

Seventy Eighth Annual Report of the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria

To the Members.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Council has much pleasure in presenting the following report of proceedings of the Society for the year ended 31st December, 1948.

Royal Melbourne Century Show.

Bearing in mind the fact that this Society is the successor to the Port Phillip Farmers' Society, which was instituted in 1848, your Council resolved to name the 1948 Show "The Royal Melbourne Century Show," to commemorate one hundred years of service to the primary producers of Australia in general, and Victoria in particular.

building materials and labour could not be obtained, owing to the continued shortage of housing.

Despite the publicity already referred to, the number of entries received could only be described as phenomenal, and Committees had an unenviable task in reducing the horse entries, after examination of lists of their performances, and the cattle entries were arbitrarily reduced to one entry from any one exhibitor in each class for animals under three years old.

An inexpensive alteration to the old sheep pavilion permitted provision for increased accommodation of exhibits, and also a desirable improvement in facilities for judging.

The Port Phillip Farmers' Society had established one branch, under the title of The Mornington Farmers' Society, now known as the Berwick Agricultural Society, and your Council was pleased to learn that the century of service was also to be celebrated by that Society at the Berwick Centenary Show.

As indicated in its last report, your Council resolved that quality, rather than quantity, should be the keynote for the Royal Century Show, and early notification was given of its intention to so restrict entries as to ensure that what stock was exhibited would be of a high standard, and assured of reasonable accommodation in the pavilions available on the Show Ground, as, even had it desired to do so, it was impossible to increase that accommodation, because permits for

Your Council could not visualise a Century Show without provision of a section for Merino sheep, and therefore a classification for this breed was included in the Prize Schedule, and entries in all sections were restricted to two in each ram class, and one in each ewe class, from any one exhibitor.

Young pigs were accommodated two in one pen, and in the poultry pavilion borrowed coops were placed on top of the Society's equipment. In this way it was found possible to accommodate a record number of stock, the high quality of which was favourably commented upon throughout the Show, which was held from Thursday, 23rd September, to Saturday, 2nd October.

The Society was not particularly fortunate in the weather, as, following rain on the Monday, very heavy rain fell throughout the evening on the second Thursday, and the following day was also wet.


These and other factors caused the postponement of an evening Polo Match and the cancellation of an evening Grand Parade, and in other ways interfered with the smooth running of the arena programme, and led to some friction between a section of the exhibitors and the Society. However, a total of 531,214 people attended the Show during its nine day and eight night sessions, and were not only appreciative of the outstanding display of exhibits of all kinds, but of the arena programme, high lights of which were undoubtedly the grand musical spectacle on the first Saturday evening, when, through the co-operation of the Australian Broadcasting Commission and the Military Authorities, the full A.B.C. Symphony Orchestra, Variety Orchestra and National Band united in a rendering of the "1812 Overture," with sound effects from military equipment, this feature being broadcast throughout the world; a very comprehensive display by the Police Department on the Tuesday evening; a very effective demonstration by some 10,000 members of Youth Organisations on the final Saturday afternoon; and a very spectacular Military Tattoo on that evening, when there was also a Massed Display by Highland Bands; Polo Matches on three evenings; demonstrations by members of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade, and other special features, interspersed with spectacular Grand Parades, with Hunting and Jumping Competitions, Trotting Contests, Sheep Dog Trials, etc., throughout the Show.

His Excellency the Governor (Sir Winston Dugan) attended the Dinner specially arranged to mark the occasion of the century, on the first evening, and officially opened the Show on the following day, when he congratulated the Society on the work accomplished, and expressed his wishes for continued successful development of its activities.

A special Luncheon was arranged at the Show Grounds on the Tuesday of the Show, when the opportunity was taken by the President, on behalf of his colleagues on the Council and members of the Society generally, to express keen appreciation of the honorary services rendered by the Judges, Stewards and Stewardesses.

The Judges included two from overseas and many from other States, and their complimentary remarks regarding the quality of the stock brought before them acted as a welcome counter to the friction and criticism of the section of exhibitors already referred to, as indeed did also the correspondence subsequently received from stud stock societies, expressing appreciation of the facilities provided for the accommodation and judging of their stock.

The wonderfully comprehensive display organised by the Australian Wool Board, for which the main Horticultural Hall was this year made available, was indeed a Show within a Show.

The thoroughly reorganised exhibition in the Government Pavilion, arranged by the Department of Agriculture, was also an outstanding feature very favourably commented on by patrons, as were also the exhibits staged by the Nurserymen and Seedsmen's Association and the "Save the Forests" Campaign Council.

Mention should also be made of the fact that the various business firms made every effort to combine with the Society to ensure that the display of non-competitive exhibits would be as comprehensive and bright as ruling conditions would permit.

Your Council received many expressions of appreciation of its decision to issue, as mementoes of this "Century" Show, engraved medallions to the owners of champion animals and successful exhibitors in selected classes, also attractively-designed metal badges to Judges, Stewards and other officials.

Associated Bodies.

In accordance with usual practice, paragraphs relating to the activities of stud stock societies and other organisations of primary producers,

the secretarial and administrative work of which is carried out by the staff of this Society, are included herein, and your Council takes this opportunity to express appreciation of the co-operation of these various bodies throughout the year, and more particularly in ensuring the success of the Century Show.

**The Commonwealth Clydesdale Horse Society.
(Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)**

Throughout the year there have been indications of a growing realisation that the horse is indispensable to agriculture in Australia, and particularly in the Eastern States, and it has been noticeable that animals of good type and conformation have met with ready sale at satisfactory prices.

It is only fitting that such should be the case, as the present position in regard to dollar exchange, and the significance of warnings issued regarding the world wheat situation, serve to focus attention on the value and independence of horse usage.

At the Royal Melbourne Century Show the display of Clydesdales was almost up to pre-war standards numerically, whilst the quality of the animals was very favourably commented upon, and competition in all classes was keen.

As a counter to rising costs, the Society intends to consolidate its activities. A sub-committee has been appointed to examine the position and submit a report to Federal Council at next meeting.

During the year the New South Wales Government set a fine example by importing from Great Britain a three-year-old stallion named "Kirkbride Choice," for use in its own stud, and his services will also be available to other breeders interested.

As he carries on the blood of such famous stallions as "Ardyne Refiner," "Craigie Beau Ideal" and "Dunure Footprint," he should prove an asset to the industry, and breeders will doubtless await the arrival of his progeny with keen interest.

