

OF THE
COUNCIL
OF
The Royal Agricultural Society
OF VICTORIA

To the Members,

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Your Council has pleasure in presenting the following report of proceedings of the Society for the year 1940.

Occupation of Show Grounds.

In last year's report, reference was made to the fact that the Grounds had been taken over by the Defence Department immediately after the 1939 Royal Show, and at the annual general meeting of members of the Society in February last the President announced that, as the Grounds were to be vacated by 30th June, the Council purposed proceeding as usual with arrangement for the Royal Show to be held in September, 1940.

However, shortly after the annual meeting, Ministerial advice was received to the effect that the Show Grounds were to be retained for the duration of the war, this action being decided upon as one means of facilitating the carrying out of Australia's part in the Empire Air Scheme.

Thus the Show Grounds, which were first taken over by the Military authorities, were for the first three months of 1940 divided between Military and Air Force, and then fully occupied by the Air Force as its No. 1 Engineering School. Since that time a large amount of money has been expended in adapting the various buildings to Air Force requirements and providing additional facilities for the thousands of men being trained at the Grounds.

Sectional Efforts.

Faced with the loss of the Show Grounds for the duration of the war, your Council was placed in the unenviable position of determining how best to continue the national work of the Society. It immediately recognized that, without unlimited capital, there was no possibility of holding a Royal Show, and that sectional efforts would have to be relied on to maintain, as far as possible, the Society's connection with its supporters.

Efforts were at once made to secure a suitable ground which could be adapted for shows of horses, cattle and other classes of stock at different times and in this connection your Council appreciated action taken by its supporters interested mainly in the Dairying Industry, in an endeavour to secure from the Commonwealth Government a grant sufficient to enable the Society to provide accommodation in which a Cattle Show and Sales could be held. This effort, which was organized through the United Country Party, resulted in a representative deputation to the Minister of Commerce who, after mature reflection, stated that the request could not be complied with.

Your Council then announced its intention of conducting a Show of Dogs, Poultry and other sections which could be accommodated in the Exhibition Building, and a Light Horse Show and Programme of Events on a racecourse or other suitable ground later in the year. It also expressed its willingness to co-operate in any movement initiated by those interested in other classes of stock to provide some substitute for the facilities provided by the Royal Show in their particular section or sections.

This led to co-operation with the Committee of the Victorian Branch of the Commonwealth Clydesdale Horse Society in the provision of R.A.S. prize cards, ribbons and sashes for sweepstakes and open classes for young stock, in conjunction with the Annual Horse Parade and Sale.

A donation of £50 was made to the funds of the Australian Sheepbreeders' Association in recognition of the fact that that Association had materially increased the classification for British Breeds of Sheep at its annual Show, for which record entries were received. Later in the year, R.A.S. prize cards and ribbons were made available for competition at a special stud ram show and sale organized and very successfully conducted by the Victorian Branch of the Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep.

Another very successful effort was the outcome of co-operation with the Victorian Branch of the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society in the conducting of educational Bacon and Pork Pig Competitions, in conjunction with Stud Pig Sales in pens transported from the Show Grounds to buildings made available by the Melbourne City Council at the abattoirs, where every facility was readily provided for slaughtering, cooling, weighing and finally displaying the carcasses. The wide-spread interest created by these Bacon and Pork Pig Competitions, the success of which was the outcome of the co-operation of the Department of Agriculture, the Stud Pig Breeders' Society and the Australian Meat Board, prompted your Council to make an early announcement of its intention to conduct similar competitions in 1941.

The sections catered for at the Show held in the Exhibition Building was well staged, and quite up to Royal Show standard in quality and number of exhibits. General satisfaction was expressed by exhibitors at the action of the Society in thus making provision for them under existing conditions.

The Show, which was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor, was greatly assisted by the co-operation of the Australian Wool Board display and the mannequin parades conducted in conjunction therewith.

The horticultural exhibit, staged by the Nurserymen and Seedmen's Association, was also an outstanding feature, whilst the displays made by various patriotic bodies were not only of interest to patrons, but a public demonstration of their activities in the interests of Australia's sailors, soldiers and airmen.

The Light Horse Show and Programme of Events, conducted on the Moonee Valley Racecourse early in December, was particularly well supported by exhibitors, no less than 842 entries being received in the 72 classes provided in the Prize Schedule.

General satisfaction was expressed that this very important section of the Royal Show had been so well catered for.

Though neither of these special shows was a financial success, owing mainly to adverse weather conditions and counter attractions, your Council looks on the expense involved in these and other efforts as an investment in the best interests of the Society, as everything possible must be done to hold the Society's supporters together until such time as it is possible to resume its activities on the Show Grounds.

Associated Bodies.

Your Council is pleased to be in a position to report that it has been possible to maintain full co-operation with and service to the various stud stock breeders' societies and other organizations, the secretarial work of which has for years past been carried out by the Society's staff. The following paragraphs, relating to the activities of these bodies will be of interest to members generally.

The Commonwealth Clydesdale Horse Society (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The extremely dry conditions which prevailed throughout the Commonwealth during the year had an adverse effect on the horse breeding industry, and the demand for horses of all types slackened considerably.

The decrease in the membership of the Society was, however, not extensive, and many, believing that horses are essential in the economic welfare of the Commonwealth have made every effort to hold their teams and continue breeding.

