of the type of surface, the type of wheels used, and the speed of movement, and is thus made identical for each horse competing.

8. **Ground Surface.**—The surface used for the pulling contest will be grass sod, covered with sand, and raked in between successive pulls.

9. **Broken Harness.**—Should any part of the harness break, or come loose during the pull, the horse will be allowed a further attempt.

10. **Height of Drawbar.**—The driver may adjust the height of the drawbar, provided it is not less than one foot above ground level.

11. **Drivers, etc.**—Drivers of horses shall be designated by the owners. The driver may either ride on the car or walk alongside his horse. Whips must not be carried, and any driver who strikes a horse in any way or raises his voice unduly during the contest will be disqualified.

12. **Management.**—Classes will be in charge of Stewards, whose directions to drivers to "get ready" and the like must be immediately obeyed.

Each pull will be started and controlled by the Official Starter and Time-keeper. A driver must start his horse at the word "go," from a standing start, with the front wheels of the dynamometer waggon on the mark.

The decision of the Judges shall be absolute and final as to the winning horses and on all happenings during the contests, and they shall have power to prevent any horse from either commencing or completing a test.

13. **Dates of Contests.**—If the number of entries warrant, the preliminary rounds, as mentioned in Rule 4 above, may be conducted on one day, and the finals on another day during the Show. Competitors will be duly notified of the dates and times fixed for the contests.

Sheep Dog Trials.

Judge: A. J. RITCHIE, Esq.

Steward: F. E. CLARKE, Esq.

(Conducted under the rules of the Victorian Working Sheep Dog Association.)

TRIAL RULES.

1. Three sheep will be allotted to each dog in first instance, and subsequently any number the Judge may appoint.

2. Competitors must take their place by direction of the Steward, and any dog absent when called upon to compete may be disqualified at the discretion of the Steward. In the trials held in the Arena the Steward in charge will draw for the order of running, and will notify each competitor directly his three sheep are placed ready for liberation.

3. Any competitor with a bitch on season will be disqualified unless he reports her condition to the Stewards prior to taking her on to the course, and she will only be permitted to compete last on the list in the heats, after inspection.

4. The moment worker and dog are at the starting peg and the sheep liberated, and so long as the sheep remain within the arena fence, they should be the sheep to be worked by that dog.

5. The competitor, with his dog, shall stand at a flag indicating the starting point, and shall not release his dog until directed by the Trial Steward.

6. The maximum time allowed to competitors will be fixed before the trials commence. Any competitor withdrawing his dog before the expiry of the full time allowed, unless at the direction of the Judge, shall not be entitled to a prize.

7. Should the Judge deem fit, he may order fresh sheep at any time during a trial.

8. If a dog shall bite, or in any way injure a sheep, such dog will at once be disqualified, and the competitor held responsible for any damage done to the sheep. Should a dog bark or snap at the sheep when they are stuck up, points may be deducted, but the dog should not be disqualified.

9. If the working of any dog is of inferior merit, the Judge has power to terminate the trial before the expiration of time allowed.

10. Any dog crossing the cast, or passing between competitor and sheep at any time during the trial, will be disqualified. (This rule does not apply in special field trials when "driving" or "flanking.")

11. The competitor will not be allowed to assist his dog in any way, except by signal, whistle, or word of mouth.

12. When the competitor has to move from one given point to another, he must do so in a direct line, and not stop to work his dog. Infringement of this rule will entail a deduction of points for each offence.

13. Should there be a "final" trial by selected dogs, the Judge will give his awards to those gaining highest aggregate number of points in both trials. At least one dog more than there are prizes offered shall be selected to compete in the "final" trial.

14. The Judge's decision shall be final.

15. Scale of Points:—Cast, 12; Approach, 5; Bringing, 8; Command, 20; Obstacles, 25; General Work, including Force, Steadiness, and Control of Sheep, 30. Total, 100.

16. At the conclusion of each trial, the competitor must take his sheep to the enclosed yard as expeditiously as possible.

17. If, in the opinion of the Judge or the Council, any man ill-uses his dog, he will be subject to a fine of £1, and may be debarred from competing again at any Trial conducted under these Rules.

18. The Trial shall take place over such a course as the Show or Trial Committee may determine, and any additional tests shall be over the whole or such portion of the said course as they may decide upon.