Entries received to date for inclusion in Volume 15 of the Commonwealth Clydesdale Stud Book total 180 stallions, 722 mares, 1,322 foals, and 1,195 transfers, and Federal Council will possibly decide to proceed with the publication of the volume during the coming year.

Seasonal conditions over the past few years have been conducive to horse breeding, and it is of interest to note that the number of stallions certificated under the Horse Breeding Act (Victoria) for the year 1946-47 totalled 777, representing an increase of 63 on the previous year, whilst in the year 1947-48 the number was further increased by 59, making a total of 836, made up as follow: Draught, 255; Light, 272; Pony, 309.

Advantage is also being taken of the Victorian Government plan to encourage the breeding of

draught horses of good type and conformation, and the number of foals by certificated draught stallions from approved draught mares, in respect of which the foal bonus was paid, was 150 greater than in the year 1946-47. This is most satisfactory, indicating as it does that breeders generally are breeding for quality rather than numbers.

**The Australian Pony Stud Book Society.
(Victorian Branch.)**

Greater interest was shown in pony-breeding circles during the year, and good type ponies have been eagerly sought after.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Society, held in Sydney during the 1948 Royal Easter Show, formal approval was given to the recommendation of this branch that the privilege extended to Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania in relation to the acceptance of ponies which are not the progeny of registered sires and dams, also apply to Victoria. This has resulted in a considerable increase in the number of registrations received from breeders in this State.

Volume 3 of the Society's Stud Book was issued during the year, and a good representation of the studs of Victorian Branch members was included therein. The Council has decided that entries for Volume 4 will close during Easter, 1949.

R.A.S. Light Horse Control Council.

Registration of a considerable number of gymkhanas in the country districts, as well as in the metropolitan area, was effected during the year, and many agricultural societies maintained registration of the Light Horse Section of their Shows.

Reference was made in last year's Report to the suggestion that, to widen the scope of this Council, representatives of country agricultural societies' associations in various parts of the State should be appointed to the Committee.

Your Council adopted this suggestion, and, although there was considerable delay in receiving nominations from some of the associations concerned, a reconstituted Executive of the Light Horse Control Council will be possible when committees are appointed by your Council, in accordance with its annual custom, in March.

**The Shorthorn Society of Australia.
(Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)**

The sustained world-wide demand for beef has greatly stimulated interest in the beef-raising industry throughout the Commonwealth, and this is reflected in greater inquiry for stud stock and keener activity in stud breeding circles.

Shorthorns have more than kept pace with the development of the industry, and their popularity is such that at sales held throughout the year the demand, particularly for stud females, has exceeded the supply, and very satisfactory averages have been obtained.

Perhaps the most encouraging feature of progress made in recent years is the ever-increasing inquiry from station owners right through the central and northern cattle areas for bulls of modern type, and this demand has resulted in the development of new studs in both Western Australia and South Australia, thirteen having been established during the year.

At its Easter meeting the Federal Council resolved to reorganise the Society, and as from 1st May last all entries from breeders in all States of the Commonwealth have been forwarded direct to the Federal Office. It is anticipated that this action will prove beneficial, as the various branch committees will now be free to foster and encourage the breeding of Shorthorns in their respective States.

Entries received to date for inclusion in Volume 14 of the Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia, which closed at the end of the year, total 391 bulls, 1,200 cows, 2,967 calves, and 1,892 transfers. These figures indicate that the volume will be the largest ever published by the Society, and demonstrates the progress which the breed is making.

The renowned Scottish Judge, Mr. Walter Biggar, of Grange Farm, Castel Douglas, Kirkcudbrightshire, who has had the unique experience of having judged at the Chicago Exposition on ten different occasions, was appointed to adjudicate in the Shorthorn Section at the Sydney Royal Show, and the value of his sound judgment and advice, given during his tour through the States, will doubtless prove of great assistance to breeders.

Four bulls and two females have recently been acquired by Victorian and New South Wales breeders from leading studs in Great Britain, and are expected to arrive early in the new year.

It is also certain that Australian studmasters will attend the famous Perth (Scotland) sale of Shorthorns, which will be held on the 14th to 16th February, 1949, and it is expected competition from all the beef-raising countries of the world will be keen.

The Dairy Shorthorn Association of Australia.

The demand for Dairy Shorthorns is still far in excess of the supply, but, despite the shortage of breeding stock, the membership has shown a further increase over the year, and there are now over 200 breeders enrolled.

The increasing popularity of the breed was also reflected in the all-time record of 190 entries received in the Dairy Shorthorn Section at the Royal Melbourne Century Show. This was far in excess of the previous record of 127 entries received last year.

Volume 4 of the Dairy Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia is nearing completion, and copies will be available for distribution to members early in the new year. The volume will be the largest

yet issued by the Association, featuring the adult registration of 2,144 animals, with produce recorded to 31st December, 1946, together with particulars of additional produce, changes of ownership and other information relating to 1,078 cows registered in previous volumes.

The final figures released by the Department of Agriculture in connection with the 1947-48 Standard Herd Test Lactation Period once again proved that Dairy Shorthorns are consistent producers of milk and butterfat. Although not included in the 1947-48 report, covering the year ending 30th June, 1948, the remarkable performance of "Willow Park Duchess 35th," which completed her ninth lactation period on 14th July last, is well worthy of note. This cow, in the herd of the Estate of the late W. K. Atkinson, produced, in 273 days, 19,242 lbs. of milk and 791.1 lbs. butterfat, with an average test of 4.11 per cent.

The keen demand for Dairy Shorthorns was reflected at one dispersal sale in Victoria during the year, when bulls brought up to 700 guineas, and cows to 400 guineas.

The Red Poll Cattle Breeders' Association of Australia.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

The breed continues to make good progress, despite the limited number of breeding stock available to lay the foundations of new herds.

Entries for Volume 14 of the Red Poll Herd Book of Australia recently closed, and compilation will be taken in hand early in the new year.

The "Australian Red Poll Breeders' Guide" is now taking definite shape, and it is hoped that copy will be ready for the printer early in the new year. When completed, the booklet should prove to be a valuable work of reference insofar as the breed in Australia is concerned.

During the year the Federal Council approved of the formation of a branch in South Australia, and there are now branches in every State except Queensland. At the present time breeders in Queensland are enrolled as members of the New South Wales Branch.