In view of the serious position created by the war, and its effect on most branches of agriculture and industry, it seems certain that the horse will be called upon to play an important part in maintaining production and essential services, and thus assist the Commonwealth's war effort.

Volume 12 of the Society's Stud Book was published during the year and copies forwarded to all financial members and kindred bodies overseas. It contains the pedigrees of 128 stallions, 529 numbered mares with progeny, together with 53 new appendix B mares, and particulars of additional progeny from 1801 numbered mares 369 Appendix B and 261 Appendix A females registered in previous Volumes.

As the Melbourne Royal Show had to be abandoned, owing to the grounds having been taken over by the Defence Department, the horse breeding industry received a severe setback. The committee of the Victorian Branch therefore decided to continue the Clydesdale Produce Sweepstakes Competition, in conjunction with Messrs. Campbell & Sons Annual Horse Parade.

Your Council co-operated in the effort, and the display of Clydesdales exhibited, though not as numerous, was quite up to the standard of previous Royal Shows.

The Society is continuing its efforts to influence Governments to provide encouragement for the horse breeding industry, which would tend to stimulate interest in the breeding of more and better horses, so as to ensure Australia's independence from an agricultural and commercial point of view, in times of national conflict or economic stress.

This important matter has again been brought under the notice of the Australian Agricultural Council, and representations have also been made to the Government in this State, as a result of which it is hoped that the fund established for the improvement of horse breeding will be utilized in the form of a bonus on foals bred in Victoria.

Unfortunately, persistent appeals from this Society and other interested bodies, for the deletion from the Victorian Horse Breeding Act of the clause which permits an owner to retain an uncertificated stallion for use with his own mares, have not yet been successful, but it is hoped that the degrading influence which this privilege exerts on the standard of our horses generally, will soon be fully realized and the Act amended so as to provide complete control of all unsound and undesirable stallions, and permit the Act to fulfil the purpose for which it was specially designed.

The Australian Pony Stud Book Society.

The number of entries received during the year from Victorian breeders for inclusion in Volume 2 of the Stud Book shows a slight decrease when compared with previous years. This, no doubt, is due to a large extent to the cancellation of the Royal Show, at which the entries in the Stud Pony Classes have, since 1934, been restricted to registered animals.

However, interest in the Association has been maintained, and the decision of the Federal Council to close Volume 2 of the Stud Book on 30th June, 1941, should create much activity in Pony circles during the coming year.

The Shorthorn Society of Australia (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

Although seasonal conditions have not been encouraging, the beef-raising industry has remained active and little variation in the demand has been manifest.

Breeding is still being carried on extensively and a steady demand exists for Shorthorns, they having fully demonstrated in the leading markets of the State their early maturing qualities and ability to produce carcasses eminently suitable for both the export and local trades.

Several new members have been enrolled during the year and it is pleasing to note a growing tendency on the part of graziers generally to introduce pure bred bulls into their herds.

Entries for Volume 10 of the Shorthorn Herd Book close on the 31st December, and new adult entries already in hand total 131 bulls and 785 cows.

Unfortunately, the Melbourne Royal Show had to be abandoned, and breeders were thus deprived of the opportunity to exhibit their

stock. A special Stud Sale was, however, arranged by Messrs. E. Trenchard & Co. on 27th September, and their action in this connection was greatly appreciated.

Owing to difficulties created by the war, the importation of stud cattle from Scotland has practically ceased, but as a direct result of the foresight and enterprise of many breeders, there are already in the Commonwealth numerous imported animals representing the best blood obtainable, and by their judicious use, the work of raising the general standard of our cattle can, fortunately, be carried on.

The Victorian Branch suffered a great loss during the year by the death of Mr. A. J. Simpson, one of the foundation members of the Society, and a member of the executive since its inception.

Mr. Simpson had become famous as a breeder and an exhibitor at Royal Shows throughout Australia. He was keenly interested in the breed, and always did his utmost to further the work of the Society.

The Dairy Shorthorn Association of Australia.

The Association has experienced another satisfactory year, the membership list having been strengthened by the enrolment of fifteen new breeders, who have submitted their herds for registration in the second volume of the Herd Book.

It is of interest to record that a breeder resident in Queensland has joined the Association, and thus a further step has been reached in the endeavour to make the Association Australian in character as well as in name. Members had previously been enrolled from Victoria, South Australia and New South Wales, and though no members have yet been enrolled from Western Australia, several purchases have been made from Victorian breeders to go to that State.

The number of Dairy Shorthorn herds under the Victorian Government official herd test has been increased during the past year, and the results obtained prove that the breed is not lacking in butter-fat producing qualities.

Championship sashes were again made available for competition at country Shows, at which entries in the Dairy Shorthorn section were restricted to registered stock.

The Red Poll Cattle Breeders' Association of Australia. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

Keen interest is still being maintained in the activities of this Association and it is again possible to report an increase in the membership. Twenty-two new members have been enrolled since the publication of Volume 10 of the Herd Book was taken in hand early in the year. The Volume was completed and issued by the Federal Council in May last, and the number of pedigrees recorded therein totalled 1284. The greater percentage of registrations are in the two highest classes, there being only three bulls and 76 cows registered in other than Classes AA and A. Included in the Volume for the first time is the revised Breed Standard Description, which was recently altered to make it conform more readily with the standard adopted by the Red Poll Cattle Society of Great Britain and Ireland.

