TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1901 :—

Permanent Buildings and Works.

Early in the year the following works were carried out, viz:— Break view and Sanitary accommodation at the railway entrance, and new sanitary buildings at doghouse and northwest corner, drainage, &c., cattle stalls opposite pigshed, and new ticket boxes at front entrance; at a cost of £397. Later on barbed wire was erected round the grounds costing £84 1s.; a double row of new cattle stalls running west from the sale rotunda was built at a cost of £489; the Council's dining hall was extended at a cost

of £142 15s. 8d.; and additional shafting was erected in the dairy plants shed costing £58. A considerable sum was spent in general repairs to the grand stand, the dogs and poultry benches, and minor improvements throughout the grounds, the outlay for the year being £1,531 9s. 4d., making the total expenditure on buildings and works at the grounds £38,687 17s. 8d. In the last report it was stated that a premium of £50 had been offered for a design for providing viewing accommodation for the public at the arena in the show grounds. The premium has been awarded to Messrs. Gregory and Spence after consultation with Messrs. W. Davidson, Inspector-General of Public Works, and Mr H. Byron Moore, Secretary V R.C. The winning design has been modified by somewhat reducing the area of the oval, and the Works Committee has been authorised to have specifications prepared and tenders called for carrying out the undertaking.

The Exhibition.

The Annual Exhibition was held on the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th September. The prize schedule was again thoroughly revised, four new sections introduced, and the prize money in several classes somewhat increased. The entries reached 5106, a record number for the society. The entry fees amounted to £946 5s. being £4 3s. 8d. behind last year. The gate money, including £420 0s. 9d. at the grand stand, reached £3,571 12s. 9d. being £114 6s. short of last year, but £376 1s. 3d. ahead of the year before, and £1,257 7s. 5d. in advance of the year before that. In this connection it is worthy of note that the takings on the grounds exceeded those of last year, but the railway receipts were £194 19s. 9d. behind.

Reviewing the exhibits in the order of the schedule, the draught horses topped the last two years in numbers, the grand Draught Horse Produce Stakes classes for yearlings filling particularly well. Thoroughbreds more than doubled in numbers, and some good stallions were shown. The Arab section just introduced was very disappointing, only one animal being entered, and he could not be properly classed as an Arab. Trotters showed a great advance, and the competition throughout was keen. Roadsters were few, the section for English Hackneys which previously had to compete as Roadsters having been introduced, and Cleveland do not appear to find favour in this State. The Hunters' classes filled well throughout; and the highjumping event was keenly contested, and its interest was well maintained. Hackneys and Ladies' Hackneys kept up their numbers, but there is a great falling off in

all classes of light harness horses, which, it is to be hoped, will be remedied next year as, when well filled, these classes make an attractive display on parade. The saddle and harness pony classes were well represented in numbers and quality. Shorthorn Cattle showed an enormous increase, and the section contained animals of great merit. A section was introduced for milking Shorthorns and some attractive animals were exhibited, the section promising to become a very important one. The quality of the Herefords left little to be desired. The polled angus section has gradually shrunk, till this year the breed was represented by six exhibits only, from one owner. The Milch Cow test prize was again keenly competed for, and special provision was made to have the test satisfactorily carried out. Merino Sheep were again a small section, while longwools were fairly well represented. Shropshires were this year divided, an extra section having been made for sheep in their natural growth of fleece, and the total entry of Shrops was 130 against 66 last year. The swine classes were again well filled with exhibits of great merit. Poultry and Dogs both showed a considerable falling off in numbers. Carriages and buggies were somewhat short, but competition throughout was very keen. The dairy produce showed a falling off in entries, the deficiency being accounted for by the great drop in the number of export butter exhibits, the season having been unfavourable, and it being the wrong time of the year to expect a thoroughly representative display. In addition to the exhibits tabulated, there were 178 stands against 157 last year of machinery in motion, machinery, implements, and miscellaneous exhibits proving a most attractive and up-to-date collection of labour-saving appliances in connection with rural industries. The weather on the whole, although not wet, was cold, gusty and disagreeable, as it generally appears to be at this time of the year so that the show was not held under conditions inviting to the general public. The attendance was somewhat behind last year, but still ahead of any year previous to that, and the exhibition, taken all round was the fullest and most representative in the annals of the Society.

