TO THE MEMBERS.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN—

Your Council has pleasure in presenting the following report of proceedings of the Society for the year 1914:—

### **Permanent Buildings and Works.**

During the past year another section of the adopted scheme for further improving the Grounds was carried out.

The chief works were the erection of two handsome brick pavilions, one for horses and the other for cattle. Both buildings were painted white throughout, lit by electric light, and provided with removable metal mangers. With slight modifications it is intended to adopt this type of building for all future accommodation required.

The ramp buildings commenced in 1913 were completed last year, and now provide a fine vantage point, from which the events in the arena can be seen.

The fat cattle were removed to the north-western corner of the Grounds, and the pens improved and increased in number.

To facilitate the work of the caterers, a number of alterations were carried out at the refreshment rooms, where coppers for boiling water were installed, an increased water service supplied, and storage tanks provided.

The District Exhibits Building was renovated, and at Show time presented a very fine appearance, particularly that portion in which the Women's Industries were displayed in some fine new glass cases. The floor of the stand over this building was covered with "Malthoid," to make the roof of the hall beneath thoroughly watertight.

The Sheep Judging rings were re-arranged and asphalted.

Nearly 200 shade trees were planted about the Grounds, and a number of tastefully arranged garden plots and lawns were laid out. These beauty spots were admired by all Show patrons.

The Trotting Track was regraded, the chains removed from the edge of the track, and the arena top-dressed, and at the open-

ing of the Show this section of the Grounds looked particularly fine.

New and thoroughly up-to-date turnstiles were installed at the main entrance gates. The water service was further improved by the extension of the 4in. water main towards the Swine Pavilion and the erection of additional pillar hydrants.

The Melbourne and Essendon City Councils asphalted the footpath in Epsom Road from the railway crossing to Grand National Avenue, and thus added greatly to the comfort of Show patrons travelling by tram.

During the year the sum of £10,862 2s. 9d. was expended in improvements and maintenance, whilst the total expenditure to date now reaches £100,450 18s. 5d.

During last Session, Parliament agreed to advance to the Society, by way of a loan, a sum of £50,000, the first instalment of £20,000 being made available during the year. Your Council is, therefore, now in a position to proceed more rapidly with the extensive scheme previously adopted for providing more up-to-date accommodation for Show patrons and exhibits.

On Tuesday, 22nd September, during Show week, a fire broke out in the Grandstand, and, before it could be extinguished, it demolished not only that structure, but the Industrial Hall and twelve buildings belonging to exhibitors.

The proposed works for 1915 include not only the replacing of the Grandstand and the Industrial Hall by substantial and practically fire-proof structures, but further improving the accommodation for stock and the erection of a large luncheon room fitted with every convenience.

It is also proposed to roof over the "Chirnside" Stand, which was just completed last year.

Your Council was very pleased to find that the sum of £1000 had been placed on the Estimates by the Government as a first instalment towards the erection of a suitable Government building on the Show Grounds.

### **The Exhibition.**

The Annual Exhibition was held from 21st to 26th September. The Prize Schedule was again carefully revised, and an increased amount of prize money offered for competition.

Notwithstanding the unfavourable season, the Society secured a record entry for its 1914 Show, when 10,296 entries were received, as against last year's record of 9844. This is the first occasion on which any Show in the Southern Hemisphere has exceeded a 10,000 entry.

Prior to the opening of the Show, our Empire was compelled to take part in a gigantic war unparalleled in the history of the world; a large portion of the Commonwealth was suffer-

ing from the effects of a severe drought; during Show Week the weather conditions could not well have been more unpleasant; an unusually large number of counter attractions were provided during the week; the fire which broke out on the official opening day robbed the Show of much of its interest and cast a gloom over the whole proceedings; it was, therefore, no surprise to your Council to find that there was a marked falling off in attendances and in the amount of gate money received.

The gate money, including £151 5s. 6d. from the Grandstands, amounted to only £3454 9s. 3d., as compared with last year's record of £7312 15s. 9d., included in this amount being £898 8s. 3d. taken at the Grandstands.

The attendance also fell from 184,637 in 1913 to 99,807 at last Show.

Last year, for the first time, your Council invited Judges to send in reports on their sections, and extensive extracts from them were published as an addendum to the 1913 Annual Report.

The Judges' remarks were read with so much interest that it has been decided to continue this practice in the future.

The outstanding feature of the stock exhibits was the remarkably even quality as compared with previous years.

Fewer draught horses were shown, but a greater number of light horses, and in all classes the general standard of quality was exceedingly high.

The arena events were well filled, and were again watched with interest by the public during the whole course of the Show.

Though there was a slight falling off in the number of dairy cattle shown, the beef cattle were largely in excess of any recent Show.

Notwithstanding that restrictions by way of registration were placed upon sheep and swine exhibits, there was a highly

satisfactory entry. Sheep were slightly fewer in numbers, whilst a small increase was shown in the number of swine.

The poultry entry was again over 1000, whilst all other sections had a somewhat similar entry to last year, one highly gratifying increase being in the fruit section, where double last year's entries were received.

The machinery stands and non-competitive exhibits were again amongst the most attractive features of the Show, and the standholders are year by year heartily co-operating in the movement to improve the appearance of the Grounds.

### **Draught Horse Stud Book of Australia.**

During the year Volume VIII. of the Draught Horse Stud Book of Australia was published. It contains the pedigrees of 118 stallions and 199 mares which had been registered since the publication of Volume VII., and also 130 colts and 193 fillies, progeny of mares registered in Volume VIII. and previous volumes.

Photographs of the Champion Stallion and the Champion Mare at the 1913 Show were reproduced in the volume.

Your Council again desires to express its thanks to Mr. Ewen T. Campbell, of Kirk's Bazaar, for having revised and extended the pedigrees, as in previous volumes.

The Committee appointed to conduct the Stud Book recommended that the qualifications for registration of Clydesdales and Shires be raised. This recommendation was adopted by your Council, a desire being expressed that from time to time in the near future a further raising of the standard should take place.

It is with extreme satisfaction that your Council reports that the Agricultural Show Council of Tasmania resolved to adopt the Draught Horse Stud Book of Australia as the standard for that State, instead of commencing a Stud Book of their own. There is also every probability of the Agricultural Societies of New South Wales adopting a similar course.

In order to indicate the opinion that is held in the Old World of your Society's Annual Show, it might be mentioned that the Shire Horse Society of England decided to offer, in successive years, gold cups for the best Shire Stallion and the best Shire Mare at the leading Shows of the five States on the mainland of Australia, commencing with the Melbourne Show in 1913. Instead of carrying out its original intention, the Shire Horse Society again offered the cups for competition at the 1914 Melbourne Show.

### **Flock Book.**

The Sixth Volume of the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia was published during the year, and it

contains the histories and annual returns of all flocks regarded as registered at the time of publication.

This volume contained a revised history of every flock from the time of its foundation, and also the pedigrees of 597 rams that were individually registered in accordance with the newly-adopted rules.

Towards the end of the year the Flock Book Committee found itself in a position to recommend to Council that the Flock Book of the Australian Longwool Sheepbreeders' Association of New South Wales be officially recognised. This recommendation was adopted by your Council, and in future transfer certificates from the New South Wales Association will be accepted for registration in the Victorian Book.

### **Shorthorn Herd Book.**

The work of compiling the first volume of the Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia is now nearing completion, and it is hoped that within a few months the Committee will be in a position to publish the initial volume.

### **Ayrshire Herd Book.**

The Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia is now preparing for the publication of Volume IX., and it has been decided that in future volumes there will be no appendix included for the recording of pedigrees of animals whose pedigrees are not up to the standard required for ordinary registration.