19. Any person or persons bringing dogs on the ground and allowing them to run loose, either by mistake or otherwise, except when directed by the Trial Steward, may be fined £1.

20. Owners of dogs competing must be financial members of the Victorian Working Sheep Dog Association, or of a recognised Working Sheep Dog Association in another State, and their dogs must be registered in a recognised Stud Book.

21. Any dog having won a first prize at any sheep dog trial shall not be eligible to compete in a Novice Class. A dog that has only divided a first prize is not debarred from competing as a novice.

22. Any protest against a dog competing must be lodged in writing with the Secretary or the Trial Steward, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, and accompanied by a fee of £1. Such protest will be dealt with by the Council, and, if upheld, the fee will be returned.

23. An owner may appoint a nominee to work his dog, or dogs, in the Trials, and such nominee will conjointly assume responsibility with the owner during the Trials.


24. Any person or persons refusing to conform with these Rules will be expelled from the ground, and may be disqualified from competing at any future Trials conducted under these Rules.

25. In the event of any question or situation arising not provided for in these Rules, the matter in question will be dealt with by the Council, and its decision shall be final.

NOTE.—In all trials, one dog more than there are prizes offered will be selected to compete in the finals.

6. The Committee of the V.A.W.C. shall be the absolute authority on the matter of settling any disputes which may arise prior to or after the contest. Their decision shall be final and without appeal. The Referee of the day shall have sole jurisdiction during the period of the race. His decisions on all matters relative to that period shall be final and without appeal.

7. The entrance fee shall be Two shillings (2/-). Entries will be accepted only from bona fide members of the various walking clubs of Australia, who are affiliated with their State associations, and which are, in turn, affiliated with the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION.

Post entry. No entry fee.

The Competition shall be for teams of three members, male or female, who have not passed their eighteenth birthday.

Each team must represent an organised body, e.g.—A Young Farmers' Club, Agricultural College, Farm Institute, or Orphanage.

Each Competitor shall be a bona fide member of the organisation he or she represents and must be vouched for by the Body represented.

One or more teams may be entered from the same organisation.

Teams shall be responsible for their own expenses.

The Competitors will be required to judge mature cows of one breed only and will be permitted to nominate their breed.

Four animals will be led into each ring and the Competitors will be required to select and place them in order of merit: one, two, three, four.

Cards will be supplied to each Competitor, on which shall be marked the order in which he or she places the cattle. No other writing of any kind shall be made on the cards.

Twenty minutes shall be allowed for judging.

The Competitors shall form one large ring. The cattle bearing their numbers will be paraded around the ring for five minutes, after which the Competitors will be allowed to handle and inspect the cattle for fifteen minutes. At the expiration of the time limit, Competitors will be marshalled under the charge of the Steward till individually summoned to the Judge's table, where they will be allowed two minutes to give their reasons.

In giving their reasons the Competitors must speak up so that the spectators may hear their reasons.

When placing the animals the Competitors shall be allowed to make notes. These notes may be used for reference, but shall not be allowed to be read verbatim to the Judge.

No Competitor may use or have with him or her while competing a catalogue of the Show, any instructional cards or papers giving the points of live stock.

Competitors must not obtain from or give to other Competitors any information by word or sign during the time of judging, and must not obtain information or advice from any onlooker under penalty of disqualification of the whole team. This regulation applies equally to individual members of the same team or different teams.

The decision of the Judge shall be final.

Marks shall be allowed as follows:—

12 marks for each animal correctly placed.

9 marks for each animal one place out of order.

3 marks for each animal two places out of order.

No marks for animals three places out of order.

Maximum 48 points

Marks will be allowed for stating reasons as follows:

Correct reasons 30 points

Use of correct terms, including parts of the animals, i.e., correct phraseology 10 points

Competitor's ability to express himself or herself in a clear and concise manner 12 points 52 points

Total Aggregate Points 100

The Competition will be conducted in the Jersey judging ring on Saturday, 25th September, commencing at 9.30 a.m.

Special Regulations re Champion Prizes of Australia

(The Gift of the Government of Victoria, through the Department of Agriculture).

