LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1900 :—

PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

During the year a considerable number of improvements have been carried out on the grounds. An extension of the dairy plants shed, making provision for a cloak room for the public, and space for industrial exhibits, was built at a cost of £178. An additional water service to the pig sheds was provided, and two coppers, for boiling food for stock, were

put in at the north-west corner of the grounds, also gravelling in front of the dairy cattle stalls, these items costing £99 5s. On account of the large entry for the Government prize for export butter, it was resolved to further extend the dairy plants shed by adding a building 80ft. x 40ft., and this was done at a cost of £675 10s. A number of other minor works were also carried out, making the outlay during the year £1,364 12s. 2d., and bringing up the total expenditure on buildings and works at the grounds to £37,156 8s. 4d.

THE EXHIBITION.

The Annual Exhibition was held on the 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th September. The prize schedule was a very attractive and liberal one, the prize money in a number of classes being increased. The result was the largest entry on record, there being 5,053 exhibits catalogued. A new regulation was introduced to the effect that exhibitors enter three exhibits in all the live stock classes at ordinary entry fee, but for any over that number, and for stock for sale, only 50 per cent. extra entry fee should be charged. The entry fees and ground rent reached £950 8s. 8d., being an advance of £67 17s. 8d. from the previous year. The gate money, including £449 17s. 6d. at the grand stand, amounted to £3,685 18s. 9d., being an increase of £490 7s. 3d. from last year, and £1,371 13s. 5d. from the year before.

Reviewing the Exhibits in the order of the Schedule, the Draught Horses were short of last year in numbers, but a high standard of merit was maintained throughout the different classes. In Thoroughbreds only four stallions (of a good class) were shown. Trotters were a strong section, the time test trotters attracting a good deal of attention. In Roadsters there was close competition; but in Clevelands only a mare was shown. In Breeding Ponies the exhibits were good, and the competition keen. The Jumpers' Plate was this year substituted for the Heavyweight Hunters' Plate. The Hunters' Plate, for *bonâ fide* hunters (Masters' Certificate to be produced) was

introduced for the first time. Juvenile Hunters formed a good field, while Ladies' Hunters showed a falling-off in numbers. The High Jumpers' event still retains its great attractiveness to the public. A class was introduced for Gentlemen's Cob, but the exhibits did not seemingly meet with the approval of the judges, as no prize was awarded. Cavalry and Mounted Riflemen's Horses were rather ahead of last year, and the quality of the Carriage, Brougham, and Buggy Horses was an improvement on the year before. Saddle and Harness Ponies were good classes. In Shorthorn Cattle, the high standard of the section was well maintained, and the Herefords were of great merit. Ayrshires and Jerseys again presented high average quality. In Milch Cows, subject to test, for which a prize of £100, to be won three times, was provided, the first prize cow produced 2lbs. $3\frac{3}{4}$ ozs. of butter, irrespective of points allowed for time calved. Merino Sheep were, as usual, a small section; and in the Longwools the numbers greatly fluctuated from last year, the Shropshires being, for the third year in succession, the largest section of sheep exhibited. Swine were a strong section. In Poultry there was a notable increase in the entries, and Dogs, too, showed an increase, the arrangement introduced last year, of allowing Poultry and Dogs to come in on the second day of the Show, being continued. Carriages, Buggies, &c., made a very attractive section of the Show. In the Dairy Produce section there were forty-seven exhibits entered for the £50 export butter competition, the liberal prize provided by the Government attracting great attention. In addition to the exhibits in the tabulated statement, there were 157 stands of machinery (in motion), machinery, and miscellaneous exhibits, comprising a very extensive collection of the latest and best improvements in all classes of machinery and implements required in connection with the development of the great producing interests of the colony. The weather on the whole during the Show was the best that has been experienced for years, the first four days being fine, but unfortunately the Saturday was wet and unfavorable. The attendance, as indicated at the beginning of this section of the report, was highly satisfactory, notwithstanding the wet Saturday; the crowd on Thursday (the holiday) being the largest ever seen on the Grounds.

FLOCK BOOK.

The Central Committee of the Flock Book of British breeds of sheep in Victoria, have arranged to publish a second volume

of the book immediately after the receipt of the annual returns for 1901, the date fixed for the receipt of such returns in connection with the flocks registered in the first volume being 1st June in each year. Flocks for which returns are not duly furnished will be omitted from the second volume. Mr. Albert Austin, a member of the Committee, was appointed a delegate to the International Conference of Sheepbreeders, held in England, at York, in June. Mr. Austin has not returned to the colony, so that he has not yet reported to the Committee. The recommendation of the Committee to the Council to undertake the publication of a Flock Book for Merino Sheep, has been adopted. The Committee first communicated with the leading Societies in connection with the proposal, but as the scope of the work had not apparently been understood, the Committee resolved to apply direct to breeders, and circulars have accordingly just been issued to all prominent breeders of Merino Sheep in the different colonies, setting forth the scope and object of the work, and asking them to co-operate in bringing it out by entering their flocks.

