To the Members.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Council has pleasure in presenting the following report of proceedings of the Society for the year 1921.

**Permanent Buildings and Works.**

During the year no works of a major character were undertaken, but a large number of improvements to existing facilities were carried out.

The system of barriers at the railway exit gates was greatly improved, and withstood record traffic in a most satisfactory manner. The barriers at the luncheon room ticket windows and at the change boxes reduced to a minimum the overcrowding that usually takes place on the busy days of the show.

A very necessary extension was made to the ladies' room at a cost of £350. An artistic roof was erected over the Show Grounds Model.

About sixty additional feed stalls were built for the use of exhibitors, and a great number of additional seats were provided in various parts of the ground. A hot water service was also installed in the refreshment buffet that is situated in the machinery court.

In addition to the works enumerated were many of a minor character, which were all carried out with the object of improving the facilities for exhibitors and for providing additional comfort for show patrons. The total expenditure on permanent buildings and works amounted to £1509/19/1.

**The Exhibition.**

The Society's Jubilee Show was held from the 19th to the 24th of September. The prize money was considerably augmented, and the schedule of classes revised and extended.

A record entry was received, and temporary accommodation had to be provided in a number of sections. It is recorded with pleasure that the agricultural and dairy machinery exhibitors were again represented in full strength, and provided one of the most interesting features of the whole exhibition.

Though judging day opened with showery and generally unpleasant conditions, the weather throughout the show was moderately satisfactory. Light rain fell on the Wednesday, and, as this was followed with heavy rain throughout the night, the arena became a quagmire during the latter portion of the week.

The Thursday and Saturday were both very pleasant from a show patron's point of view, but the Friday was windy, cold and dusty, and generally unpleasant. Notwithstanding these conditions, record attendances were established on every day throughout the week except Friday, the aggregate of 212,916 being over 7000 ahead of the previous record attendance in 1919.

The gate money, including £1683/4/- from the grandstands, amounted to £16,341/7/3, being £4713/12/4 in excess of the highest amount previously taken. The added receipts were due in a large measure to the higher charge that was made for the admission of the public to the grounds, this charge having been raised from 1/6 to 2/-. The charge for the admission of children remained at 6d., as in previous years.

It will be observed that the entries in both light and heavy horses showed a substantial increase on the previous year's figures, and the judges were of opinion that the general standard of quality was quite equal to that of any previous show.

Beef cattle showed a marked advance in both quality and numbers, whilst the exhibition of dairy cattle was undoubtedly superior to that at any previous show.

Much greater support was accorded to the "Weekly Times" Butter Fat Test. Record entries were received, and very much greater interest was taken in the competition both by cattle exhibitors and the general public.

A very heavy entry was received in the sheep classes. Almost every section showed an advance on the previous year's figures. In this department of the show the quality was well maintained, and several judges expressed the opinion that no better exhibition of long-wool sheep had ever been made in Australia. Owing to the generosity of one of the Society's warmest supporters, the prize money in the Merino Section had been considerably increased, and both the quality and the number of exhibits in this section were far in advance of that received at any previous show.

A very much larger entry was received in the Swine Section, and competition in the various classes was very keen.

Record entries were received in the Poultry, Pigeon and Dog Sections, and greater interest seems to be taken in these sections every year.

There was also a slight increase in the Farm and Dairy Produce Sections, but no doubt owing to the time of the year in which the show is held, the exhibits that are displayed are not a true indication of the importance of the industries which they represent.

The interest was well maintained in the section for Women's Industries, and, as greater space was provided, this section was more popular than at any previous show.

Owing to the co-operation of the stock societies and interested individual breeders, a very generous list of prizes was offered in the judging competitions. These were very keenly contested, and were no doubt productive of much good in training the youths of the State in the judging of pure-bred stock.

The arena events were of great interest to the general public, and the competitions were carried on with a commendable swing, and with almost an entire absence of anything in the nature of a serious accident. The trotting contests were again exceedingly popular, and, as an added attraction, a very interesting exhibition of trotting was provided by the horse that is credited with having trotted the fastest mile in Australia.

The display of industrial exhibits and that of machinery of all kinds was of a most comprehensive character, and reflected the greatest possible credit on the standholders, who evidently vied with each other in their efforts to make the Jubilee Show the most successful that has yet been held by the Society.

Electric traction was for the first time substituted for the old steam service in the transportation of railway passengers to and from the show grounds, and the Railway Commissioners were congratulated upon the marked improvement that was thus provided. The manner in which the transportation of stock to and from Melbourne was conducted also left little to be desired.

### **The Draught Horse Stud Book of Australia.**

As intimated in last Annual Report, no further applications for registration in the Clydesdale Section of this book have been accepted, all entries submitted being examined as to their eligibility for inclusion in the newly established Commonwealth Clydesdale Stud Book. The additional produce of a number of registered mares has, however, been recorded for future reference.

The very few animals submitted for registration as other than Clydesdales would seem to indicate that, after the publication of Volume X., there will not be sufficient support to warrant the continuance of the Australian Draught Horse Stud Book, except perhaps as an unpublished official register of pedigrees and additional progeny of animals already registered therein.

The work of compiling Volume X. is now being done in conjunction with the compilation of Volume I. of the C.C.S.B.

### **The Commonwealth Clydesdale Horse Society.**

The first annual meeting of the Victorian Branch of this Society was held in July last, and Captain A. E. T. Payne was elected President, and Mr. H. Schwiager Secretary.

At the annual meeting of the Federal Council held the following evening, the same gentlemen were elected President and Secretary of that body, and it was unanimously resolved that entries for Volume I. should close on 31st October.

At that time there were only two branches of the Society (viz., New South Wales and Victoria), but since then additional branches have been formed in South Australia and Western Australia.

A very large number of entries for inclusion in Volume I. has been received, and the examination of all pedigrees submitted is now in hand; but it will be readily understood that the branch secretaries have a heavy task in securing all the necessary information to prove the eligibility of the stock submitted for registration by breeders in the various States.

Every endeavour is being made to prepare the entries received for submission to the Editing Committee, which was appointed at the Federal Council meeting, after which the publication of the volume will be proceeded with.

It is very gratifying to note the support that has been accorded the Society by breeders of Clydesdales throughout the Commonwealth.

## **Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia.**

Volume 13 of the Flock Book was published in June last, and contained the annual returns for 1920 of 340 flocks previously registered, together with histories and particulars of 40 new flocks.

Owing to the Council's decision to insist upon the registration of all British Breeds of sheep exhibited at the 1924 Show and thereafter, this volume contained the registration of three flocks of Suffolks and one of Dorset Horns, and further applications for the registration of flocks of these breeds have since been accepted for publication in Volume 14, which is now being compiled.

A number of new applications for the registration of other British Breeds have been passed by the Flock Book Committee during the year, and they also will be included in the new volume.

Owing no doubt to the very unsatisfactory state of the stud sheep market during the last few years, a number of owners neglected to furnish their annual returns, and, consequently, their flocks will cease to be regarded as registered, and will be omitted from the volume about to be printed.

The annual meeting of owners of registered flocks was held on the Thursday of show week, and was very well attended. At this meeting proposals made by the Australian Longwool Sheepbreeders' Association, having for their object the amalgamation of their publication and the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia, was very thoroughly discussed, but it was unanimously decided that no action be taken.

At this meeting a motion was also recorded expressing the satisfaction of breeders at the manner in which the Flock Book was being conducted by this Society.

The Committee again paid out of the Flock Book funds special prizes of £5/5/- each to the owners of the winning sires in the four Longwool Sections at the recent show, and they also increased the prize money in the Sheep Sections of the Youths' Judging Competitions to the extent of £24.

## **The Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia.**

The second volume of this Herd Book was published during the year, and contained not only the pedigrees of stock descended from animals registered in Volume I., but a large number of pedigrees of stock from herds not previously registered.

In August last an arrangement was come to, whereby the control of this Herd Book was handed over to the newly established Shorthorn Society of Australia, which Society undertook to refund to your Council the money it had expended in connection with the publication of Volume II.

The large number of entries received for the third volume, which closed at the end of the year, augurs well for the future success of this Herd Book.

## **The Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia.**

The thirteenth volume published by this Society was circulated during the year, and a large number of entries for Volume XIV., which closes on 1st February, has already been received.

This Society shows a substantial increase in members, who are keenly alive to their responsibilities, as is evidenced by the decisions which were arrived at at the annual and subsequent special meetings of members held during the year.

At the annual meeting it was at last resolved to publish in future volumes of the Herd Book the records of registered Ayrshire cows

tested under the Government Herd Testing schemes in the various States, and at the subsequent special meetings it was resolved to urge members to have their herds tested.

In addition to these decisions, which are undoubtedly in the best interests of the breed, it has been decided to institute a vigorous publicity campaign to endeavour to increase interest in the breeding of Ayrshire cattle throughout the Commonwealth. For this purpose a publicity officer and an enthusiastic committee have been appointed, and the registration fees are to be considerably raised to provide the necessary funds.

In order to provide for the extra clerical work occasioned by the increased support accorded this Society, and the greater number of entries received for each succeeding volume of the Herd Book, it has been agreed to double its contribution for secretarial services.

In addition to the sashes and trophies offered annually for competition at the leading agricultural shows in Australia, the sum of £32 was added to the prize money offered in the Youths' Judging Competition at the recent Jubilee Show.

If the policy recently adopted by the members of this Society is faithfully carried out, an increase in the already great popularity of the Ayrshire breed in Australia will undoubtedly become apparent in the near future.

### **The Australasian Jersey Herd Society (Victorian Branch).**

The ever-increasing number of members enrolled and the large entry received for each volume of the Herd Book is striking evidence of the success which has attended the efforts of the Council of this branch to extend the popularity of Jersey cattle in Victoria.