At the instance of the Ayrshire Society, your Council resolved not to permit any but registered animals being exhibited in the Ayrshire Section at future Shows.

This condition was imposed at the last Show, with satisfactory results.

### **Chamber of Agriculture.**

The Twelfth Annual Convention of the Chamber of Agriculture was held at Maryborough on 30th June and 1st and 2nd July, 1914.

It was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor, Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, K.C.M.G., and was attended by the Hon. the Prime Minister and other leading politicians, as well as a large and representative gathering of delegates from all parts of the State.

The delegates from your Society reported that the tone of the debates was of a higher standard than in previous years, and that the innovation of circulating, some time before the

Convention, the papers that were listed for discussion was highly satisfactory.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded His Worship the Mayor of Maryborough and to the President and Members of Committee of the local Agricultural Society for the courtesies extended to your Society's representatives during their stay in Maryborough.

### **Horse Parade and Sale.**

The first Horse Parade and Sale conducted by the Society since its establishment at the Flemington Show Grounds took place from 20th to 25th July, 1914.

Nearly 300 horses were offered for sale, but, owing to the exceptionally dry season, the prices at which the animals were sold were not altogether satisfactory.

Notwithstanding that the rebate commission on the sales was fixed at only  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent., the fixture was conducted at a profit to the Society of £56 6s. 11d.

Your Council has decided to continue holding these Annual Parades at about the same time in future years.

### **Judging at Royal Show.**

Single judging was adopted at last Show, and on the whole gave satisfaction.

For the first time a system of judging according to a pre-arranged time-table was tried, and proved so successful that it will, with slight modifications, be adopted at future Shows. Stock were precluded from being admitted to the arena until required in the judging rings, and consequently much confusion was obviated and the work of adjudication was carried out much more expeditiously.

### **Extension of Show Grounds.**

During the year your Council purchased three allotments of land on the southern side of Watson's Terrace at a cost of £445 5s., and, being anxious to connect these newly-acquired blocks with the Show Grounds, found it necessary to purchase Mr. Quinn's property, which comprised four allotments of land on the southern side and eleven allotments on the northern side of Watson's Terrace, for a sum of £3350.

Your Council, not having any use for the land on the northern side of Watson's Terrace, resold that portion for a sum of £2,300.

The Society's property now extends from the old boundary near the Swine Pavilion to the end of Watson's Terrace at a point directly opposite the Flemington Racecourse Railway Platform.

### **Prizes for Appliances for Handling Grain in Bulk.**

Through the liberality of Mr. A. E. T. Payne, who donated the prize money, prizes were offered for the most effective and economical methods and appliances for handling wheat in bulk from the time of its delivery from the harvester, stripper, or thresher, till its arrival at a country railway station elevator, including storage on the farm. Consideration was given to the utilisation of existing farming implements as far as practicable.

Twelve entries were received, and some highly ingenious appliances were placed before the Judges, who awarded First and Second Prizes only, on account of the fact that in their opinion no others worthy of a prize complied with all the conditions of the competition.

### **The Council.**

As nominations for election at the Annual Meeting were not in excess of the vacancies on the Council there was no poll, and the whole of the members whose seats had become vacant by effluxion of time were declared re-elected.

In February last Mr. Guy Peppin tendered his resignation, owing to his removal to New South Wales, and on the 12th May Mr. J. Lang was elected in his place.

Owing to continued ill-health, Mr. David Mitchell severed his connection with the Council in July last, and on 11th August Mr. A. McMillan was elected to the seat rendered vacant by Mr. Mitchell's retirement.

In December Mr. W. B. Cumming tendered his resignation owing to his inability to attend the monthly meetings with regularity, and, in accordance with By-Law No. 15, the vacancy will be filled at the Annual Meeting to be held in February, 1915.

### **The Journal.**

The "Australian Farm and Home," with which is incorporated this Society's official journal, is still being conducted in a manner that is highly satisfactory to your Council. Careful and accurate reports of the monthly meetings of Council were published during the year, and the journal also contains many well-written and instructive articles on subjects of interest to rural producers and others.

It was through the medium of this journal that the papers in connection with the last Convention of the Chamber of Agriculture were published and distributed.

### Acknowledgments.

Your Council desires to express its appreciation of the interest His Excellency the Governor-General and Lady Munro-Ferguson displayed in the Society's Show.

They desire to thank His Excellency the Governor and Lady Stanley for the keen interest they manifested in all the operations of the Society, and to also thank His Excellency for officially opening the Show.

To the Government of Victoria they are also indebted for having granted the Society a loan for the purpose of improving the accommodation on the Show Grounds, for continuing the grant of the annual subsidy, and for again offering the Champion Medals, which are so highly valued by exhibitors.

They desire to acknowledge their appreciation of the liberality of the donors to the prize fund, particularly of the Shire Horse Society of England for again donating two handsome gold cups, valued at £50 each; and of those exhibitors who generously returned the whole or portion of their prize winnings at the recent Show.

They desire to thank the Judges and Stewards for again carrying out their duties in a highly satisfactory manner.

To the Press they also accord their most sincere thanks for the valuable assistance rendered in bringing prominently before the public particulars of the Society's operations, and to all others who assisted in furthering the interests of the Society they extend their warmest thanks.

### Finance.

On reference to the Financial Statement, it will be seen that the receipts totalled £20,658 9s. 11d., but, as a sum of £6200 received in settlement of the insurance claim in respect to the destruction of the Grandstand and Industrial Pavilion is included in this amount, the actual revenue for the year was only £14,458 9s. 11d., being £5036 1s. 3d. less than in 1913, mainly owing to the large falling off in Show receipts. The expenditure (including £4974 11s. 4d. in cash prizes, £11,654 9s. 9d. in buildings and maintenance, and £3795 5s. in the purchase of land) amounted to £28,469 1s. 4d., the overdraft being increased from £11,525 16s. 10d. to £19,336 8s. 3d. Deducting from the gross receipts the amount of the insurance claim, and taking the expenditure in permanent improvements, and the purchase of land as assets, the working expenses show a profit on the year's transactions of £1439 3s. 4d., as against last year's record profit of £7505 13s. 5d.



# RULES.

1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**
2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Stock Raising and Industrial Resources of the State—
  - (1.) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
  - (2.) By holding meetings for the purpose of popularising rural life and disseminating knowledge of improved methods and new ideas in relation thereto.
  - (3.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies, and collecting information for the furtherance of the objects of the Society.
  - (4.) By promoting the discovery, investigation, and introduction of improved kinds of agricultural implements and machinery, the better equipment and construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
  - (5.) By promoting the discovery, investigation, and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
  - (6.) By collecting and distributing information on all subjects concerned with the objects of the Society, including the preparation and publication of Flock Books, Herd Books, Stud Books, Pamphlets, Essays, and Papers, and by the establishment and maintenance of a Library and Reading Room for the use of Members.
  - (7.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants and taking measures to encourage the prevention or eradication of such diseases.
  - (8.) By remunerating any person for original research work leading to the advancement of the objects of the Society.
  - (9.) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.
3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members. The term "Member" shall (unless the context otherwise requires) be deemed to include a Life Member, Life Governor, and Governor.

4. Subject to the provisions of Rule 27, every applicant for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company such firm or company shall nominate in writing one of the members thereof, who shall on the receipt by the Secretary of such nomination, be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges of membership, and be bound by the Rules, By-Laws, and Regulations of the Society, and may be elected to any office.