The Royal Melbourne Century Show attracted an entry of 93 animals in the Red Poll Section. This included a team from New South Wales, for the first time for many years. The revised schedule of prizes, as adopted by your Council for the dual-purpose breeds, operated for the first time, and proved satisfactory.

The 1948 tour of the Classification Board, appointed to inspect herds nominated for inclusion in the Voluntary Classification Scheme adopted by the Victorian Branch, took place during the latter part of the year. Board members reported a very successful tour, covering some 1,800 miles.

The Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

It is pleasing to report that the breed continues to gain in popularity, and membership of all branches increased considerably during the year.

This popularity is world-wide, as is indicated by the number of animals exported from Great Britain to countries all over the world. Australia is taking part in this export trade, and some 40 head were exported to Kenya Colony and the Philippines during the year. New blood has also been introduced into Australia by importations from Scotland and New Zealand.

During the year the Federal Council issued Volume 39 of the Ayrshire Herd Book of Australasia, and Volume 40, which is almost ready for distribution, will contain pedigrees of 301 males and 1,394 females, being an increase on those contained in the preceding volume. An interesting feature of Volume 40 will be the number of extremely good test results and the increase in individual animals tested during the year.

It is interesting to note, through the comments of judges at the principal Shows throughout the Commonwealth, that a high standard of type is being maintained, particularly as the breed is also performing well under test. It is evident from this that, in increasing yields, the breeders are not neglecting the type of their stock.

At its meeting held during the Royal Century Show, the Federal Council was informed that, although strenuous efforts had been made, it had not been found possible to re-establish a branch of the Society in Western Australia, and the few breeders in the Western State will still remain attached to the South Australian Branch.

The Society was unfortunate to lose, through death, the services of Messrs. W. R. Brisbane, F. A. Stimpson and E. F. Alloid, the first two of whom were members of the Federal Council, and the last-named a member of the Committee of the Victorian Branch. All of these gentlemen had done outstanding work in the interests of the breed, and their deaths were keenly felt by all members.

The Friesian Cattle Club of Australia. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

Increased interest of members of the Victorian Branch was demonstrated at the Royal Melbourne Century Show. Many new studmasters exhibited stock, and raised the number of entries in the section for Friesian Cattle to 193.

Two meetings of the Federal Council were held during the year, and many matters were dealt with. All branches reported another profitable year, and numerous inquiries for the black and white breed. The membership throughout the Commonwealth has considerably increased.

Many new herds have been admitted to the Victorian Government Standard Herd Testing

Scheme, and it is worthy of note that in Tasmania the Friesian cow, "Martigay Flora Roberts," as a mature, gave the splendid yield of 820 lbs. butterfat under Government Standard Herd Test.

The Victorian Branch held its second annual dinner during Show Week, and many Interstate visitors were present. An enjoyable time was spent by all.

Mr. W. T. Smith, "Wattle Bank," Koo-Wee-Rup, was elected Chairman of the Victorian Branch, Mr. T. Gilmore having retired. A minute was recorded for the good work Mr. Gilmore had done for the branch and the breed in general.

The Guernsey Cattle Society of Australia. (Victorian Branch.)

This branch reported last year that the indications were that it would soon become the strongest in the Society, and the past twelve months have confirmed that opinion.

Numerous inquiries have been made for the Society's literature, issued by the Federal Council, and distributed through this branch. It has been very much appreciated.

The demand for Guernsey cattle in Victoria is still greater than the supply, in spite of numerous Interstate importations.

The herds of more members are now under Government Standard Test in this State, and the excellent butterfat records have further proved the dairy qualities of the breed.

The world-famous Guernsey cow, "Yarraview Le Mode," again had remarkable figures, producing 821.4 lbs. butterfat. Unfortunately, as she did not re-calve within the stipulated time, she was ineligible for the Championship. However, another cow from the same herd, "Yarraview Carol," was champion cow of all breeds, with a production record of 768.9 lbs. butterfat in 273 days.

Entries for the Royal Melbourne Century Show numbered 188, as compared with the record of 146 last year.

During the year, the Victorian President, Dr. F. G. Stephens, was appointed Federal President of the Society.

The Federal Council recently issued Volume 16 of the Guernsey Herd Book of Australia, and copies are now being forwarded to members.

With the approval of the Federal Council, the Branch Committee adopted a stud register, which must be kept by each member.

On the recommendation of this Committee, the Federal Council resolved to introduce a regulation that all registered Guernsey cattle sold by public auction shall be inspected for tattoo brands by an official appointed by the branch.

In July last Mr. P. A. Mahy, a well-known breeder from Guernsey Island, visited Victoria, and, at a special meeting arranged in his honour,

gave an address of great interest to members of this branch.

The Australian Illawarra Shorthorn Society. (Victorian Branch.)

Rapid progress in Victoria over the past twelve months, and the keen demand for stock, gives every indication that Victoria is fast losing its title of the "Cinderella" State insofar as the A.I.S. breed is concerned.

In the past, intending breeders had to rely mainly on importations from the northern States for the foundation of new studs, but, with many more Victorian breeders now in the field, some relief in the shortage of breeding stock can be looked for in the near future.

An all-time record entry of 235 animals was received for the A.I.S. Section at the Royal Melbourne Century Show. This included teams from New South Wales, for the first time for many years, one being specially organised by the Mid Rivers (N.S.W.) Branch of the Society.

The Federal Council issued Volumes 10 and 11 of the Australian Illawarra Shorthorn Herd Book during the year, and the studs of Victorian breeders were well represented therein.

As usual, the branch took an active part in the affairs of the Federal Council. Recently, particular attention was given to the matter of late entries and effectively-tattooed animals. All members throughout Australia were requested to make a careful inspection of their herds, and immediately notify their Branch Secretary of any irregularities in connection with tattoo brands. The 31st December, 1948, will, to a very large extent, mark the end of Branch Committee and Federal Council consideration of applications for the admission to the Herd Book of irregular and late entries.

The Australian Jersey Herd Society. (Victorian Branch.)

The popularity of the Jersey breed is reflected in the continual increase in membership and the growth in volume of registration and transfer of stock. Membership of this branch is now 1,284, as against 1,150 last year.

Owing to the increase in the number of registrations, it has been necessary to introduce a new system for recording the births of calves. Hitherto, a copy of each calf registration form lodged with this branch was made and retained in the office, prior to forwarding the original to the Federal Secretary. Under the new system, each birth is recorded on a card provided for each dam, thus saving a considerable amount of labour, while enabling more than one person to record births.