The number of entries sent to the Federal Council for inclusion in Volume IX. was by far the largest yet received, and entries for Volume X., which are restricted to the progeny of registered sires and dams, are coming to hand by every mail.

Owing to the increased amount of work necessitated by the growth of this branch, it has agreed to double its contribution to this Society for secretarial services.

The Federal Council has decided that from 1st January, 1922, the registration of birth of calves and transfers of registered stock shall be compulsory, under penalty—at the discretion of that body—of a fine or a refusal to register progeny of an animal not so registered or transferred.

This branch published its third booklet—copies of which were widely distributed—in addition to advertising the breed in various papers during the year, and offered for competition at the last show two valuable silver cups, as well as doubling the amount offered by the Society as prize money in the Youths' Judging Competition.

### **The Red Poll Cattle Breeders' Association of Australasia.**

The publication in September last of the first volume of the Red Poll Herd Book of Australasia was proof of the success achieved by the enthusiastic committee of this Association. The volume, which contains the pedigrees of 777 animals classified according to the rules and regulations of the Association, also includes a comprehensive history of the breed throughout the world in general, and Australia and New Zealand in particular, as well as the individual histories of herds in New Zealand, Queensland, New South Wales, Western Australia, Tasmania and Victoria, the prizes awarded to, and the milk and butter fat records of, the cattle registered in the volume, and complete indices, etc.

These, together with the fact that every bull in every pedigree has been registered, go to make a very complete book, which compares more

than favourably with the initial volumes of herd books published in Australia for other breeds of cattle.

At the annual meeting of this Association, it was decided to expend some of the surplus funds in propaganda work to further popularise the breed.

Among the entries already received for the second volume are many from herds which were not represented in Volume I., and, as applications for registration will be received for some months yet, a very large entry is assured.

The Association made satisfactory arrangements for the payment for secretarial services, and offered for competition at the Jubilee Show two pieces of plate for the best two-year-old and the Champion Red Poll bull exhibited.

### **The Friesian Cattle Club of Australia (Victorian Branch).**

The efforts of the committee appointed to establish a live branch of this club in Victoria have been very successful.

The branch was formally constituted in June, and already over 40 members residing in Victoria, Tasmania and King Island have been enrolled. A booklet was printed and circulated in September last, and the work of compiling another is now in the hands of the publicity officer.

A large number of applications for registration of animals in Volume III. of the Australian Friesian Herd Book has already been received, and, after the stock has been inspected, the entries will be forwarded to the General Secretary.

The financial position of this branch was considerably strengthened by the commendable action of a number of the original members forming a syndicate to import from New Zealand a number of Friesian females, the profits on the sale of which were donated to the funds.

This branch also doubled the prize money offered in the Youths' Judging Competition at the Jubilee Show, and offered £20 as a special prize to cover the expenses of a trip to the next Sydney show of the winner of this competition.

As the Friesian cattle in Victoria represent some of the best strains of blood in the world, and interest in this breed is daily increasing, the continued success of the Victorian Branch of the club is confidently anticipated by its members.

### **The Milking Shorthorn Cattle Breeders' Association of Victoria.**

The ever-increasing demand for the registration of the Milking Shorthorn cattle in Victoria, occasioned by the fact that the Government Herd Testing Scheme and the exhibition of cattle at the Royal Show is confined to registered stock, coupled with the failure of negotiations with the body controlling the Milking Shorthorn Herd Book, which is published in New South Wales, for a moderation of the regulations to permit Victorian foundation stock to be registered under similar conditions to those applying to the registration of foundation stock in other States, led to the formation of a Victorian Association for the purpose of establishing a separate herd book in this State, which may possibly be amalgamated with the older book later on.

At the request of this Association, your Council agreed to the secretarial work being undertaken by its staff. Rules have already been adopted and entry forms drawn up preparatory to calling for entries for the Victorian Milking Shorthorn Herd Book early in the new year.

### **Government Herd Testing Scheme.**

Early in December the Hon. the Assistant Minister for Agriculture convened a conference to consider the question of continuing to test pure-bred herds under the Government scheme at the fees then in force.

The conference was attended by representatives of the Australasian Jersey Herd Society (Victorian Branch), the Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia, the Friesian Cattle Club of Australia (Victorian Branch), the Red Poll Cattle Breeders' Association of Australasia, the Milking Shorthorn Cattle Breeders' Association of Victoria, the Chamber of Agriculture and this Society.

Having addressed the conference, the Minister stated that the Government felt that owners of herds being tested under the Government scheme should at least provide half the expense incurred in carrying out the work.

As this would mean an increase from 5/- to something like 35/- per cow tested, it was recognised that no definite proposal could be made at that conference, and it was decided that representatives of the various bodies should hold a meeting early in the new year to give further consideration to this matter before making a definite proposal as to how the financial position could be bettered without impairing the effectiveness of the scheme or reducing the number of cattle being tested.

### **The Chamber of Agriculture.**

The Nineteenth Annual Convention of the Chamber of Agriculture was held at Sale on the 12th, 13th and 14th of April, 1921. It was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor, the Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., and was attended by a large and representative gathering from all parts of the State. The debates were exceedingly interesting, and the papers that were listed for consideration were productive of very valuable discussions.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded to His Worship the Mayor of Sale, and to the President, Secretary and members of the Committee of the North Gippsland Agricultural Society for the courtesy extended to the members of this Society during their stay in Sale.

The outstanding feature of the work of the Chamber of Agriculture during the recent year has been in the direction of devising schemes for the improvement of the dairying industry in this State. The Chamber is also represented on the Board that has been appointed to control the Victorian Wheat Corporation.

### **Horse and Cattle Sales.**

The horse parade and sale of registered cattle conducted under the auspices of this Society was held at the Show Grounds on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 19th, 20th and 21st July, 1921.

This year the sale of both horses and cattle was confined to the one week, and the innovation was appreciated by all concerned. Previously the cattle sales had been held in May, and the horse sales in July.

A very good entry of 154 horses was received, as compared with 69 last year. The bidding was not very spirited, but nearly all the animals offered were sold at satisfactory figures. The entries for the cattle sale were not as numerous as last year, only 58 being received, as compared with 150. The sale of cattle was not as successful as could be desired, but breeders are realising that, owing to the restriction of entries for the show, the sales in connection therewith do not provide a sufficient outlet for their surplus stock, and consequently they must look for some other means of disposing of these animals.

The sales were well attended, and the arrangements for the convenience of patrons were satisfactory.

After paying all expenses, the profit on the fixture amounted to £45, as compared with a total loss on both horse and cattle sales last year of £19.

### **Agricultural Scholarships.**

The Society's scholarship for 1921 was awarded to Master W. R. Horne, a son of Mr. W. Horne, of Allansford. This student has made good progress during the year, particularly in the practical subjects.

Master J. R. Vicary, the holder of the 1920 scholarship, continues to make very good progress in all subjects.

It is regretted that up to the present there has been hardly any competition for these scholarships, the candidates not averaging more than two per annum.

### **Membership.**

It is gratifying to record that during the past four years the membership of the Society has increased by more than 25 per cent. This year the membership stands at 3953, as against last year's record number of 3857.

At last annual meeting it was decided to increase the life member's subscription from £10/10/- to £15/15/-, as soon as the jubilee grandstand was adequately financed, and it is expected that this decision will be brought into operation in the near future.

### **Extension of Show Grounds.**

At the end of the year, it was unanimously resolved by your Council to purchase the only remaining property between Lang's-road and Nyora-street. It is now hoped that there will be no difficulty in extending the Show Grounds to Epsom-road, and thereby making provision for the extra space that is so urgently required by exhibitors.

### **Jubilee Grandstand.**

The scheme that was launched in 1919 for financing the erection of a new members' grandstand has been warmly supported, and at the close of the financial year an amount of £12,460 had been promised, of which £11,864/7/- had actually been paid into the trust account which had been opened for this purpose.

At the time the appeal was launched, it was estimated that the work could be carried out for approximately £11,000, but prices rapidly rose, until February, 1921, when the estimated cost was £14,800. A further estimate was made at the end of the year, and this showed that the work was then likely to cost £13,497, indicating a reduction in price of £1303 during the year. Your Council is now further investigating this matter with a view to ascertaining the possibility of a further reduction in the cost of construction, and a decision as to whether the work will be undertaken as soon as the full amount has been subscribed or postponed until there is a further reduction in the cost of building will shortly be announced.

### **Farm Competition.**

Another Farm Competition was conducted in the Wimmera District under the auspices of the Society. Greater interest was displayed than in the previous year, there being eleven competitors, all of whom were prize winners in competitions conducted by their local agricultural societies. The competition was won by Mr. W. E. Dahlenburg, of Salisbury, who secured 236 points out of a possible 300, the second prize being awarded to Mr. F. W. Sallman, of Kornheim, who secured 233 points. The competition was again conducted most satisfactorily by Mr. H. A. Mullett, Senior Field Officer of the Department of Agriculture, and during the present season a similar competition is being held in the Mallee District, and Mr. Mullett is again adjudicating.

### **"William Farrer" Memorial.**

During the year an opportunity presented itself to the Society to consider the great services rendered to primary production in Australia by the late William Farrer, who was an agricultural scientist in the New South Wales Public Service, and whose chief life's work consisted of propagating improved varieties of wheat, the most notable being the variety known as "Federation," which is so extensively grown because of its heavy yielding qualities. It was resolved to make an effort to establish a fitting memorial to him, and a committee was appointed to devise a scheme with this object in view. As his services were Australian in character, a conference was convened during the week of the Royal Show, at which representatives from all the States were invited to be present. Every State was represented, and the proposals were fully discussed, and with slight modifications the scheme submitted was enthusiastically and unanimously agreed to. As a result of this, an appeal is now being made to growers of wheat in all the States to give at least one bag of wheat each towards the memorial fund for a period of three years. If this appeal meets with a generous response, a fitting memorial to this great scientist will be founded, and permanent good to primary production will result. An appeal to other primary interests will follow later. The objects of the proposed memorial are to encourage and reward (1) anyone within Australia who will develop a wheat or other cereal superior in yield and quality to any now in existence; (2) anyone who will improve or develop any indigenous grass; or (3) anyone who makes any worthy improvement, invention or discovery associated with primary production.