1. All exhibits to be the *bona fide* property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the exhibitor.
2. For Champion Awards to be made, three exhibits must be entered (at least two of which must be duly shown), unless the judge reports that an exhibit (even though alone) is of exceptional merit and worthy of such award. If, however, in the opinion of the Judge, none of the exhibits are of sufficient merit, he may withhold the prize altogether.
3. Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1928.
4. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.
5. In any case where, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be awarded.
6. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes of Australia.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

ENTRIES.

(Also see Special Notes in Each Section.)

1. Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society, and all exhibits must be the *bona fide property* of the Exhibitor at time of entry, and produce, which must be the growth of the preceding 12 months, must be produced, grown or made by the Exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being Exhibitors.
2. No exhibit may be entered in more than one class, except for a sweepstake, a special or champion prize, or unless specifically stated in the regulations governing the Section. Where any exhibit has, through oversight, been allowed to compete in more than one class (not being one of the exceptions abovementioned), such exhibit shall, whether awarded a prize or not, be deemed to be ineligible to compete, or to have competed, in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.
3. The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry submitted for this exhibition. No disqualified or deformed animal shall be allowed to compete for a prize.
4. When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

CLOSING DATES OF ENTRIES.

5. Applications for stands for harness and saddlery, vehicles, machinery and implements, single exhibits, or goods for exhibition only (Section 54), must be made (by ordinary letter) on or before Saturday, 19th June. After the applications close, positions will be allotted and a charge will be made for the space granted. Entries of this description of exhibits must afterwards be duly made by letter before Saturday, 21st August, 1937, at 12 o'clock noon.

6. Entries (Arena events excepted) must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and (including those by post) must be in the hands of the Secretary, at his office, Temple Court, 422 Collins-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, 21st August, 1937, at 12 o'clock noon. Entries for Arena Contests and Competitions will be received on or before Saturday, 4th September, 1937, at 12 o'clock noon. Entry fee must accompany each entry. Entries for competitions are limited to three exhibits in Cattle and two exhibits in Sheep and Swine (except where specified otherwise), which exhibits must be brought before the Judge.

AGE OF EXHIBITS.

7. The date of birth of live stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the exhibit. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age.

8. The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year for all horses, and 1st July in each year for all cattle. Australasian bred shall mean bred in any of the Australian States or New Zealand.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTRY.

9. All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be visibly entire, and any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

10. All sheep over 18 months old, except where otherwise specified, must have been shorn since 1st August in the preceding year. The date on which sheep were shorn to be stated on entry form. Any sheep infested with ticks or lice are liable to disqualification. The month and year of lambing of all sheep under 2½ years old must also be stated.

VETERINARY CERTIFICATES.

11. All Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1928. All Mares, 3 years old or over, entered in Sections 1 to 9 inclusive, must have first obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Officer. Government Veterinary Officer will stamp all Entry Tickets for Stallions and Mares "Pass to Ring." These stamped tickets must be produced to the Steward before entering the Arena. Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Officers on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 22nd September, commencing at 10 a.m. Judges are particularly requested to satisfy themselves, as far as possible, regarding the soundness of all other horses before awarding the prize, and to avoid giving prizes to animals showing symptoms of hereditary diseases. A Judge may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeon if he deem it expedient. No protests on veterinary grounds will be received.

THE EXHIBITION.

12. The Exhibition will be open to the public daily from 9 a.m.; admission, 2/-. Admission to main grand stand, 3/- extra; "Chirnside" and "Cliff" grand stands, 2/- extra; and to the seated reserves, 1/- extra. The charge for admission to the grounds for children is 6d.

13. Members, on presentation of their badges, and members' ladies, on presentation of their tickets, will be admitted free to the grounds and grandstands subject to such regulations as the Council may make.

Children of Members, up to 14 years of age, will be permitted to enter the Jubilee grand stand on payment of 1/- each.

ENTRY TICKETS.

14. Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen

be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes, admitting up till 10 a.m., will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 22nd September, 1937.

PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION.

15. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and 10/- for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar entrants from taking part in any future Exhibitions of the Society.