CHAMBER OF AGRICULTURE.

The steps taken to form a Victorian Chamber of Agriculture were set out in last year's report, and it was notified that the Committee appointed to enroll Societies and Members had taken the necessary action, and that after the date fixed for the receipt of subscriptions, the first Council would be elected. The Chamber was duly inaugurated, and a representative Council, with a strong Executive Committee, was appointed, so that the Institution is now fairly established. The subscriptions received for the first year were sufficient to more than meet the expenditure. A circular has lately been issued to all the Societies of the State, and also to individuals, asking them to join the Chamber, by subscribing for the current year. The future success of the Chamber will depend very materially on the response to this circular, and it is hoped that a still larger number of Societies and individual Members will be enrolled during the second year than at the inception, so that the Institution may become such an influential and authoritative body as its promoters at the outset designed and intended it to be.

THE JOURNAL.

On account of the large increase in the number of Members to whom Messrs. J. Twomey & Co., the proprietors of the *Farmer and Grazier*, with which the journal of this Society is incorporated, have to supply the journal free, that firm asked for an increase in the subsidy paid to them. After consideration, the amount of the subsidy was increased by the Council, on the recommendation of the Editing Committee, to £100 per annum, and a fresh agreement on these terms has been entered into.

THE COUNCIL.

At their first meeting in February, the Council re-elected Mr. William Thomson, President; and Messrs. A. McCracken, J. K. Joynt, and George Young, Vice-Presidents. In May, Mr. J. M. Peck resigned his seat on account of failing health. Mr. Peck, who was an enthusiastic worker on the Society's behalf, was a very old Member of the Council, having been elected in 1872, to a vacancy in the second Council, and holding office to the end of 1873, when he retired. He was again elected in 1879, was a Vice-President in 1884 and 1885, after which he retired from the Council, but was again elected to a vacancy in 1886, and held office continuously till his resignation in May. Mr. H. Huntington Peck—Mr. Peck's son—was elected in his place.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council desire to express their warm thanks to his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Sir John Madden, and Lady Madden, for their kind patronage of the Society's Show. They thank the Minister of Agriculture for again granting gold and silver medals for Champion prizes, and for the export butter prize of £50. They desire to record their indebtedness to the donors of prizes for continued and liberal support. They wish to express their thanks to the Judges at the Show for their valuable services gratuitously rendered, and the Stewards for their active assistance. They cordially acknowledge their great obligations to the Press for most invaluable assistance and co-operation, and to all who have aided them in their work for the year they express their kindly thanks.

GENERAL.

(PHOTOS OF FIRST PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY).

During the year the Council have had enlargements made of photographs for hanging in the office, of the Hon. William Degraives, the first President, and Mr. Donald Munro, the first Secretary of the Society, thus providing an interesting historical record of increasing value as the years roll on.

(MEMBERSHIP).

Last year the Council had the pleasure of reporting that, as the result of an effort, the Society had, for the first time, over 1,000 subscribers on its roll. The Council this year issued 8,250 circulars, and the net result of the year's operations in that connection is that the total number of members is now 1,184, or an increase of well on to 200 more than last year.

(TROOPS AT SHOW GROUNDS).

In the last report it was stated that the Council had placed the Show Grounds at the disposal of the military authorities free of charge, for the accommodation of the First and Second Contingents of Mounted Rifles for South Africa. This year the Australian Imperial Regiment was admitted, when they were flooded out of their Camp at Langwarrin, and again when they were leaving, and the boat was not ready for them, as anticipated. The Council were very pleased to be able to thus render assistance and co-operation in this patriotic movement, and for their action they have received the thanks of the Defence Department.

(CONTROL OF SHOW GROUNDS).

During the year by-laws have been drawn up, approved by the Governor-in-Council, and gazetted, for the better control of the Show Grounds, whereby the Council and Officers of the Society can deal effectively with offenders.

(PURCHASE OF LAND).

In order to increase the area of the Show Grounds, with a view to extending the accommodation for exhibits, the Council

have purchased a piece of land, about two and three-quarter acres in extent, adjoining the Show Grounds, on the south-west, along the racecourse railway line.