It is confidently hoped that there will be a liberal response to this worthy appeal.

### **The Journal.**

Copies of the "Australian Farm and Home" have during the year been regularly forwarded to members of the Society. This publication, with which is incorporated the Society's Official Journal, not only gives an accurate report of the proceedings of the monthly meetings of Council, but contains articles of educational value which are of interest to the rural producers of the community. The policy of this journal has during the year been consistently in advocacy of the improvement of the dairy herds of the State.

### **The Council.**

As the nominations for election at the annual meeting were not in excess of the vacancies on the Council, there was no poll, and the whole of the members whose seats had become vacant by effluxion of time were declared re-elected.

It is with very sincere regret that the death of one of the Society's trustees has to be recorded. Mr. John Mitchell, who was elected to the Council in 1906, passed away in July last after a somewhat lengthy illness. The loss to the Society of such a popular and highly respected member was felt most keenly, and resolutions recording your Council's sincere sympathy with the bereaved widow and family were unanimously adopted.

Captain A. E. T. Payne was appointed to the vacant trusteeship, and Mr. H. V. McKay was unanimously elected to the Council in place of Captain Payne.

In March last Mr. R. C. Bell tendered his resignation as a member of Council on the eve of his departure on a trip to Europe, and Mr. F. E. Clarke, of Bolinda Vale, Lancefield Junction (a son of the late Mr. Robert Clarke, who for so many years was probably the best-known cattle breeder in the Commonwealth), was elected to the vacant seat.

Messrs. O. J. Syme and R. O. Blackwood were granted leave of absence whilst they were touring abroad, and towards the end of the year both gentlemen were cordially welcomed on their return.

### **Acknowledgments.**

Your Council desires to extend to His Excellency the Governor-General and Lady Forster the Society's warmest appreciation of their interest in the Society's annual exhibition.

It is desired to thank His Excellency the Governor for officially opening the show, and, together with the Countess of Stradbroke, for the very keen interest they displayed in the whole of the operations of the Society.

Your Council is deeply sensible of the honour conferred upon the Society by the presence at the recent Jubilee Show of a number of distinguished visitors, including His Excellency the Governor of South Australia and Lord Northcliffe. To the Government of Victoria the Society is indebted for the continuance of the annual subsidy and for awarding special prizes in a number of competitions at the recent show. It is desired to acknowledge the Council's appreciation of the liberal support accorded to the Society by the donors to the prize fund. The Society's best thanks are due to the judges and stewards who performed their onerous duties in a most satisfactory manner. It is also desired to thank the press for keeping prominently before the public the whole of the operations of the Society, and to all others who assisted in furthering the interests of the Society your Council accords its warmest thanks.

### **Finance.**

On reference to the Financial Statement it will be seen that the revenue for the year was £37,149 3s. 6d. This amount includes subscriptions and donations to the Jubilee Grand Stand Trust Account of £4129 17s. Excluding this amount the revenue shows an increase of £3085 12s. 2d. on that of last year, after advances made by the Government and the Jubilee Grandstand Trust Account receipts last year have been deducted.

The expenditure (including £6651 19s. 6d. in prizes, £200 deposit on the purchase of property, and £1509 19s. 1d. for buildings and improvements) amounted to £33,887 15s. 11d., the Bank overdraft being decreased from £32,331 1s. 7d. to £29,069 14s. and the Society's indebtedness to the Government, inclusive of interest, decreased during the year from £43,459 5s. 7d. to £42,149 14s. 4d., whilst in addition a sum of £4175 17s. has been deposited in the Jubilee Grand Stand Trust Account.

Taking the expenditure in permanent improvements and the purchase of property as assets, the working expenses show a profit on the year's transactions of £4971 6s. 8d. as against last year's profit of £478 11s.




## HORSES.

### CLYDESDALE (MALES).

At the recent show the Clydesdale males were hardly up to the standard of the previous year, but in the aged class some very fine animals were shown. The champion stallion was a good big horse, possessing quality and height. He had nice action, and stood on good feet, with a nice length of pastern. He had good, flat bone and nice quality hair. He was a splendid mover, with a well-sprung rib, but slightly wanting from tail to crup, and a trifle coarse about the head.

The winner of the second prize in the aged stallion class did not possess the same quality as the winner, but had a good set of legs and feet, though rather weak in the knee. He possesses good, sloping pasterns and fair quality hair. He stands well up for height, but falls away somewhat on the back and coupling, but moves well and easily.

The three-year-old colt class was a very strong one, and the winner was an extremely good specimen of the breed. He was an excellent mover, and possessed good bone and hair of the first quality. The other prize-winners were also of good type. Nine two-year-olds entered the ring, but were hardly up to standard, though the first prize winner showed promise. This colt moved well in front, but was a little wide behind. There was a strong yearling class, which, with the exception of a few, were a very good lot. The winner of the first prize was a well-grown bay, that handled well. He was of good quality and size.


In the class for stallion and three of his progeny, "Douglas Chief" came along with a nice family of three.






**Champion Shire Mare, "Royal" Show, 1921.






**Champion Shorthorn Bull, "Royal" Show, 1921.




The Ayrshire females were stronger, on the whole, than the males. The champion cow, Rayda of Oakbank, was really a beautiful animal, and Messrs. McNabb Brothers are to be congratulated upon bringing out a cow of such merit. The reserve champion cow, Clarice of Gowrie Park, is a heifer that is hard to beat, and difficult to fault. In the other classes there were many animals showing good type and quality, and the Ayrshire breeders of Victoria may well be proud of the showing made in all the female classes.

The aged bulls were an even lot, but there was not one of outstanding merit amongst them. The three-year-old which won the championship is a very attractive bull, of good quality and excellent carriage. The two-year-old winner is a very nice even bull, of good quality. This class was, taken right through, a very good one. A very large class of yearling bulls was exhibited, many of them being of very good quality.

It was pleasing to note that amongst the young classes there was a big percentage of animals of the right type, showing capacity as producers, and not many of the small animals that have no constitution. There was a small percentage of the exhibits that should not have been shown, but there were not many, considering the large classes.

## AYRSHIRES.

W. Kirkham, Woodside, Lyndhurst.

The females were certainly a good lot, the younger classes showing most improvement. The champion cow was of especially good type, with plenty of size and constitution. The reserve champion cow was also beautifully even in type, but was a little on the small side. Another heifer that pleased me very much was *Baronia of Sparrovale*. She was of fine size, with a good udder, well set on, and had good teats. She should be a great milker. This is certainly the right class of cattle to breed.

Though the aged bulls were an even lot, I have, on previous occasions, judged better ones at Melbourne.

In the two and three-year-old classes some very good animals came forward. *Scottish Hero of Gowrie Park* is of nice style and length, and shows plenty of character. He should certainly become a good sire.

The yearling bulls were the best in the section, some very fine animals being brought into the ring. There was very little between the placed animals, and many other very good ones did not get a card.

There were some very interesting-looking youngsters, but some were too short and dumpy to use as a sire for getting milkers. A sire should be of good size generally.

## JERSEYS.

W. S. Conochie, Tingoora, Queensland.

Very satisfactory entries were received in most classes. The females were, on the whole, particularly good, but this could only be expected, when an analysis of the position the breed holds in the Government herd-testing is taken into consideration. The most typical animals were to be found in the classes for cows in milk. The bulls were not of such a high standard, and a want of breeding quality was evident in many of the animals exhibited.

The aged cow, *Golden Noble Duchess*, stood out an easy winner. She is a most beautiful specimen, and carries a typical Jersey bag, with four good teats, nicely placed. Besides winning the championship in this section, this cow was also successful in the "Weekly Times" Butter Test. *Hawthorn 4th of Banyule* was second and reserve champion. She carries a bag of great capacity, and would please the eye of any dairyman. That she is breeding on is evidenced by the fact that she is the dam of the champion bull.

In the aged dry cow classes some excellent animals were paraded. The three-year-olds brought out one of the choicest young females that was exhibited. She was *Dunalister's Perree's Quicksand*. She is full of Jersey quality, and, with good care, should have a good future.

In the classes for three-year-old dry heifers, *Molly 6th of Banyule* secured first place. She carries a nicely-balanced bag, with good teat setting.

Though the competition was not keen in the two-year-old in milk class, the prize winners displayed plenty of quality. In the younger classes the entries were large, and the competition good. In the male classes, competition was not so keen—in fact, there was a general weakness in all classes. The winner in the aged bull class—*Eminent, V.C.*—looked a dairy bull, but was rather badly shown.

The three-year-old bull classes provided the champion and reserve champion, in *Thorn of Banyule*, and *Jessemia's Imperial 5th of King's Vale*, respectively. The champion is a very stylish bull. He is a splendid mover, and has a nice outlook, but is a little plain in the head. In the younger classes a few good bulls were shown.





## GUERNSEYS AND DEXTER KERRIES.

R. G. Keys, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne.

I am pleased to report that there was a decided improvement in the numbers and quality of the exhibits in the Guernsey Section. Three excellent aged bulls were shown, and I had much difficulty in placing them. The winner was undoubtedly a very fine animal, and showed great quality and type. He was also of lovely color. This bull eventually won the championship, and a very promising bull from the three-year-old class took the reserve.

The cows in the aged classes were of excellent quality, and would be hard to beat in the Commonwealth, or even in Guernsey itself. The champion cow was a fine beast, showing plenty of quality, and was of beautiful color, and, best of all, she had a very fine vessel. Some of the heifers in the other classes also showed great promise.