16. Wheat exhibits must be lodged at the Show Grounds on or before Saturday, 17th July, at 5 p.m. Wine exhibits must be lodged at the Show Grounds on or before Saturday, 21st August, 1937, at 5 p.m. Fleeces and Skins on or before Saturday, 11th September, 1937, at 12 noon. Exhibits of Fat Cattle must be penned before 3 p.m. on Wednesday, 22nd September. Cows in milk must be penned before 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 22nd September. Exhibits of Needlework and Arts and Crafts must be lodged at the ground before 5 p.m. on Saturday, 18th September. Exhibits of Foods must be lodged at the Grounds before 2 p.m. on Tuesday, 21st September. Machinery, Implements and Miscellaneous Exhibits (Section 54) must be in their places before 6 p.m. on Thursday, 23rd September. Table Vegetables must be benched before 10 a.m. on Friday, 24th September. Business Turnouts to be in the Grounds before 10 a.m. on Friday, 24th September. Horses entered for the Arena Events will only be required to be in the yards on the day or days on which they perform. (If a request be made on the entry form, the Society will endeavour to provide boxes for horses entered for contests.) Poultry and Pigeons must be in their places in the yards before 9 p.m. on Tuesday, 28th September, 1937. Budgerigars and Cage Birds must be in their places in the yards before 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 22nd September. Dogs entered in Division "A" must be benched before 9.30 a.m. on Saturday, 25th September; those entered in Division "B" before 9.30 a.m. on Monday, 27th September; those entered in Division "C" before 9.30 a.m. on Wednesday, 29th September; and those entered in Division "D" before 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 1st October. Cats must be benched before 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, 23rd September. Sheep (except Fats) must be penned before 10 a.m. on Monday, 27th September. Fat Sheep and Lambs must be penned before 10 a.m. on Tuesday, 28th September. All other exhibits must be in their places in the yards by 9 a.m. on Thursday, 23rd September, 1937.

17. Exhibits will not be received in the yards after the date and hour specified. No exhibit, whether for competition or not, will be admitted to the Show Grounds unless duly entered as an exhibit.

18. All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) must not be re-

moved from their classes during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Secretary being first obtained.

REMOVAL OF DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS.

19. The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

19a. In case any live stock, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall be injured or maimed or suffering from any ailment requiring, in the opinion of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon or that of some qualified substitute, immediate veterinary aid, and the owner of such stock is absent or fails to forthwith render such aid, the Secretary or Assistant Secretary may provide such aid, and the cost and expense thereby incurred shall in every case be borne by the owner of such stock. If such aid be not immediately available, the Secretary or Assistant Secretary may, on the advice of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, or of such substitute, have such live stock destroyed. The owner of such stock and any persons having the control thereof shall indemnify the Council Secretary or Assistant Secretary and the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, or such substitute, against all damages, costs, expenses or liability incurred in connection with the same.

19b. All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend their exhibits at their own risk, and in case any exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers and members, property and effects from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.

PRECAUTIONS RE MACHINERY.

20. All machinery in motion shall either be securely fenced or be in such position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.

PASSES FOR ATTENDANTS.

21. As many men as the Council may deem necessary will be allowed into the yards free to take charge of exhibits, and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary.

RUGGING OF EXHIBITS.

22. Exhibits must not be rugged and horses must not wear spats during the hours the Show is open to the public, and the upper portion of horse boxes outside the pavilions must remain open during those hours. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

CLEANING OF STALLS.

23. Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right through the Show.

Any Exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

No advertisement or notice (except ordinary sale notice) is permitted on any stall or building.

PARADES.

24. When ordered by the Stewards, all horses and cattle must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of ten shillings in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to their exhibit or exhibits. All horses and cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers. No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

AWARDING OF PRIZES.

25. It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judge, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective exhibits, or address the Judge, unless authorised by the Stewards of the section in which they are competing. Competitors not ready at the appointed time of adjudication will be liable to disqualification.

26. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

27. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

28. The Judge shall award Reserve Champion Sashes in all Horse and Cattle Sections, and Rosettes in all Sheep and Swine Sections in which Champion awards are made, and the animal second in the class to the Champion shall be allowed to compete for the Reserve Championship.

29. Any Exhibitor or Attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and keep the same on the exhibit during the hours of exhibition, or any exhibitor or attendant altering a Prize Card in any way, will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and may be disqualified from again competing, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Ribbon or Prize Card on his exhibit stall or stand, in addition to those issued by the Society for the year. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.

30. Stock exhibits wearing bridles or head stalls, with their names or the names of their owners displayed thereon, are liable to disqualification.

31. The Council may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, or when exhibits have been tampered with or improperly dealt with, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to Exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements in relation to any of their exhibits; and Exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements, or found guilty of tampering with or improperly dealing with their exhibits, may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors must, if required by the Council, make a statutory declaration regarding their entries.