5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of ten annual subscriptions.

6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-three Members (elected from amongst the Members of the Society as hereinafter provided), and the Trustees, who shall be *ex officio* Members of the Council.

7. One-third of the Council (the Trustees excepted) shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

8. Land acquired, or to be acquired, for the Society shall be held by and be vested in the Trustees for the time being of the Society for and on behalf of the Society. The Trustees shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due course at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society. Any new Trustee or Trustees shall be appointed at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society, or in accordance with Rule 14. The Trustees shall deal with the lands of the Society as directed by resolution of the Council of the Society (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence), and they shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of the Society's property.

9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees), a President and three Vice-Presidents.

10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof, and for these purposes the Members of the Society for the time being shall be deemed to have constituted the Council of the Society for the time being their agents.

11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members; nominations therefor having been submitted at a previous meeting, and a notice of such nominations having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The financial year of the Society shall end on the 31st day of December of each year, to which day the accounts of the Society shall be balanced. At the monthly meeting of the Council, to be held in January in each year, the Council shall prepare a list of Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies in the Council. Nominations (other than those made by the Council) of Members who may be candidates for such vacancies must be in the hands of the Secretary prior to such meeting. Every nomination other than those made by the Council shall be signed by at least two Members other than the candidate, and shall have endorsed thereon the consent of such candidate duly signed by him.

18. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council, two paid Auditors appointed, and any other business transacted of which due notice in writing shall have been given before the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of the second Tuesday in January immediately preceding.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his Deputy shall send to all Members of the Society a ballot-paper, numbered, and initialled by the President or his Deputy, or the Secretary, with the names of all the candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Member desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot-paper containing more or less than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President (who shall be Returning Officer) or his Deputy at the election. Every such ballot-paper shall be returned before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot-papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Fourteen days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every Member of the Society.

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of the Council next after the Annual Meeting the Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President or on the requisition of twenty Members of the Society, of which meeting there must be given ten clear days' notice stating the business to be transacted, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

24. At the Annual Meeting twenty Members, including Members of Council, or at a Special General Meeting, ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council, shall form a quorum.

25. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of Members of Council, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, and Lectures, and, with two ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds, and grand-stands (subject to such regulations as the Council may make) on production of the member's ticket for the current year. And while the Society issues a monthly Journal a copy shall be posted free to every Member.

26. Any Member neglecting or refusing to comply with these Rules, or any or either of them, or any lawful directions or requirements by the Council made in pursuance or under the authority thereof, or being guilty either before or after becoming a Member of the Society of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be summoned before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may also be disqualified from exhibiting and may be disallowed from again becoming a Member during the pleasure of the Council. A Member expelled under this Rule shall forfeit all right in and claim upon the Society and its property.

27. Any person being expelled from Membership or disqualified from exhibiting, riding, or competing by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a Member or to exhibit, ride, or compete at this Society's Exhibitions until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

28. The Council shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules, and of the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder; and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Society or the administration of its affairs, whether provided for by these Rules or by the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder or otherwise, shall be final and binding on the Members.

29. Every Member shall communicate from time to time to the Secretary his address; and all notices required by these Rules to be sent or given to Members shall be deemed to have been duly sent or given if posted or sent to such address.

30. Every person becoming a Member of the Society thereby undertakes, if at any time required to do so by the Council, to give evidence by statutory declaration or otherwise of any facts within his knowledge or information relating to the subject matter of any inquiry by the Council.


31. Every person becoming a Member of the Society shall thereby undertake to indemnify and shall with every other Member thereof be bound to indemnify the Council, and the individual Members thereof, any Committee of the Council and any Members of any such Committee, against any action or damages in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in accordance with these Rules, or the By-laws or Regulations made thereunder, during the continuance of his Membership.

32. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting.

# BY-LAWS.



## GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Notice of the Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the Members of Council at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for by at least three members present. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given in accordance with Rule 18.

2. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his Deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

## THE PRESIDENT.

3. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Members, and shall take the chair when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may decide.

## THE COUNCIL.

4. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

5. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss, and decide by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

7. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

8. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

9. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council or of any Committee shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some person present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

10. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants at the Society's Exhibitions.

11. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees when they shall think proper.

12. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

13. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

14. If any Member of Council, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

15. The Secretary shall notify to the Council any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or other members of the Council, at the meeting of the Council at which or next after such vacancy occurred, and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice, provided that if any such vacancy occur after the ordinary monthly Council meeting in November such vacancy shall not be filled except at the next Annual Meeting.

16. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by the senior Vice-President then present; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose

as their Chairman by a majority of votes. (The senior Vice-President shall be deemed to mean the Vice-President who has been a member of Council for the greatest number of years in the aggregate.)

17. The quorum of a monthly or special meeting of Council shall be five.

18. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1.) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2.) Business arising from minutes.
- (3.) Election of officers, and nominations for vacancies.
- (4.) Committee's Reports.
- (5.) Motions.
- (6.) Correspondence.
- (7.) Postponed business.
- (8.) General business.
- (9.) Notices of motions.

19. All minutes and reports read to and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.

20. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January or at some adjournment thereof.

#### COMMITTEES.

21. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the monthly Council meeting in February as they think fit, and such Committees shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two members of Committee to form a quorum.

22. The President shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees.

23. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

24. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the first Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

#### THE SECRETARY.

25. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and of Committees, and shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep copies of all letters on the business of the Society.

26. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, he shall be responsible for all moneys received, paying such sums into the Society's bank, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Com-

mittee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's bank. He shall have the charge of the expenditure for petty cash.

27. He shall have the custody of all books and property of the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

28. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he may think of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

29. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

30. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Member of the Society.

### FINANCE.

31. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet before the ordinary Council meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each monthly meeting, as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

32. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

33. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

34. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

35. The accounts of the Society shall be audited as may be required by the Council by two professional accountants to whom a balance-sheet shall be submitted by the Secretary immediately after the close of the financial year, and such, when audited, shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.





# Extracts from Judges' Reports on Exhibits at Royal Show, 1914.

---

## SHIRES.

Mr. Charles Pilgrim, Marnoo East.

The entries were numerically small, but the few that came before me, particularly in the Aged Sections, both male and female, were exceedingly good and of first-class quality.

## DRAUGHT HORSES (Females).

Mr. S. J. Lynn, Fairleigh, Orbost.

As this was the first year in which your Society had separate sections for Shires, Clydesdales, and Draughts, it is not possible to make a comparison with last year's exhibits. The brood mares were a very good average lot, nothing standing out very much above the others, and none which could be classed as inferior.

In fillies there were some very good exhibits, the First Prize filly in the Two-year-old Produce Stakes being a very taking filly. The yearlings were numerous, and a very creditable lot. I think the class for Draughts should be encouraged, as, though a very fine bred Clydesdale may be most suitable for the hilly country and Scotland, or a heavy Shire for the Fens of Lincolnshire, neither may be the best type for Australia.

## TROTTERS.

Mr. R. C. Hannah, Carrick Lodge, Donald.

I think this last Show was the third one at which I had the honour to judge Trotters, and could not help remarking the great improvement, especially in Stallions. At this season of the year those who own good mares do not like sending them from home. This accounts for the mares not being so good as the horses. Trotting has made wonderful strides the last ten years, and is still growing in public favour, all over Australia. The inclination unfortunately is towards pacers; the latter come to their speed earlier, but are not to be compared to a pure gaited trotter, either for riding or driving.