## FRIESIANS.

George Newman, Wyreema, Queensland.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 32.)

The improvement, both in quality and in the number of entries, during the last three years has been marvellous. Only two aged bulls were exhibited, but both were very fine animals. Cordyline Colantha Hero, the winner, showed great quality. He secured champion honours at the last Sydney Show. Rock Patch, who won in the three-year-old class, was awarded the championship, whilst the reserve champion also came from the same class, and was awarded to Bolobek Archie. The latter is a very heavy bull, and lacks the refinement of the champion.

The first prize winner in the two-year-old bull class was imported from New Zealand. Second honours went to Bolobek Barney, a promising youngster, but shorter than the imported bull.

Ten yearlings were exhibited. The winner, Burnbank Inka Sylvia Dutch Boy, is a beautiful youngster, and will probably be champion in years to come.

Mr. Syme's Bolobek Aaggie won first prize for aged cow in milk. She is a very fine animal.

In the dry cow class the Department of Agriculture won, with Dominion Belle Corona. Miss Muller of Berry, who got second award, was calved in 1909, and is still in the pink of condition, showing the constitution of the breed, and also the result of careful feeding by her owners.

Of the two cows shown in the four-year-old dry class, the first prize was won by Bolobek Elsie, a fine looking cow, with milking qualities. The other cow looked like a non-breeder. There were ten entries in the three-year-old cow class. First prize and championship went to Flack and Sewell's Countess Lulu of Corfield (imp.). She shows great quality, and has the appearance of being a heavy producer.

Of the seventeen two-year-olds exhibited, the first prize went to Victoria Bellona, a very handsome heifer. The second prize went to Springfield No. 7, a good looking heifer, that was somewhat out of condition.

## BUTTER FAT TEST.

R. T. Archer, Department of Agriculture, Melbourne.

Sixteen cows competed, representing Jerseys, Ayrshires and Friesians. This was the largest number of competitors since the competition has been established.


Mr. C. D. Lloyd's imported Jersey cow, Golden Noble Duchess, that won the competition in 1918, was again successful. This year, for the first time, the Friesian breed entered this test, and the third cow was Mr. Waite's Dominion Segis Fobes. This cow gave the

largest total of milk, but the test was low, and she secured only third position in the competition. Compared with the yield of the winning cow, the result shows half a pound less fat from eighty pounds more milk. Of the cows competing, five Jerseys, two Friesians, and one Ayrshire gave over two pounds of fat per day. These yields were higher than that given by last year's winner, which was a Dairy Shorthorn cow. The test, so far, has been won three times by Jerseys, and once respectively by a Red Poll, an Ayrshire and Dairy Shorthorn. This year's test aroused considerably more interest than usual.




**Champion Guernsey Cow, "Royal" Show, 1921.**




## SHEEP.


were both very fine specimens of the breed. The winner, in the class for four-tooth rams, was awarded the reserve championship. He was another good sheep, very even all over, of splendid quality, and should make a good sire. In the pair class, competition was particularly keen, and many good sheep were exhibited. The two-tooth rams were very difficult to place, on account of their evenness. There was very little between the prize winners. The general standard of quality in this class was very high. The shorn sheep were a poor lot, and I would recommend that this class be deleted from the prize schedule.

## LINCOLN EWES.

A very fine lot of Lincoln ewes was exhibited. Competition was very keen, and many good sheep were left without recognition, notwithstanding that I gave as many as six cards in three classes, and seven cards in two classes. The champion and reserve champion were the first and second prize winners in the two-and-a-half-year-old class, and for a combination of wool and mutton have probably never been excelled at any previous Royal Show. Both showed great adaptability to fatten, a point that cannot be too strongly emphasised.



**Champion Lincoln Ewe, "Royal" Show, 1921.**



If lamb breeders selected thick, fleshy, square sheep, showing that adaptability to fatten, they would find that the Lincoln ram compared quite favourably as a fat lamb getter, on suitable country, with any other breed. The young sheep were splendid.

The winning four-tooth ewes were most beautifully woolled, and the two-tooth ewes were also of the very best. Still, there were a few ewes not in show condition. The exhibitors have every reason to be proud of the high class sheep they are now producing. The Lincoln is not a fine-woolled sheep, and it stands to the credit of breeders here that they have not made it so. For size, symmetry, constitution, thickness of flesh, adaptability to fatten and wealth of fleece, the exhibits at the recent Show would be hard to beat.

## BORDER LEICESTERS.

To have adjudicated where the classes were filled with such excellent sheep was a very pleasing task, and I do not remember having seen a better lot together in any show in Victoria or New South Wales. Victorian breeders are evidently paying plenty of attention to the sheep suited to the Australian climate, having constitution and size, with a good lock of high quality wool. Carriage and style, in some cases, were not quite satisfactory, and this is what a Border Leicester must have.

On the whole, the sheep placed before me carried their wool well up the neck, and on the belly. A well-sprung rib, with straight back, and well-developed leg of mutton, is imperative, as the Border Leicester is used chiefly to breed export lambs.

## ROMNEY MARSH.




The exhibits in the Romney Marsh Section were undoubtedly the best ever shown in Melbourne. Other visitors go further, and say it was the best exhibition ever brought together in Australia. The majority of the sheep were typical of the breed, and were shown to advantage.

In the aged ram classes the first prize winner, which also gained the championship, stood out well above a very typical lot of sheep. He is the best Australian-bred Romney Marsh ram yet exhibited in Victoria, and quite equal to the best of the English-bred sheep brought to Australia. The younger rams were a very nice lot, and some very high class sheep were amongst them. These should develop into rams of good type, with plenty of size and carcass quality, combined with a good fleece. Many of these will probably be successful at future shows.

The ewes were quite equal in quality to the rams, and practically all were typical show sheep. They were of very even type, with a quality characteristic of the breed. The younger ewes were particularly good in type, size and fleece. It must be very satisfactory to breeders and to those interested in Romney Marsh sheep to note the number of high class animals that were exhibited. Sheep of this character will eventually bring the breed to a high place amongst British breeders. The carcass value, early maturity of lambs got by Romney Marsh rams, combined with the quality and weight of fleece, is bringing this breed into favour.





## CORRIEDALES.

J. Tilley, Aringa, Port Fairy.

There was a marked increase in the number of exhibits this year, and the quality, on the whole, was good. Some excellent sheep were exhibited, that would hold their own in any show grounds. In several classes non-prize takers were only beaten by the smallest of margins, and there were some beautiful sheep amongst the successful exhibits. A few, that were evidently shorn late, showed rather a short staple, but the wool was of nice quality, fairly dense, and typical of the breed.

In a few classes unevenness of fleece was noticeable, but this occurs in all breeds. The interest displayed in this section clearly demonstrates that the Corriedales are gradually but surely coming into favour as general utility sheep, and the old-time prejudice is fast disappearing. Shrewd men now recognise their dual purpose advantages.

## MERINOS.

The prize winners, with one or two exceptions, were excellent representatives of the very highest class of Western District Merinos. Although the entries showed a marked increase on former years, competition was not good, most of the prize takers coming from the same place.

There were some very fine specimens of what might be called medium to strong wool sheep, and here the difficulty of judging between two such different types was evident. A few exhibits showed that the exhibitors had little knowledge as to what a show sheep should be. To these the opportunity of comparing their sheep with others should be instructive.

There is no doubt but that, to make a Merino Section successful, two classes will have to be made—namely, "fine" and "strong" wool—but up to the present the competition seems hardly to warrant an extension of the section.

## FAT SHEEP.




Champion Merino Ram, "Royal" Show, 1921.


Champion Merino Ewe, "Royal" Show, 1921.





### FLEECES.

Messrs. F. L. Purnell, 555 Collins-street, Melbourne, and N. Bickford, Victorian Producers' Co-operative Co. Ltd, Collins-street, Melbourne.

It is much to be regretted that such indifference is shown by the majority of breeders throughout this State towards the wool exhibit, more particularly when one considers that during the appraisement period over £40,000,000 was derived from the direct sale of our wool clip; and, further than this, it is almost impossible to accurately estimate the employment given, in various directions and branches of the business, to the population of Australia.

Considering that we have the best Merino wool in the world, it is astounding to have only two exhibits of this description, and these sent in by the same owner. There are four classes provided for Merino wool, and, knowing, as we do, the number of stud breeders, it would seem quite an easy matter for growers to forward fleeces for exhibition. This would not only provide interest in the matter of competition, but would also be of educational benefit to the onlookers among the smaller growers.

Very great credit is due to Mr. Austin for his untiring efforts each year in connection with the Merino exhibit, and also for the very excellent way in which he forwards his exhibits to the grounds.

An excellent idea is provided by Mr. Austin in the matter of preparing or packing his fleece for transit. In the first instance, a sheet of brown paper about the size of the entire fleece is spread on the skirting and rolling table. The fleece is then picked up from the shearing board, thrown, and spread over the brown paper. When this is completed, another layer of brown paper is placed on top; then, instead of rolling in the ordinary way, the fleece is rolled in a cylindrical manner. This not only facilitates the opening up, prior to judging, but also assures the owner of obtaining every possible ounce in the matter of weight. We might mention that, although this practice is recommended by us, we would like exhibitors to cover the parcel securely with hessian. The old style was to pack the fleece in ordinary sacks, but this is not a good plan, for the reason that dust and foreign matter collect during transit, while in many instances fleeces are known to lose some of their bloom. This is probably occasioned by constant handling on the railways.

Unlike the judging of last season, it was considered, in the interests of the trade and growers generally, that values should be placed according to world's parity. Although we were about to revert to auction conditions prior to the 1920 Show, no stable basis was then established, and for this reason we deemed it advisable to value according to the standard set out by the appraisal scheme.

