

OF THE

COUNCIL

National Agricultural Society of Victoria.

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS,—

GENTLEMEN,—

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1887 :—

TENURE OF SHOW GROUNDS.

In the Report for last year it was stated that the Trustees had temporarily surrendered the deed of the show grounds in order that a fresh one might be issued embodying certain clauses, which, while they would not give the Council power to absolutely sell the land, would make the deed a sufficient security on which to borrow any sum of money up to £15,000 required to pay for existing or further improvements. The consent of the Minister of Agriculture was obtained to the insertion of the required clauses, but before the Crown Law officers would agree to the issue of a new deed embodying them, they submitted the case to counsel for an opinion. When that opinion was obtained it was to the effect that the Governor-in-Council could not confer on the Society or its Trustees any power to mortgage, and that the Trustees could not, in counsel's opinion, give or be enabled to give a security of any practical value over the land unless Parliament passed an Act to that end. On the receipt of this opinion a special meeting of Council was called, in order to consider and deal with it. After the opinion had been read the President reported that the Crown Solicitor had said he would not object to the Society obtaining a deed with clauses in it similar to those in the Scots' Church grant, he being of opinion

that money could be borrowed on such security. The President advised the Council to have the deed issued in the form approved by the Crown Solicitor ; when it was resolved accordingly.

PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

A number of improvements have been effected on the show grounds during the year. An entirely new set of sheep pens was erected, their design being such that they answer their purpose admirably. The pig shed was extended 48ft., the floor asphalted, and a new set of pens put up, making this shed a most complete and extensive one. The cattle stalls, where the ground sloped towards the fences, were filled up with material which the Works Committee was fortunate in being able to procure at a cheap rate from the excavation for a gasometer in the neighbourhood. The large hall under the stand, which had been before used for luncheons, was allotted to the dairy and farm produce exhibits, and a new luncheon hall was erected close to the entrance gates. The trotting and jumping course was altered, and was enclosed with a picket fence on the outer and the inner side, gates being placed in these fences for stock to pass through to their respective judging rings. A direct water supply was obtained to the grounds, and an extra reticulation laid in the yards. These improvements have been much appreciated by exhibitors and by visitors to the ground. They involved the outlay of £2,048 7s. 10d., bringing the total expenditure on permanent buildings and works at the show grounds up to £20,134 1s.

THE EXHIBITION.

The exhibition, which was held on the 23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th, and 27th of August, again showed a great advance on the last one, the entries, particularly in the live stock sections, being largely in excess of those of any previous year. Since the occupation of the present site by the Society, not only has each succeeding exhibition been more extensive than the previous one, but the relative annual increase has been greater every year, so that the grounds, which are now fully occupied, will shortly be too limited in area for the requirements of the Society. The schedule of prizes was the most liberal yet issued by the Council, a sum of over £2500 having been offered for competition. Of this amount £860 9s. was contributed by private donors, and £500 was offered by the Parliament of Victoria as Grand Champion Prizes of Australia. The total number of entries was 2,998, and the money taken for admission, including £507 17s. 6d. for the grand stand, was £3020 1s. 9d. This is below the amount received last year, the falling off being

accounted for by the Government failing to proclaim the official opening day of the show a public holiday, which was a great disappointment to the Council. The Government granted the Society £500 in lieu of the holiday, but this is not considered at all adequate compensation for the loss of the public holiday, which gave such a *prestige* to the Society, and was such an excellent advertisement for it, independently of the opportunity it afforded the public of visiting the show, and receiving the benefit it was calculated to impart from an educational point of view. In relation to the exhibits, the draught horses, of which there were 125 entries, were, on the whole, well up to the high standard usually seen at the Society's shows. The thoroughbred section, although containing a few good exhibits, was the weakest, in point of numbers, in the show. The trotters and roadsters, which were mostly driven on the grounds, attracted considerable attention, as amongst them were some noted animals. There was a fair show of hackneys, and a really good turn out of ponies. In buggy horses there were some good exhibits, but in carriage stock, for which His Excellency the Governor offered special prizes, only one exhibit came forward. The heavy and light weight hunters, of which there were 40 entries, made a fine show, their trials being watched with much interest. A high-jumping contest and a rough-riding competition, which also proved great attractions, were successfully carried out, the fences round the track enabling the management to control the crowd, and bring off the trials and contests without a hitch. The Shorthorn cattle were of the usual high class seen at this Society's exhibitions, showing no falling off in point of excellence. The Herefords were better represented than they ever were before on these grounds, and contained some exhibits of great merit. A few Devons—prizes for which were introduced for the first time—were exhibited. Polled Angus cattle mustered much more strongly than last year, some very high class representatives of the breed—which is being largely introduced to the colony—being exhibited. Ayrshires, of which there were 139 entries, formed a very strong section, and, as a new type was introduced, great interest centred in this department of the show. Jerseys were again well represented, the competition being very keen. A few Holsteins, and a number of Brittainy, dairy, and fat cattle, were exhibited. The proprietors of *The Leader* again offered a special prize of £20 for the best milch cow, subject to test, for which prize there were 19 entries, 11 of them competing. The test was most carefully and accurately carried out by the stewards, and the prize was won by a half-bred Ayrshire cow, which, during two days, produced 107½ lbs. of milk, 12 lbs. of cream, and 7 lbs. 5½ oz. of butter. The Council arranged to supply the agents of the Laval cream separator with milk during the show, so that the working of the machine was shown to the public, and the separated milk and cream were sold on the grounds. The