The Federal Council recently issued Volume 34 of the Jersey Stud Book of Australia, and copies are now being forwarded to members of this branch.

During the year the branch had the good fortune to secure the services of Mr. W. J. Yuill as Publicity Officer. Mr. Yuill, who relinquished the position of Supervisor of Herd Testing with the Victorian Department of Agriculture, has had wide experience in the testing of cattle in particular, and the dairying industry in general. Already Mr. Yuill has gained much publicity for the breed, and has compiled and published the "Lifetime Register of Merit," which is available to any person free of charge.

Jerseys have again done particularly well under the Victorian Government Standard Test, gaining the Herd Championship for the 29th time since the scheme was inaugurated, 33 years ago, the successful herd being that of Mr. James Stedman, of Appin. The Reserve Championship for cows was awarded to the senior three-year-old heifer, "Elm Grove Songstress 5th" (91937), owned by Mr. W. C. R. Gay, of North Devon, her production, without allowance for age, being 747.8 lbs. butterfat, a very creditable performance indeed.

The Type Classification Scheme conducted by the branch is also increasing in popularity, and to visit all the herds submitted necessitates travelling over 6,000 miles throughout the State during spring. In addition to the classification of cows, the scheme now provides for the classification of bulls, two years old or over, and the additional award, "Very Highly Commended," has been introduced for both bulls and cows.

In November, the Committee decided that, as the trophy offered for the Champion Jersey Cow had been won outright at this year's Royal Melbourne Century Show, a separate £10/10/- trophy be offered each year for the Champion Jersey Cow, and that a similar trophy be offered for the Champion Jersey Bull when the present trophy had been won outright.

The Committee of this branch endorsed your Council's request to exhibitors to enter only their best stock for the Royal Melbourne Century Show. Despite this request, the entries received necessitated action to reduce the number of cattle to that for which accommodation could be provided on the Show Grounds.

The Victorian Herd Improvement Association.

(Formerly the Victorian United Cow Test Association.)

It is with gratification that the Council of this Association reports continued improvement in the number of units in operation. The appointment of migrants (mentioned in last Report) has been of some small assistance in overcoming the shortage of herd testers, which is still seriously retarding the expansion of the movement.

Having been advised that a reply had been received from the Commonwealth Government with regard to Victoria's proposals as to the expenditure of this State's share of the money to be made available to assist producers to obtain greater production, an invitation was extended to Mr. T. M. Jensen (Superintendent of Dairying) to outline the scheme evolved, following a

discussion he had had with the Director of Agriculture regarding herd improvement generally. The Association heartily endorsed the proposal as explained by Mr. Jensen, and promised its full co-operation in an endeavour to obtain the maximum benefit from the amount of money to be spent, and also to promote closer relationship between the Association and the Government.

At last Annual General Conference it was decided that, as herd improvement was the main objective of those interested in herd testing, the name of the Association be altered, and it will in future function as "The Victorian Herd Improvement Association."

A complimentary dinner and presentation was tendered to Mr. W. J. Yuill, who, having severed his connection with the Department of Agriculture, which he represented on the Council, became ineligible to retain his seat. Many fine tributes to the work of Mr. Yuill during his long association with herd testing in Victoria were paid by several speakers, and it was noted with pleasure that his assistance and advice would still be available in an advisory capacity.

Mr. Bradbury, who succeeded Mr. Yuill in the Department, will in future continue the liaison between the Department and the Association.

The resignation of Mr. C. C. Johnson (President, and one of the original Councillors) was accepted with much regret, and opportunity was taken at the dinner mentioned above to make a presentation, in appreciation of the valuable services he had rendered to the Association over many years.

Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Production Certificates were again issued to owners of herds which reached a specified standard under test; and there was a keen contest in respect of prizes and trophies donated in connection with the Herd Testers' Competition.

The Goat Society of Australia. (Victorian Branch.)

The work of this newly-constituted branch, referred to in last Report, has proceeded smoothly during the year.

Mr. A. C. T. Hewitt was made an Honorary Member of the branch, in recognition of his splendid work as Honorary Secretary for Victorian breeders, and the great service he rendered in connection with the negotiations leading to the establishment of a branch of the Society in this State.

In the past twelve months the demand for goats has increased at a tremendous rate, and it has not been possible to supply more than a portion of the requirements. To ease the position, a number of Victorian breeders purchased about 100 pure-bred Saanen Goats from New South Wales.

Many doctors are advising clients to obtain goat's milk for certain ailments, and reports have come to hand that quite a number of infants

have recovered health after being given goat's milk.

Positive action has been taken with regard to the sale of goat's milk in the metropolitan area, and arrangements have been made for regular supplies to be available at two centres.

Keener interest by the public is revealed by the many inquiries that have been made for information on goat-breeding, and the increase in subscriptions to "The Australian Goat World."

The Federal Council issued a descriptive booklet on goats, which has been greatly appreciated.

This year two classes for Angora Goats were added to the Society's schedule, to give the public an opportunity of comparison between the milk and mohair goats.

The Federal Council has also issued, in one cover, Volumes 1 and 2 of the Goat Herd Book of Australia, and copies have been forwarded to branch members.

Through the medium of the press and the radio, a considerable amount of publicity has been given by the branch. This publicity has been far-reaching, for inquiries have been received from as far afield as Siam, India, New Guinea and the Northern Territory.

At the Annual Meeting of the branch this year Mr. Hewitt was appointed Chairman, Mr. O. Grayson having retired. The members expressed many thanks to the retiring Chairman for his excellent work for the Society.

The Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

The membership of this Society has increased during the past twelve months to the satisfactory total of 2,275. Of this total, 989 members reside in Victoria.

The fortieth volume of the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia, published in 1948, contains the histories of 2,428 flocks and 3,831 individual registrations.

The Committee of the Victorian Branch further extended its activities when it agreed to take over the control of the sale of registered sheep held at Wodonga in October last. The branch, as a result, now conducts registered sales in five country centres and two in Melbourne.

In the past, sheep offered at these sales have met strong demand, but buyers at the 1948 fixtures were somewhat reluctant to make their usual large purchases. This is no indication that the sales did not achieve their object, as the sheep yarded were of high standard, and some 3,000 odd sheep were sold. It is, however, some indication that fat lamb producers, owing to the uncertain conditions in the meat-killing works, are turning their attention to the production of wool, for which the market is exceptionally buoyant.

That breeders are continually endeavouring to raise the standard of their flocks is reflected by the fact that members have, during the year, again imported a number of sheep from Great Britain.