Another sale was conducted under the auspices of the Victorian Branch at Kilmore in November last, and attracted an entry of 49

animals, representing six registered studs. As has been the case with previous sales conducted under the auspices of the Association, none but registered animals were offered, and all were passed by an official Inspector before entering the Sale Ring.

The Victorian Branch again made Championship sashes available to Country Agricultural Shows, at which entries in the Red Poll section were restricted to registered stock. These sashes are now only supplied on the understanding that they will not be presented unless the winning animals are paraded at the show and their names are forwarded to the Secretary of the Association.

The Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The Federal Council of this Society published the 32nd Volume of the Herd Book and the ninth regular issue of the Herd Test Record Booklet, both of which were widely distributed to members and others interested.

Owing to the abandonment of the 1940 Royal Melbourne Show no meeting of the Federal Council was held, but a meeting is to be held at the time of the forthcoming Sydney Royal Show, when many matters of interest to breeders will be discussed.

Of paramount importance to the members of the Victorian Branch especially was the fact that cows owned by two members were successful in obtaining the Champion and Reserve Champion awards under Victorian Government Test for the year ended 30th June, 1940. Messrs. G. A. Fraser & Sons' "Glengowrie Ray" was Champion with 783 lbs. butter-fat in 273 days, whilst the record of 748 lbs. butter-fat secured the Reserve Champion award for Mr. J. H. Goddard's cow, "Donside Lydo Lady."

The Committee of the Victorian Branch gave very full consideration to a proposal to establish an Advanced Register of Merit to replace the present register published by the Department of Agriculture.

After a series of conferences with representatives of other Breed Societies, and the Victorian United Cow Test Association, a deputation waited upon the Minister for Agriculture, and placed before him a scheme for an advanced register, based on type and production, and at the same time promised the fullest co-operation of the bodies concerned.

Unfortunately, the Minister authorized a continuance of the publication of the register as originally compiled by the Department.

The Branch, in conjunction with the selling agents, organised a sale of registered Ayrshire stock during the first week in October, designed to take the place of the Royal Show sales, which lapsed through the abandonment of the Show. Unfortunately, these sales were not very strongly supported by the breeders or the purchasing public.

The Friesian Cattle Club of Australia (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

Volume 14 of the Club's Herd Book was published by the Federal Council toward the end of the year. It contained a large number of entries from the Victorian Branch, which is still the strongest of all State Branches.

The demand for Friesians in Victoria referred to in the previous report has been so well maintained that there is still a distinct shortage of both males and females.

Excellent returns were made again by Friesians under the various State Government Herd Tests, and through the publicity thus obtained it is believed the progress made will be continued.

The Guernsey Cattle Society of Australasia (Victorian Branch).

Increased membership of the Branch and a steady demand for Guernseys was noticable. This may be regarded as a reflex of the outstandingly high butter-fat yields made by the breed under Victorian Government Herd Test.

This form of publicity has proved most valuable of all, since it has demonstrated beyond doubt the true capabilities of the breed. It is pleasing to note that a member of our Council, Captain A. E. T. Payne, has attained phenomenally high butter-fat returns from his Guernsey herd.

Entries for Volume 13 of the Society's Herd Book closed during the year, and the volume, which is now in course of publication by the Federal Council will contain a high percentage of Victorian-owned stock.

The Australian Illawarra Shorthorn Society. (Victorian Branch).

Further progress has been made by this Branch during the past year and a substantial increase in the membership can be reported.

The number of adult registrations received, also birth notifications and sales recorded by Victorian breeders, show an increase when compared with previous years and provide a further indication that the breed is now firmly established and on its way to attaining in Victoria a similar position to that which it holds in other States.

Entries for Volume 7 of the Herd Book closed on the 30th April last, when compilation was taken in hand by the Federal Council. This work is nearing completion and the Volume will be available for distribution to members early in the new year.

The Australian Jersey Herd Society (Victorian Branch).

This Branch continues its march of progress, and during the past year again recorded an increase in membership.

One of its members, Mr. R. M. Chirnside, created a new record under the Victorian Government Herd Testing Scheme by winning the Herd Prize for the sixth successive year.

The type classification system, inaugurated by this Branch, is now firmly established and accepted as a measure of breed improvement. During the year 60 herds were visited by the Classification Board and 209 cows were classified, 40 H.C. and 169 C. This brings the total number of classified cows to 121 H.C. and 738 C.

It is interesting to note that all the classified cows which have been officially tested, have produced amounts far in excess of their standard requirements, and, further, that in every case the females

classified H.C. by the Board have given higher yields under test than those awarded C.

Owing to the fact that there was no Royal Melbourne Show or sales usually associated therewith, the Branch sponsored a sale which was held during the first week in October and resulted in a splendid entry being received.

After the Committee had given very full consideration to a proposal that an Advanced Register of Merit should be published to take the place of the Register at present published by the Department of Agriculture, delegates were appointed to confer with representatives of the other breed Societies, and the Victorian United Cow Test Association. Following on a series of conferences, complete unanimity was reached and a deputation placed before the Minister for Agriculture a proposal for an Advanced Register of Merit based on type and production. The Minister was assured that if he adopted the proposals submitted to him he would receive the fullest support of all concerned.

Unfortunately the Minister authorized the publication of the second issue of the Department's Register as originally compiled.

To stimulate the showing of Jersey stock the Branch made £100 available in sums of £25 each to four selected country agricultural societies for special prizes at their shows.