Flock Book.

In last year's report it was stated that the Central Committee of the Flock Book for British Breeds of sheep in Victoria had sent out circulars to all prominent breeders of Merino sheep in the different colonies, asking them to co-operate in bringing out a Merino Flock Book for Australia. The circulars were issued as follows:—Victoria 55, New South Wales 180, South Australia 20, Queensland 15, West Australia 7 and Tasmania 48, total 325. The number of replies received was Victoria '0, New South

Wales 0, South Australia 1, Tasmania 2, West Australia 1, total 14, or only a little over 4 per cent. It was therefore resolved to abandon the proposal.

The second volume of the Flock Book for British Breeds of sheep in Victoria is now in hand. It will amount to a very considerable volume, containing the annual returns for four years of the flocks registered in volume 1 for which returns have been furnished, together with the histories of the flocks passed by the Central Committee since the publication of the first volume, the whole of the matter is in the hands of the printers, the bulk of the proof has already been corrected, and the work will be completed and published in February.

Chamber of Agriculture.

This Institution which was established, at a representative conference called by this Society in September, 1899, as set forth in the report for that year, has now entered on its third year of operations. Its second annual report, recently issued, contains a record of good work done during the past year. This Society's representative on the Council of the Chamber is Mr. F. Peppin.

Improvement of Breed of Horses.

A circular was received from the Secretary for Agriculture enclosing proposals formulated by a conference with the object of raising the standard of the horse breeding industry. The Council did not approve of these proposals and appointed a special Committee to draw up recommendations in this connection. The following scheme has been recommended by the Society to the Department of Agriculture for the improvement of the breed of horses in the state.

(PREMIUMS FOR STALLIONS.)

1. That a sum of £2,000 be granted annually for premiums for Stallions.
2. That the State be divided into 10 districts.
3. That a Draught and a Thoroughbred Stallion for each district (or alternatively two Draughts) be allotted at £100 premium each.
4. That the Agricultural Societies in each of the 10 districts respectively be asked to give a minimum of £50 additional premium to each horse allotted to the district.

(REGISTRATION OF STALLIONS.)

5. That the Government appoint a Committee for each district to pass Stallions for registration; persons eligible for such Committee to be nominated by the Societies in each District.
6. That the Registration fee for each Stallion be £2 2s. and that each Sire be branded on the hoof with the registered brand (Registration every third year.)

(SELECTION OF STALLIONS.)

7. That a parade of Stallions (with prizes for horses open for selection) be held at some Central place to be agreed on by the 10 districts into which the State is divided and that the Society offering the largest premium have the first pick of the Sires, second largest, second pick and so on, mem: Prizes of £50, £30, £20, and certificates of highly commended and commended to be provided for Draught Horses and Thoroughbred Horses respectively, the Department of Agriculture to be asked to provide £100 of the prizes; the Society where the parade is held also to provide £100.

8. That registered Stallions be limited to 75 mares in one season the service fee to be £4 4s. each Mare.

(REGISTRATION OF MARES.)

9. That Mares to be served by premium stallions be passed by the same Committees that pass the Stallions, and be branded on the hoof as in the case of Sires, registration fee 10s. each mare (Registration every third year.)

That there be a penalty of £20 for any premium Stallion serving an unregistered mare.

Improvement in Cattle Breeding.

In August it was resolved that the Society, having dealt with horse breeding, should also call the attention of the Government to the cattle breeding industry; and a resolution was passed and forwarded to the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture, requesting him to deal with the cattle breeding industry in the State with a view to its improvement, and recommending that the Government purchase bulls of a superior type and give their services to village settlers and others at a specially low rate.

