

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1897:

PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

No very extensive works have been carried out during the year. Before the Show a stone wall was erected on the hunting course, to replace a rather objectionable fence, and a number of minor alterations and improvements were effected in the cattle stalls, the grand stand, and elsewhere about the grounds. Since the Exhibition the Draught Horse Court has been formed and metalled at a cost of £69 10s. In the last report it was stated that the question of providing accommodation in one building for all sheep exhibits, had been considered. This year the matter has been further dealt with, plans have been adopted, and it has been decided to call for tenders in February next for a building to be erected in the south west corner of the yard, the half only of which will be put up in the first year. Plans have also been adopted, and tenders are to be called at the same time for seats in front of the grand stand, and for gravelling outside the horse boxes facing the trotting track, and the cattle stalls above the pig pens. The cost of buildings and improvements during the year has been £188 os. 3d., bringing the total expenditure on buildings and works up to £31,590 13s.

THE EXHIBITION.

The annual Exhibition was held on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th September. The prize schedule was again carefully revised and improved by the addition of several new classes, and by the prize money in a few principal classes being increased. The entries numbered 4264, this being the record number for the Society. The amount received for admissions, including £290 12s. 6d. at the grand stand, reached £2290 11s., exceeding the previous year's total by £164 8s. The entry fees and ground rent amounted to £739 5s. 6d., against £751 1s. last year. Dealing with the exhibits in the order of the schedule, the draught horses (108 entries) showed an increase of 23 from last year, and the section was altogether a very fine one. Thoroughbreds (9 entries) were two in advance of the previous year, and the quality reached a higher standard. Trotters and roadsters (30 entries) were better represented than last year, while in Clevelands only one stallion was shown. Breeding ponies (19 entries) were three behind last year. In heavy-weight hunters there were 20 entries—an increase of twelve from the previous year—making a splendid field of horses. Light-weight hunters (12 entries) were thirteen short of last year, juvenile hunters (6 entries), three behind the previous year, and ladies' hunters (7 entries) were 4 behind, while in the high jumping contest, there were 13 entries, or twelve less than last year's record number. Hackneys (18 entries) were extra good and ladies' hackneys (7 entries) were about the usual standard. Cavalry and mounted riflemen's horses (7 entries), fell short in numbers of what was expected. Carriage and buggy horses, &c. (34 entries) were rather better represented as were also saddle and harness ponies (32 entries). Short-horn cattle (94 entries), fell back to the number exhibited two years ago and Herefords (22 entries) were rather in advance of last year. Polled Angus (13 entries) were again short of the previous year's entry. Neither Red Polls nor Devons were shown. Ayrshires (122 entries), showed an increase of thirty and Jerseys (96 entries) were twenty-one ahead, so that these dairy breeds were very strong sections. Holsteins were represented by 4 entries but Kerries and Dexter-Kerries were not shown. There were 11 dairy cows and 12 entries for milch cow, subject to test. There were 13 entries of fat cattle, an advance on the previous year, and only two heifers remained in for the cattle Derbies. In Merino sheep (23 entries) the competition fell off. Lincolns (84 entries) were twenty-seven in advance of last year, while Leicesters (19 entries) were thirteen behind. Border Leicesters (36 entries) were four less,

while Romsey Marsh (36 entries), showed an increase of thirty-two entries. Southdowns (23 entries) were seven behind the previous year and no Hampshire Downs were shown, while Shropshires (33 entries), showed an advance of ten entries and 4 Cotswolds were penned. Fat sheep (30 entries) again made a good class although not so strong as last year's. Poultry (464 entries) showed an increase of fifty, while in dogs (171 entries) there was a falling off of thirty-six exhibits. Carriages and buggies (156 entries) were nine in advance of last year and a very creditable section, while there were 20 exhibits of harness and saddlery. Farm produce (40 entries) was short of last year, and although some excellent exhibits were shown, the time of the year seems against getting together an extensive display. Dairy produce (127 entries) was just over last year's entry and this section particularly in the hams and bacon classes, formed a very attractive feature of the show. In wines there were 165 entries, twenty-nine short of last year, but more individual exhibitors competed, probably through extra classes having been provided for growers. Preserves, dried fruits, &c. (11 entries) were poorly represented. There were four exhibits of artificial manures. 138 stands of machinery (in motion), implements and miscellaneous exhibits were shown and made the most extensive and substantial display that has been put together on the grounds in this department. Unfortunately the weather on the day before the show opened, as well as on the opening day, was very wet and stormy, but it cleared on Thursday and was fine for the remainder of the week. The attendance increased as the show went on, the last days more than making up the previous shortage, so that it is satisfactory to report, that on the whole more money was received for admissions than in the previous year. As may be gathered from what has gone before, there was a very full entry in all the principal sections, so that as a really representative Agricultural Exhibition, the Show was regarded as the best the Society has yet held.