With one exception, all the animals that competed for your speed prizes at last Show were pacers; therefore, my suggestion is that next year the Society set aside one event for trotters only. At all the leading trotting meetings in America special events for trotters are provided, and the pure gaited horse is greatly increasing in popularity in that country.

### WOODCHOPPING AND SHEAF TOSSING.

Mr. E. W. Robinson, "Mayfair," 274 Inkerman-street, East St. Kilda.

In giving my report on Sections below for which I acted as Handicapper and Judge, I wish to state that the Sheaf Tossing caused some excitement when towards the finish W. Peck, of Henty, New South Wales, threw the sheaf 45 feet high, which is a record.

The Standing Block Woodchopping contest brought together some of the best axemen of Victoria, Tasmania, New South Wales, and New Zealand.

There was a good and close finish in the Teams' Match.

The Underhand Chop brought out thirty-one competitors, the heats and final being very close. The winner hailed from New Zealand.

The Tree Felling was an item of great interest, and gained great applause. The competitors of this event are the leading paling-splitters of Victoria.

The competition for the Novice Standing Block Chop was very keen and brought good entries, and was cut in record time for a Novice contest.

### SHORTHORNS.

Mr. George Butler, Fanning River, Ranswood Junction, Queensland.

Beef Shorthorns, on the whole, were a very fine lot of cattle. The Champion Bull is a very fine beast, but in the Aged Class of Bulls the entries of high class bulls were small for the Royal Show. In the Cows the winner was a very fine cow. The runners-up in this class were also good.

The Two-year-old Bull Class was very good; the winner in this class is the right kind for stud use in Queensland. The Yearling Classes in both bulls and heifers were very strong. It was very difficult to pick the first three heifers. I never saw better. I consider the younger cattle a credit to any Show in the world.

## HEREFORDS.

Mr. George Pagan, Mentone, Gilgandra, New South Wales.

Amongst the Herefords I judged, there were some very good cattle, quite up to the standard of previous years; but there seems to be a falling off in competition, and notably there were no exhibits from other States, although there are good herds of Herefords in New South Wales and South Australia.

I would suggest as a means to draw competition that a much higher prize be given for the Aged Bull and Aged Cow, leaving the other sections much the same as at present.

## MILKING SHORTHORNS.

Mr. J. T. Cole, Darbalara Estate, Gundagai, New South Wales.

The Milking Shorthorn Section was a good one, the strong feature being the keen competition in the young stock, and the excellent character of the exhibits in these Classes. This was very noticeable in the Bull Classes in particular, the yearling and 2-year-olds being very much superior to the aged bulls in quality and "dairy" character. The Champion and Reserve Champion Bulls are both promising youngsters that should develop into good serviceable sires.

The Female Classes were good throughout, and the competition was very creditable. It is evident that considerable attention and care have been devoted to the breeding of the best of these animals for a number of years. The Champion Cow is very typical of the breed and has an excellent outline, with good capacious udder, well held up, and well developed both before and behind. She is somewhat lacking at present in depth of body, but will probably develop in that respect with age, and when fully furnished will be hard to beat in her Class.

Some excellent dairy cows were brought before me in the Red Polled Section, showing robust constitution, good quality, and "dairy" points, as well as the characteristics of the breed.

The younger cows and heifers were not so good, being faulty in formation of the udder, as well as in capacity.

The bulls were not very high class.

In the South Devon and Holsteins Sections competition was slack, and the exhibits did not call for any special comment.

## AYRSHIRES.

Mr. C. J. Cowan, Haydowns, Enfield, Oamaru, New Zealand.

I was very favourably impressed with the Ayrshires on the whole, especially looking from a dairying stand-point. They were mostly of good, hardy constitution. The cows gave every appearance of being heavy milkers, having also a good length of teat. The formation of the udder could in many of the exhibits be improved upon. There was also a lacking of that style and character in some of the exhibits, which makes the aristocratic Ayrshire so much admired. The placed animals, however, were not lacking in these qualities, and in most classes stood out prominently from the others, making the Judge's work much easier in consequence.

## JERSEYS.

Mr. A. L. Manning, Warragaburra, Bega, New South Wales.

Having judged in the Jersey Section a great number of times in the past 20 years, I can say that the cattle in this section shows a great improvement on any previous year; especially as to the more even quality of the exhibits.

In years gone by there were frequently a few high-class exhibits and a number of cattle that were unworthy of being exhibited at the Victorian Royal Agricultural Society's Show. But the dairy qualities of the cattle now being exhibited show a still more marked improvement as compared with past years. One does not now see mere "park ornaments" on exhibition. Breeders generally have come to recognise that if a Jersey cow has not the essential dairy characteristics, she is of no use to the practical farmers of Australia.

## DAIRY CATTLE.

Mr. T. W. Lindsay, Kembla Park, Unanderra, N.S.W.

I must say I was very pleased with most of the exhibits placed before me in the Dairy Cattle Section.

Thirteen beautiful cows paraded for the Grand Champion Ribbon, not one of which was unworthy of carrying the coveted ribbon; and although the Champion and Reserve Champion cows were of different breeds, they both carried similar dairy points, beautiful quarters, udders and teats, and stood out as model dairy cows. Some of the cows in the same class were also very fine specimens, but were not quite in such good form

at the time. Several cows in the young classes were very promising, especially in the Two-year-old Class in Milk. The exhibits (with few exceptions) in the other classes were of nice type, and on the whole very creditable to their breeders. However, I think a little more attention might be given to the teats when breeding for dairying purposes.

### FAT CATTLE.

Mr. H. W. Wallder, Flemington.

The cattle shown in this section were an exceptionally fine lot, and in some cases it was a very difficult matter to judge between them.

In my opinion, this class of stock should be judged from a butcher's point of view, but, as the public generally do not understand this, they are apt to disagree with the judge's decision and want to know why the prizes are not given to the biggest oxen. For my own part I would very much like to see a Special Prize given for the fattest single ox in the Show.

### SHROPSHIRES.

Mr. Andrew E. Mansell, Genappe, Bridgewater, Tasmania.

I hereby give a brief report on the Shropshire Sheep, which I had the honour to judge at the last Royal Show in Melbourne. All the classes, although not containing numerous entries, had on the whole good representative animals of the breed. The Aged Ram Classes, in which one cannot expect large entries, had nevertheless some very valuable animals. The Classes under 18 Months, were not only well filled, but took considerable time to judge, as some of the sheep ran the winners very close. The First Prize Young Ram was a very symmetrical sheep, having good character and wool. He also took the Champion Ram Prize; the aged ram well earning Reserve Champion. The Young Ewe Classes were especially good, and hard to divide. The first prize in the young class also secured Champion in the ewe classes—she was full of quality and showed breeding, and had beautiful wool.

The rams recently shorn were in some respects an interesting class, enabling the public to see the natural form, although when a ram is only just shorn he is too unfurnished to judge his merits as a sire.

On account of the bad season, the sheep were not in high condition, but notwithstanding I was pleased to find their backs well covered with good firm flesh. This is most important to the

breed, for, if this quality can be maintained and improved, the Shropshires will keep up the reputation they have secured for themselves as the sheep to look for when raising fat lambs and mutton sheep.

### LINCOLN RAMS.

Mr. B. Aves, Riby Grove, Upper Manilla, N.S.W.

The Lincoln Rams were well up to the standard we have in Australia at the present time. I have seen better sheep in Sydney a few years ago. In the two first classes there were two or three very good rams, a good many of them with large frames, but their wool was not the sort we want out here. We want a wool that will suit the dry parts, that is, sheep carrying plenty of yolk with a nice free lock not too wide. If the lock is too wide you will soon get the wool too short, and that is what we must try and arrest. The wool gets too harsh as soon as the sheep get a bit short of feed.