Quality was the keynote of the sheep displayed at the 1948 Royal Melbourne Century Show. Your Council has expressed appreciation of the contribution made by the Victorian Branch to the prize fund in the sheep classes.

Members who exhibited British Breeds at the 1948 "Royal" have expressed appreciation of the efforts of your Council in improving arrangements for the judging and selling of their sheep.

At the 1948 Annual Meeting of the Victorian Branch members accepted, with much regret, the resignation of Capt. A. E. T. Payne as a member of the Branch Committee. Capt. Payne has been associated with the British Breeds Society since 1906, and, as an acknowledgment of the valuable services rendered during those years, he was made a Patron of the Victorian Branch.

Members of the Society deeply regret the loss of one of its stalwarts, through the death of Dr. A. Caddy, in April last.

The Australian Corriedale Association. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

There has been a keen demand for Corriedales during the past twelve months, and as a result the membership of this Association has been increased to 756. The number of registered sheep owned by these members exceeds 286,000. Approximately 80,000 of these sheep are registered by the 260 members of the Victorian Branch.

Corriedale wool has always realised good prices, and the present demand and values for wool should create a still greater inquiry for this dual-purpose breed.

At the 1948 Annual Meeting of the Federal Council approval was given to suggestions made by branches concerning the revision and reprinting of the booklet, "The Corriedale." This booklet has proved very valuable to sheep breeders, both in Australia and overseas. It is anticipated that copies of the revised publication will be available early in the new year.

Realising the valuable work being carried out by the District Committee formed some years ago in the Wimmera, breeders in the Goulburn Valley decided to establish a similar Committee; and when approving the proposal, the Branch Committee expressed its appreciation of the interest shown, and, to assist the funds, made available a grant of £21.

During the year there was a substantial increase in the number of applications from country Agricultural Societies for Champion sashes, made available by the branch to Shows restricted to registered sheep; and, to ensure that these Societies would be able to select competent

judges, the Branch Committee prepared an official panel, copies of which have been distributed to all Agricultural Societies throughout Victoria.

Corriedales exhibited at the 1948 Australian Sheepbreeders' and Royal Melbourne Century Shows made attractive displays. The Victorian Branch contributed to the funds of both these Shows, and your Council has thanked the Branch for its donation to the "Royal" funds.

The Australian Pig Society.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

Although those engaged in pig production are passing through troublous times, interest in this Society has never been greater.

Reference was made in last year's Report to the recognition of the need for unity amongst those interested in pig-raising throughout Australia, and to the Commercial Pig Committee being formed by the Victorian Branch.

The successful outcome of the Victorian arrangement aroused such interest in other States that the Federal Council arranged a conference for the purpose of ensuring that the pig-producers of Australia be united in one Commonwealth-wide organisation, in the best interests of the pig industry. This conference, which was held at the Show Grounds during the Royal Melbourne Century Show, and was attended by representatives of influential primary producers' organisations from every State, unanimously approved of the principle of one organisation to

represent the entire pig interests of Australia, and resolved that all organisations present take steps to affiliate with the Australian Pig Society, so that it would be the sole voice of the industry. The conference also requested that all branches of this Society take steps to bring about the affiliation of all organisations interested in the production of pig meats in their respective States.

There has been much activity within the various States, following the conference above referred to. It was realised that the work of major benefit to the producer would be done in the various States, and the first essential was for pig-producers to put their own affairs in order in their respective States, so that a strong Federal body would eventuate. A further Federal conference of interested organisations will take place in Melbourne in January, 1949, to finalise matters. Reports indicate that full success will be achieved.

Following representations made by the Federal Council, the Australian Meat Board arranged a conference, early in the year, between representatives of the Society, bacon-curers, and members of the British Delegation which was in Australia inquiring into the possibilities of increased production of meat for export to the Mother Country. Sir Henry Turner, leader of the delegation, left those present at the conference in no doubt that the demand for meats from Australia would be on a huge scale for many years. In respect to pig meats, he stated that for the next four or five years Britain could take from Australia 300,000 tons of bacon carcasses and 100,000

tons of porker carcasses annually. The gigantic task set for the pig industry can be better gauged when it is realised that the total quantity of pig meats produced in Australia during 1947 was 100,000 tons.

Representatives of each branch of the Society went carefully into the matter of costs of production of pig meats in the various States, the availability of food supplies, and ways and means by which producers could be encouraged to increase their production to meet the demand from England. It was finally agreed that an export price of 1/6 per lb. was necessary to provide an incentive for present producers to increase production and to encourage others to establish piggeries. Despite a recommendation to that effect to the Australian Meat Board, the British contract was signed at 1/0½ per lb., a price well below the actual cost of production. It is therefore obvious that, under existing conditions, pig meat production cannot even be maintained. There certainly can be no increase.

In May last, the Victorian Branch co-operated with the Australian Meat Board, Victorian Department of Agriculture and your Society in successfully staging a Bacon Pig Competition, Pig Raisers' Convention, and Stud Pig Sale. A feature of the three-day programme arranged was a conducted tour of the Angliss Imperial Meat Works, where a splendid educational demonstration was arranged by Mr. J. Reynolds, Veterinary Officer of the Commonwealth Meat Inspection Branch. In addition to carcasses of ideal, over-fed and poorly-fed pigs, were carcasses of pigs infected with various diseases, which were explained in a manner easily understood by all present. Such a demonstration was worthy of a 100 per cent. attendance by pig-raisers who hoped to make a success of pig meat production.

The Victorian Branch again subsidised Bacon and Pork Pig Classes at the Royal Melbourne Century Show.

The Kennel Control Council.

The year 1948 has been the most successful yet experienced by the K.C.C. Membership has risen from 1,038 in 1943 to an all-time record of 3,924.

Mr. A. S. Crouch was appointed by your Council to fill the vacancy caused by Mr. M. M. O'Toole's resignation, due to ill health. Your Council records its sincere appreciation of Mr. O'Toole's valuable service to the dog world.

The "K.C.C. Kennel Gazette" has been a most helpful medium for disseminating information, which must reach the members in accurate form. The inclusion of the official calendar of shows, parades and meetings, also prize schedules, has been of much service to members and affiliates.

