

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1895:

PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

During the year a number of important works were carried out on the Show grounds. The dairy plant shed was extended to the sheep shed at a cost of £207, the building being further improved for exhibitors by the erection of shafting at a cost of £111 9s. 6d. The road from the main entrance to the grand stand was formed and metalled, with catchpits and underground drains, in front of the Secretary's office, at a cost of £152 10s.; the road in front of the engine stand and the divisional roads of the machinery ground were formed and metalled at a cost of £113 14s.; all these roads being afterwards coated with ashes procured from the Railway Department at a cost of £24 6s. The Council also contributed £60 to the Essendon Council as half cost of constructing and channelling Grand National Avenue—the road leading up to the main entrance gates of the Show grounds—which the Essendon Council was good enough to put in excellent order before the Show. This, together with the newly formed roadways inside the grounds, did away entirely

with the objectionable under-foot conditions of the previous Show, the improvements being very favourably commented on by visitors. A number of other minor improvements were carried out on different parts of the grounds, the amount laid out during the year being £793 7s. 9d., bringing the total expenditure on permanent buildings and works on the Show grounds up to £30,651 14s. 5d.

THE EXHIBITION.

The annual Exhibition was held on the 28th, 29th, 30th and 31st August. The schedule of prizes, which had been increased in the previous year, was reduced to below the amount offered in 1893. The entries, however, numbered 4048, or only 82 less than the previous year, when the largest number ever received by the Society was recorded. The money taken for admissions, including £241 6s. 3d. at the grand stand, amounted to £2089 19s. 6d., being £86 14s. 6d. in excess of the amount received the year before. The entry fees and ground rent amounted to £736 10s. 6d., against £716 12s. in the previous year. With regard to the exhibits, the draught horses (89 entries) were practically the same in number as last year, being only four short. The quality was well maintained in the breeding stock, while the lorry pairs made the best display yet seen on the grounds. In thoroughbreds there were only 4 entries, the section being almost a blank. Trotters and roadsters (24 entries) were rather in advance of the previous year, but in Clevelands only 2 mares—of good quality, however—were shown. Breeding ponies (19 entries) showed an improvement on the previous year. In heavy-weight hunters (15 entries) and light-weight hunters (22 entries) the numbers were only one short of last year, and there was a fine lot of horses shown. In the juvenile hunters there were 17 entries, an increase of eight on the previous year; in the ladies' hunters' class, 7 entries; and in the high-jumping contest, 11 entries, five more than in the previous year. Hackneys (15 entries), five in advance of last year, and ladies' hackneys (5 entries) were about as before. Carriage and buggy horses, &c. (28 entries), were thirteen ahead of last year, but again only 1 brougham horse was shown. Saddle and harness ponies (34 entries) were only three behind last year, some nice exhibits being shown. The shorthorn cattle (97 entries) were eleven short of last year's number, their quality being about the same. Herefords (18 entries) were eight short of last year, the quality being well maintained. Polled Angus (18 entries) were five ahead of last year, so that they have taken a turn from their continuous

drop for a number of years. In Devons there were 5 entries. Ayrshires (81 entries) showed a considerable drop in numbers from last year through the absence of stock from New Zealand, but they still continue one of the strongest cattle sections of the Show. Jerseys (41 entries) were only five short of last year, and their high quality was well maintained. Holsteins (18 entries) were again an attractive section. There were 15 dairy cows, and 13 entries for the *Leader* Special for best milch cow, subject to test, the dairy classes filling extra well. There were 29 entries of fat cattle, a great increase on any previous year, and there were 4 for the cattle Derbies. Merino sheep (29 entries) were twenty-four ahead of last year, when only 5 were shown, and the entries comprised some excellent sheep. Lincolns (54 entries) were rather short of last year. Leicesters (47 entries) were a much larger exhibit than before, and Border Leicesters (38 entries) also showed an increase, exhibitors appearing to appreciate the separation of the two types into different sections. Romney Marsh (5 entries) were again weak. Southdowns (22 entries) were only two behind last year, while Hampshire Downs (29 entries) showed an advance of eleven entries, Shropshire Downs (48 entries) an advance of thirty-two entries, and Cotswolds (4 entries) were as last year, when they were shown for the first time. Fat sheep (32 entries) were one ahead of the previous year's large entry, when prizes were first introduced for freezers. Swine (74 entries) showed a drop of forty from last year's entry, but the quality was well maintained, and there were more exhibits of the white breeds than have been seen for a number of years. Poultry (471 entries) showed an increase of thirty-nine entries on the previous year, and dogs (191 entries) were also better represented. Carriages and buggies (138 entries) were short of last year's numbers. There were 18 exhibits of saddlery and harness. Farm produce (48 entries) was rather weak, though the quality of the grain was good, and in this section the Department of Agriculture exhibited a very interesting collection of wheats, consisting of over 400 specimens. In dairy produce (145 entries) there was a fine show, the exhibits of butter and cheese suitable for export and the great display of hams and bacon attracting special attention, while the Department's exhibit of poultry, &c., packed and frozen for export, was also an interesting feature. There were 139 entries of wines, a few short of last year's number, the growers not entering as freely as could be desired. Preserves, dried fruits, &c. (25 entries), showed an advance on last year, but there is still room for improvement. Two exhibits of artificial manures were shown. There were 144 stands of machinery (in motion), implements and miscellaneous exhibits, making a very attractive and instructive