Address to Governor-General.

On the arrival of His Excellency Lord Hopetoun, Governor-General of Australia, the Council presented him with the following address which was engrossed and illuminated, and enclosed in a handsome morocco case.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE EARL OF HOPETOUN, GOVERNOR-GENERAL OF AUSTRALIA.

May it please your Excellency,

We, the President, Vice-President, and Members of the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, beg most humbly to approach your Excellency with heartfelt assurances of loyalty and devotion to His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward VII. In the year 1889 this Society had the honour of presenting Your Excellency with an address, and of welcoming you to this fair State, then the colony of Victoria, as its Governor and Commander-in-Chief, and it is with peculiar feelings of gratification that we now hail your Excellency's advent amongst us as Governor-General of the great Commonwealth of Australia.

We have every confidence that Your Excellency, in the discharge of your high duties, will not depart from your previous practice of assisting to promote the interests of our primary producing industries; for the deep love and respect, amounting to devotion, which Your Excellency evoked from all classes

of the community, when previously our Governor, augurs well for your recognition of every interest pertaining to the present office which Your Excellency is universally acknowledged to be so well fitted to fill and adorn.

Address to the State Governor.

The following engraved and illuminated address, enclosed in a handsome morocco case, was presented by the Society to His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, at Government House, Malvern:—

His Excellency expressed his pleasure at receiving the address, and replied to it in very gracious terms. Afterwards he asked a number of questions on Agricultural matters generally, the President affording His Excellency the information he required.

The Council.

At their first meeting in February the Council elected Mr. James Gibb president, and re-elected Messrs. A. McCracken, J. K. Joynt, and George Young vice-presidents. Messrs. E. H.

Cameron, M.L.A. and J. C. Stanford lost their seats through non-attendance, and were re-elected in July. In November, Mr. R. G. Stevenson resigned his seat on the Council. Mr. Stevenson was elected to the Council in 1895 in the room of Mr. R. Grice, resigned, and had since continued to hold office. A letter was written to him conveying the Council's thanks for his past services. The vacancy in the Council will be filled at the January meeting.

The Honorary Solicitor.

The Council report with regret the death on the 12th of June of the Hon. James McKean, the Society's Honorary Solicitor. Mr. McKean was appointed on the 12th September, 1882, so that he was Honorary Solicitor for nearly 19 years, and during that long period he was always ready and willing to give his valuable professional advice to the Society; in the affairs of which he took an enthusiastic interest. A wreath was sent to Mr. McKean's residence, and the Society was officially represented at his funeral. Also, at the succeeding meeting of Council, a resolution was unanimously passed ordering a letter of condolence to be written to his wife and family. Messrs. McKean and McKean, sons of the deceased, were elected in his room as Honorary Solicitors to the Society.

Acknowledgments.

The Council desire to express their warm thanks to His Excellency the Governor-General, and Her Excellency Lady Hopetoun, for their patronage. They also wish to record their indebtedness to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Sir John Madden, and Lady Madden, for their patronage of the show. They thank the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture for having granted champion prizes together with champion gold and silver medals for competitions. They thank Messrs. Davidson and Moore for their services in connection with designs for the show grounds. They cordially acknowledge the liberal aid of donors to the prize fund. They wish to record their thanks to the judges at the show for their valuable work, and the stewards for their active services. They acknowledge the valued co-operation of the press; and to all who have assisted them during the year, they return their best thanks.

GENERAL.

(DEATH OF THE QUEEN.)

On the death of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, the following cablegram was forwarded to the Secretary of State for the Colonies through His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

“The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria desire to convey an expression of their profound sorrow at the death of Her Majesty the Queen, and their condolence with the Members of the Royal Family.

The Council subsequently subscribed £50 to the Queen's Memorial Statue Fund.

(ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT M'KINLEY.)