The Rams under 18 Months ought to have been a lot better, but when you get a sheep carrying over twelve months' wool they will go back in spite of you. The wool gets straight and loses all its characteristics, and it makes it very difficult for the man that has to judge. I think it would be a good idea if you tried a class for rams under eighteen months, shorn about seven months before the Show; also a similar class for ewes. You could throw out the pens of two and make the competition for single sheep.

I have been single judging during the last 25 years, but I am always in favour of two. If two good men are together you can talk over things. I also think you would secure more satisfaction.

### LINCOLN EWES.

Mr. R. A. D. Hood, Merrang, Hexham.

The ewes this year were a very good lot, well up to the standard of previous years. The competition right through being very keen, a number of breeders showing sheep well grown and carrying fleeces of well bred style of Lincoln wool, good heads, and, with few exceptions, good on their points and bellies. I think the young sheep were a more even, well-bred lot than I have seen for the last few years, and think most breeders are on the right track in going for a good heavy style of Lincoln wool with plenty of character.

## ENGLISH LEICESTERS.

Mr. Frank E. Clarke, Bolinda Vale, Lancefield Junction.

In complying with your request to make a report on sheep judged by me at the recent Show, I have to state that I found the English Leicesters much more uniform in type than any I have seen at former Shows, although there are still some sheep being shown that leave a great deal to be desired in that respect. The competition in some of the classes was very close, and took me some considerable time to come to a decision. With a few exceptions the quality of the sheep was very good, carcase very good, and most of them were carrying a fleece of nice bright wool of the right quality.

## BORDER LEICESTERS.

Mr. A. S. Brunskill, Dalkeith, Wagga Wagga, N.S.W.

With reference to the Border Leicesters which I judged at your recent Royal Show, I am pleased to have the opportunity of making a few comments on same.

The sheep were of a good even class. Many of them stood well on their feet, carrying a good frame covered with a good class of wool showing plenty of character, also having a good lookout with typical Border Leicester heads.

The Champion Ram stood exceptionally well on his feet, was well sprung in ribs and very evenly woolled all over with wool which was true to type. He was undoubtedly a very fine animal. Altogether it was a pleasure to judge in such a well represented class of sheep.

## ROMNEY MARSH.

Mr. J. B. Palmer, Lenham, Cranbrook, W.A.

I was somewhat disappointed to have so little to do in judging the Romneys, there being so few entries in all the classes; but I was pleased to see that with one or two exceptions the sheep were of rare merit.

I would suggest that in future all ewes of 2-years-old and over should be shown with their lambs, as it is very difficult to judge between a ewe with a big lamb (which has taken off a lot of bloom) and a barren ewe. Barren ewes should not be encouraged.

Could not something be done to encourage more entries, such as offering prizes to men with a limited acreage or who have never won prizes?

## FAT SHEEP.

Mr. A. Stevens, Clifton Street, Richmond.

I have much pleasure in reporting on the section I adjudicated in. The quality of the sheep was not up to the standard of previous years. This was more noticeable in the Merinos than in the Crossbreds. The export lambs, especially the first and second prize pens, were exceptionally good quality, and as near perfect as regard weights and quality as it is possible to have them, in fact equal to Canterbury first-grade lambs. One pen of lambs entered in the export class also as local trade lambs were exceptional weights and of good quality; they were not prize-takers on account of the weight.

## BERKSHIRE AND BRITISH LARGE BLACK PIGS.

Mr. Luke Williams, Claremont, Moonah, Tasmania.

Taken as a whole there was a very fine exhibition of Berkshires, totalling 110 exhibits of this breed. As a rule the sows were somewhat superior to the boars in quality.

In Boars 15 Months Old or Over there were some high class animals who were past their prime for competing in a show yard of such excellence as the Royal.

The prize-winners were well marked, large framed, typical pigs. Those that were not placed were by no means disgraced, as they were all of considerable merit, but were competing against much younger animals. The First Prize and also the Reserve Champion went to a typical Berkshire, who should make a good sire.

Boars Under 15 Months and Over 6 Months Old.—This was the weakest class in the section for quality, there being a tendency to plainness and coarseness that is undesirable in young sires.

Boars 6 Months Old or Under.—This was the strongest class in the section, 28 competed, the bulk of them being especially good animals. The First Prize boar also won the Championship. At the time of judging he was 5 months and 29 days old, and was a remarkably well grown and developed animal, well marked, and with a good head, he was quite large enough for any baconer, his greatest fault was a slight drooping in the hind quarters.

While I do not approve of giving Champion Prizes to very young animals as a rule, I had no hesitation in awarding it to that exhibit, as he was sufficiently well-grown for slaughter, having already arrived at commercial maturity, thus there was no need to ask oneself "what he will be like next year?"

As a sire he should have a tendency to produce early maturing stock. Since judging him I have carefully perused his pedigree, and am pleased to find that he is descended from the very best strains of Berkshires in Australia. He realised 36 guineas at the Show sale (top price of the sale for any breed), and is to remain in Victoria.

Sow Over 12 Months Old (suckling her own litter).—There were six very choice sows in this class, but the litters, although good, were not up to the standard of previous years. The prize-winners were all superior sows, the First Prize sow had a litter of 10.

Sows 15 Months Old or Over.—This class was high grade as a whole, containing some splendid sows, the winners being worthy of note.

Sows Under 15 Months and Over 6 Months Old.—There were 18 in this class, all pigs of superior quality, fit to compete at any show. The prize-winners were all true to type and would be hard to excel. The First Prize winner also secured the Championship, and was almost a perfect specimen of a true Berkshire. She obtained 99 points out of a possible 100, the one point lost was owing to a slight thickness in the shoulders. Speaking afterwards to a well-known breeder and judge, he stated that after a careful examination of this sow he was unable to find a fault in her, and on my referring to her shoulders he admitted it might be a fault, but as it gave width and space for heart and lungs he would be inclined to overlook it.

The day following the judging I turned the sow into the lane and invited the breeders, exhibitors, and visitors present to say what faults she had; only two could find any, and they said it was a slight thickness in the shoulders, thus bearing out my judgment. It is pleasing to note that she is from the best strains of Berkshires in Australia. At the Show sale this sow realised 25 guineas, being purchased by a South Australian breeder. This was the highest price obtained for any sow at the sale.

Sow, 6 Months Old or Under.—Twenty-three competed in this class, mostly very choice pigs. The prize-winners are a credit to their breeders, and will probably be heard of again in the Show yards.

I might mention that I used the following system of judging by points, totalling 100 for the 12 main points, adopted as the "Standard of Excellence" by the Berkshire Society of Australia:—

The allotment of the Scale of Points given is my own, having built it up after years of study as a breeder of Berkshires, and having applied it to the breeding of my pigs. The results in the show rings and at the sales have fully convinced me of its value and correctness.

At first some of the exhibitors at your Show thought that I was rather slow in the judging, but when I had finished they were good enough to admit that every pig was subjected to a complete examination.