In conclusion, we would like to draw your attention to the Crossbred exhibits. In Crossbred sheep there is a tremendous range in quality, and this range shows a very great variation in price, so much so, that, with the present basis of values, it is almost impossible for coarse quality fleeces to compete with other fine sorts, even though the coarse fleeces weigh considerably more than the fine ones. In view of this, we would suggest that the Crossbred Section be limited to fleeces of no finer quality than quarter-bred, i.e., 56's, spinning quality. The foregoing, if adopted, would make competition much keener, and, in all probability, doubly interesting to growers generally, and should increase entries.

After a careful inspection of several of the fleeces, we are of the opinion that some breeders forwarded last year's wool—in other words, fleeces that were practically twelve months old. Although there is no rule of the Society to prevent this, we would like, as far as possible, to discourage the practice, as growers and onlookers generally wish to see the product of the present season—not that of the previous one.

## BERKSHIRES.

J. Heard, Wyabun Park, Gisborne.

The three placed pigs in the fifteen-months-old boar class were well up to the standard of past years, there being very little to choose between the first and second prize winners. The winner of the class between nine and fifteen-months-old was an exceptionally fine animal, and afterwards gained the champion award. In the next two classes there were no less than sixty-two entries. Half of these animals were very good, but some of the others were badly marked, and had inferior heads and feet, faulty feet being also found in some of the other classes. In my opinion, some of the exhibits in the young boar classes were well up to the age limit. There was keen competition amongst the eighteen entries in the class for sows with litters. These were all up to the standard, and all of the litters were suckled, which is not always the case. The litters of the three placed sows were particularly fine. The champion and reserve champion amongst the sows came from the class fifteen months old and over. The champion was sold for 150 guineas during the Show.

It was a very difficult task to award the prizes in the class for sows between nine and fifteen months of age, and, of the twenty-six entered, there was little to choose between the six best. In the four months and under class, there were nineteen entries, and, with three exceptions, the exhibits were hardly up to standard. Some of them should never have been sent to the Show.

## YORKSHIRES AND TAMWORTHS.


P. J. Miller, Hillside, Ballarat North.


The aged boars and sows were a fine type of the medium Yorkshire breed, and would be hard to beat in any other show. The litters also displayed breeding and quality. The young boar class was only of fair quality, with the exception of the prize winners. Some were badly shaped, and inclined to be short. They were also small under the ears. The young sows had well-shaped, nice-sized ears, and the animals were of much higher quality.

Only a few Tamworths were exhibited, but they would be hard to beat for quality or breeding.


The judging competition for boys was very interesting, and should tend to teach the lads something that will be of value to them in the future.




Champion Berkshire Boar, "Royal" Show, 1921.

## POULTRY.

### LEGHORNS.

J. W. Sidebottom, Berkeley-street, Oakleigh.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 42.)

Some fine specimens of White Leghorn males were penned in the adult classes, the placed birds being of good quality, and the type and feathering excellent. In the young classes, the quality was not quite so high.

Several fine specimens were exhibited in the female classes, where large entries had been received. There were, however, a number of birds that were out of condition. A few fair specimens were penned, in both the male and female classes, for Brown Leghorns, but the color in this breed was not up to the standard. With the exception of the winning hen, the Black Leghorns were poor in quality. Blue Leghorn males were of only moderate quality, but some of the females were very fine-colored birds.

In the classes for trios, some first-class birds were penned, and the general standard of quality was high. These classes were probably the best that have ever been exhibited in this State.

### WYANDOTTES AND ORPINGTONS.

G. Dwyer, Lisson-grove, Hawthorn.

(Complete awards in these Sections will be found on page 42.)

The Wyandottes and Orpingtons were of fair average quality. Wyandottes particularly were well represented. The first prize silver cock is the typical Wyandotte, with good lacing. The colour was not so satisfactory. Not one bird in the classes had a clear silver back.

The classes for cockerel and pullet breeding trios warranted their inclusion, their educational value being undoubted.

With the exception of the cockerels, the Black Orpingtons were good. Some of the cockerels lacked type, and those having the typical shape showed the undesirable purple bars across the feathers.

White Orpingtons were not numerous, but the winner in each class was typical, full of quality, and penned in beautiful condition.

The Blue Wyandottes were of nice, even color, but failed somewhat in type.

Some good birds were exhibited in the farmers' trio classes. Some of the birds in the winning pens could not be purchased at the breeders' farms at the fixed price of the trio. It is, therefore, difficult to understand why there were not more sales. A number of birds were infested with vermin. This is not fair to the Society, as the benching is likely to become infested also. Neither is it fair to the judges, who have to handle the birds, nor to the owners of clean birds. I would recommend that a regulation be framed, penalising the owners of verminous exhibits.

Permit me to draw attention, also, to the unequal tasks allotted to the judges of poultry. It was not possible for all to complete their work of adjudication until nearly three o'clock. I would strongly recommend that additional judges be appointed in this section.

## RHODE ISLANDS AND PLYMOUTH ROCKS.

P. Briggs, Chesterville-road, Moorabbin.

(Complete awards in these Sections will be found on page 46.)

The Rhode Island Reds and the Plymouth Rocks were amongst the outstanding features of a magnificent show of poultry. Both breeds had large entries, and the quality was really first class. The red cocks and cockerels excelled in type, and were of a vivid, even shade of red throughout. They were not too dark, which is becoming a prevailing fault. The hens and pullets were rather disappointing, as, though of good color, many failed on account of size.

Though limited in number, the rose-comb reds were of good quality, as were also the whites.

The Plymouth Rock classes brought together about the best display of this breed that has ever been seen in Melbourne, and it was a most difficult task to award the prizes, as the exhibits were sound in color, and had fine, clean-cut barring from head to tail. By an almost unanimous vote of the judges, the winning cock was considered to be the best bird in the whole Show.

The White Rocks were very good indeed, both in type and colour, as well as in condition, but they do not appear to make much headway in popularity.

## LIGHT UTILITY POULTRY.

Sydney Buscumb, 39 Katawa-grove, Brunswick.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 47.)

Entries in the light utility classes were smaller than in the previous year, and the quality, too, was only fair. One or two birds, however, were particularly fine. The White Leghorn cockerel and pullet were both excellent birds, but others were somewhat below the standard. Many men who are making their living from poultry do not seem to realise what they are missing by not bringing their birds before the public at the shows.

## FANCY PIGEONS—PART I.

E. Furness, 163 Brougham-street, Kew.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 49.)

The staging of the birds left nothing to be desired, and, as the light was also good, judging was a pleasant task. The carrier classes were not well supported, and there is room for improvement in type, also. Though Pouters were of fair quality, none were of exceptional merit. Dragoons made a nice show, most of them being good in beak and straight in face. Show Homers were of good quality, on the whole, the Blue Ribbon winner being a Black Chequer, of great substance of beak and even sweep of skull. There were several very promising birds amongst the Show Homers.

Magpies were well supported, and are a very popular variety. The most notable birds were the winners in the adult black cock classes. They had typical heads, and had good reach and style. The cup winner amongst the young Magpies is a truly typical specimen, possessing the points required by the standard.

African Owls were a nice collection, the chief prize winners being good in head and beak, and neat in body. The Nuns were a fair lot. Several were good in the crests, but wanting in markings.

## FANCY PIGEONS—PART II.

G. Heath, 9 South Audley-street, Abbotsford.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 49.)

The exhibition of pigeons was a splendid one, and the conditions under which they were shown were ideal. The decorations in the pigeon house gave the place quite a gala appearance, and everything was greatly appreciated by the crowds who visited this section of the Show. The pigeon superintendent was courteous and obliging in the discharge of his duties.

The Jacobins that were exhibited were a particularly fine lot, and the winner in the young bird classes was considered the best young bird in the Show. The Long-faced Tumblers made quite a show in themselves, and some fine typical birds were exhibited. Short-faced Tumblers were also well up to the standard.

Some beautiful White Fantails were penned. The winner of the cup for the best young bird was a particularly fine specimen.

## DOGS.

### DIVISION A (OTHER THAN TOY DOGS).

W. H. Doherty, 93 Elizabeth-street, North Richmond.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 54.)

Twenty Collies were shown, and they made a good display. The quality of the prize winners was very high. The Old English Sheep Dog was disappointing, and was not of sufficient merit to warrant the first prize being awarded. The winner in the Great Dane class was quite the best dog that we have seen for a long time. The winning bitch was also a very fine one, but not quite so good in the head.

The twenty-one Retrievers made a fine show. The champion dog and bitch were a good pair in a very fine class, both of the exhibits being in nice working condition.

Many of the Kelpies were shown altogether too fat, but there were quite a lot of good ones exhibited. The champion Cattle Dog was in fine working condition, and the champion bitch won somewhat easily. She was shown in nice bloom, and good head, body, legs and feet. Some of the others were in bad condition, being much too fat. Some of the Whippets were somewhat deficient in quality, being too straight on top.

Whilst the Deerhounds were few in number, they were all of good quality, the champion dog being an extra fine upstanding hound. The two Borzois dogs exhibited were fit to win in good competition, even though they were not in full coat. Most of the Greyhounds were on the small side, but still, of nice quality.

## PRODUCE.

### OATS, BARLEY AND PEAS.

James George, Mt. Alexander-road, Ascot Vale.

(Complete awards in these Sections will be found on page 58.)

Very good samples of Algerian oats were shown, and were quite up to the average of previous years. Tartarian oats are not regarded with so much favour by farmers as they were a few years ago.

The half-bushel (Imperial measure) of the prize-winning exhibit in the stout white oats class weighed 26 lbs. net. There is no standard

fixed for stout white oats, but milling Algerian oats are fixed at 40 lbs. per Imperial bushel, and feed Algerian at 37½ lbs. A very great difference in standard weight was, therefore, apparent between the exhibits of white oats and Algerian.

