

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS,

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1894 :

ADMISSION TO GRAND STAND.

Before dealing with their business for the year, the Council desire—for the purpose of general information—to call attention to the new rule passed by the subscribers at the last annual meeting, granting extended privileges to members. In accordance with this rule every subscriber to the Society has now the right of entrance to the grand stand with one lady free of charge. The result of the working of the rule is alluded to in a subsequent paragraph of the report.

PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

In this connection the work of most importance consisted in fencing and raising the ground in front of the grand stand and including it in the area to which admission is charged. The idea proved a good one, the new arrangement working very satisfactorily. Several other improvements of a minor character were also carried out. The sum expended during the year was £105 9s. 9d. The total expenditure on permanent buildings and works on the show grounds now amounts to £29,858 6s. 8d.

FIELD TRIAL.

With a view to giving the makers and importers of new and improved implements an opportunity of practically showing the merits of their inventions to the farmers of the colony, the

Council in February resolved to hold a Field Trial, which they carried out on the farm of Mr. John Kernan, Moonee Ponds, on the 29th March. There were 73 entries, comprising a very varied collection of new and improved implements used in the cultivation of the soil, together with new and labour-saving appliances generally, and as the field placed at the disposal of the Society was very suitable for the trial, the ground being dry and somewhat hard, the implements were subjected to a really good working test. The judges, who took great pains to arrive at the relative merits of the various exhibits, awarded six silver medals, six certificates of merit, and highly commended eleven exhibits. Altogether the event proved a great success, the implement makers and importers expressing themselves very pleased with the Society's action in holding the trial, while the farmers had the advantage of seeing an interesting exhibition of good, practical, up-to-date cultural work.

THE EXHIBITION.

The annual exhibition was held on the 29th, 30th, and 31st August, and 1st September, having been altered from a five to a four days' show. A very liberal programme of prizes was issued, the total amount of money offered showing a considerable increase from the previous year, owing principally to the introduction of additional classes. There were 4130 entries, the largest number yet received by the Society. The money taken for admission, including £229 15s. at the Grand Stand, amounted to £2003 5s., which was £72 1s. 9d. below the sum received the year before. The entry fees and ground rent amounted to £716 12s., against £709 8d. in the previous year. With regard to the exhibits, the draught horses (93 entries) showed a considerable increase from last year, and the animals were of excellent quality, particularly the young stock, in which the judges commended whole classes. In thoroughbreds (9 entries) there were again one or two high-class stallions, but the other classes were, as usual, very poorly filled. Trotters and roadsters (21 entries) showed rather an improvement, both in numbers and quality, while the 4 Clevelands exhibited were good representatives of their breed. Hackneys (10 entries) and ladies' hackneys (5 entries) were well up to last year in number and quality. Carriage and buggy horses (15 entries) were behind last year in numbers, and only 1 brougham horse was shown—all the light harness horse classes being short in entries. Saddle and harness ponies (37 entries) were also short of last year's numbers, but there were 15 exhibits of good breeding ponies. In the heavy weight hunters (14 entries) and light weight hunters (24 entries) the numbers were rather short of last

year, but the fields comprised some very fine horses. In the maiden hunter's class there were 9 entries, and in the ladies' hunter's class, re-introduced this year to the prize list, 4 entries. In the high jumping contest (6 entries), the number fell short of previous years, and the performances were not so sensational. The shorthorn cattle (108 entries) were very much as last year in number and quality. Herefords (26 entries) were rather short of last year in numbers, but there was again keen competition in most classes. Polled Angus (13 entries) again showed a falling off in numbers from the previous year. In Devons there were 4 entries, two more than last year. Ayrshires (109 entries) showed a large increase in numbers from the previous year, which was accounted for by the New Zealand breeders again exhibiting, after having dropped out last year. Jerseys (46 entries) also showed an increase in numbers from last year, while their high standard was well maintained. Holsteins (15 entries), were again an attractive section, these cattle appearing to gain favour with breeders. Kerries and Dexter Kerries, breeds comparatively new to this colony, for which prizes were offered last year for the first time, were represented by 5 exhibits of attractive animals. There were 5 exhibits of Brittanies, and 14 dairy cows, this class filling extra well, while there were 8 entries for the best milch cow, subject to test. There were 10 entries of fat cattle, and 5 for Cattle Derbies. Merino sheep (5 entries), were very poorly represented. Lincolns (71 entries), were an improvement on last year. Leicesters (26 entries), and Border Leicesters (33 entries), showed a considerable improvement, the breeds having been divided for the first time this year. Romney Marsh (3 entries), were weak, exhibitors of previous years having dropped out. Southdowns (24 entries) were also short. Hampshire Downs (18 entries), and Shropshire Downs (16 entries), were stronger, and there were 5 entries of Cotswolds, for which prizes were offered for the first time. Fat sheep (31 entries) showed a great improvement in numbers and quality, which was brought about by the introduction of classes for sheep suitable for export as freezers, resulting in a most interesting exhibit. Swine (114 entries) were more numerous than last year—the Berkshires, being as usual, the predominating breed. Prizes were offered for the first time for Tamworths, of which there were 4 entries. Poultry (432 entries) showed a very considerable falling off in numbers from last year, while Dogs (176 entries) were better represented. Carriages and Buggies (172 entries) showed an improvement on last year's entry; their arrangement during the Show was altered, as exhibitors were allowed to group their vehicles after judging. There were 24 exhibits of saddlery and harness. In farm produce