Merino sheep were scarcely so numerous as last year, but their quality was well maintained. Lincolns and Leicesters were well represented, and there were a few Downs and fat sheep. The swine were short of last year's large exhibit, but their quality was excellent, and the competition was very keen. There was a large increase in the entries for poultry and dogs, which proved very interesting sections of the show. The display of carriages, buggies, &c., for which there were close on 300 entries, was by far the best and largest the Society has ever brought together, the covered space being altogether inadequate to hold the exhibits; and there was a good show of saddlery and harness. The dairy produce section, consisting of butter, cheese, hams and bacon, was an excellent one, but the farm produce, though showing some improvement, was still short of what it should be. Some fine samples of wine were shown, the judging of which, owing to one or two exhibits having been overlooked, was protested against. The exhibitors, however, unanimously consented to a re-judging, which was satisfactorily carried out in the Society's office after the show. The very large and valuable collection of agricultural machinery (in motion), implements, and stands of exhibits containing all manner of inventions and articles calculated to facilitate agricultural operations, was the most extensive and interesting yet seen on any show grounds in Australia, and reflected the greatest credit on the enterprise of exhibitors. Sales of exhibits were held on the grounds on Monday and Tuesday, after the exhibition, instead of on the Friday and Saturday of the show, as formerly, and proved highly successful.

PAPERS.

During the year two papers have been read before the Council, the writer in each case being Mr. W. T. Kendall, M.R.C.V.S. The first, on "The Prevailing Diseases of Stock," was read in April, and the second, on "The Prevention and Suppression of Animal Diseases," was read in December. Both papers were published in full in the Society's Journal.

ALLEGED CURE FOR PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.

Early in the year Mr. J. Kelleher, of Moonee Ponds, wrote to the Council stating that he had in his possession a cure for pleuro-pneumonia in cattle, which he would like to have tested by a committee of experts appointed by the Society in order to give it publicity. He had already tried it on the farms in his district sufficiently to be thoroughly assured of its efficacy as a cure for the disease. The letter was received, and a committee was appointed to investigate the matter. The consent of the

Chief Inspector of Stock was obtained to this procedure, but the Council regret that Mr. Kelleher has not yet afforded the Committee an opportunity of pronouncing on his alleged cure.

CHANGE OF JUDGING SYSTEM.

For a number of years several members of Council endeavored to bring about a change in the old system of adjudicating by means of three judges, as under that system there was always a difficulty in fixing the responsibility for the decisions on any one judge. Resolutions affirming the desirableness of adopting the single judging system were submitted, but though they received considerable support were never carried, the latest motion to this effect having been discussed at the last annual meeting. In May, however, of the past year, a sort of compromise was arrived at, when the Council passed a resolution to the effect that two judges and one referee be appointed for each class, the referee to be called in only in the case of disagreement between the judges. This system was, therefore, adopted at the last show, with fairly satisfactory results.

STUD BOOK.

In the last report it was stated that a considerable amount of preliminary work had been done with a view to establishing a draught horse stud book. However, after the Council had the whole details before them, they resolved to let the matter drop, as they considered the work should be undertaken by the breeders, to whom they would, in the event of their going on with it, give every assistance. It was then resolved to call a meeting of horsebreeders in the Society's office on an evening during the show week. The meeting was duly called and held, and it was decided to form a society, to be called the Draught Horse Society of Victoria, with the object of bringing out a stud book. A code of rules and by-laws was drawn up for the constitution and guidance of the Society, but before further action was taken it was resolved to have the recommendations printed and submitted to the agricultural societies of the colony. This was accordingly done by circular, but up to date only six societies have replied, which is not at all encouraging to the promoters of the Society.