display. The Government granted a half-holiday for the official opening day of the Show, the Council, at the desire of the Government, reducing the charge for admission on that day from 2s. 6d. to 1s. This procedure was a complete success, and the holiday and reduced price of admission were much appreciated by the public, for there was a greatly increased attendance, more money being taken at the lower price than was done at the higher price on the corresponding day of the previous Show. The weather was again wet and unfavourable on the opening and on the third day, but on the Viceregal day and Saturday was all that could be desired. The attendance throughout the Exhibition, as has been already indicated, was larger than that of the previous year, and the Show as a whole, for variety and excellence of exhibits, was generally pronounced to be the best yet held by the Society.

THE JOURNAL.

The agreement with the publishers of the *Farmer and Grazier*, with which paper the Journal of the Society is incorporated, has been renewed for one year on the amended conditions resolved on by the Council as set forth in last year's Report.

PAPER.

A paper was read before the Council in April, by Mr. E. Jowett, on "The Unnatural Fall in Prices Due to Currency Legislation." The occasion was made more interesting by the presence of Mr. Moreton Frewin, the well-known lecturer on bimetallism, who addressed the meeting on the subject of the paper.

ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

The Association of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural and Viticultural Societies of Victoria—which it was stated in the last report had been formed as the result of a proposal from the Council of this Society—has continued in operation during the year, but has not received the support anticipated, as shown by the following extract from the Association's second annual report: "Your Council regret that during the past year the agricultural and kindred societies of the colony have not taken a greater interest in the Association, only nineteen societies having actually paid their subscriptions. Your Council

trust that during the coming year many more societies will join the Association, and thus increase its strength and influence. The want of a central association by which the whole agricultural and kindred interests of the colony could combine for their common welfare was long felt, and now that an organisation possessing all the necessary machinery has been formed with that object, and with the possibility of doing a great deal of useful work, your Council trust that it will receive that measure of support which is necessary to make it a success."

AN AUTUMN SHOW.

In November a proposal was brought forward to hold an autumn Show, but after discussion it was decided that such a Show be not held in 1896. It was, however, resolved that the matter be again revived in February, so that in the event of it being decided to carry out a Show in the autumn of 1897, ample notice would be given to the public.

SOCIAL MEETINGS.

In December the Council resolved that a club be established to be called the "Social Club of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria," with the object of holding quarterly dinners, at which papers would be read and afterwards discussed. The idea has been well received, but it is intended to submit the proposals to a general meeting of the subscribers, in January, before finally inaugurating the Club.

BRANDING ACT.

A special committee of the Council dealt with the report of the Conference of Chief Inspectors of Stock, held in Queensland in January last, and submitted a report, which was adopted by the Council, endorsing the recommendations of the Conference relative to the branding of stock, the object being to prevent the present great depreciation in the value of hides owing to indiscriminate branding.

CHEWING'S FESCUE.

In April the Council obtained a quantity of the seed of the grass known as Chewing's Fescue from New Zealand, in the

-North Island of which colony it was said to have done wonders on the poorest parts, and it was also regarded as a great drought-resisting grass. Seventy-seven samples were distributed by the Society throughout the colonies. Results have not yet been ascertained, but reports on the merits of the grass will be received later on.

CIDER.

In October, as the result of correspondence, a valuable pamphlet on "Cider and Cider-making" was obtained by the Society from Mr. Radcliffe Cooke, M.P., Gloucestershire, England. With a view to calling attention to and imparting information on what should become an industry in the cooler districts of the colony, the pamphlet is being published as a serial in connection with the Society's Journal.

ADDRESS TO THE GOVERNOR.

On the arrival in the colony of His Excellency Lord Brassey, the Council, through the Finance Committee, prepared and presented an address to him at Government House. His Excellency received the address favourably, and replied in very kindly terms. The address and reply were as follow :

"TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THOMAS LORD BRASSEY, KNIGHT COMMANDER OF THE MOST HONOURABLE ORDER OF THE BATH, GOVERNOR AND COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF OF VICTORIA AND ITS DEPENDENCIES, &c., &c., &c.

"MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,

"We, the President, Vice-Presidents, and members of the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, beg most humbly to approach your Excellency with heartfelt assurances of attachment and loyalty to the throne and person of Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen.

"We desire to extend a most cordial welcome to your Excellency to our Australian shores, and to assure you of our great gratification in having as Governor a gentleman of such extensive experience and practical knowledge to preside over the destinies of our land, for we feel fully confident, from your distinguished career and public utterances, that while giving due attention to the higher functions of your office, and promoting the fraternal federal spirit throughout the colonies of

Australasia, you will not omit to attach due importance to our more substantial agricultural and pastoral interests, which interests it is more particularly the province of this institution to foster and support.

“We wish to express the hope that your sojourn amongst us may prove to your Excellency, Lady Brassey and family so completely satisfactory and enjoyable that you will always retain the most pleasing recollections of your official connection with our colony, which has the distinguished honour of bearing the name of our beloved Queen.

‘THE COUNCIL.

In March Mr. Richard Grice resigned his seat on the Council through his time being so much taken up on the days of meeting, and his resignation was accepted with regret. Mr. R. Grant Stevenson was elected in the room of Mr. Grice. In August a vacancy was reported in the Council through the greatly regretted death of Mr. William Wragge. A record was

placed on the minutes of the high esteem in which Mr. Wragge was held by his fellow members of Council, and a letter of condolence was written to his widow and family. The vacant seat was filled by the election of Mr. Alexander Cameron.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council wish to record their obligations to His Excellency Sir John Madden, the Acting-Governor, and Lady Madden, for their kind patronage of the Society's Exhibition and for the personal interest they manifested in its various departments. They desire to thank the Government for having granted a holiday on the official opening day of the Show, the holiday having tended greatly to popularise the Exhibition. They have again to acknowledge their indebtedness to the Department of Agriculture for providing valuable medals as Champion prizes. They wish to return their very grateful thanks to the donors of prizes for their continued liberal support. They desire to thank the judges at the Show for their very valuable and important services, and the stewards for their active co-operation in carrying out the arrangement in the yards. They have also to convey their thanks to the Press for the publicity given to the operations of the Society, with particular reference to the splendid reports and illustrations issued in connection with the Show.

FINANCE.

On reference to the Financial Statement, which has been carefully audited (*vide* report below), it will be seen that the revenue for the year amounted to £5408 5s. 4d., being £125 in excess of that of last year. The overdraft at the bank has been reduced by £886 3s. 8d., while during the year £793 7s. 8d. has been expended in permanent improvements. This latter sum is an investment, so that practically the ordinary working expenses show a profit of £1679 11s. 4d. on the year's transactions. The overdraft stands at £4635 4s. 4d., as against £5521 8s. last year.





RULES.

1. The Society shall be called *The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria*.

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony :

(1.) By holding exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint ; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such exhibitions.

(2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.

(3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications and Scientific works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.

(4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.

(5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.

(6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit ; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.

(7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

(8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.

(9.) By remunerating any person, who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members,

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The Trustees shall be elected from the Members of the Society, including Governors and Members of Council, and may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a member of the same, and shall have all the rights of Membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.

8. (a) The Council shall consist of thirty-four Members to be elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society. (b) From these thirty-four Members the Council shall elect a President and six Vice-Presidents, who shall be selected from the class of Governors only.

9. One-half of the Council shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society ; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each Member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.

12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.

13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members ; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each Member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December ; and a preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February ; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be read, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all Subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all

names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. All such ballot papers shall be signed by the Subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at 3 o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

19. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding year to 31st December shall be forwarded to every Subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

20. The Secretary shall report to the Meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.

21. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society; but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.

22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next monthly Council.

23. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room and Lectures, and, with one lady, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds and grand stand at all times.

24. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its Exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

25. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

BY-LAWS.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member ; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such Report and comment thereon ; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council ; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the Meeting.

3. The Council at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President or his deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which Meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

5. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

6. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

7. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

8. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

9. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

10. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

11. If before half an hour after the time at which any Meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if only one be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such Meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

12. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

13. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own Meetings, which shall be binding on the

Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns ; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibitions.

14. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whenever they shall think proper.

15. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

16. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

17. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

18. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or Members of the Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy ; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

19. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President ; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

20. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.

21. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows : (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies. (3) Finance Committee's Report. (4) Postponed business. (5) Correspondence. (6) Motions. (7) Notices of Motions.

22. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by, the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

23. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

24. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

25. Each committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion ; and any member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

26. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall sit until they have made their respective reports ; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

THE SECRETARY.

27. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

28. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same ; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

29. He shall have the custody of all books, models and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

30. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

31. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

32. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

33. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form —

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

34. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

35. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

36. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

37. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