Of course, when judging by points there are certain *essentials* such as a *complete animal of typical colour*, etc. The points being highest when nearest to the ideal. Take for instance, "colour." The typical Berkshire *must have* white on face, feet, and tip of tail, the body being covered with fine black hair. Some breeders who have not the "ideal" in their mind would say, if you allow five points for colour, then a black face, foot or tail (six places in all which should have white) should only lose one point each? This would be incorrect reasoning, as, being *essentials*, each animal *must have* them to be eligible to compete; the greatest number of points being given to the exhibit

whose markings are nearest to the *ideal*. If that is not done, we would soon have a distinct breed of "Australian Black Pigs." Again, 12 points are allowed for head, and 12 points for feet, but no breeder would expect the Champion Sow to have lost only 12 points because she was minus her head, or the like amount for the loss of her feet, though she would still have 88 points and be well in advance of some others in regard to points secured. No one would think of judging a pig at a show without head, feet, or legs. I might add that the whole of the prizes were awarded to typical Berkshires, and the whole of the breeders that I spoke to afterwards expressed themselves satisfied with the awards and my reasons for giving them, after I had shown them that the prize-winners were nearer to the ideal than any of the others.

British Large Blacks.—No boars were shown in this class, but there were four full grown sows, true to type, and of massive proportions. The First Prize sow was a magnificent specimen of the kind (closely followed by the Second Prize one). She was also awarded the Champion Prize for Sow, any age, any other breed than Berkshire and Yorkshire; the other competitor was a Tamworth sow.

Mr. D. Stewart, Judge of Yorkshires and Tamworths, took part with me in judging for this latter Championship. We did not consider the Tamworth boar exhibited was worthy of being awarded a "Champion Prize of Australia," as we felt that such a prize should be awarded to a first-class animal only. This the boar in question could lay no claim to be.

#### MEDITERRANEAN VARIETIES OF POULTRY.

Mr. W. Mansfield, 22 Maitland Street, Geelong West.

The entries in these varieties was a show in itself numerically and otherwise, the total number on view being 316; the very fine accommodation and liberal prize money being responsible for this, as at that period many of the best specimens are in the breeding pens, and breeders are very reluctant to disturb them; but the liberal prize money and the honour of a win at the Royal, which is so much desired by all fanciers, proved irresistible, and resulted in the very fine entry.

I was much impressed with the attention given to the exhibits by the Society's stewards and attendants; it was all that could be desired.

The one improvement that I would like to see is single tiers. Double decking makes it hard for Judges and others to get a proper view of the birds in the top tiers, and specimens,

laced, or with fine markings cannot be handled expeditiously or with ease, and mistakes are more likely to occur.

For evenness of quality and type the White Leghorns took pride of place, there being the splendid entry of 50 birds.

Thirty-one Brown Leghorns were benched, but they lost in evenness of type and feather as compared with the White Leghorns.

Six Duckwing Leghorns were on view. These were a very moderate lot, and required a lot of improvement, especially in colour. If established on sound lines, I am of opinion that they would become popular.

Rose Comb Leghorns were rather disappointing, the comb on most of the specimens (of which twelve were penned) was very coarse and loose, and tail carriage high. A neat head and good tail carriage are two of the essential points in Leghorns, and it is disappointing to find the Rose-comb Brown Leghorns, at the present time, so poor in these qualities.

The birds shown in the class for any Other Colour Leghorn were a very moderate lot. The best of them were a couple of Black Leghorn Hens, which were very nice specimens, the balance of the seventeen exhibits being very poor.

Twenty-nine Minorcas were penned. This beautiful and profitable variety was somewhat disappointing on account of the condition of many of the exhibits and want of uniformity in type.

Twenty Andalusians were on view, and amongst them were some very fine typical well laced specimens. There is a marked improvement in the Andalusian to-day, breeders reverting back to the old type.

Only four Anconas were penned, and they were a very moderate lot.

Eighteen entries of Black Spanish were benched, and amongst them was a wonderful specimen, showing what can be achieved by the energetic and enthusiastic fancier or breeder.

There were thirty-two trios in the Farmer's Trios class, and amongst them were birds fit for competition in the open classes, many of the single birds in all of the classes being worth the schedule price of the trio.

## DUCKS, TURKEYS, AND GEESE.

Mr. J. Pickstock, 513 Albion-street, Brunswick.

The visitors to the Royal Show, whether fanciers, utility men, or the general public, must have been considerably impressed on entering the buildings set apart for the exhibits of Ducks, Turkeys, and Geese. The arrangement was good, both for light and

comfort, and the birds were well looked after both for food and water, and there could no complaint even from the most exacting fancier. In point of numbers and quality, especially in all the Duck Classes, it was the finest I have ever seen in Australia, especially when you take into consideration the lateness of the season, when the feather is not of the best.

In Pekins the first and second prize-winners in both classes were birds that were truly typical, having beautiful colour and carriage, nice head, and clean in beak, full, rounded breast, with not the slightest sign of a keel, and was consistent with the Waterfowl Club Standard, and not of the cross American type that was so much admired here some few years ago.

Rouens made a fine display, and there were handsome birds in both sexes. The beautiful colours in the drake's plumage, coupled with their great size, must appeal to the general public.

Indian Runners, both in Fawns and Whites, were both good in quantity and excellent in quality. Carrying that soda water bottle type that a true fancier looks for, with that Penguin carriage, with that fine wedge head, slim neck, combined with perfect feather markings, they look smart and business-like, which they are as egg machines, nothing in the feathered world has ever excelled them for producing eggs with the least amount of trouble.

White Runners made a fine display.

Geese was a small class. There was one grand specimen of Toulouse, having great size and carriage.

There were some good useful birds put together and well mated in the Farmer's Trios.

Turkeys were not numerous, but were splendid in quality. There was not much to choose between the first, second, and third, one having the slight advantage in size, whereas in colour and markings there was not much to choose.

## EXPORT POULTRY.

Mr. R. Hart, Government Produce Offices, Melbourne.

The chicken classes were well represented, and the quality was the best that has ever come under my notice at the Show.

The competition in the Turkey classes was also very good; the three placed pens weighed over 60 lbs. the pair.

The class for Ducks, which were of the Pekin and Aylesbury Cross, was not large, but the quality was good, and the birds weighed about 14 lbs. a pair. They were most suitable

for export, as they were white feathered birds and mature in 10 weeks, and command top prices on the London markets.

The Export Classes at your Show are very much admired by the public, and is a great object lesson to the farmers, showing the importance of topping off their birds before sending to market so as to command top prices.

1914 SPORTING DOGS (Other than Terriers).

Mr. John Clark, 47 Queen Street, Melbourne.

The quality of these dogs was very similar to that of last year, in some instances the same dogs winning on both occasions.

The Russian Wolf Hounds, Grey Hounds, and English Setters were good.

In Irish Setters a really fine specimen was shown.

The Gordon Setters were fair, but not rugged enough; while the Pointers could be considerably improved by the introduction of fresh blood.

Three fine imported specimens of Retrievers were shown. Two of these were curly and one smooth coated, and it is to be hoped that this extremely useful class of dog will receive more attention from sportsmen and fanciers.

The display of Field and Cocker Spaniels was exceptionally good. A recent importation was shown. He is a good bodied one, but was shown altogether out of condition.

## TERRIERS.

Mr. A. S. McMichael, Rose Street, Armadale.

The rank and file now in nearly all classes are of much higher merit than 20 years ago, when I first judged at a Melbourne Show. It is, however, an open question in individual instances.

To find such a splendid building and such extensive classes inspires me, if not exceeding my duties, to congratulate your Society on such an advancement in the classes I am so interested in.

The winner in the Smooth Fox Terrier Dog Class was of nice size, and full of vim and terrier character and style, which he is likely to impress on his progeny.

Wire Haired Dogs, Open, was won by a dog with a nice crisp coat, so rarely met with in the Rough Coated Classes.

In the Skye Terriers the winners were of more than ordinary merit, whilst the Scotch Terriers were excellent specimens.