32. Any person insulting or interfering with a Judge during the Show will be subject to removal from the yards; and the prizes, if any, awarded to such person may be forfeited.

33. Cheques for prizes at the Show will be passed for payment at the Council meeting on Tuesday, 19th October, one week after which date they will be payable.

34. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

PROTESTS.

35. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

36. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the question.

37. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judge appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests, alleging infringement of the regulations, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS.

38. No exhibit (except Live Stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) shall be removed from the Exhibition until 5 p.m. on Saturday, 2nd October, when all exhibits may be removed. Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Swine may be removed from the Grounds on Friday, 1st October, after 5 p.m.

39. Any exhibit of Horses or Cattle may be removed from the yards each day of the Exhibition after 5 p.m. on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 (or for any exhibit of Dogs, 10/-, with a maximum of £1 for any one exhibitor), as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before 9.30 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned before the time specified, the deposit, together with all the prize money (if any) it has won, will be liable to forfeiture; but on the animal's return each day the cheque will be refunded to the Exhibitor.

WATER AND FORAGE.

40. Water will be provided in the yards for Live Stock and for the working of machinery, but exhibitors using gas engines, suction gas plants and refrigerators, must provide water storage tanks on their stands, and not permit water to run to waste. Exhibitors of stock will be required to provide their own forage (which can be purchased in the yards at Melbourne prices), but no feed must be stacked in any of the Stock Pavillions. Exhibitors of machinery will be required to provide their own fuel (which must be coke or wood, no coal being allowed), and materials necessary to enable them to comply with the regulations.

PRIVILEGES.

41. The successful tenderers for the privilege of photographing exhibits have the exclusive right thereto, with the reservation that the Council may allow the Press to take photographs of exhibits for the purposes of illustration.

DISTRIBUTION OF ADVERTISING MATERIAL.

42. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements or other documents is restricted exclusively to Exhibitors at their respective stands. Any person infringing this regulation will incur expulsion from the yards. Any Exhibitor desiring to distribute trade lists, etc., must lodge a deposit of £1 with the Secretary before the Show opens, to be returned after the Show is closed if this regulation has been complied with, and to be forfeited if it has not.

CARE OF EXHIBITS.

43. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.

USE OF PENS AND STALLS.

44. All exhibits of Live Stock, for which boxes, stalls or pens are provided, have the use of such accommodation free for one week (and in the case of oversea exhibits, for a fortnight), before the Show opens, but they must be removed from the grounds within one week after the last day of sales, or a charge will be made.

EXHIBITS AT SHOW GROUNDS.

45. The Society's carter will receive competitive exhibits of produce, poultry, dogs, etc., that are addressed to the Show Grounds Siding, and place the entries in their respective sections. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits; but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. For the carting of stock feed and non-competitive exhibits, etc., to any part of the ground, the following charges will be made, for which receipts will be given:—Up to 1 cwt., 6d.; up to 3 cwt., 1/-; up to 6 cwt., 1/6; up to 10 cwt., 2/-; up to 15 cwt., 2/6; and each additional 5 cwt., 6d.

46. In order to facilitate the unloading and loading of Stock at the Show Grounds Siding, the grounds will be lighted at night, and the Society will engage a corps of stock assistants, who will meet every stock train.

All stock assistants will be numbered, and will not approach the trucks unless requested by exhibitors.

They will be permitted to charge Exhibitors not more than 9d. for each "lead" (one or more animals) of stock between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., nor more than 1/- for each "lead" between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.

VEHICLES OTHER THAN EXHIBITS.

47. Vehicles and motors other than listed exhibits will not be permitted to enter the grounds.

A paddock for parking motor-cars and other vehicles is provided. Charges—Motors or Vehicles, 1/-.

Vehicles and motors are not permitted to be driven indiscriminately about the grounds, but must proceed directly to their destinations.

Notices.

Prize lists, entry forms and every information on application to the Secretary, Temple Court, 422 Collins-street, Melbourne, or Secretary of any Agricultural Society in Victoria.