(58 entries) the exhibits were still few in number, but were of a very high class. With a view to encouraging a new industry, the Council granted the Silk Culture Association a space free of charge in the farm produce room, for the display of exhibits connected with the silk producing industry, and the Association made a very interesting and instructive display. In dairy produce (166 entries) there was good competition, prizes having been specially introduced for cheese and butter suitable for export, and the exhibits of bacon and hams were most attractive. There were 167 entries of wines, a slight increase from the previous year. Preserves, dried fruits, etc. (15 entries) were poorly represented. Three exhibits of artificial manures were staged. There were 138 stands of machinery (in motion) implements, and miscellaneous exhibits, making altogether a very extensive and varied display, which reflected great credit on the enterprise of exhibitors. Auction sales of exhibited stock were held on the grounds on Friday and Saturday, and were very fairly successful, for—although the high prices of some years ago were not reached—a large number of animals were sold at a fair prices. Unfortunately for the complete success of the Show, heavy rain set in on the Sunday before it opened, and continued to fall till after the opening. The new rule (referred to at the beginning of the report) admitting members to the Grand Stand with a lady, was found to work very satisfactorily, for while there was rather less money taken for admission to the stand, the shrinkage was more than made up by the increase in members' subscriptions brought about by their extended privileges, and the Council hope that as the privileges of membership become better known, there may be a very substantial increase in the subscribers' roll. As before stated, the entries exceeded those of any previous year, making the Show the largest and most varied ever held by the Society, and the attendance of the public was almost equal to that of last year, so that it is very gratifying to be able to report that, notwithstanding the bad times and the adverse weather conditions under which the Show was held, it resulted so satisfactorily.

THE WINE TASTING.

The conditions under which wines are entered for the Show provide that half the exhibits of old wines shall become the property of the Society for purposes of adjudication, and for future reference and comparison. This regulation has been in force for four years, so that the Society has collected a valuable stock of wines, which are stored in the cellars of the Exhibition Buildings. In order to afford those persons interested an opportunity of ascertaining how the wines had kept and matured in

bottle, it was resolved to hold a wine tasting, which was carried out on the 13th November, on somewhat similar lines to the one held two years ago. Upwards of 200 invitations were issued, and there was an attendance of about fifty prominent citizens, more or less interested in the development of the wine industry. The wines, which were catalogued, and arranged to be submitted, were those of the 1891 Show, together with the champions of 1892. Although some of the wines were not up to expectations, this was evidently owing to their having been bottled when out of condition. Many of the wines, however, were of a very high-class character and in excellent condition, showing decided improvement during the years they had lain in bottle in the cellars, and clearly demonstrating the fact that our vignerons have splendid material to work on, and that it only requires proper treatment and manipulation to make the wines of Australia equal, if not superior to those produced in any of the older European countries.

THE JOURNAL.

Owing to a Melbourne morning paper having quoted an article of an extreme party political character from the *Farmer and Grazier*, with which the Society's Journal is incorporated, as from "a Journal published in Victoria, and professing to represent the Royal Agricultural Society," it was resolved that the existing arrangements regarding the Journal were unsatisfactory, and might become at any time detrimental to the interests of the Society, and action was taken with a view to severing the then connection. Tenders were called for the publication of a Journal on the basis of complete control by the Society, but after doing this, and obtaining all the information possible, the Editing Committee recommended that the agreement with the publishers of the Journal be renewed on the same terms as before, with the understanding, however, that the *Farmer and Grazier*, with which the Journal was incorporated should cease to be the organ of the Victorian Farmer's Association, and that a written guarantee be given that no such objectionable article as lately appeared in the paper be published in future. This recommendation was adopted by the Council, and the Journal is being carried on satisfactorily on these lines.

ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

In the last report it was stated that as the result of a proposal emanating from the Council of this Society, it had been resolved to form an Association, to be called the Association of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural and Viticultural Societies of

Victoria, and that a meeting would be held in February to establish the Association. The meeting was duly held, and Mr. Peppin, the president of this Society, was elected the first president of the Association. The Association has since continued to progress satisfactorily, as shown by the following extract from its first annual report, published in September last:—"Although so recently formed, the Association has already been instrumental in bringing several important subjects bearing on the producing interests prominently before the public, as well as in influencing the Government in a number of matters connected with the agricultural, pastoral and horticultural industries, and your Council earnestly hope that the Association may receive the continued and increasing support of the societies of the colony, in order that it may become a powerful and influential institution." According to its constitution this Society is entitled to three representatives on the Association, the members of Council in addition to the president appointed to represent the Society being Messrs. James Gibb and Thomas Skene.