The Silky Terriers were an even lot. The Airedales were of good size and type, and even in quality. Bull Terriers were not so good as they have been in the past, still some fair dogs were shown. Blue and Tan Australian Terriers Classes show no improvement in type or character, being somewhat inferior to some of the earlier dogs when classes were first instituted for these terriers in shows. It is some years since I have seen two such good terriers as the winners in the Black and Tan Terrier Class. They were handsome and useful, and the breed deserves more support than falls to its lot.

### HARNESS AND SADDLERY.

Mr. James Oaten, 184 Queen Street, Melbourne.

Considering there was but one exhibitor my labours were very light. The exhibit was in every way a most worthy one from every point of view, quality of material, workmanship, style and general get up, and adaptability for general use, which I consider an important point in exhibition goods.

### FARM PRODUCE.

Mr. W. H. McFarlane, 535 Collins Street, Melbourne.

I have pleasure in reporting that the bulk of the exhibits were high class, and competition very keen in several classes.

I would suggest that Wheaten, Oaten, and Lucerne Hay weight be reduced to 1 cwt., as 2 cwt. of bundled sheaves especially are too bulky to handle when conveyed by rail. The majority of Interstate shows schedule 1 cwt. I also note that Pumpkins, table and field, draw large entries, notably at Brisbane.

### WHEAT.

Mr. A. E. V. Richardson, Department of Agriculture, Melbourne.

The system adopted by your Society last year of judging wheats on points according to their milling and baking qualities has had the effect of directing attention to the importance of quality in wheat. In every class there is a marked improvement in the standard of quality of the exhibits this year as compared



The second prize was awarded to entry No. 4176, also Comeback, weighing 67.4 lbs. per bushel, giving flour of high strength and gluten content.

The other entries, 4177, 4178, were also Comebacks, and it is interesting to compare these two samples with Nos. 4179 and 4176. The latter are harder, more translucent and of considerably higher strength and gluten content, the effect most probably of different soil and climatic conditions.

**High Strength Red Wheats.**—The prize was awarded to entry No. 4743, a magnificent sample of Cedar weighing 68½ lbs. per bushel. This sample gave a high yield of flour of excellent quality. The strength of the flour was the same as the winning wheat in the High Strength White Class.

Second prize was awarded to entry No. 4174, with a total of 88 points, with an attractive sample of Cedar.

**Macaroni Wheats.**—First prize was awarded to entry 4172, with a bright well-grown sample of Indian Runner. As might be expected from Macaroni wheats the bushel weight was rather low (65.7), but the gluten content of the flour (13.6 per cent.) was the highest of all the exhibits.

Second prize was awarded to entry 4171, with a bright attractive sample of Velvet Dun. The bushel weight was 66.6, and the sample very attractive, but in flour yield, gluten content and strength, was inferior to No. 4172.

**Low Strength Wheats.**—Pride of place was awarded to entry No. 4184, with a fine attractive sample of Bunyip wheat. The weight per bushel was 67.6 lbs., and the wheat was easy to mill, giving a flour of excellent colour, fair strength and good glutent content.

Second prize is awarded to entry No. 4181, with a good sample of Yandilla King.

Third prize was awarded to entry 4182, with a good sample of King's Early. The weight per bushel was exceptionally high (69.1 lbs.), the sample plump and uniform, the flour of high strength for its class, and the loaf rose well in the oven.

**Champion Prize.**—The Champion Prize is awarded to entry 4179, "Comeback," the winning exhibit in the High Strength White section, with a total of 93 points.

The standard of quality of the exhibits this year is markedly superior to that of 1913, and competitors are to be congratulated on the general excellence of the exhibits.

I wish to mention that most of the exhibits which were awarded prizes were of a superior class. At the same time I would state that some exhibitors did not display good judgment in the selection of their parcels, as tubers very uneven in size, varying from 6 oz. to 32 oz., were to be found in the same bag. Others were not true to name, and more objectionable still was the fact that inferior stuff was found in the bottoms of some of the bags. In consequence of this I would suggest that all exhibits be displayed in the open on benches. This would add greatly to the appearance of the exhibition. It would facilitate the work of judging and ensure a more even class all round.

### STATE SCHOOL COMPETITIONS.

Mr. J. H. Refshauge, Agricultural High School, Ballarat.

The exhibits of fodder wheats, oats, and barleys were quite up to the standard of excellence of previous years, and in most cases these were prepared for exhibition in a better manner. Millets, Sorghums, and Maize were not so good as on previous occasions, although a few of the exhibits were excellent. It is a most difficult matter to judge wheat, oats, and barley fodders in both dry and green states. I would suggest that none but dried specimens should be exhibited. If it is desired to have green specimens, they should form a class by themselves. Some very good exhibits of grain were staged. In the wheats the number of competitors was not great. I daresay this was due to the fact that a classification into Macaroni, High Strength, and Low Strength wheats was made for the first time at the Show.

The exhibits in maize were disappointing. This might be accounted for, as in the case of fodder maize, by the fact that the growing season for maize was throughout Victoria almost rainless.

The potatoes exhibited were much better than at any previous Show. That this should be so is somewhat puzzling, as, on the whole, throughout Victoria the season was unsuited to their growth.

### STATE SCHOOL COMPETITIONS.

Mr. J. P. McLennan, Agricultural High School, Warragul.

The sections dealt with by me were Forage and Roots, Grasses and Clovers, Flax, and Honey. The new arrangement is a great improvement on the old, both from the educational point of view and that of the ease of judging. There was a

large number of entries, and the general character of the exhibits was distinctly good. Some poor ones, however, were shown. There will probably be a smaller entry next year, but more uniformly good. I would suggest the omission of Cow Cabbage (Kohl Rabi, Kale, etc.) and Rape from the schedule.

## AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOLS.

Mr. H. Pye, Dookie.

This season's exhibits were not, in my opinion, quite as good as last year. The exhibits in the sub-sections should be kept together, and each sub-section distinctly marked with a printed card, as I found in a few instances some difficulty in finding the exhibits belonging to a subsection owing to them being scattered.

More descriptive matter should be available about the cereals, and a small bundle of wheat, barley, oats, etc., in the straw should be placed adjacent to the jars of grain, in order that it may be noted whether or not the grain was true to name. The conditions under which the cereals were grown and the rainfall would, if given, increase the educational value of the exhibits. A few photographs of incidents in the training of the pupils would arouse more public interest, and add to the attractiveness of the exhibits which, generally speaking, lacked design in arrangement.

## CHEESE.

Mr. G. C. Sawers, Department of Agriculture, Melbourne.

The competition in this class was very keen, particularly in the Export class.

The average quality was far in advance of that shown in previous years, which made the task of judging very difficult.

The principal faults amongst those who were unsuccessful were unclean flavours in some, in others excessive acid or weak body, indicating carelessness on the part of the makers.

The colour all through was good, and the cheese well finished, with the exception of one or two lots, which showed cracks on the outside.

The flavour and make of the exhibit which gained the Champion Award were nearly perfect, and a standard to which all makers should endeavour to attain. I am of the opinion that had the other exhibitors paid more attention to the use of a proper starter and to mellowing the curd longer before putting into the hoops, it would have materially increased their chances of success.

## BUTTER.

## BACON, HAMS, AND LARD.

Mr. Thomas Main, Parklea, via Blacktown, N.S.W.

I was very pleased with the exhibits I had the honour of judging. I was told before leaving Sydney that my task would be very light compared with the Sydney Show, but I found such was not the case: competition was much keener, your class of pigs, cure and get-up, is superior to our Sydney curers.

I strongly advocate point judging, which means that each curer can see where he has failed.