During the year the K.C.C. was strengthened by the affiliation of the Ararat, Central Gippsland, Dachshund, Fox Terrier, Horsham, Non-Sporting (other than Toys), North Gippsland

and Scottish Terrier Kennel Clubs, and the Fern-tree Gully and District A. and H. Society; whilst the Bendigo Kennel Club, and the Echuca and District A. and P. Society, which had been in recess since before the war, were re-affiliated.

A surcharge of 1/- per entry at both shows and parades did not, as forecast by some, cause any decrease in entries—in fact, all shows received increases. The revenue produced in this way has been set aside for the benefit of the fancy.

In all, 99 dogs and bitches were granted the title "K.C.C. Champion" during the year. It must be gratifying to successful owners to know that the prestige of the title won in Victoria was never higher.

The Annual Championship Field Trials for the two groups—Pointers and Setters—Spaniels and Retrievers—were held at Mickleham and Donnybrook respectively. There was a good attendance at both trials.

The appointment of the world-renowned judge, Mr. J. W. Marples, F.Z.S., to adjudicate in the Dog Section of the Royal Melbourne Century Show was greatly appreciated, as indicated by the largest entry yet received.

The maximum classification to be permitted during 1949 was reviewed, and, where necessary, reductions or increases were made, so that healthy competition would be encouraged.

The 1949 Calendar of Shows and Parades was drawn up, this difficult task being finalised to the satisfaction of the greatest possible number of clubs.

A buffet dinner for members and their friends was held at the conclusion of the Royal Melbourne Century Show. The function was well attended by Victorian and Interstate visitors. The spirit which prevailed assured success, despite the impossibility of holding a dinner and dance, as in the past.

The K.C.C. Committee has recorded its grateful appreciation of the valuable support of your Society in the best interests of dog-breeding and exhibiting in Victoria.

The Victorian Working Sheep Dog Association.

The Association experienced another satisfactory year, and a further increase in the membership can be reported. The total number of members enrolled is now 223. The number of affiliated clubs has also increased, and there are now 35 bodies throughout Victoria conducting trials under the Rules of this Association. These trials again proved popular, many club secretaries reporting record entries and large and enthusiastic attendances.

The two main events of the year—the Capt. Payne Field Trial and the William Cooper and Nephews Utility Trial—were successfully staged

at North Wonwondah and Nathalia respectively. Local arrangements for the Payne Trial were carried out by the North Wonwondah Working Sheep Dog Club, and Mr. O. F. Fish, of Oatlands, Tasmania, took the honours with his dog, "Rockton Moss." This was the first occasion on which a Tasmanian competitor had entered for this big event in the Victorian Sheep Dog world, and only the second time since the inception of the trial that a win has been recorded by an Interstate competitor. Local arrangements for the Cooper Utility Trial were in the hands of the Nathalia Agricultural Society. The trial was won by Mr. J. Moses with "Vic of Berwickshire" (imp.).

During the year the Association entered into a reciprocal agreement with the Sheep Dog Workers' Association of New South Wales, the secretarial work of which has been taken over by the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales. It is felt that this move will do much to eventually bring about the desired uniformity of trials conducted in both States.

Poultry Control Council.

As reported last year, your Council acceded to the unanimous request of metropolitan poultry-showing societies, and formed a Poultry Control Council, on lines similar to those which have proved so successful in the conduct of the Kennel Control Council.

The strong Committee appointed by your Council, after consideration of nominations received from the various poultry societies, held its first meeting on 6th April, 1948, with Mr. Harold Bartram as Chairman.

The Committee immediately proceeded with the registration of show dates and the compila-

tion of a constitution and rules, which, when adopted, were accorded the approval of your Council.

The Committee expresses its deep appreciation of the assistance rendered by Mr. H. T. C. Woodfull in drawing up this constitution and rules.

A complete and comprehensive panel of judges was framed, and the Committee is now engaged in revising the standards of excellence for the various breeds of poultry, which, when completed, will be made available to breeders and exhibitors.

During the Royal Century Show advantage was taken of the presence of Interstate representatives, and a conference was held, with the object of fixing an Australian standard for the Australorp breed, to replace the varying standards now in force in the different States. Considerable progress was made, and negotiations are being continued by correspondence. It is confidently anticipated that complete unanimity will be reached within the next few months.

There is no doubt that the formation of this Council satisfied a long-felt want. This is reflected in the fact that 415 exhibitors were registered, and all showing societies received record entries for their shows, whilst at the "Royal" 2,105 entries, representing almost 2,300 birds, were exhibited. Although extra coops had been obtained during the year, this huge entry taxed our resources, and double decking had to be resorted to in portion of the building.

The Victorian Young Farmers' Clubs Association.

The Association is pleased to report that an increased grant has been made available by the

Government to facilitate further development of the Young Farmer Movement.

In addition to the previous gift of £100 from the Hugh Victor McKay Charitable Trust, a further donation of £500 has been received, to be used for the extension of club activities. The donors have the sincere thanks of the Association for the support they have accorded.

The financial year ended with a very fine total of 364 junior, and 38 senior clubs.

A member of the Senior Section—Alan Turner, of Kergunyah—was selected to take part, with two New South Wales young farmers, in a Cattle-Judging Competition, at the York Royal Show, in England, in July. Sending a Victorian representative was made possible by the generosity of the proprietors of "The Australian Farm and Home," the official journal of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, who provided a sum of £450/7/6 to defray all expenses, including a visit to Norway, Denmark, and Jersey Island. Such generous support is keenly appreciated.

A display which created widespread interest was made by the young farmers of Bell Practising School, in the window of Messrs. McEwans Pty. Ltd., Elizabeth Street, during Education Week.

The eleventh annual three years scholarship at an Agricultural College, provided by the Agricultural Education Division of the Department of Agriculture, was this year awarded to Alan Heslop, of Woorinen North Club, who has commenced his studies at Longerenong College.

A vacation school for Young Farmers' Club leaders was held at the Teachers' College during the May vacation. As usual, the Association had the co-operation of officers of the Departments of Education and Agriculture, of the manager and staff of the Werribee Research Farm, and principal and staff of the Burnley School of Horticulture, Mr. J. Hall, and the Bell Young Farmers, the Australian Broadcasting Commission, and Australian Cement Ltd. The school was one of the most profitable yet held, and the success was due in no small measure to the co-operation of the foregoing and to the supervisors, who delivered courses of most helpful lectures.