The selected Societies were Wangaratta, Kyabram, Maffra and Noorat, and all gladly accepted the Society's offer. Unfortunately, later in the year, the first two mentioned shows were abandoned, and the Societies were unable to take advantage of the subsidy. At Maffra and Noorat however, the special prizes stimulated competition and fine teams were shown. In one case a breeder travelled over 100 miles to compete.

It is with sincere regret that reference is made to the loss through death of Messrs. G. T. Chirnside, W. Woodmason and John D. Read. All were foundation members of the Society and of the Committee of the Branch, and were held in the highest esteem by everyone who knew them.

The Victorian United Cow Test Association.

Reference was made in last year's report to the difficulty this Association was experiencing in ensuring an adequate number of qualified herd testers to service affiliated Associations. Following a conference with the District Man Power Officer, it was announced that the Federal Government, realizing the national importance of herd testing, had resolved to regard herd testers as in a "reserved occupation." This decision, though helpful, did not have any material effect owing to enlistments, whilst for a similar reason, the position was further aggravated by the shortage of labour on farms and the abnormally dry season. Thus several local Herd Testing Associations had to reduce the number of active units and others had to suspend operations altogether.

The Council is making every effort to ensure that, following a breaking of the drought, testing will not only be resumed but extended during the coming year.

Though, owing to the cancellation of the Royal Show, and the necessity for altering the time of the Annual General Conference of delegates from affiliated Herd Test Associations, it was regretfully decided to cancel the Annual Field Day, the Herd Testers' Competition was conducted as usual, and the judge very favourably commented

on the standard of the work of those competitors who secured the gold medals and cash prizes offered.

R.A.S. of V. Production Certificates were again issued to members whose herds attained the specified standards under Association test.

At Conference's forecast in last year's report, complete unanimity was reached between representatives of this Association and the various dairy cattle breeders' societies, regarding the establishment of an advanced register based on both type and production.

A fully representative deputation waited on the Minister of Agriculture and advocated that such a register should be in future published in lieu of that recently issued by his Department. Though this effort was unsuccessful, the conferences are to be continued to discuss matters of mutual interest to the bodies represented in particular and the dairying industry in general.

The Association has, by direct representation, maintained its interest in the activities of the Chamber of Agriculture, Pasture Improvement League, Pig Industry Committee, Cattle Research Association and the Dairymen's Association, which last-named body has had its full support more particularly in connection with its views regarding the manufacture and sale of margarine and the scheme for the rationing of petrol in the dairying industry.

The Australian Cattle Research Association (Victorian Branch).

As a direct result of the strenuous efforts mentioned in last year's report, the national importance of the work initiated by this Association was recognized and commended by the Australian Agricultural Council. The adoption of that Council's recommendations by Federal and State Governments enabled the Association to continue to finance the investigations into Bang's Disease in New South Wales and Bovine Mastitis in Victoria.

Arrangements are to be made for an address at the forthcoming Farmers' Convention on this work which means so much to the dairying industry.

The Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The year just concluded was one of the most successful that the Society has experienced. The already excellent membership was increased to a record total of 2126. Of this total 915 members reside in Victoria.

Volume 32 of the Flock Book, which was published in February last, contains 2,075 histories of flocks throughout Australia. This total exceeds the record number of histories included in Volume 31 by 299.

Volume 33, which is now in course of publication, will show an increase of over 300 new flocks, and it will contain a record number of individual registrations of both rams and ewes.

This Society is continuing its endeavour to bring about the licensing of all breeders of pure-bred rams, as it feels that if such a scheme were adopted it would, in a short time, bring about a vast improvement in the important export lamb trade.

During the past year no less than 420 Export Certificates were issued by the Society for sheep exported to South Africa and New Zealand. To ensure that only sheep of a high standard are exported from Australia, all stud sheep about to be exported must be submitted for inspection.

Owing to the cancellation of the 1940 Melbourne Royal Show, the Victorian Branch agreed to a suggestion that it co-operate with the Australian Sheep Breeders' Association with regard to the 1940 Sheepbreeders' Show, which was held during August. The Committee of the Branch, in addition to its usual donation of ten guineas, decided to give a special donation of 55 guineas for distribution in the various British Breeds Classes. Despite the war and unfavourable seasonal conditions, this Show attracted a record entry of 454 in the British Breeds Section.

Being of opinion that August is too early for the sale of British Breeds, the Committee of the Victorian Branch decided to conduct a Show and Sale of Stud Rams at the Newmarket Sale Yards on 8th November, 1940. This Show and Sale attracted an excellent entry of over 200 rams, and the prices realized at the sale proved to be quite satisfactory. In addition to the prize money offered by the Victorian Branch, your Council made available 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize cards and ribbons for distribution in each of the 27 classes.

Realizing the importance of British Breeds rams to the fat lamb industry, the Victorian Branch again decided to conduct sales of Registered sheep at Shepparton, Bendigo and Newmarket. At the Shepparton sale a record entry was received, and each of the other sales attracted more sheep than in the previous year. Although seasonal conditions in most parts of the State were unfavorable, all sales were well attended, and the prices realized in most cases were in excess of those expected by breeders.

The Australian Corriedale Sheepbreeders' Association. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

Despite adverse seasonal conditions there has been a further increase in membership during the year ended 31st December, 1940.

The Inspectors in the various States have completed the examination of the 1939 drop of lambs, and report that although the sheep were showing effects of the long, dry spell, they were much more even and truer to type than formerly.