Members' tickets, £1/10/- each, giving the member the privilege of admission, with two ladies, to the grounds and grand stand during the currency of the Society's Annual Exhibition, subject to such regulations as the Council may make, a vote for the election of office-bearers, reduced entry fees, Annual Report with list of Show awards, and free admission to the sale rings on the grounds, free copy of the Society's monthly journal, which is published with the "Australian Farm and Home," if written application is made, admission to the grounds and grandstands of the Sydney, Adelaide, Perth, Brisbane, Hobart, New Zealand "Royal," and Launceston Societies, etc., may be had on application to the Secretary. Extra Ladies' Tickets, 10/6 each.

Holiday tickets at excursion fares on all railway lines.

Intending competitors are particularly requested to observe the date fixed for the reception of entries at the office. as the rules will be STRICTLY ENFORCED.

Sales.

Sales of exhibits (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility) will be held on the Show Grounds, and the Society reserves to itself the right to decide time and order of sales in all sections. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show.

INSURANCE OF LIVE STOCK. Victorian Railways.

CONDITIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF LIVE STOCK.
Supplementary to the General Conditions of Carriage. (See Page 7.)

1. The Commissioners will not be liable for the loss of or injury to any horses, cattle or other animals, or birds in excess of the amounts specified hereunder, unless at the time of delivery thereof at the station or siding for the purpose of being carried, the value of such horses, cattle or other animals, or birds, shall have been declared by the consignor thereof, and the increased charges hereunder set forth (which are in addition to the freight charges), shall have been paid to and accepted by the employee duly authorised to receive the same.

On horses, cattle or other animals insured at the risk of the Commissioners, power is reserved to them to regulate the number of animals which shall be carried in each truck, and the Commissioners will not be responsible for any loss or injury which may occur to any livestock during the loading or unloading, or during transit, when such loss or injury arises from fear or restiveness, or through such live stock being suffocated or trampled upon, and without negligence on the Commissioners' part.

The Commissioners' liability is limited as follows, viz.:—For any horse, £50. For any neat cattle, per head, £20. For any sheep, pig, dog, or other small animal, or bird, per head, £1.

The increased charges are as under, and must be prepaid upon consignment of the stock:—

Railway Regulations.

IMPORTANT NOTICE.—Exhibitors desiring to have their stock conveyed by rail from the Show Grounds on Friday evening must order their trucks through the Show Grounds Station-master before 12 noon on Wednesday, 29th September.

Exhibits are consigned direct to Show Siding at Society's Grounds, and exhibitors are particularly requested to send in their applications for trucks at once to the local Station-master, or to the Live Stock Agent, Railway Department, Melbourne, or through their own selling agents.

1. The undermentioned conditions shall be applicable in respect of agricultural machines and implements, machinery, produce, live stock (including dogs, poultry and other birds), buggies, trotting sulkies* accompanying trotting horses, motor-cars, drays, waggons and other goods of a like nature sent for exhibition at Shows.

They may also, by special arrangement with the General Passenger and Freight Agent, be made operative in respect of:—

Agricultural machinery sent for field trial.

Ploughs sent for ploughing matches.

Horses sent for horse parades.

2. The exhibits will be carried at the convenience of the Commissioners by Passenger, Mixed or Goods trains as may be desired by the consignors. Valuable animals may be sent by passenger trains in horse-boxes if this class of vehicle be available, and charged the same rate as if loaded in cattle trucks, and forwarded by Goods trains. Each three stalls in horse-box to be regarded as equivalent to one full cattle truck.

3. When the exhibits are consigned on the forward journey, the consignors will require to declare, on the consignment note therefor, that they are for exhibition, specifying the Show for which they are intended, and the way-bill must be endorsed accordingly.

The ordinary freight charges shall be imposed and prepaid in respect of the forward journey in all cases.

4. On the backward journey, any exhibits, or portion thereof, which have been exhibited and were carried by rail on the forward journey, and not sold, will, subject to the conditions in Clause 7 and on production of the approved certificates, signed by the Secretary of the Show, be carried "free" to the station whence they were forwarded, provided the journey is completed at any time within one month from the date of despatch on the forward journey. The certificates must be handed in when the exhibits are consigned, and attached to the waybill.

If, on the backward journey, a greater number of vehicles be used for the carriage of exhibits than was used on the forward journey, ordinary freight charges will be imposed in respect of exhibits carried in the additional vehicles.

All exhibits, or part thereof, which have been sold, or are not accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, will be subject to the ordinary freight charges and conditions on the backward journey.