Great interest has been taken in broadcast sessions. The Australian Broadcasting Commission, through its rural officer, Mr. R. Thompson, conducted many sessions, and practical demonstrations at club centres. A broadcast over "Radio Australia," controlled by the Department of Information, giving the story of the young farmers of Victoria, was given during the year, and was followed by an actuality broadcast from three Geelong District Young Farmers' Clubs. Reports from overseas stated that these broadcasts were most successful.

The 1948 Young Farmer Leadership Competition, conducted by the Australian Broadcasting Commission, was of great educational value, and, after a keen competition among the Victorian candidates, Mr. Jim Aldous, of the Mansfield Senior Section, was chosen to represent Victoria.

The final, comprising the winners from all States of Australia, was conducted at the Royal Melbourne Century Show, and resulted in a win for Athol Barret, of Western Australia. State finalists were the guests of the Commission during the Show, and the good fellowship and interchange of ideas on agricultural projects has been most beneficial in creating an Australian-wide development of this great movement.

The annual display of activities by the junior and senior young farmers of Victoria, in the Young Farmers' Pavilion on the Royal Show Grounds, reached the highest standard yet achieved. The attendances of the public at the display evidenced the increasing interest that is being created in the movement. A feature was the central pyramid, on which a comprehensive array of the projects of senior sections was presented for the first time.

The Young Farmer Pig-Raising Competition, conducted by the Royal Agricultural Society and Australian Broadcasting Commission, was well supported. Seventeen carcasses were on display in the Young Farmers' Pavilion at the Royal Century Show, and created great interest. Mr. L. A. Downey, Pig Expert of the Department of Agriculture, judged the exhibits, and commended the young farmers on the quality of bacon produced. First prize went to L. Dale, of Huon.

The principal of the Burnley School of Horticulture again made available a number of fruit trees free to clubs. Mr. L. J. Cole, of Tyabb, has supplied many fruit trees, at low cost, to clubs. Their assistance has been of great value to young farmers in fruit areas, and is much appreciated.

During the Annual Convention of the Chamber of Agriculture of Victoria, at Bendigo, in March last, a camp of young men of the Senior Section was conducted at Axedale. The organisation of this first camp was most successful, and will be helpful in arrangements of camps for both young men and women of Senior Section clubs which will be held in the future. The members of the camp visited a session of the Convention and presented their Charter to the President of the Chamber, Mr. J. McIntosh.

In the educational programme of the State of Victoria, Young Farmers' Clubs occupy an important place. All who have taken part in the building of the movement and in its development must feel proud to think that its influence has spread from the boys and girls of our schools to the young men and women throughout the State.

The Chamber of Agriculture of Victoria.

In view of the gradual withdrawal of wartime controls, this Chamber has prepared to resume its activities in the best interests of the primary producers of this State.

Its second post-war country Convention, held at Bendigo, was outstanding, if only for the comprehensiveness of the discussion on the farm labour problem.

This feature was so well received by the delegates that it has been decided to devote a session or sessions at future Conventions to thoroughly

discuss a problem or problems affecting all producers.

At the Bendigo Convention many educational films were exhibited, and addresses on various subjects were subsequently published in the Chamber Year Book, copies of which are regularly applied for by libraries and kindred organisations in other countries, as well as in other States.

At the Bendigo Convention Professor S. M. Wadham was elected as President, with Messrs. C. C. Johnson and W. F. Weigall as Vice-Presidents.

Quarterly meetings of the Council have been held in Melbourne during the year, and arrangements are now being made for the 1949 Convention, which is to be held at Ballarat.

It has already been decided that a session at this Convention will be set aside for full discussion of a proposal for the removal of the Newmarket Saleyards.

Australian Council of Agricultural Societies.


A meeting of the Australian Council of Agricultural Societies was held in Sydney at Easter time, and a further meeting at Melbourne during the Royal Century Show.

At this latter meeting a constitution was formally adopted, and Hon. C. A. Sinclair was unanimously re-elected as President.


Your Council resolved to maintain affiliation with this organisation, and appointed Messrs. John Bott and Keith McGarvie to represent this Society.

The Journal.

Throughout the year your Council has been pleased to receive many congratulations on the improvement effected in the official journal of this Society, "The Australian Farm and Home," since the change of ownership referred to in its last report.

Your Council was also particularly pleased when the proprietors of the journal resolved to sponsor a Victorian young farmer as a member of an Australian team to visit England and take part in judging competitions at the Royal Show.

The quality of this journal has been such as to greatly increase its circulation, and the added publicity given to the activities of this Society has been a factor in the considerably increased number of members enrolled during the year.

Victorian Pasture Improvement League.

Your Council has continued its interest in the activities of this organisation, and its contribution towards the funds, which have been expended to good purpose on work associated with the improvement of pastures throughout the State.

The Australian Cattle Research Association.

The Society's contribution towards the funds of this Association has been renewed by your Council, which has been interested in reports received regarding the scientific investigations into Bovine Mastitis and Bang's Disease, being carried out by arrangement with the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research in Victoria, and at the Glenfield Research Station in New South Wales.

The Australian Meat Board.

Your Council was gratified to learn that, at its meeting in November last, the Australian Meat Board had decided to co-operate with this Society in the provision of refrigerated accommodation on the Show Grounds, in which educational displays of meat could be staged during Royal Shows, and also other special exhibitions between Shows.

The Society's Architect has been instructed to make inquiries and report regarding the avail-

ability of the necessary materials, in the hope that it will be possible to have the accommodation ready for use at the 1949 Royal Show.

Your Council was pleased to be able to co-operate with the Australian Meat Board and the Australian Pig Society by making buildings at the Show Grounds available for a display of carcasses of pigs entered for the Board's competition in May last, and for a conference of pig-raisers, and sale of stud pigs arranged at the same time.

Wheat Crop Championship Competitions.

The Farm Competitions Association of Victoria has expressed its appreciation of the continued co-operation of this Society in connection with the Wheat Crop Championship Competitions, annually conducted in the Wimmera, Mallee, and Northern District.

Your Council has again undertaken to provide £150 as prize money—£50 in each district—and has been advised that twenty-two Agricultural Societies have arranged competitions, from which the Championships will eventually be determined. Judging is now in progress.

Fodder Conservation.

As a result of the activities of this Society over the years, interest in fodder conservation has been increased throughout Victoria.

The R.A.S. (1947-48) Fodder Conservation Campaign was successfully conducted, with the full co-operation of the Department of Agriculture, which not only renewed its financial support, but made available the services of its officers as judges.

The reports of these judges have been widely publicised.