THE PRESIDENT AND COUNCIL.

At the first meeting of Council for the year, the Hon. Thomas Brunton, M.L.C. was elected president of the Society, he being at the time absent in Western Australia. On his return Mr. Brunton wrote stating that he did not think he would be doing either the Society or himself justice in accepting the position, as he anticipated being out of the colony very frequently during the months immediately following, and he therefore respectfully declined the position. The letter was submitted to the Council at the monthly meeting in April, and was received with regret. At the following meeting of Council, in May, Mr. Peppin was unanimously re-elected president for the unexpired portion of the year. At the succeeding meeting Mr. Brunton was unanimously elected a vice-president. No other change occurred in the Council during the year.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council again desire to express their obligations to His Excellency the Governor and the Countess of Hopetoun for their kind patronage of the Society's Exhibition. They wish to thank the Department of Agriculture for again providing valuable medals as champion prizes. They have to acknowledge their indebtedness to Mr. John Kernan for placing a paddock at their disposal for the field trial of implements. They desire to return their cordial thanks to the donors of prizes, for so liberally subscribing to the prize fund. They wish to thank the judges at the Show and at the field trial for their very important services, and

the stewards at the Show for their active assistance and co-operation. They desire also to thank the press for their valuable reports of the operations of the Society during the year.

FINANCE.

On reference to the financial statement which has been carefully audited (*vide* report below), it will be seen that the revenue for the year amounted to £5,283 5s. 4d., being £695 15s. 8d. short of the previous year. This shortage is mainly accounted for by the withdrawal of the annual vote of £500 for grand champion prizes, an item which appeared in the accounts for last year, when it was received by the Society for the prizes which were awarded in 1892. Medals were substituted for the vote in 1893, so that the usual amount which would have come to hand in 1894 if the vote for 1893 had been continued, is absent from the receipts. The cost of management has been reduced, and the general expenditure has been very carefully kept in check, so that, although the prize money was increased, the overdraft has been reduced by £973 4s. 11d. The statement also shows that £105 9s. 9d. has been expended on permanent improvements, which are an investment, so that the ordinary working expenses show a profit of £1078 14s. 8d. as the result of the operations for the year. The overdraft stands at £5521 8s., as against £6494 12s. 11d. last year.



RULES.



1. The Society shall be called *The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria*.

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony :

- (1.) By holding exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint ; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such exhibitions.
- (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
- (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications and Scientific works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
- (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
- (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit ; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

(8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.

(9.) By remunerating any person, who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The Trustees shall be elected from the Members of the Society, including Governors and Members of Council, and may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a member of the same, and shall have all the rights of Membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.

8. (a) The Council shall consist of thirty-four Members to be elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society. (b) From these thirty-four Members the Council shall elect a President and six Vice-Presidents, who shall be selected from the class of Governors only.

9. One-half of the Council shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but

no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each Member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.

12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.

13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each Member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be read, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given

18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all Subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. All such ballot papers shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at 3 o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning officer is making up the poll.

19. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the report and audited balance sheet for the preceding year to 31st December shall be forwarded to every subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

20. The Secretary shall report to the Meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.


21. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society; but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.


22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next monthly Council.

23. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room and Lectures, and, with one lady, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds and grand stand at all times.

24. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

25. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.





BY-LAWS.



GENERAL MEETINGS

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any questions to the Council respecting the matters contained in such Report and comment thereon; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

3. The Council at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President, or his deputy, shall conduct the Election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President, or his deputy, to assist in making up the state of the poll.

5. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

6. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

7. The Council shall hold a Meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

8. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money, brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

9. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

10. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

11. If before half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if only one be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such Meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

12. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or in case of his absence, by some member present, whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

13. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own Meetings, which shall be binding on the

Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibitions.

14. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whenever they shall think proper.

15. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

16. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

17. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

18. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or Members of the Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

19. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

20. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.

21. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows: (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies. (3) Finance Committee's Report. (4) Postponed business. (5) Correspondence. (6) Motions. (7) Notices of Motions.

22. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by, the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

23. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

24. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

25. Each Committee, at its first meeting shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion; and any member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

26. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

THE SECRETARY.

27. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

28. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

29. He shall have the custody of all books, models and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

30. He shall have the immediate superintendance over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

31. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

32. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

33. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such support.

34. The Chairmain of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

35. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

36. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

37. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