At the Council meeting in September attention was called to the assassination of Mr. McKinley, the president of the United States of America, and pursuant to resolution of Council immediately after the meeting, the President, Vice-President, other members of the Council, and Secretary waited on Mr. Bray, the American Consul, and conveyed to him the sympathy of the Society with the United States, and also with Mrs. McKinley in her bereavement.

(DEATH OF DR. PLUMMER.)

During the year the Society has lost a prominent supporter in Dr. Andrew Plummer, of Port Melbourne and Wyabun Park, Gisborne. Dr. Plummer was President in 1882, and again from 1885 to 1890 inclusive, and was for many years one of the Trustees. On his retirement from the Council in 1896, he was elected an Honorary member of the Society in appreciation of his past services. Attention was called to Dr. Plummer's death at the meeting in September, and the Council ordered a letter of condolence to be written to his family.

(PROPOSED DUKE OF YORK SHOW.)

In last year's report it was stated that it had been proposed to hold a Show in Melbourne during the visit of His Royal Highness the Duke of Cornwall and York, and that the Council were awaiting a reply from the Minister of Agriculture, to their request that the Government would include the proposed Show in their official programme, and give a grant towards it. It was subsequently found that the programme could not conveniently be made to include this function, and the idea was abandoned.

(TROOPS AT SHOW GROUNDS.)

The Council placed the Show Grounds at the disposal of the Government free of charge for a mounted camp for troops on review during the Commonwealth celebrations in connection with the visit of their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York. The offer was gladly availed of, and the Society received the warm appreciation and thanks of the Celebrations Committee and of the Defence Department.

(AUSTRALIAN WINES TO DUKE OF YORK.)

From their accumulated stock of prize Australian wines in the Exhibition cellars the Council sent six cases of selected wines on board H.M.S. *Ophir*, as a present to His Royal Highness the Duke of Cornwall and York. A letter was received from Lord Crichton, A.D.C., thanking the Society for the kind present of Australian wine, which His Royal Highness much appreciated.

(THE JOURNAL.)

The agreement with the publishers of the Journal (Messrs. J. Twomey and Co) has been renewed on the advanced terms mentioned in last year's report, and the publication appears to be appreciated by the subscribers to the Society, who obtain the Journal free of charge.

(PRIZE CARD DESIGNS.)

In the course of the year the Council offered a premium for a new design for prize cards, which was won by Messrs Sands and McDougall. The new prize cards are much approved by exhibitors, and they have been copyrighted.

(THE SECRETARY AT BRISBANE.)

In March the Society received an invitation from the National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland to be officially represented at their annual exhibition in May, during the visit of their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York. The Secretary was appointed to represent the Society, and visited the Show. On his return he wrote a report to the Council, for which he received a vote of thanks. The report appears on page 116.

Finance.

The financial statement published herewith shows that the revenue for the year amounted to £7,309 15s. 5d., and the expenditure (including £2,074 9s. cash prizes) to £6,685 8s. 5d. The overdraft has been reduced by £569 14s. 9d., while during the year £1,531 9s. 4d. has been expended in permanent buildings and works on the Show Grounds. This latter sum is an investment, so that practically the working expenses—with £54 12s. 3d. carried forward—show a profit of £2,101 4s. 1d. The overdraft stands at £2,256 16s. 9d. as against £2,826 11s. 6d. last year.



RULES.



1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**
2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial Resources of the colony.
 - (1.) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
 - (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
 - (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications, scientific and other works, as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
 - (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
 - (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
 - (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit: and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
 - (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.
- (9.) By remunerating any person, if thought fit—who shall ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice—for any loss incurred by such experiments.
3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.
4. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the annual meeting next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, they shall at time of paying such subscription nominate one of the members of the Firm or Company who shall be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges attached to such membership, and may be elected to any office.
5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.
6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-two members, elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society as hereinafter provided, and also the Trustees, who shall be *ex-officio* members of the Council.
7. One-half of the Council, except the Trustees, shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.
8. The Trustees shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.
9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees) a President and three Vice-Presidents.
10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof.
11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members; nominations having been submitted at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they shall think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the second Tuesday in January following, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid and an Honorary Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies, to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

18. The annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send to all subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy at the election. Every such ballot paper shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance-sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society, but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A special meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

24. The privileges of Membership shall consist of a power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room and Lectures, and, with one lady, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds, and grand-stands at all times. And while the Society publishes a monthly journal, a copy shall be posted free to each member.

25. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

26. Any person being disqualified by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a member or to exhibit at this Society's Exhibitions until such disqualification be removed, provided such disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

27. Any dispute as to the interpretation of the rules, by-laws, regulations, or provisions shall be determined by the Council, whose decision shall be final.

28. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

BY-LAWS.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting, and the minutes of the preceding Preliminary General Meeting, shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Governor or Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. The President or his deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

3. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting, nominations to be made at the former meeting and elections to take place at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

4. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name or on the behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

5. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

6. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss, and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

7. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

8. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

9. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting, and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

10. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

11. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibition.

12. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

13. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

14. No money shall be drawn from the society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

15. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

16. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or other Members of the Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

17. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

18. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.

19. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1.) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2.) Business arising from minutes.
- (3.) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies.
- (4.) Finance Committee's Report.
- (5.) Correspondence.
- (6.) Postponed business.
- (7.) Motions.
- (8.) Notices of motions.

20. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.

21. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

22. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in February as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two Members of Committee to form a quorum.

23. The President shall be *ex-officio* a Member of all Committees.

24. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

25. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the first Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that Standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

THE SECRETARY.

26. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and of Committees, and shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

27. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's bankers. He shall have the charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

28. He shall have the custody of all books, models, and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

29. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

30. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

31. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

32. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting in the following form:—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the Meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

33. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

34. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

35. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

36. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, assisted by an honorary auditor, before whom a balance-sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.

## Secretary's Report, Brisbane Show.

*To the President and Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of  
Victoria.*

Gentlemen,—I have the honour to report that, pursuant to resolution of Council, I officially represented the society at the Exhibition of the National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland, held at Brisbane, from the 21st to 24th May—during the visit of their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York.

The above is a complete report, so that I might stop at this point, but as my trip was made under very exceptional circumstances, and was crowded with incident, I venture to submit some notes and reflections—premising that I have pruned down my matter so severely that when I shall have finished I can safely say the half has not been told.

The Show Grounds are close to the city, and are easy of access; electric trams running right to the gates. The site originally owned by the Society may be described as an irregular oblong—over thirty acres in extent. A number of years ago the Council borrowed £32,000, and put up a very large brick building, the cost of which, with interest, eventually ran up to £40,000; and as this load was too heavy to carry, they had to surrender the building, the Government securing it and converting it into a permanent museum, which is now cut off from the yards. In 1897 Mr. Joubert erected a building for his Exhibition, covering four acres of the ground at the end adjoining the museum—this area, with about 13 acres additional, forming the present yards. A deep gully ran transversely across the middle of the land. This gully has been filled up at considerable cost to form a pretty little well-grassed arena, where parades and events can be viewed—practically from all parts of the grounds, which gradually slope towards it from either end. The Show on the whole was not so big as those we are accustomed to in Melbourne, but was exceedingly interesting and instructive to a southerner. The draught horse section was weak, there being only one stallion that stood out, according to our standard; but, as an old Western Port friend of mine, who is now managing a big station in Queensland, said to me, “We don't want your hairy-legged cold country horses up here in this climate, we prefer the active Suffolk Punch type.” The light horses were good, and as animals were allowed to compete for different prizes, the entries were thus swelled and the classes strengthened. In the high jumping, Mr. T. Fitzgerald, of circus renown, had horses competing I had seen at the last Traralgon Show down in South Gippsland. Owing to the tick restrictions, the beef breeds of cattle were poorly represented—some good Herefords, however, being shown. Ayrshires, forming the strongest cattle section, comprised some animals of a superior type; while Jerseys were a good second, a few particularly nice females being paraded. There was a capital muster of fat cattle, all really ripe and prime. Sheep were not