In an endeavour to compensate for the loss of the Royal Show the Victorian Branch made a donation to the prize fund and offered two cups for competition at the Australian Sheepbreeders' Association Show in August. Provision was also made for Corriedales at the special Stud Ram Show and Sale at Newmarket in November, when R.A.S. prize cards and ribbons were awarded.

Vol. XIV of the Flock Book was published in June, and the compilation of Vol. XV to be published in 1941 will be taken in hand early in the New Year.

During the year the Victorian Branch made donations to the Australian Red Cross Society and the Australian Comforts Fund.

The Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society (Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The Federal Council completed the publication of Volume 30 during the period under review. The number of pigs registered in that Volume, and the remarkable increase in the membership of the Society, reflect the rapidly growing interest being taken in Stud Pig breeding throughout the Commonwealth.

In an endeavour to afford breeders an alternative for the loss of the 1940 Royal Show sales the Committee of the Victorian Branch conducted sales of registered pigs at the Melbourne City Abattoirs. Altogether 188 pigs, representing 33 different studs were catalogued for sale. The Committee also co-operated with your Council and the Department of Agriculture in staging the new Bacon and Pork Pig Competitions, which were originally intended to be conducted in conjunction with the 1940 Royal Show. These competitions, apart from being of value in educating the pig breeder and raiser as to the types of bacon and pork pigs required for the export trade, were also designed to provide breeders with a service for recording the production of their pigs.

Your Council has already announced its intention to conduct similar Competitions in 1941 and the Victorian Branch Committee has intimated that it will again financially support and co-operate in the staging of these competitions. It has also announced its intention to conduct Stud Pig sales in 1941 as in 1940.

Breeders learned with regret of the decision of the Council of the National Pig Breeders' Association (England) to suspend publication of the "Pig Breeders' Annual" for the duration of the war. No doubt when the war is over and the issue of the Annual is resumed, this Society will again see its way clear to purchase copies for distribution to its members.

The Kennel Control Council.

The Kennel Control Council, as now constituted under the auspices of the Society, completed its fifth year. It was a year of such progress that the fancy clearly substantiated the fact that the breeding and exhibition of dogs in Victoria, whilst a pastime, is also now an industry.

Under the Presidency of the Society's own President and the Chairmanship of Mr. William Cockbill of your Council, the ten gentlemen nominated by Council as the Committee of the K.C.C. were able to introduce many worthwhile measures of benefit to all.

Despite heavy enlistments in the A.I.F. and enrolments in militia camps fanciers again strongly supported the shows and parades held almost weekly throughout the year by the K.C.C.'s numerous affiliates.

Many fixtures were held in aid of War Funds, and the individual proceeds of these reached as high as £150. The war has given dog showing a new importance for that reason. Many organizations not formed to conduct dog shows found that an owner's pride in his pet, regardless of pedigree, is such that small dog "competitions" held with the sanction of the K.C.C., in aid of war funds could be made quite lucrative.

Victoria's dog world made no secret of its appreciation of the Society's action in conducting, among others, a sectional dog show, and so keeping faith with those who had bred valuable pedigree dogs with the Royal Show as the principal objective. The Kennel Control Council again was able to contribute to the undoubted success of the section through its organization of the fancy and the donation of trophies and cash prizes.

The Victorian Working Sheep Dog Association.

Although a number of the trials usually conducted by Sheep Dog Clubs and Agricultural Societies were not held this year owing to the war, those which were held attracted excellent entries, and the thanks of all sheepdog owners are due to the organisers responsible for the conduct of these trials, for their efforts.

The 1940 competition for the "Captain Payne 50-guinea Trophy"

was staged at Portland, in conjunction with the Portland and District P., A. & H. Society. The trial attracted an excellent entry, and was won for the first time by an Interstate competitor.

In order to compensate members for the loss of the Royal Show trials, the Council of this Association conducted trials on the Moonee Valley Racecourse. Although not very well supported by the public, some excellent performances were witnessed.

The desirability of encouraging the entry of station dogs in Sheep Dog Trials was stressed at the recent annual general meeting of members of this Association, and, following a discussion along these lines, it was resolved that the promotion of Utility Trials, similar to those recently staged in New South Wales, would have the desired effect. Both Open and Novice Utility Trials will be conducted in conjunction with the 1941 Competition for the "Captain Payne Trophy."

The Victorian Young Farmers' Clubs Association.

Assisted by an increased grant from the State Government, the Victorian Young Farmers' Clubs Association was able better to service the activities of established Young Farmers' Clubs and to arrange the formation of many new ones. The enlistment in the A.I.F. and the Home Services of older brothers, has made greater calls upon the time available for Young Farmer Club work, and to an extent it has suffered, but the ability of the Young Farmers to step straight into the breach, ready equipped with the requisite knowledge, has itself been a great source of satisfaction to those interested in the movement.

With three supervisors now almost constantly travelling among the Clubs, much has been done to guide the members and Club leaders along correct lines. The availability of officers of the Department of Agriculture to lecture not only to the children, but to their parents, has enabled the dissemination of much knowledge of value to primary producers. Much useful literature was distributed among Clubs.

Through the generosity of the Council of Agricultural Education, it was possible for the Association to allot for the third year in succession a three-year scholarship at an Agricultural College. The Committee was greatly impressed with the Young Farmers nominated for selection. The usual teams of Victorian Young Farmers were sent to the annual camps held in conjunction with the Brisbane and Sydney Royal Shows. Privileges such as those mentioned serve to encourage the Young Farmers to do better at their studies, both theoretical and practical.