(ACCOMMODATION FOR PUBLIC).

The question of facilitating the viewing of parades and events on the Grounds has been under the consideration of the Council since last Show, and they have recently passed a resolution offering £50 as a premium for a design for providing accommodation for the public, either by cutting down the hill or otherwise.

(SYSTEM OF LEASING BULLS).

In reply to correspondence, full particulars were received from the Northumberland Agricultural Society (England) of their conditions for purchasing bulls, and leasing them amongst their Members. The particulars were published, but nothing further has been done to initiate a system which, in the Society referred to, has been very successful.

(DUKE OF YORK SHOW).

It has been proposed to hold a Show in Melbourne during the visit of His Royal Highness the Duke of York. Before proceeding definitely in the matter, the Council resolved to ask the Government if they would include the proposed Show in their official programme, and give a grant towards it. A deputation waited on the Minister of Agriculture and submitted this request to him. He promised to consult the Cabinet, and the Council are now awaiting the result.

(END OF THE CENTURY).

With the close of the century the Council desire to congratulate Subscribers on the position the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria has attained, and to express the hope that in the new century just entered upon, and marked by the inauguration of the Great Australian Commonwealth, it may continue its prosperous career, its influence ever becoming more and more effective in the promotion of the best interests of all the arts of peace.

FINANCE.


The Financial Statement published herewith shows that the revenue for the year amounted to £7,318 8s. 9d., and the expenditure (including £1,780 14s. 6d. prize money) to £6,091 15s. 8d. The revenue exceeds that of the previous year by £796 14s., and the overdraft at the bank has been reduced by £1,226 13s. 1d. A sum of £1,364 12s. 2d. has been expended in permanent buildings and works, and £250 on the purchase of land, but as these amounts are investments, the working expenses practically show a profit on the year of £2,841 5s. 3d. It must be satisfactory alike to the Council and Subscribers, and is worthy of note that this is the best financial result yet attained by the Society in any one year ; and if building operations had been suspended and additional land had not been purchased (the results of the expenditure on these items, however, standing as assets) the overdraft would have entirely disappeared. The overdraft is £2,826 11s. 6d., against £4,053 4s. 7d. last year.

RULES.

1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**
2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial Resources of the colony.
 - (1.) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
 - (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
 - (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications, scientific and other works, as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
 - (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
 - (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
 - (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit: and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
 - (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.
- (9.) By remunerating any person, if thought fit—who shall ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice—for any loss incurred by such experiments.
3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.
4. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the annual meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company any one member of such firm or director of such company may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.
5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.
6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-two members elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society as hereinafter provided and also the Trustees, who shall be *ex-officio* members of the Council.
7. One-half of the Council, except the Trustees, shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.
8. The Trustees shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.
9. The Council, shall at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees) a President and three Vice-Presidents.
10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof.
11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members; nominations having been submitted at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

15. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each member of the Council.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the second Tuesday in January following, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid and an Honorary Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies, to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. Every such ballot paper shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

19. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

20. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

21. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society, but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.

22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

23. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room and Lectures, and, with one lady, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds, and grand stands at all times. And while the Society publishes a monthly journal, a copy shall be posted free to each member.

24. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions or other objects, shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

25. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.



BY-LAWS.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Notice of the Preliminary, Annual, and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting, and the minutes of the preceding Preliminary General Meeting, shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Governor or Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. The President or his deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

3. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting, nominations to be made at the former meeting and elections to take place at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT,

4. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name or on the behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

5. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

6. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

7. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

8. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

9. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting, and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

10. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

11. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibition.

12. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

13. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

14. No money shall be drawn from the society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

15. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

16. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or other Members of the Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy ; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

17. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President ; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall chose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

18. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.

19. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows :—

- (1.) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2.) Business arising from minutes.
- (3.) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies.
- (4.) Finance Committee's Report.
- (5.) Correspondence.
- (6.) Postponed business.
- (7.) Motions.
- (8.) Notices of motions.

20. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.

21. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

22. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in February as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two Members of Committee to form a quorum.

23. The President shall be *ex-officio* a Member of all Committees.

24. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

25. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports ; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the first Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that Standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

THE SECRETARY.

26. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and of Committees, and shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

27. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same ; and excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's bankers. He shall have the charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

28. He shall have the custody of all books, models, and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

29. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

30. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

31. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

32. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting in the following form :—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the Meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

33. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

34. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

35. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

36. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, assisted by an honorary auditor, before whom a balance-sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