numerous, the Vermont type of Merinos prevailing; and swine were also few in number. Dogs, poultry, pigeons, and canaries were well represented and comfortably housed in the annexes of the 4-acre structure. The show of machinery and implements was considerable, several Victorian firms having stands. In the roomy exhibition building, in addition to farm and dairy produce, there was a great industrial and educational display of fine arts, children's technical works, women's industry, and an artisans' section, all of which was admirable from the technical educational point of view. The Government farm exhibit was also a creditable feature. But the outstanding display was the collection of district exhibits, for which prizes of £100, £70, and £30 were offered. There were five entries in the section, all of which reflected infinite credit on those who procured and arranged the exhibits, and afforded visitors direct and impressive evidence of the wonderful and varied resources of Queensland. But after one had travelled over that magnificent belt of country—the Darling Downs, stretching from Warwick to Toowoomba, through which the Condamine flows, one was not surprised to see everything in the collections, from mammoth pumpkins and maize, to tapioca, tea, and coffee; and from rice, sugar-cane, pineapples, ginger and Jack fruit, to strawberries, rosella, sweet potatoes and yams. I desire to record a fact I have not seen elsewhere noted, that this was the first agricultural show in Australia at which an Heir Apparent to the British Throne was ever present; so that it must be regarded as an historic event. The Council made provision for the Duke and Duchess in a pavilion on vacant ground at the end of the grand stand, reserved seats for the special guests who attended the luncheon being placed immediately beside the Royal pavilion. The Duchess viewed the wood-chopping contest, the parades and events from the pavilion; but the Duke, somewhat to the surprise of the executive, went down into the ring, and showed that he was keenly interested in the stock, which were paraded for inspection. In this respect, however, he only follows the lead of his Royal father, who, as I had opportunity of personally observing when in England some years ago, takes a great interest in stock; for, being privileged to attend the fat stock show at Islington the day before the public were admitted, I remember the Prince of Wales—now our King—with the Duke of Portland, the President of the club, going all round, and critically inspecting the exhibits. The special show luncheon was held in recherché surroundings in a fernery pertaining to the Museum, the president of the society being in the chair. In the Queensland society, the president only acts on special occasions—the permanent Chairman of the Council taking the place corresponding to that of our president, and being the active head of the society, as shown by his having responded to the toast of the Association. The president, in proposing the toast of the Visitors, mentioned only two names—that of the Primate of Australia, and my own as your secretary—a marked compliment to our society. On Friday, the last day of the show, children were admitted free to the grounds, and they swarmed in in hundreds. I am not quite clear that this would work in our show, as Saturday, our last day, is a big day for the public; but the idea in the abstract is an excellent one, for it must necessarily serve to interest the rising generation in farming affairs, and attract them to country pursuits, thus helping to counteract the present youthful tendency to gravitate to towns and cities, which appears to be the universal characteristic of modern civilisation.

I think you will be pleased to learn that as your representative I was most cordially received. Mr. MacDonald, the chairman of the Council, whom I had met when he was down here in connection with the Commonwealth celebrations, showed me no end of kindness and courtesy, and all the members of Council to whom he was good enough to introduce me, seemed desirous of making me welcome. Mr. Swain, the secretary, had secured me accommodation in the Gresham, a first-class hotel—a great desideratum in an overcrowded town where beds were off, and shakedown at a premium; so that altogether I have very pleasing recollections of the picturesque city of Brisbane, nestling among hills on its magnificent river 380 yards wide, its streets at the time of my visit arrayed in a tropical luxuriance of palms, the most graceful and effective decoration imaginable.