JUBILEE ADDRESS.

On the occasion of Her Majesty the Queen's Jubilee, the Council prepared and presented to His Excellency the Governor, an appropriate address handsomely illuminated; for trans-

mission to Her Majesty. The text of the address was published in the July number of the Society's Journal.

FEDERATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

In the last report it was stated that, owing to a change of Ministry, certain promises which had been obtained in relation to perfecting the scheme for the federation of agricultural societies, giving it legislative recognition and setting it in motion, had not been carried out. Also, that a deputation which had waited on the Minister of Agriculture to request him to carry out the promise of Mr. Service, when Premier, of a grant of money, had been asked to obtain an expression of opinion from the societies as to whether they were in favor of the federation scheme being carried out and worked on an independent basis, or whether they were in favor of the scheme being allowed to lapse into the Council of Agricultural Education, and that a circular had accordingly been issued. Only 26 replies have been received to the circular, of which 13 are in favor of the scheme being carried out and worked on an independent basis, 7 in favor of its being allowed to lapse into the Council of Agricultural Education, and 6 are undecided. The Central Board has not yet taken further action in pushing on the scheme, which has been less successful than it would have been had more of the societies interested themselves and urged the matter on. Indeed, in this regard it somewhat resembles the Federal Council, which would have been more effective had more of the colonies given in their adherence and co-operation. However, although the scheme for the Federation of Agricultural Societies has not come into active operation, there is no denying the fact that the movement has had a most healthful influence, and has been the indirect means of doing much good for the agricultural interest, as evidenced by the increased activity in the agricultural community coincident with the initiation of the scheme, and the beneficial results which have since accrued.

SYDNEY AND ADELAIDE SHOWS.

In May the Secretary was appointed to represent the Society at the exhibition of the Agricultural Society of New South Wales in Sydney, which he accordingly did, and on his return wrote a report on the show. Again, in September, he was appointed to represent the Society at the exhibition of the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of South Australia, at Adelaide, which he did, and in this case also wrote a report on the show. Both these reports, which were received by the Council, were published in full in the Society's Journal.

THE JOURNAL.

Allusion has already been made, incidentally, to the Society's Journal, which has been, so far, conducted successfully on the lines on which it was established. The term of the agreement under which the Journal is to be continued in its present form is four years, two and a half of which are past, so that it has yet one and a half years to run in the style in which it now appears, after which it will become the joint property of the Society and the publishers.

THE COUNCIL.

At the monthly meeting in March attention was called to the retirement of Mr. Alexander Patterson from the Council. At the time of his retirement Mr. Patterson, who for three years held the position of a vice-president, was the only member of Council who had been a member continuously from the initiation of the Society. A letter was ordered to be written to him conveying the Council's regret at his feeling necessitated, through advanced age, to retire from the Council, of which he had been for 16 years continuously a member, and thanking him for his past services to the Society. In June the attention of the Council was called to the death of Mr. Robert McDougall, whose funeral taking place on the day of meeting, the same was adjourned out of respect to his memory, a letter of condolence having been first ordered to be written to his widow and family. Mr. McDougall's connection with the Council ceased in 1882, but up to that date he had been a Trustee from the inception of the Society, in which, during its earlier years, he took an active interest. In the same month three additional members, Messrs. John Jones, William Wragge, and Thomas Harmer, were elected, it having been resolved that the Council should be made up to 34 individual members, the number previously being 31, on account of the Trustees holding two offices, one being president and two vice-presidents. In August the Council suffered a severe loss through the lamented death of Mr. John Finlay. Mr. Finlay, who was first elected to the Council in 1877, and who for one year held the position of a vice-president, was one of the most active supporters of the Society, having been for several years Chairman of the Finance Committee, during which time he was most regular and punctual in his attendance at meetings, always taking a most lively interest in the affairs of the Society. Mr. Finlay's death took place immediately before the last show, during which, as a mark of respect to his memory, the members of Council wore a piece of black ribbon on their badges of office. At the monthly meeting, in September, the Council passed a resolution placing on record their sorrow at the early death of