For the benefit of those loyal school teachers who are responsible to a great extent for the welfare of the Clubs in their Schools, the Association again conducted its twelve-day School of Agriculture, at which lectures and demonstrations were given by officers of the Agricultural Department and other experts. There was a good attendance of teachers and others seeking more knowledge on agricultural subjects. It is worthy of record that all the teachers voluntarily gave up portion of their vacation to be present. The Association is indebted to His Excellency, Sir Winston Dugan, for performing the official opening ceremony.

With the continued co-operation of the Education and Agricultural Departments and other bodies, and the interest of school teachers, it will be possible for the Association to add materially to the valuable work already done for rural youth.

The Chamber of Agriculture of Victoria.

The forty-first Annual Meeting and the thirty-eighth Annual Convention of this Chamber, held at Wangaratta on 5th, 6th and 7th March last, was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor, Sir

Winston Dugan, and was attended by a large number of delegates representing affiliated bodies throughout the State.

All were impressed with the warmth of the welcome accorded them and the efforts made to ensure that their visit would be an enjoyable one.


The Rt. Hon. the Prime Minister gave an address on the part being played by primary producers in Australia's war effort, and a number of other addresses on matters of vital importance to "the man on the land," several of which were illustrated with excellent films and slides, were greatly appreciated by the delegates.

Items of business on a lengthy agenda were earnestly discussed and resolutions passed were subsequently brought under notice of responsible Ministers by deputation or otherwise suitably dealt with by the Executive.

A full report on the Convention and all the addresses delivered thereat appeared in the third Year Book published by the Chamber. Copies of this publication were widely distributed at home and abroad.

The Executive has been greatly encouraged by the recognition of the value of the work of the Chamber, revealed by the number and standing of bodies which have become affiliated during the year.





Fodder Conservation.

Twelve subsidies were granted to applicant Societies desirous of conducting Fodder Conservation Competitions in various parts of the State, and though, owing to the abnormal season, some were compelled to cancel, others were able to complete very successful competitions the results of which were given wide publicity. Being convinced of the desirability of continuing to encourage the conservation of fodder—a practice now commanding Government attention—your Council has announced its intention to allocate further subsidies under conditions amended in accordance with experience gained from competitions conducted in past years.

Wheat Crop Championships.

Another pleasing feature of the Society's activities has been the interest taken in the Wheat Crop Championship Competitions conducted by the Farm Competitions Association in the Wimmera and Mallee for cash prizes made available by this Society. That so many competitors took part in such competitions in such a year is at once a tribute to farming practices and the drought-resistant wheats bred in this State.

Horse Breeding.

Throughout the year your Council has urged Governments to seriously consider the encouragement of horse breeding, not only from the aspect of defence, but also as a means of saving exchange and reducing the consumption of petrol, whilst at the same time fostering Australian industry and making possible the more economical production of food stuffs for export.

Farm Labour.

Your Council also gave consideration to the matter of labour on farms, and, whilst its enquiries showed that the drought had materially relieved the position so far as the wheat harvest was concerned, it realizes the need for a comprehensive survey by the Government to avert a serious effect on production in practically all phases of primary industry in the coming year.

The Council.

As nominations for election at the annual meeting in February last were not in excess of the number of vacancies, all of the retiring members of Council were elected for a further period of three years.

Your Council records with deep regret the great loss sustained through the death of three members who rendered invaluable service to the Society for many years—Mr. R. O. Blackwood (Trustee); Mr. H. A. Anderson (Senior Vice-President), and Mr. W. Woodmason, who had been a member of the Council since 1904.

In addition to the foregoing, your Council regrets to report the death of two former colleagues, Mr. George T. Chirnside and Mr. W. G. Macalister.

Mr. G. L. Wilson was unanimously elected as a Trustee of the Society, whilst Messrs. Keith McGarvie, T. A. Meaklim and Norman Mitchell were elected in that order to fill the vacancies in the Council as they occurred.

Special leave of absence was granted to Mr. C. N. McKay, who visited England; Mr. M. A. Nicholas, who visited America; Captain A. E. T. Payne, whilst on an extended tour of the Northern States; and to Mr. J. C. Mackinnon, because of an illness, from which it is pleasing to report he has fully recovered.

at the Exhibition Building, commended the Society for endeavouring to maintain its activities under such difficult circumstances.

His Excellency, accompanied by Lady Dugan and the Hon. the Premier, made a complete tour of the Show and displayed much interest in the exhibits and the stands occupied by various patriotic bodies.

Your Council also records its grateful thanks to the Australian Wool Board for its co-operation in arranging the display and the mannequin parades in the Wool Court at the Exhibition Building; to the Moonee Valley Racing Club, for making the Moonee Valley Racecourse available for the Light Horse Show, and placing every possible facility at the disposal of the Show Committee; to the Melbourne City Council and its Abattoirs and Markets Committees, for assistance already mentioned in this report; to the Press and various broadcasting stations, for the generous publicity given to the Society's activities; to the judges, stewards, stewardesses and other officials, who, under trying conditions, carried out their responsible duties in connection with the adjudication of exhibits in the various sections; to the standholders and exhibitors, who, by their wholehearted support, showed their appreciation of Council's action in catering for them, and to all others who, in any way, assisted in furthering the interests of the Society throughout the year.