QUARTERLY DINNERS.

The quarterly dinners have been continued during the present year, the fourth of the series having been held at Scott's Hotel on the evening of the 18th February, the date of the Society's annual meeting. The chair was occupied by Mr. John MacKiehan, a member of the Society, and Mr. Frederick Peppin, a past president, read a paper on "Federation and Australian Agriculture." The fifth quarterly dinner was held on the evening of the 11th May, Mr. Robert Clarke, a member

of Council being in the chair. The paper was read by Mr. MacKiehan, the subject being "Victorian Wine and Wine Growing." The sixth quarterly dinner was held on the evening of the 3rd September (the Friday in show week), at the Vienna Cafe. Mr. Thomas Skene, President, occupied the chair and the subject for the evening was "Shows, and their Educational value," the opening speaker being Mr. James Gibb, a Vice-President and Trustee. The seventh dinner was held at the Vienna Cafe on the evening of the 8th November. The chair was taken by Mr. John Hurst, a member of Council, and the paper was read by Mr. Robert Clarke on "Disease in Stock." Much the same remarks as were made in last report might again be applied to these dinners. Excellent papers have been read and good discussions have followed, but the attendances have fallen short of the expectations of the promoters.

FLOCK BOOK.

In the last report it was stated that the Council had adopted the recommendation of a Special Committee that the Society should undertake the compilation and publication of a Flock Book for British breeds of sheep in Victoria. A Central Committee of importers and breeders, was appointed and rules and forms of entry were adopted and sent out to all known breeders. The Committee has been engaged during the year dealing with the entries, which have been highly satisfactory, and the entry fees will provide ample funds for the work. The Secretary of the Society has been appointed Editor of the Flock Book, which is now in the hands of the printer, and will probably be published in February.

THE SHEEPBREEDERS' ASSOCIATION

(PROPOSED AMALGAMATION).

A Committee from the Council of this Society waited on the Committee of the Australian Sheepbreeders' Association in March and submitted certain proposals for amalgamation. These proposals were favourably entertained by the Committee, and were referred to the Annual Meeting of the Association in September, when a letter was received from the secretary stating that the members could "not see their way to the proposal." This is the second time the Sheepbreeders' Association has been approached on somewhat similar lines, the last approach having been made in 1884 with a like result to the present.

FIELD TRIAL.

At the July meeting of the Council, Mr. Gibb suggested that after the Show a field trial of implements should be held. A Committee was appointed to deal with the matter, and they recommended that a trial on somewhat similar lines to the one held in 1894, be carried out on the 18th September. Afterwards, on account of the time of the year being found unsuitable the Committee recommended that the trial be postponed to some convenient date previous to next show, and the recommendation was adopted by the Council.

JUBILEE DONATION.

On the occasion of the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, the Council felt that the Society should mark the event, and they resolved—instead of presenting an address, as was done at the Jubilee—to donate £50 to the Queen's Memorial Fever Hospital.

THE LATE SIR WILLIAM CLARKE.

During the year the Society has lost by death a valued supporter in Sir William Clarke, Bart. Sir William was a Life Governor of the Society and from 1876 to 1881 held the office of a Vice-President. The late Baronet was a liberal donor to the prize fund and a prominent exhibitor at the annual shows. A letter of condolence was written to his widow and the Society was officially represented at his funeral.

RULES AND BY-LAWS.

At the last annual meeting the whole matter of the revision of the rules and by-laws of the Society was referred to a Committee. During the year this Committee has very fully revised the rules and By-laws, and these in their amended form will be submitted for adoption at the annual meeting.

SHOW EXTENSION AND PARADES OF STOCK.

Considerable dissatisfaction was expressed by the stewards at last show with regard to the parades of stock. During the year a special committee has fully dealt with this matter and has made different arrangements for next show. The Exhibition will be open for five days beginning on Tuesday

30th August and continuing to Saturday, 3rd September, one day longer than last year. The parades of stock and sales of exhibits have been altered and arranged in a way that it is hoped will result satisfactorily alike to the management of the Society and the general public.

THE JOURNAL.

The agreement with Messrs. J. Twomey and Co. the publishers of the *Farmer and Grazier*, with which the Journal of the Society is incorporated, has been renewed again for 12 months, and the Journal is being carried on very satisfactorily. The proprietors deserve credit for their enterprise in publishing in full the papers read at the Quarterly Dinners and the discussions thereon, together with photographs of those who contribute the papers.

THE LIBRARY.