their late treasurer and colleague, and their great regret at being deprived of his mature counsel, and his active and ready co-operation in every matter calculated to advance the interests of the Society, and ordered that a letter of condolence be written to his widow and family. Mr. George Ramsden was elected in the room of Mr. Finlay.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council wish to record their high appreciation of the continued support of the Society's distinguished patron, His Excellency the Governor, and to express their indebtedness to His Excellency and Lady Loch for the warm interest they manifest in the Society's exhibitions. They also thank the Government and the Parliament of Victoria for continuing the vote for Grand Champion Prizes of Australia, which have contributed in no small degree in making the Society's exhibition, as it now is, quite intercolonial in character. They also express their thanks to Mr. Bosisto, C.M.G., the President of the Victorian Commission at the Colonial and Indian Exhibition, for the handsome show case, containing a large number of samples of agricultural products, &c., which he presented to the Society. They beg to convey their best thanks to the donors of prizes at the late show for the liberal and handsome amounts they contributed to the prize fund. They also thank the judges and referees at the show for the careful performance of their onerous duties, and the stewards for their active services in carrying out the arrangements. They also wish specially to place on record their high esteem of the valuable assistance they have received from the press in furthering the interests of the Society.

FINANCE.

On reference to the financial statement, which has been carefully audited (*vide* report on page 12), it will be seen that the receipts for the year, including £5 7s. 4d. cash in hand from the previous year, amounted to £8442 14s. 4d., and the expenditure to £7015 19s. 11d., reducing the overdraft from £9548 6s. 2d. to £8121 11s. 9d. As previously stated in the portion of the report which deals with permanent buildings and works, the amount expended on additional improvements at the show grounds during the year was £2048 7s. 10d. It is, therefore, exceedingly gratifying to the Council to report that, after having spent over £2000 in permanent buildings, the balance-sheet shows a profit on the year's transactions amounting to £1426 14s. 5d.

R U L E S .



1. The Society shall be called "*The National Agricultural Society of Victoria.*"

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony :—

(1). By holding Exhibitions, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint ; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions.

(2). By holding Meetings, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which Meetings papers may be read and discussed.

(3). By collecting such information from Agricultural Publications and Scientific Works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.

(4). By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.

(5). By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.

(6). By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit ; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.

(7). By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

(8). By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times

and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.

(9). By remunerating any person who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members, (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The President, Vice-Presidents and Trustees shall be elected from the class of Governors, being, or having been, Members of Council; and the Trustees may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound, annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of Membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one Member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.

8. The Council shall consist of thirty-four Members, including the President, Vice-Presidents, and three Trustees, to be elected from the class of Governors only; the remainder to be elected indiscriminately from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society.

9. One-half of the Council, excepting the President and Trustees, shall retire annually, but be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and Objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each Member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds to the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.

12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.

13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members ; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December ; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint Auditors, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February ; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance-sheet shall be read, all office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.

19. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society ; but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

20. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council ; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next Monthly Council.

21. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of all office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, Lectures, and, with two ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions and grounds at all times.

22. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its Exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and if found guilty shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

23. These rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

BY - LAWS.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any questions to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper; provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

3. The Council, at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election, shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the Election at the Annual General Meeting, and the ballot shall be kept open from 12 noon to 3 p.m.

5. To allow of a ballot being taken, printed lists of the Governors and Members duly proposed shall be given by the Secretary to each Member of the Society present, two scrutineers shall be chosen, and each Member desiring to vote shall hand to the Chairman his copy of the said list, with such names erased therefrom as he may think fit. Any list containing more than the requisite number of names unerased shall be rejected by the scrutineers.

6. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

7. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

8. The Council shall hold a Meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

9. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes, on a show of hands, all questions, not involving an unusual outlay of money, brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object, and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

10. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

11. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

12. If before half an hour after the time at which any Meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if only one be present, or the Secretary if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

13. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present, whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes

shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

14. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns ; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every, the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members, Officers and Servants of the Society, as well as on all Exhibitors, or their Assistants, at the Society's Exhibitions.

15. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

16. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

17. No money shall be drawn from the Society's Banking Account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

18. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive Monthly Meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

19. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or Members of Council, at the Meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy ; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the Monthly Meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

20. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President ; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

21. The quorum of a Monthly or Special Council shall be five.

22. At every Monthly Meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows :—(1). Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2). Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies. (3). Finance Committee's Report. (4). Postponed business. (5). Correspondence. (6). Motions. (7). Notices of Motions.

23. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by, the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

24. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in that month, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

25. The Council shall elect such Standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

26. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion; and any Member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a Member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

27. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

THE SECRETARY.

28. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter-books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

29. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, he shall be responsible for all moneys received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amount allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

30. He shall have the custody of all books, models, and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

31. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

32. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

33. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

34. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form:—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

35. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Hon. Treasurer of the Society.

36. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

37. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

38. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an Audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance-sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