Finance.

Reference to the financial statement, published herewith, will show that the Bank overdraft was increased by £4,700 during the year. It will, however, be noted that such items as interest and part redemption of Government loans do not appear therein.

As the Defence authorities could not see their way to recognize loan repayments, your Council made representations to the State Government, and, as a result, payments in redemption of loans have been suspended until after the Society has reoccupied its Grounds and conducted a Royal Show thereon. This arrangement was made on the understanding that interest payments would be maintained.

Your Council was able to take advantage of this arrangement because the Defence authorities included interest on loans in the list of items of expenditure for which liability would be accepted during the occupancy of the Show Grounds, but owing to protracted negotiations it was not possible to secure a settlement of the Society's claim prior to the end of the financial year. In the absence of available funds, payment of interest and some other accounts had, of necessity, to be deferred pending a settlement which has been promised early in 1941.

Your Council fully realizes the value of the Show Grounds as a unit in the Empire Air Scheme, and regards their loss for the duration of the war as the Society's sacrifice towards the securing of that victory of which we are all confident and hope will be speedily achieved.

Nevertheless, it also recognizes the adverse effect on the national work of the Society occasioned by the suspension of the Royal Show in this State, and, therefore, expresses the hope that it will be favoured with a continuance of the co-operation of its members and supporters in its endeavours to keep the organization in working order in readiness for that expansion of operations which will be possible when peace is restored.

RULES

1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Stock Raising and Industrial Resources of the State—

- (1) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
- (2) By holding meetings for the purpose of popularising rural life and disseminating knowledge of improved methods and new ideas in relation thereto.
- (3) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies, and collecting information for the furtherance of the objects of the Society.
- (4) By promoting the discovery, investigation and introduction of improved kinds of agricultural implements and machinery, the better equipment and construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (5) By promoting the discovery, investigation and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (6) By collecting and distributing information on all subjects concerned with the objects of the Society, including the preparation and publication of Flock Books, Herd Books, Stud Books, Pamphlets, Essays and Papers, and by the establishment and maintenance of a Library and Reading Room for the use of Members.
- (7) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants and taking measures to encourage the prevention or eradication of such diseases.
- (8) By remunerating any person for original research work leading to the advancement of the objects of the Society.
- (9) By the purchase of live stock for breeding purposes and allowing farmers and other rural workers the use thereof for improving the standard of live stock.
- (10) By promoting or assisting any scheme for herd testing and remunerating any person for his services in connection therewith.
- (11) By promoting or assisting competitions in regard to farm crops and other primary production, implements of husbandry and improvement of the conditions and methods of rural work.
- (12) By promoting or assisting any other work which may be regarded by the Council of the Society as being beneficial to primary production or the improvement of live stock.
- (13) By borrowing monies at interest on "short call" or otherwise from bankers or any other source for the purposes of the Society, and particularly for repaying in whole or in part monies owing or which may become owing by the Society either on current account or otherwise.
- (14) By establishing and supporting or aiding in the establishment and support of funds, trusts and conveniences calculated to benefit employees or ex-employees of the Society, or the dependents or connections of such persons, and by

granting pensions and allowances, and by making contributions towards Insurance Premiums.

(15) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, four Trustees (three of whom shall be appointed as hereinafter provided, and one shall be appointed by the State Governor), Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members. The term "Member" shall (unless the context otherwise requires) be deemed to include a Life Member, Life Governor and Governor.

4. Subject to the provisions of Rule 27, every applicant for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company such firm or company shall nominate in writing one of the members thereof, who shall, on the receipt by the Secretary of such nomination, be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges of membership, and be bound by the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Society, and may be elected to any office.

5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds three shillings and Members one pound ten shillings annually. Life Governors shall pay a subscription of fifty pounds, and Life Members a subscription of twenty-five pounds.

6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-three Members (elected from amongst the Members of the Society as hereinafter provided) and the Trustees, who shall be *ex officio* Members of the Council.

7. One-third of the Council (the Trustees excepted) shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

8. Land acquired, or to be acquired, for the Society shall be held by and be vested in the Trustees for the time being of the Society for and on behalf of the Society. The Trustees appointed as provided by these rules shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due course at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society. Any new Trustee or Trustees shall be appointed at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society, or in accordance with Rule 14. The Trustees shall deal with the lands of the Society as directed by resolution of the Council of the Society (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence), and they shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of the Society's property. If the office of Trustee, appointed by the State Governor, shall become vacant by reason of death, resignation or otherwise, a new Trustee shall be appointed by the State Governor.

9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees) a President and three Vice-Presidents.

10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof, and for these purposes the Members of the Society for the time being shall be deemed to have constituted the Council of the Society for the time being their agents.

11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific and Corresponding Members, nominations therefor having been submitted at a previous meeting and a notice of such nominations having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may, except as to the Trustee appointed by the State Governor, fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The financial year of the Society shall end on the 31st day of December of each year, to which day the accounts of the Society shall be balanced. At the monthly meeting of the Council, to be held in January in each year, the Council shall prepare a list of Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies in the Council. Nominations (other than those made by the Council) of Members who may be candidates for such vacancies must be in the hands of the Secretary prior to such meeting. Every nomination other than those made by the Council shall be signed by at least two Members other than the candidate, and shall have endorsed thereon the consent of such candidate, duly signed by him.

18. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the last Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted. Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council, two paid Auditors appointed, and any other business transacted of which due notice in writing shall have been given before the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of the second Tuesday in January immediately preceding.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his Deputy shall send to all Members of the Society a ballot paper, numbered, and initialled by the President or his Deputy, or the Secretary, with the names of all the candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Member desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more or less than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President (who shall be Returning Officer) or his Deputy at the election. Every such ballot paper shall be returned before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Fourteen days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every Member of the Society.

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of the Council next after the Annual Meeting the Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President or on the requisition of twenty Members of the Society, of which meeting there must be given ten clear days' notice stating the business to be transacted, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President or of three members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

24. At the Annual Meeting twenty Members, including Members of Council, or at a Special General Meeting ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council, shall form a quorum.

25. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of Members of Council appointed by the Society, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room and Lectures, and, (with two ladies if the member be a Life Governor, whenever so constituted, or a Life Member, so constituted before the 2nd February, 1939, but with one lady only as regards all other Members) to the Society's exhibitions, grounds and grandstands (subject to such regulations as the Council may make) on production of the Member's ticket for the current year. And while the Society issues a monthly journal a copy shall, on receipt of a request in writing, be posted free to every Member.

26. Any Member neglecting or refusing to comply with these Rules, or any or either of them, or any lawful directions or requirements by the Council made in pursuance or under the authority thereof, or being guilty either before or after becoming a Member of the Society of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be summoned before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may also be disqualified from exhibiting and may be disallowed from again becoming a Member during the pleasure of the Council. A Member expelled under this Rule shall forfeit all right in and claim upon the Society and its property.

27. Any person being expelled from Membership or disqualified from exhibiting, riding or competing by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a Member or to exhibit, ride or compete at this Society's Exhibitions until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

28. The Council shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules, and of the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder; and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Society or the administration of its affairs, whether provided for by these Rules or by the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder or otherwise, shall be final and binding on the Members.

29. Every Member shall communicate from time to time to the Secretary his address; and all notices required by these Rules to be sent or given to Members shall be deemed to have been duly sent or given if posted or sent to such address.

30. Every person becoming a Member of the Society thereby undertakes, if at any time required to do so by the Council, to give evidence by statutory declaration or otherwise of any facts within his knowledge or information relating to the subject matter of any inquiry by the Council.

31. Every person becoming a Member of the Society shall thereby undertake to indemnify and shall with every other Member thereof be bound to indemnify the Council, and the individual Members thereof, any Committee of the Council and any Members of any such Committee, against any action or damages in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in accordance with these Rules, or the By-laws or Regulations made thereunder, during the continuance of his Membership.

32. The Council and the Members thereof shall be indemnified out of the Society's property against risk and expense which may occur through borrowing monies in accordance with paragraph 13 of Rule 2; and Members of the Society, notwithstanding Rule 31 hereof, shall not by reason only of their membership be or become personally liable through, by reason, or on account of any such borrowings.

33. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting.

BY-LAWS

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Notice of the Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the Members of Council at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for by at least three Members present. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given in accordance with Rule 18.

2. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his Deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

THE PRESIDENT.

3. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Members, and shall take the chair when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks and other documents as the Council may decide.

THE COUNCIL.

4. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

5. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide by a majority of votes on a show of hands all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that, if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

7. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

8. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

9. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council or of any Committee shall be taken during their progress by the

Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some person present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

10. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants at the Society's Exhibitions.

11. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees when they shall think proper.

12. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

13. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

14. If any Member of Council, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

15. The Secretary shall notify to the Council any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or other members of the Council, at the meeting of the Council at which or next after such vacancy occurred, and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice, provided that if any such vacancy occur after the ordinary monthly Council meeting in November such vacancy shall not be filled except at the next Annual Meeting.

16. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by the senior Vice-President then present; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes. (The senior Vice-President shall be deemed to mean the Vice-President who has been a Member of Council for the greatest number of years in the aggregate.)

17. The quorum of a monthly or special meeting of Council shall be five.

18. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2) Business arising from minutes.
- (3) Election of officers and nominations for vacancies.
- (4) Committee's Reports.
- (5) Motions.
- (6) Correspondence.
- (7) Postponed business.
- (8) General business.
- (9) Notices of motions.

19. All minutes and reports read to and adopted by the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

20. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

21. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the monthly Council meeting in February as they think fit, and such

Committees shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two members of Committee to form a quorum.

22. The President shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees.

23. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

24. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the last Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

THE STAFF.

25. The Manager shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council and of Committees.

26. The Secretary shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society and keep copies of all letters on the business of the Society.

27. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, the Secretary shall be responsible for all monies received, paying such sums into the Society's Bank, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bank. He shall have the charge of the expenditure for petty cash.

28. The Secretary shall have the custody of all books and property of the Society. All books, pamphlets, etc., becoming the property of the Society shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

29. The Manager shall have the immediate superintendence over all of the servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he may think of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

30. The Manager and the Secretary shall each find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

31. Neither the Manager nor the Secretary shall exercise any of the privileges of a Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

32. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet before the ordinary Council meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each monthly meeting, as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

33. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

34. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

35. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

36. The accounts of the Society shall be audited as may be required by the Council by two professional accountants, to whom a balance sheet shall be submitted by the Secretary immediately after the close of the financial year, and such, when audited, shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