The English barley exhibits were of the highest quality, but the colour had been spoiled, probably by rain.

Some years ago there was a good sale for peas at from 3/6 to 5/- per bushel, but now the prices are from 7/- to 10/- a bushel, on account of scarcity.

### MAIZE.

James Fisher, Orbost.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 58.)

The maize exhibit was fully equal to the average of the last few years. An improvement was noticeable in the Yellow Dent cob classes. White maize was well represented, and showed little or no sign of cross fertilisation. Though only one entry in the Flint variety class, it was well worthy of first prize. The sweet corn was not all that could be desired in the matter of size.

### FARM PRODUCE (EXCEPT CEREALS AND POTATOES).

Hugh Pye, Agricultural College, Dookie.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 58.)

I was somewhat disappointed at the paucity of entries in the seed classes. Seed growers should recognise that the Royal Agricultural Society gives the opportunity to show what Victoria can produce. There was only one entry for Canadian Wonder beans, but it was a very fine sample. In respect to collections of seeds, it may be an advantage if standardised jars or bottles were available for displaying the seed.

There were only two entries each for linseed fibre and flax, but all were good, the winning exhibit being a little heavier per bushel.

Some good well-cut samples of oaten and wheaten chaff were exhibited. These were free from dust, but in the oaten chaff classes there were samples with a great preponderance of oats, of which probably not more than 2 per cent. were cut by the chaffcutter.

In respect to the collections of grass seeds, neither came within the sphere of a practical exhibit. Still, both showed considerable effort in the collection of small seed samples of indigenous grasses. Keen interest was displayed in both of the collections of grasses that were exhibited.

The first prize pumpkin gained the prize on account of it being more even in shape and density than the exhibit that gained second prize. The latter was about 2 lbs. heavier than the first prize exhibit.

The margin separating sweet from sour silage was very fine. I favoured the most evenly fermented exhibit, showing quality and palatability. I am of opinion that if score cards were available, noting the principal points taken into consideration, exhibitors would be better guided in the selection of their samples.

### TABLE VEGETABLES.

G. T. Allnutt, Melrose, Dromana.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 59.)

The vegetables were of good quality, but the entries were somewhat small, no doubt on account of the long interval between the closing date for entries and the opening of the Show. If arrange-

ments could be made for a carrier to attend the Queen Victoria Market to receive exhibits on the morning of the Show, I think greater entries would be received.

## POTATOES.

G. Seymour, 265 Tooronga-road, East Caulfield.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 59.)

There was a marked all-round improvement in the quality and preparation of the exhibits, compared with those in 1914, when last I judged. The display of exhibits in open trays, or placed upon the benches, greatly facilitates the work of adjudication, besides adding to the attractiveness of the exhibition.

The judging was carried out on the point system adopted on the previous occasion. Competition in all classes was very keen. The first prize for the collection of varieties gained the maximum number of points, and was a particularly attractive exhibit. I would suggest that in future exhibits in the Potato Section securing 80 points or over, which are not awarded a prize, shall be given a certificate, according to merit, and the points set out on a card placed on each exhibit. The difference between the three prize winners and the unplaced exhibits is sometimes very trifling.

The grouping of varieties according to type has proved very satisfactory, and was the means of bringing to light an exhibit of the variety Factor, which secured third prize. The seed from which this parcel was grown was originally imported from Scotland by the Department of Agriculture.

## AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES' COMPETITION

CEREALS, GRASSES, OTHER GRAINS AND SEEDS, FLOUR, MEALS, HAY, CHAFF AND SILAGE.

W. Champion Hackett, Dequettville-terrace, Kent Town, South Australia.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 60.)

The exhibits upon which I adjudicated made a very fine and attractive display. The quality of most of the produce was of a very high standard of excellence, and I would specially mention the very fine collection of wheat and maize from Wagga; also the grasses and different varieties of hay from the same district. Lucerne hay and chaff, in most cases, were exceptionally good, as was also the silage.

In the Whittlesea exhibit the hay, chaff and silage secured the maximum number of marks, as did also the flour and wheat products in the Bacchus Marsh exhibit. The grass and garden seeds were also very fine samples.

There was a good exhibit of flax from Sale, and some fine samples of broom millet were shown in more than one collection.

The maximum points allowed for flour and meals are 50, and an attractive display may be made of these; and, in my opinion, they should be staged separately from the cereals. Under this heading may be shown maize meal (yellow and white), buckwheat meal, lentil meal, bean meal and Kaffir corn meal. In some cases "crushed" grain was shown instead of ground meal; consequently, points were deducted.

Some attention might be paid to the arrangements and display of the exhibits in these sections, so as to facilitate the work of adjudication, and to enable the farmers and others to examine them

more carefully. In view of the fact that 295 points are allowed for cereals, grasses, flour, meals, hay, chaff and silage, these exhibits should command more prominence and space than at present, particularly as it is an agricultural society's competition, and, therefore, agricultural produce should predominate.

In staging the maize, it is desirable that the cobs and shelled corn should be placed close together. I would suggest that the Council considers the desirability of stating in the schedule of prizes a minimum quantity of grain to be shown. The schedule states that exhibitors are requested to supply complete lists of all produce shown; so far as I am aware, only one of the exhibitors (Wagga) complied with this request.

### DAIRY PRODUCE AND FOODS.

T. Robertson, c/o. Messrs. Fletcher, Chester and Co., Elizabeth-street, Melbourne.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 60.)

The samples of butter in the district exhibits were generally of good quality, but one or two had rather a strong briny flavour. This can be overcome by more care being taken in the salting. In other cases the moisture was too great.

The cheese samples were rather disappointing, as most of the exhibits were on the new side, and the texture was tough and leathery. A rich fat texture is required for best results, especially for maturing. The flavour in some instances, was distinctly acid. I would also like to impress upon exhibitors that the cheese cloth must be allowed to remain on, otherwise the cheese is apt to split and break.

The cream and milk exhibits were of a high standard of quality.

Only a small portion of preserved meats was exhibited. Evidently the majority of districts regard this as a side line.

The bacon and ham exhibits, in three out of four entries, were factory cured, and hardly gave the other exhibit a chance to obtain anything like equal points. The small exhibit of farm cured bacon was of good quality, but badly butchered.

I would like to suggest that the factory exhibits be only entered for exhibit purposes, and the points for quality be given to farm cured goods only.

Eggs were of first-class quality, and in three out of four exhibits were well graded.

The home-made bread, scones, etc., were of good quality, and I would especially like to mention the one shown by the Wagga district as being a particularly good and clever display.

### FRUITS, PICKLES, SAUCES, VEGETABLES AND ROOTS.

J. W. Bailey, Narre Warren.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 60.)

The fruits, pickles, vegetables, etc., that I judged, were well and attractively staged, although not always in the best positions for judging. The latter disability is no doubt unavoidable when one considers the desire of the exhibitors to make the display as attractive-looking as possible.

Some of the exhibits of bottled and fresh fruits were very creditable indeed.

## EFFECTIVE ARRANGEMENT.

J. C. Gardner, c/o. F. T. Bullock Pty. Ltd., High-street, Prahran.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 60.)

In the Whittlesea exhibit the view was made flat in the background, and nothing stood out boldly in it. All neutral colours were used in decoration, and they did not blend very well. The bottle stand was very large and blocked the view, thus spoiling the general finish.

The background of the Bacchus Marsh exhibit was good and nicely spaced, and the colors well blended. The handling of vegetables was also very well done. The sectional stands at the ends were well arranged. The centre stand would be improved by not making it solid looking, slightly altering the shape, and making it smaller. The general finish, however, left little to be desired.

Though the general appearance of the North Gippsland exhibit was good, it was not up to the standard of that of Bacchus Marsh. Sectional stands could be better arranged, thus making a better general finish. Some of the tickets were very poor, torn paper written in pencil being put on some of the chaff exhibits.

The Wagga exhibit was spoilt by having a glass show case in front, which blocked the view. This very fine case could well have been placed to one side; by so doing it would not have spoilt the sectional arrangements. The ticketing left nothing to be desired, but the bottle stand was not very good, and rather spoilt the general appearance.

Taking the displays as a whole, I would like to point out that, in labelling the jars of fruit, etc., the plain white tickets, typewritten, as in the Wagga exhibit, looked very much superior to the others on account of their uniformity. This is, of course, within the exhibitor's province, not of the man who displayed the goods. I also think that the bottle stands could be improved by making them narrower.

## STATE SCHOOL COMPETITIONS.

### FODDER CROPS, GRAIN AND POTATOES.

J. H. Refshauge, Agricultural High School, Ballarat.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 60.)

Taken as a whole, the exhibits were well up to the average standard of merit of previous years, and in several sections, notably the grains and fodders, superior to those of previous years.

There seems to be considerable doubt amongst the exhibitors with regard to sorghums. I think it would be advisable, in the next schedule, for the varieties to be set out; then samples of millets would not be shown as sorghums, and vice versa.

The exhibit of potatoes showed considerable improvement, and greater care was shown in naming varieties correctly. The exhibits were worthy of the show. The only regret I have is that more of the primary schools do not send in exhibits.

### FORESTRY, FRUIT TREES AND VEGETABLES.

W. H. Callister, Shepparton.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 60.)

The exhibit in the fruit section consisted of oranges and lemons. Though not really first-class, they represented a very commendable

effort on the part of the pupils who grew them. A school ground is not the easiest place in the world to grow fruit. The quality of the dried fruits shown was very good.

In forestry, the eucalypts and the acacias were, as usual, fairly well represented. The trees were healthy, well grown, well shaped and suitable for transplanting. The pines and the pepper trees, which afford excellent shade in summer and shelter in winter, and which are easily grown, were conspicuous by their absence. The sugar gum is generally first favourite in this section, but it cannot be recommended for school grounds. The wood is of little value, the limbs fall easily, and very often the tree runs up like a mast. *Acacia saligna* and *acacia cyanophylla* afford good shade and shelter, and make rapid growth. They can be recommended for school grounds where water is not available for irrigation.