#### AT SYDNEY.

Having been commissioned to visit the Show Grounds of the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales, I broke my return journey at Sydney, where I arrived on Monday in time to view the Royal Reception from the Society's office—and a right Royal reception it was—the long array of Lancers and Australian Horse, all well mounted, making a most effective display, and forming an escort fit for even our King's son. The following day I attended by invitation the official opening of the Young People's Industrial Exhibition on the show ground—the opening ceremony being performed by the Lieutenant-Governor, Sir Frederick Darley, a most distinguished-looking man. The extent of the exhibition may be gauged from the fact that there were over 20,000 entries of all manner of exhibits connected with the technical education of the young. This is a subject in which I take considerable interest, and it is rather strange that in another State I should have struck this exhibition promoted and organised by private enterprise, backed up by the Government; for you will remember that some three or four years ago, when it was proposed to form an association for the promotion of technical education here, I, being appointed a representative of this society, was elected to the Council, only to find that, after having with others spent laborious nights in organising an association, reading up, and formulating practical recommendations, the then Government, instead of fostering private enterprise and working through it, as seems to have been so effectively done in New South Wales, took such action as practically superseded the effort.

On the following day I again visited the grounds, and Mr. F. Webster, the secretary of the society, although a very busy man, was good enough to show me round, and also give me all the information I desired about turnstiles and telephone arrangements in the grounds, particulars of which it was my main mission to secure. The yards have been wonderfully improved since my last visit to the Sydney Show. I used to be a pretty good bushman, but have to confess that on entering the spacious grounds, it took me some time to pick up the lie of the country, such great changes have been wrought all round. The treatment meted out to this society by Parliament is vastly different from that which our society has of late years received from the State. An extensive building has been erected by the Government for produce and for the accommodation of live stock imported by the State; the society participates in the Government subsidy in common with provincial societies, and big special prizes are also given by the Government,

which co-operates with and acts through the society. From somewhat extensive reading on the subject, I gather that this is the practice adopted in all European countries where great agricultural advancement has taken place in recent years. Voluntary associations and institutions are stimulated and backed up by the State, instead of, as in Victoria, being jockeyed out or "suppressed," as effectively as was poor Bill the Lizard in "Alice in Wonderland." The result of the opposite policy to this is becoming apparent in the marvellous success of the Sydney Show, in which it is a factor; and it would pay our Government, and through them this State, and the people of the State, handsomely, to assist, and back up and work through, and with its leading agricultural organisation, thereby increasing the importance of the show, retaining and developing a great market centre, attracting visitors from other States, and extending the trade of the metropolis.


On my return from Sydney Show five years ago I was convinced not only of the advantage it would be to have the hill in the centre of our grounds cut down, but also of the practicability of the project. My present visit to Brisbane and Sydney has only served to confirm my previous judgment. The contour of our grounds, as a show ground, I regard as absolutely wrong; to take steps to make it right is therefore a commonsense procedure. This I believe can be effectively done, as I demonstrated to our architect, by reducing the area of the arena, paring off the top of the hill, and raising the ends, thus providing viewing accommodation for over 30,000 people, the number I saw in the Brisbane yards, where the natural conformation of the grounds enabled all to have a good view of the events in the central circle.

On Thursday, the day I left Sydney, I attended the official opening by the mayor, Sir James Graham, of the New South Wales Poultry, Pigeon, Canary and Dog Society's Show, in the Exhibition Building in Prince Alfred Park, where one of the best displays—particularly of poultry, pigeons and canaries I have yet seen was effectively staged and shown to great advantage in the large, well-ventilated and well-lighted Exhibition building. In the hon. secretary, Mr. A. J. Gray, I ran against a man whom I had met over here two or three years ago in connection with the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club exhibition, and who reminded me that I had shown him some little attention in taking him out to our grounds. Mr. Gray gave me a most hearty welcome, introduced me all round, and presented me with a specially bound copy of his Show Catalogue.

Permit me in conclusion, Mr. President and Gentlemen, to thank you most gratefully for having afforded me the opportunity of an exceedingly pleasant trip, and also for the almost inestimable boon of a respite from the routine of office.—Your most obedient servant,