Stud sheep purchased at Agricultural and Pastoral Shows by exhibitors thereat, and forwarded from the Show uncrated in the same truck as the exhibitor's returned unsold exhibits of sheep to the original forwarding station of the latter, shall be charged at Class "2" mileage rate on the basis of 3 cwt. per animal, and subject to the Tariff for Smalls, where cheaper than the ordinary rates.

5. Exhibits, accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, may be forwarded on from one Show to another, subject to the freight charges and conditions, as prescribed in Clause 3 of this division, which freight charges must be prepaid, and when the final destination is reached, they may be returned "free" to the original despatching station, subject to the conditions in Clause 7. If, however, in proceeding to another Show, such exhibits be returned over any portion of the line in respect of which the full freight charges have been paid on the forward journey, the exhibits may be sent free, subject to the conditions in Clauses 4 and 7, over such portion of the line.

*Wherever practicable, trotting sulkies shall be afforded similar transport on the return journey as was given on the forward journey, so that, as far as possible, the sulkies may accompany the horses.

6. Exhibits must be loaded and unloaded by or at the expense of the consignors or consignees. In all cases where Show exhibits are loaded or unloaded by the department the charges prescribed for the service shall be imposed.

7. Exhibits, other than live stock, may, where alternative rates apply (Condition 4), be consigned on the forward or the backward journey at the sender's option either at the rates and conditions prescribed in the Goods Rates Book for carriage at Commissioners' Risk or at Owner's Risk. On the backward journey, when consigned at Commissioners' Risk, the full Commissioners' Risk Rate shall be imposed, but if such exhibits be consigned at Owners' Risk they will be carried free.

Live stock exhibits shall be carried at the prescribed rates for live stock on the forward journey, and shall be carried on the backward journey free, but whether on the forward or backward journey, such carriage shall be subject to the conditions prescribed in the Goods Rates Book in respect to the carriage of live stock.

8. Owners of stock going to and returning from Shows may be allowed free carriage each way of fodder, as specified hereunder, if it be loaded in the trucks with the animals:—

1 cwt. for each horse or head of cattle.

20 lbs. for each pig or sheep.

9. Exhibits from the Department of Agriculture, viz., wheat, straw in bulk, olive oil, wine, honey, etc., fruit (preserved), charts, etc., fibres, including flax, hemp (dressed and undressed) willows, manures, vegetable oil, eggs, also the necessary marquees, poles and pegs, tables, trestles and fittings, forwarded to the various Agricultural Shows in the State, shall be carried free both on the forward and backward journeys at Owner's risk; when consigned at Commissioners' Risk on the forward or backward journey the full Commissioners' Risk Rate shall be imposed.

10. District Exhibits forwarded by local Agricultural Societies to the Royal Agricultural Show shall be carried on the forward journey at the Grain Rate, subject to the "Tariff for Smalls," and returned "free," subject to the conditions in Clause 4.

11. Consignors should give not less than (4) days' notice to the stationmaster of the number and description of live stock trucks, and 48 hours' for other trucks, etc., required to load exhibits.

12. Judges appointed to act at Agricultural Shows will, on production of an approved certificate, be granted return tickets at Holiday Excursion Fares.

13. When Holiday Excursion Tickets are issued in connection with a Show, exhibitors and live stock attendants travelling in charge of stock for exhibition may, if required, obtain such tickets up to four days, and employees of catering firms one day, before they are on issue to the public.

14. If a full sheep-truck load of sheep, or a full cattle-truck load of horses, cattle or pigs has been paid for on the forward journey, and the whole of the stock has been returned "free," in accordance with the provisions of Clause 4 of this division, one stock attendant, in respect of each truck, will be granted a refund of the return fare paid by him. He must travel in the truck or in the van of a goods train with the stock, and must provide himself with a copy of Form P69, duly completed by the station-masters at the forwarding and returning stations respectively. A receipt for the refund must be given on the certificate by the attendant. This refund shall, however, only be allowed provided a straight up and down journey is made between two stations. When the stock is returned from any station other than that to which it was waybilled by the original despatching station, the stock attendant certificates for the journeys made must be retained by the stock attendant until he returns to the original despatching station, and forwarded by the Stationmaster at that Station to the General Passenger and Freight Agent, where any refund due will be adjusted.