The vegetables shown included melons, pumpkins, marrows, carrots, parsnips, onions, red beet, rhubarb, leek, peas and broad beans, all evidently grown by experts. The general quality was very good, while the carrots, parsnips, turnips, onions and beet were excellent. The practice of teaching children to grow vegetables is one that cannot be too highly commended. There is no food more beneficial to the health, or more necessary, than vegetables, and everybody knows that home-grown vegetables are sweetest.

#### FORAGE AND ROOTS, GRASSES, CLOVER, HONEY AND FLAX.

W. F. Friday, Agricultural High School, Sale.

(Complete awards in this Section will be shown on page 61.)

The exhibits judged were good specimens, but the entries were few in many cases. Competition was, therefore, narrowed down, and the awarding of prizes was an extremely easy matter. Since some schools are able to send splendid exhibits, it is surprising that more schools do not compete. Some stimulating influence appears to be necessary to arouse interest in this great annual competition.

As in most things, I presume that enthusiastic and sound organisation would bring about the desired result. If the teachers will only lead the way, it is certain that the pupils will follow wholeheartedly.

Some good roots were shown, but there was lack of uniformity in several cases. Probably this was due to the fact that the specimens were grown on very small plots. The roots were well preserved.

Some very fine specimens of introduced grasses were shown. Most of these were made up neatly, but others were presented in a rather rough condition. Exhibitors should bear in mind that neatness assists very materially in securing first prize.

The exhibits in native grasses were very poor indeed. Only one native grass was set up, and it was not named. The other specimens were introduced grasses. It is to be hoped that the Wagga exhibit, and the splendid display of native grasses made by Mr. Baker, of the Agricultural Department, will help to awaken new interest in our native grasses.

There was better competition amongst the clover and lucerne exhibits. Many good specimens were shown. The colour was good in most cases, and good methods of preservation were evidently employed.

Some very good honey was shown, but the number of exhibits was small. There were only two exhibits of honey-in-wax (10lbs.), but as one of these weighed only 5½lbs., it failed to comply with the conditions laid down. Where weight is asked for, exhibitors should

see that good weight is given. One exhibit in wax was neither white nor yellow. Here, again, conditions were not complied with.

Good specimens of flax were shown. It is to be regretted that the full length of crops was not always shown. The pulled crops would, I think, be best for exhibition purposes. Good length of fibre is very important when crops are grown mostly for fibre.

### CHEESE.

G. C. Sawers, Department of Agriculture, Melbourne.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 61.)

The entries were more numerous than in the previous year, but the general exhibits, with the exception of the prize-winning cheeses, were not too clean in flavour, and many showed open textures. Even one of the first prize lots lost a point in texture through the latter fault.

I presume a great deal of the cause is due to the short hours introduced into our cheese factories in this State, the makers being compelled to rush the work through, and not giving the curd sufficient time to mature before placing it in the hoops. This results in a weak body and open texture, and with age the flavour starts to deteriorate and become tainted.

I would recommend, on future occasions, that the Society have cards printed for each competitor, giving points awarded and brief remarks.

### BUTTER.

P. J. Carroll, Rialto, Collins-street, Melbourne.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 62.)

It was a very great pleasure to me to find such a substantial increase in the number of entries staged in the various butter classes at the recent show.

Factory butter suitable for export was represented by 19 exhibits, comprising butters from New South Wales and South Australia, as well as Victoria. The butter was a very fine lot, and with two exceptions only, scored first-grade points at time of examining—some six weeks after date of manufacture. Great care seemed to have been exercised in the selection of the cream, and the butter was well manufactured and suitably packed.

Print and powdered butter exhibits were equally satisfactory in respect to quality and manufacture, as well as packing. I am of the opinion that if the same care and attention were given to the manufacture of butter generally in the factory as was apparently given in these instances, Victorian butter would stand in much better flavour than it does to-day, and Victorian dairy farmers would be richer by many thousands of pounds sterling.

Notwithstanding the extraordinary care that was exercised in the manufacture and preparation of the butters comprising the exhibits in the export class, the winning butter, which was exhibited by the Murrumbidgee Irrigation Butter Factory, stood alone as an example of perfect manufacture and finish, and it was in this respect that it gained the advantage over the other good butters.

The class which provided for the selection of the exhibit from the selling agents' floor was the one calling for most comment, and the one, unfortunately, which must be taken as the criterion for basing the quality of the work performed in the butter factory under ordinary working conditions. These samples, being selected from the

ordinary manufacture of the factory, would naturally represent the average workmanship of that factory, and I can say without hesitation that the samples were such as to make one feel ashamed of the system that permitted such slipshod methods. The matter has received considerable publicity in the press, and I am pleased to say that much good has already resulted, and a very decided improvement has been shown in the packages, as well as the methods employed in the packing of the butter.

#### BACON, HAMS, LARD AND EGGS,

E. Setchell, 71 Ourimba-road, Mosman, N.S.W.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 62.)

I was rather disappointed at the small number of exhibits. Otherwise, I found a collection of hams and bacon of the very highest quality and flavor. I am of the opinion that the breeding of the better class pigs in Victoria is reflected in the high quality bacon and ham that is produced.

I think 12 weeks would be ample time to store the side of bacon that is now lodged with the Society six months before the show. The farm-cured hams and bacon were very fair, both in quality and condition. Some of the meat was slightly dark, no doubt due to the use of fresh pickle. Brine about eight weeks old gives better results, both as regards keeping and colour.

#### WINES—GROWERS' CLASSES.

I regret that the number of entries in the Growers' Classes was somewhat small, but in many cases the excellent quality made amends for the fewness in number.

The outstanding features are the full-bodied dry red wines, which maintain the character that has made Australian export wine so famous. Every sample entered in the red sweet wine classes was also a credit to the vigneron who produced it.

#### FRUITS.

W. Farquhar, Black Flat.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 63.)

The fruit section as a whole was first-class. The arrangements for staging were good, and this section made a very fine display. Most of the fruit that was shown was nearly perfect in condition, and the competition very keen. I would suggest that, for the district collection, 20 varieties should be asked for, and that four should constitute a dish.

#### CITRUS FRUIT.

F. A. Cock, Percival-street, Bendigo.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 64.)

The citrus exhibits were not numerous, and with the exception of the general collection, were hardly up to show standard. The three collections were exceedingly good, both in type and quality. Wrongly-named varieties were noticeable, both in the individual classes and the general collections. The correct naming of varieties should receive more consideration.

Considering the importance of the citrus industry to this State, the number of exhibits was disappointing. Probably a more comprehensive section, which would include district exhibits, also case lots, both in oranges and lemons, would be worthy of consideration, especially if backed up by the Agricultural Department's special prize, or the Society's champion badge or medal. Citrus fruits cannot be properly judged on outside appearance; consequently, one fruit in each variety was halved, and the exhibit judged on the following points:—uniformity, size, colour, blemishes, rind pulp, core, rag and correct name.

### CANNED FRUIT.

E. Meeking, Department of Agriculture, Melbourne.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 64.)

Both exhibits of canned fruits were of very high character. The apricots and pears exhibited by the Shepparton Preserving Co. were slightly better so far as uniformity and size was concerned, but this exhibit lost points in the peach exhibit by making little or no difference between first and second grades in the number of pieces in the cans. Shepparton secured points over the Australian Jam Company by better grading of their apricots and pears, and by using labels with a grade designation. In both exhibits of apricots, many of the fruits were over-cooked. This was caused through under-ripe and ripe fruits being packed together in tins, and resulted in the clouding of syrup and wrinkling of skins.

### HORTICULTURE.

G. Cooper, Alexandra-avenue, Melbourne.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 64.)

I was particularly impressed by the show of palms and aspidistras, and a new selaginella. The last-named was particularly good, the foliage being a beautiful peacock blue. Window box was also an excellent exhibit, while that of two collections of plants was also most attractive.

As there was an improvement in the number of entries received this year in the horticultural section, and as the space allotted for this display was the same as in previous years, exhibitors had difficulty in staging their plants to advantage. They were so crowded that the public were unable to pick out the plants in the different sections.

Permit me, therefore, to suggest the removal of the horticultural section to some other part of the building next year, when a larger area might be obtained and a much better display made.

## WOMEN'S INDUSTRIES.

### PLAIN NEEDLEWORK.

Mrs. Harvey-Smith, Upper Beaconsfield.

(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 65.)

The exhibits in plain needlework were very numerous, and showed a satisfactory improvement upon the work that had been exhibited previously. I have never before judged work of such efficiency and of such a very high standard as has now been attained. It is unnecessary to single out exhibits for special mention, for, with very few exceptions, all were of the very best workmanship, and executed in good style.

## FANCY NEEDLEWORK.

Miss Holden, The Stitchery, The Block, Collins-street, Melbourne.  
(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 66.)

The fancy needlework did not quite come up to my expectations. Both classes, in the collection of fancy work, were very fine. The embroidered photograph frames and handbags were fair. The majority of the cotton crochet work was excellent, whilst the table centres, both in color and white embroidery, were exceedingly fine and artistic.

Both classes in handkerchiefs were well done, as were also supper cloths and pillow shams. Mount Mellick was not quite up to the standard, but Richelieu and eyelet work were especially well done. Cosies and sofa cushions were, on the whole, very crude in colour, design and workmanship. Embroidered d'oyleys and guest towels were finely worked. The smocking was exquisite, and the tatting, point lace and collection of lace were very beautiful. I would like to suggest an alteration in the cushion class:—To substitute two classes for the unmounted linen cushion cover—one for the most artistic sofa cushion, and the other for a worked sofa cushion (no braid, etc., to be used).