At one of the Quarterly Dinners, a member of the Society stated that the veterinary works in the library were not up to date. As it is over a quarter of a century since the library was established, this is doubtless the case, and it will continue to be so unless new works are purchased or donated. Considerable additions have been made from time to time to the works in other departments of the library, and the Council would like members of the Society to avail themselves more frequently of the privilege of reference to these works.

THE COUNCIL.

It is satisfactory to report that for the first time for several years no change whatever has occurred in the Council during the year. Two or three members have been temporarily granted leave of absence, but the personnel of the Council has remained the same throughout the term.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council wish to record their indebtedness to His Excellency the Governor and Lady Brassey for their kind patronage of the Society's show. They thank the Government for again proclaiming a holiday on the official opening day of the show and for providing through the Department of Agriculture champion medals for competition. And with reference to the holiday it was stated in the last report that the President

for the year, the Hon. T. Brunton, M.L.C., had induced the Premier to proclaim a whole holiday. This year Mr. Brunton has followed up his work and has prevailed on the Government to place the holiday for the show on the Statute Book, so that it is now established by Act of Parliament. They have again to thank the Shropshire Sheepbreeders' Association in England for their gold medal. They desire to express their grateful thanks to the donors of prizes—the list being headed by His Excellency Lord Brassey—for their continued liberal support. They have to thank the judges at the show for their highly appreciated honorary services and the stewards for their valuable assistance; and they very cordially acknowledge their deep debt of gratitude to the press. They also wish to thank Mr Murphy, Secretary of the Canterbury Agricultural Society of New Zealand, for three bound volumes comprising: The Flock Book, the Herd Book for breeds of cattle other than shorthorn, and the Shorthorn Herd Book; Mr. Martin, Secretary of the Department of Agriculture for several printed reports, and Mr. J. Twomey for a bound copy of the *Farmer and Grazier* for 1896. They desire to thank Messrs. Dalgety and Co. for old building material which was utilised in the stone wall and for metalling the horse court, and they thank Mr. A. L. Potter for having painted the wine kiosk with his patent paint.

FINANCE.

The financial statement has been carefully audited (*vide* report below) and it will be seen that the revenue for the year amounts to £5084 16s. 3d., being £235 3s. 6d. in excess of that of last year. Of this excess £131 11s. was received in connection with the Flock Book, a new departure in connection with the Society. The overdraft at the Bank has been reduced by £1172 19s. 6d., while £188 os. 3d. has been expended in buildings and works at the Show grounds. This latter sum is an investment, so that practically the ordinary working expenses show a profit of £1360 19s. 9d., inclusive of £111 11s. balance at credit of Flock Book trust account. The overdraft stands at £3117 6s. 3d., as against £4290 5s 9d. last year.



RULES.



1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony :

- (1.) By holding exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint ; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such exhibitions.
- (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
- (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications and Scientific works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
- (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
- (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit ; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.

- (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.
- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.
- (9.) By remunerating any person who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number) and Corresponding Members.

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The Trustees shall be elected from the Members of the Society, including Governors and Members of Council, and may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions,

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.

8. (a) The Council shall consist of thirty-four members to be elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society. (b) From these thirty-four Members the Council shall elect a President and six Vice-Presidents, who shall be selected from the class of Governors only.

9. One-half of the Council shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each Member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.

12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.

13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific and Corresponding Members; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting to appoint a paid Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be read, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all Subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that

any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. All such ballot papers shall be signed by the Subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

19. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding year to 31st December shall be forwarded to every Subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

20. The Secretary shall report to the Meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.

21. A special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society; but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.


22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next monthly Council.

23. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading Room and Lectures, and with one lady to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds and grand stand at all times.

24. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its Exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

25. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

BY-LAWS.



GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such Report and comment thereon; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the Meeting.

3. The Council at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President or his deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

5. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

6. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

7. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

8. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

9. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

10. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

11. If before half-an-hour after the time at which any Meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of members be not present, the members present, or the majority of them, or any one member, if only one be present, or the Secretary, if no member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

12. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied in a minute book kept for that purpose.

13. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on

the Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibitions.

14. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

15. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

16. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

17. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

18. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or Members of the Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

19. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

20. The quorum of a Monthly or Special Council shall be five.

21. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows: (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2) Election of officers and nomination for vacancies. (3) Finance Committee's Report. (4) Postponed business. (5) Correspondence. (6) Motions. (7) Notices of Motions.

22. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.

23. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

24. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

25. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion; and any member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

26. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

THE SECRETARY.

27. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

28. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

29. He shall have the custody of all books, models and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

30. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

31. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

32. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or member of the Society.

FINANCE.

33. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

34. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

35. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

36. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

37. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