In Bacon the competition was very keen, but the winner in Hams stood out on his own. The worst exhibit was from New South Wales, and one exhibit from Queensland was very much off.

## APICULTURE.

Mr. T. Bolton, Lambruk, Victoria.

In reference to Section 55 and the Apicultural exhibits which I judged at the late Show, I beg to say that the display was a very small one compared with what it ought to be, considering the number of extensive and up-to-date bee-farms there are now in Victoria. This may be said of previous years also, but following on the past poor honey season doubtless had something to do with its small size on this occasion. I have given this matter some consideration. There are several reasons, to my mind, that hinder an expansion of interest in the "Royal's" bee sections, and these I will try and explain.

First, the necessary tendency of the Schedule as it stands to restrict exhibiting ventures to practically one part of the State, such as the Grampians-Pyrenees and Glenelg region, where the Red Gum, Yellow and Grey Box furnish a paler and superior honey, i.e., superior from a trade point of view. It takes even more care, skill and patience to raise a crop of honey in the Central and North-East, in Gippsland, or in the coastal plains, and because his honey is of a darker kind, the bee-man in those parts knows it is useless to compete against exhibits from the first-named regions. The remedy, then, is to give a "class" to different districts. This applies principally to the matter of

extracted honey, but it does apply also to comb and to bees-wax to some extent. The matter of receiving, at your end, railed beekeepers' exhibits, staging them, and at the close re-packing and returning them is one that perplexes the average man in the bush. In so small a matter he cannot afford to journey to town every year. He knows no one probably that he can ask to do it, or in whose care he has sufficient confidence; and he knows that competing against him will be a city firm, who know all the ins and outs of how to make a display. Though this matter is mentioned in the Prize Schedule, there are only a few bee-men who have this. I suggest that a letter to the Secretary of Victorian Apiarist's Association, to be published in the "Australian Bee Journal," and a reminder next July issue would be a good means of making this announcement. The judge should be free to take small samples of winning entries for future use and comparison.

### ONE WOMAN'S WORK (FOODS).

Mrs. E. M. Hill, Kilgour-street, Geelong.

Every exhibitor showed one or more exhibits in the fruit and kitchen garden section, but a very few went into it fully. A poor attempt at showing much in the way of "Fruits" was made, more time having been spent on the products from the kitchen garden.

On the whole, the foods in the exhibits were very good.

Not one exhibitor showed a full exhibit of drinks, therefore I would say the standard was low.

The class for honey and its uses was worked up by few of the exhibitors, but some showed very creditable work.

In the open competition, the exhibits of foods showed great care. In many cases the results were so good that it made judging very difficult.

In classes for mincemeat and lemon cheese the exhibits were particularly good.

There was room for improvement in the class for bread.

In preserved fruits, jams and jellies, the quality of work was very good, but particularly in preserved fruits.

### APPLIANCES FOR HANDLING GRAIN IN BULK.

Mr. Robert Stanley, Merri-street, Northcote.

Many progressive men, while conceding all that is claimed for bulk handling of wheat, pointed to one weak link in the

chain of arguments which to them seemed to preclude the application of the system—the handling of loose grain in the field, its storage on the farm, and its carting to the railway station.

At the time when the Royal Commission was investigating the question generally, this gap seemed to many thoughtful minds a barrier to the complete adoption of bulk handling of wheat without the use of bags in an appreciable measure in connection with the handling of the grain until it was delivered at the railway station.

The question consequently had resolved itself into a discussion as to what proportion of the number of bags ordinarily used would be required to bridge this break in the system, and what economies and benefits would eventually accrue to wheat producers from the establishment of the bulk system, and the retaining of a part of the existing method of bag handling in connection with local handling.

Feeling that this barrier to the adoption of complete bulk handling was possible of solution, Mr. A. E. T. Payne donated £100 towards a competition for the most effective and economical methods and appliances for handling wheat in bulk, from the time of delivery from the harvester, stripper or thresher till its arrival at a country railway station elevator (including storage on the farm). Consideration was to be given to the utilisation of existing farming implements as far as practicable.

There were 12 models of appliances submitted, and of these all were rejected with the exception of two. The others it was realised lacked the necessary simplicity, and, in instances, it was feared that in operation the appliances might be fraught with danger.

Being the appliance that most nearly complied with the conditions, and as it possessed, in addition, the merits of simplicity, practicability and economy both in cost and operation, the model which won the first place may be described as if applied to a farm of between 400 and 500 acres, on which about 150 acres is cultivated, with a average yield of five bags to the acre.

At a convenient point of the harvesting field, the farm waggon is drawn up. Placed on it is a large box, strongly constructed, and of a size capable of holding from 30 to 50 bags of grain according to the farmer's requirements. Immediately at the rear of the waggon is another box of the same capacity as the harvester box, slightly resting on runners leading

to the waggon box. When the harvester has gone round a strip of wheat it is stopped at the small or elevating box resting on the ground, and the wheat is at once discharged into it from the harvester box. The driver thereupon seizes a rope which is attached to the waggon end of the elevator box, and runs thence through a pulley attached to the rear of the waggon. At the end of the rope is a specially constructed hook, which is then placed in a ring fastened to the back of the harvester. The driver moves the harvester on its proper course, and the box is drawn up the runners leading to the waggon box, into which it tilts its contents, and at the same time the hook attached to the harvester is automatically released. The small or elevator box at once falls back into position for the next delivery (the model exhibited is to be modified so as to steady the box back to the ground, and so avoid bumping). For the field work the appliance would not involve any very great additional expenditure. It utilises the existing farming implements to the fullest extent, and the necessary power is supplied by the team of horses, and involves no manual power at all. Its construction is simple, and its durability is unquestionable. It seemed to us to have removed in a practicable way the disability of utilising bags during harvesting. Of course no bags are required at all.

At luncheon time, if the homestead were at a handy distance, the horses could be hitched to the filled waggon, which would be drawn to a granary constructed on the silo system. The grain would be lifted by a small elevator worked by an oil engine. Once in the silo the wheat would be in perfect storage, and would be free from damage by the weather, vermin or birds.

When the grain is to be carted to the station, the box waggon is placed under a chute, and the box rapidly filled by gravitation until the grain is emptied to about eight or ten feet level, after which it would be gravitated into the elevator box and lifted into the waggon in the same way as in the paddock. At the railway station the grain would be unloaded quickly by the station elevator. The silo granary would be a permanent structure, and useful for other purposes, such as the storage of oats for farm feed after the wheat had been delivered.

The cost will be well within the capacity of the ordinary farmer, and when the wastage of bags, grain, etc., under the bag system is considered, there should be no question as to which is the cheaper plan.

APPLIANCES FOR HANDLING GRAIN IN BULK.

Mr. R. W. Hill, South Geelong.

I beg to state that the whole of the appliances for handling grain in bulk had merits in their particular line. Of the number, two were selected by the judges for first and second prizes, as coming within the award; the former was not too expensive, well within the capability of most farmers—it was simple, reliable, and not of many mechanical parts. The mode of lifting the grain to the waggon and the silo was by a travelling turnover bucket on slides, easy of application and removal, the power to lift the weight being derived from the horses that work the stripper or waggon.

The second prize was more elaborate, and very ingenious, showing great capabilities of the different parts, yet thoroughly in accord with the utilisation of the category of things used on a farm, though more expensive and more complicated than the first prize, yet, if put into the field in working condition, would prove successful. The rest of the exhibits were well worthy and commendable to those who so creditably laboured to bring forward something, even if not capable of gaining a prize, yet a footstep on the ladder of fame.