The work was excellently displayed, and the ladies who acted as stewardesses are entitled to great praise for the manner in which they dealt with the exhibits.

## ARTS AND CRAFTS.

Miss Tronson, 69 Drummond-street, Carlton.  
(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 67.)

The arts and crafts exhibits were quite up to the usual standard. The new velour painting had several samples of work, but I was sorry to see that there were no entries for poker work this year, considering that it is so popular at the present time. I would like to see more entries in the different classes from country exhibitors, who generally make a good display of work at their local agricultural shows. There were several excellent samples of hand-spun yarn which were deserving of great praise.

## FOODS.

Miss F. Pell, 98 Wellington-street, St. Kilda.)  
(Complete awards in this Section will be found on page 68.)

The glass-fronted show cases provided adequate space for the exhibits, and allowed the public to see all of the entries without undue effort, and, at the same time, kept foodstuffs from exposure to flies, dust, etc.

On the whole, the high standard achieved was well maintained, and in many classes increased entries were received. Bread-making, sponge, plain and fruit cakes, plum puddings and shortbread stand out as being very fine. In the lemon butter judging was difficult, as many exhibits were very close. The chutney was very fine, as was also the collection of jellies. Preserved fruits provided a showy class, and although limited in the number of bottles of each kind, the exhibit lost nothing from the competitive or spectacular point of view.

There were five entries in the "One Woman's Work" class, and the space allowed for each seemed too small by half. I would like to submit for consideration two matters:—The possibility of keeping the show open at least one more day; make it a children's day, and let all the schools have the advantage from an educational side. Secondly, have a separate school section for needlework and cookery.

# RULES.

1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Stock Raising and Industrial Resources of the State—

- (1.) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
- (2.) By holding meetings for the purpose of popularising rural life and disseminating knowledge of improved methods and new ideas in relation thereto.
- (3.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies, and collecting information for the furtherance of the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By promoting the discovery, investigation, and introduction of improved kinds of agricultural implements and machinery, the better equipment and construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (5.) By promoting the discovery, investigation, and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (6.) By collecting and distributing information on all subjects concerned with the objects of the Society, including the preparation and publication of Flock Books, Herd Books, Stud Books, Pamphlets, Essays, and Papers, and by the establishment and maintenance of a Library and Reading Room for the use of Members.
- (7.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants and taking measures to encourage the prevention or eradication of such diseases.
- (8.) By remunerating any person for original research work leading to the advancement of the objects of the Society.
- (9.) By the purchase of live stock for breeding purposes and allowing farmers and other rural workers the use thereof for improving the standard of live stock.
- (10.) By promoting or assisting any scheme for herd testing and remunerating any person for his services in connection therewith.
- (11.) By promoting or assisting competitions in regard to farm crops and other primary production, implements of husbandry and improvement of the conditions and methods of rural work.
- (12.) By promoting or assisting any other work which may be regarded by the Council of the Society as being beneficial to primary production or the improvement of live stock.
- (13.) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, four Trustees (three of whom shall be appointed as hereinafter provided, and one shall be appointed by the

State Governor), Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members. The term "Member" shall (unless the context otherwise requires) be deemed to include a Life Member, Life Governor, and Governor.

4. Subject to the provisions of Rule 27, every applicant for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company such firm or company shall nominate in writing one of the members thereof, who shall on the receipt by the Secretary of such nomination, be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges of membership, and be bound by the Rules, By-Laws, and Regulations of the Society, and may be elected to any office.

5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds three shillings and Members one pound five shillings annually. Life Governors shall pay a subscription of thirty one pounds ten shillings and Life Members a subscription of ten pounds ten shillings.

6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-three Members (elected from amongst the Members of the Society as hereinafter provided), and the Trustees, who shall be *ex officio* Members of the Council.

7. One-third of the Council (the Trustees excepted) shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

8. Land acquired, or to be acquired, for the Society shall be held by and be vested in the Trustees for the time being of the Society for and on behalf of the Society. The Trustees appointed as provided by these rules shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due course at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society. Any new Trustee or Trustees shall be appointed at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society, or in accordance with Rule 14. The Trustees shall deal with the lands of the Society as directed by resolution of the Council of the Society (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence), and they shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of the Society's property. If the office of Trustee, appointed by the State Governor, shall become vacant by reason of death, resignation, or otherwise, a new Trustee shall be appointed by the State Governor.

9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees), a President and three Vice-Presidents.

10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof, and for these purposes the Members of the Society for the time being shall be deemed to have constituted the Council of the Society for the time being their agents.

11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members; nominations therefor having been submitted at a previous meeting, and a notice of such nominations having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may, except as to the Trustee appointed by the State Governor, fill up any vacancies in its own body created

by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers

15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The financial year of the Society shall end on the 31st day of December of each year, to which day the accounts of the Society shall be balanced. At the monthly meeting of the Council, to be held in January in each year, the Council shall prepare a list of Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies in the Council. Nominations (other than those made by the Council) of Members who may be candidates for such vacancies must be in the hands of the Secretary prior to such meeting. Every nomination other than those made by the Council shall be signed by at least two Members other than the candidate, and shall have endorsed thereon the consent of such candidate duly signed by him.

18. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council, two paid Auditors appointed, and any other business transacted of which due notice in writing shall have been given before the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of the second Tuesday in January immediately preceding.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his Deputy shall send to all Members of the Society a ballot-paper, numbered, and initialled by the President or his Deputy, or the Secretary, with the names of all the candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Member desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot-paper containing more or less than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President (who shall be Returning Officer) or his Deputy at the election. Every such ballot-paper shall be returned before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot-papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Fourteen days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every Member of the Society.

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of the Council next after the Annual Meeting the Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President or on the requisition of twenty Members of the Society, of which meeting there must be given ten clear days' notice stating the business to be transacted, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

24. At the Annual Meeting twenty Members, including Members of Council, or at a Special General Meeting, ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council, shall form a quorum.

25. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of Members of Council appointed by the Society, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, and Lectures, and, with two ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds, and grandstands (subject to such regulations as the Council may make) on production of the member's ticket for the current year. And while the Society issues a monthly Journal a copy shall be posted free to every Member.

26. Any Member neglecting or refusing to comply with these Rules, or any or either of them, or any lawful directions or requirements by the Council made in pursuance or under the authority thereof, or being guilty either before or after becoming a Member of the Society of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be summoned before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may also be disqualified from exhibiting and may be disallowed from again becoming a Member during the pleasure of the Council. A Member expelled under this Rule shall forfeit all right in and claim upon the Society and its property.

27. Any person being expelled from Membership or disqualified from exhibiting, riding, or competing by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a Member or to exhibit, ride, or compete at this Society's Exhibitions until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

28. The Council shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules, and of the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder; and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Society or the administration of its affairs, whether provided for by these Rules or by the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder or otherwise, shall be final and binding on the Members.


29. Every Member shall communicate from time to time to the Secretary his address; and all notices required by these Rules to be sent or given to Members shall be deemed to have been duly sent or given if posted or sent to such address.

30. Every person becoming a Member of the Society thereby undertakes, if at any time required to do so by the Council, to give evidence by statutory declaration or otherwise of any facts within his knowledge or information relating to the subject matter of any inquiry by the Council.

31. Every person becoming a Member of the Society shall thereby undertake to indemnify and shall with every other Member thereof be bound to indemnify the Council, and the individual Members thereof, any Committee of the Council and any Members of any such Committee, against any action or damages in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in accordance with these Rules, or the By-laws or Regulations made thereunder, during the continuance of his Membership.

32. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting.

# BYE-LAWS.



## GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Notice of the Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the Members of Council at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for by at least three members present. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given in accordance with Rule 18.
2. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his Deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

## THE PRESIDENT.

3. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Members, and shall take the chair when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may decide.

## THE COUNCIL.

4. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.
5. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss, and decide by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.
6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.
7. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.
8. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called a quorum of Members be not present, the

Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

9. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council or of any Committee shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some person present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

10. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants at the Society's Exhibitions.

11. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees when they shall think proper.

12. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

13. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

14. If any Member of Council, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

15. The Secretary shall notify to the Council any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or other members of the Council, at the meeting of the Council at which or next after such vacancy occurred, and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice, provided that if any such vacancy occur after the ordinary monthly Council meeting in November such vacancy shall not be filled except at the next Annual Meeting.

16. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by the senior Vice-President then present; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes. (The senior Vice-President shall be deemed to mean the Vice-President who has been a member of Council for the greatest number of years in the aggregate.)

17. The quorum of a monthly or special meeting of Council shall be five.

18. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1.) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2.) Business arising from minutes.
- (3.) Election of officers, and nominations for vacancies.
- (4.) Committee's Reports.
- (5.) Motions.
- (6.) Correspondence.
- (7.) Postponed business.
- (8.) General business.
- (9.) Notices of motions.

19. All minutes and reports read to and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.

20. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January or at some adjournment thereof.

### COMMITTEES.

21. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the monthly Council meeting in February as they think fit, and such Committees shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two members of Committee to form a quorum.

22. The President shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees.

23. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

24. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the first Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

### THE SECRETARY.

25. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and of Committees, and shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep copies of all letters on the business of the Society.

26. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, he shall be responsible for all moneys received, paying such sums into the Society's bank, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's bank. He shall have the charge of the expenditure for petty cash.

27. He shall have the custody of all books and property of the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

28. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he may think of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

29. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

30. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Member of the Society.

## FINANCE.

31. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet before the ordinary Council meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each monthly meeting, as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

32. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

33. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

34. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

35. The accounts of the Society shall be audited as may be required by the Council by two professional accountants to whom a balance-sheet shall be submitted by the Secretary immediately after the close of the financial year, and such, when audited, shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