Having received an assurance of a continuance of the co-operation of the Department of Agriculture, your Council resolved to conduct a 1948-49 Fodder Conservation Campaign, and invited applications for subsidies of £15 each, as prize money in local district Fodder Conservation Competitions to be conducted by agricultural societies, herd-testing associations, and other approved organisations of primary producers.

The interest in this campaign was revealed by the correspondence received from no less than fifty-five bodies, each of which will be eligible to receive a subsidy if a minimum of five entries is received.

To facilitate earlier judging, entries will close with local secretaries on 31st January.

"Leo Bartels" Memorial Prize.

At its November meeting your Council decided to commemorate the work of the late Mr. Leo

Bartels by the inauguration of a memorial prize, for competition at future Royal Shows, this prize to be offered for conserved fodder, the palatability and protein content of which would be taken into account by the judges.

When arriving at this decision, Council endorsed the view that the death of Mr. Bartels, who had been the Senior Agrostologist of the Department of Agriculture, had meant a great loss to Victoria, because he had done more than anyone else to develop pastures of this State.

It is confidently anticipated that many firms and individuals will welcome the opportunity to subscribe to the fund from which this memorial prize will be financed in perpetuity.

Associate Judges' Contest.

As indicated in last report, the success of the contest at the 1947 Royal Show for Associate Judges of Light Horses prompted your Council to adopt the suggestion that similar associate judges' contests be conducted for other classes of stock.

As a result, country agricultural societies, agricultural colleges, and young farmers' clubs were invited to submit nominations for contests in the various breeds of cattle, sheep and pigs.

The reports of the adjudicators will guide your Council as to the advisability of continuing these contests under conditions similar to those which applied at the Century Show, or some variation thereof.

Use of Show Grounds Between Shows.

Night Trotting.

During the year harmonious relations have existed between your Council and the Trotting Control Board.

The Society's revenue has benefited as a result of night trotting racing at the Show Grounds, and there is no lack of evidence of public appreciation of the manner in which this sport has been conducted.

Following a successful first season, the Board commenced its 1948-49 series of meetings on Melbourne Cup Night (Tuesday, 2nd November), and to date not only has the amount of stakes been increased, but much greater public patronage has been accorded.

Olympics.

Your Council readily endorsed the view expressed by the President that, if the 1956 Olympic Games were to be held in Melbourne, there could be no question but that, of the various sites suggested for the Olympic Stadium, the Show Grounds would prove to be the most suitable.

Members will have noted that the Olympic Invitation Committee had chosen the Show Grounds for development, subject, of course, to the acceptance of the invitation to hold the Games in Melbourne.

This invitation is to be considered at a meeting of the World Olympic Council, to be held in Rome during April.

In the meantime, it is of particular interest to the members of this Society to note that, in the event of a favourable decision in Rome, the State Government, which has approved of the proposal

to use the Show Grounds, has undertaken to make the necessary financial arrangements to ensure the provision of adequate facilities for the proper presentation of the Games in Melbourne.

Acknowledgments.

Your Council welcomes this opportunity to place on record its grateful appreciation of the continued interest taken in the Society and its activities by His Excellency the Governor and Lady Dugan.

Last year reference was made to their impending departure for England, but, as members are aware, arrangements were altered in view of the proposed visit to Australia of Their Majesties the King and Queen, and Her Royal Highness Princess Margaret.

Now that the Royal visit has had to be cancelled, owing to the illness of His Majesty, His Excellency will be returning to England early in the coming year, and your Council reiterates, on behalf of this Society, keen appreciation of his services, and those of Lady Dugan, during their long sojourn in Victoria, and joins with all citizens in expressing best wishes for their health and happiness in the years to come.

Your Council also records its appreciation of the co-operation of Government Departments, public bodies, stud stock societies, the press and broadcasting stations (both metropolitan and country), and also the valuable services given in an honorary capacity by judges, stewards and stewardesses, and the many other supporters of the Society who contributed to the success of the Century Show.

The Council.

The eleven members of the Council who retire, through effluxion of time, being eligible for re-election, were, at the Annual General Meeting of members in February, returned unopposed for a further period of three years.

At its meeting in March your Council elected Mr. R. R. Kerr to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation, owing to ill-health, of Mr. F. E. Clarke. A minute of keen appreciation of Mr. Clarke's services as a member of Council over many years was duly recorded.

In June the President was heartily congratulated on having been elected to Honorary Membership of the Royal Agricultural Society of England.

At the July meeting special leave of absence was granted to Mr. M. A. Nicholas during his extended tour abroad.

At its August meeting your Council learned with deep regret of the death of Mr. Thomas Patterson, who had occupied the position of Secretary of this Society from 1890 to 1910, inclusive. During his long retirement, Mr. Patterson had maintained his interest in the activities of the Society, and had annually acted as a steward up to the time of the war.

At the September meeting the death of Mr. A. C. Gibb, a Trustee of the Society, was reported, and fitting reference was made to the very valuable services rendered to the Society by Mr. Gibb, as a member of the Council, the Finance and other Committees, as well as a

steward-in-chief in the Clydesdale Horse Section for many years.

The President (Mr. C. N. McKay) was unanimously appointed to the vacant trusteeship at the October meeting. At this meeting also a cordial welcome was extended to Mr. S. A. Greaves on his return to the Council table, following the illness which befell him early in the Show.

At the November meeting Mr. A. R. Creswick was unanimously elected to fill the vacancy in the Council caused by the appointment of the President as a Trustee.

At a special meeting in December, Council received a report of the death of Sir Charles E. Merrett, a Trustee of the Society, its President for 32 years, and member of the Council for 45 years. Members will unanimously endorse the view expressed by the President that, through the death of Sir Charles, the Society has lost its most devoted and respected member.

Last year your Council extended hearty congratulations to Professor Wadham on having been awarded the Farrar Medal for distinguished services in agricultural research, and this year it no less heartily congratulates him on having been the first recipient of the Australian Medal of Agricultural Science, awarded by the Australian Institute of Agricultural Science in recognition of distinguished service to Australian agriculture.

At the forthcoming Annual Meeting, eleven of the thirty-three members of your Council retire, but, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election, and have been duly nominated.

Finance.

As is customary, the audited financial statements published with this report are given in such detail as not to require any special comment.

Members will readily be able to follow the information set out in these statements, and will agree that the state of the Society's finances is important, in view of the possibilities of great development at the Show Grounds as and when materials are free from control and labour is more readily available.

In concluding this report, your Council desires to express, on its own behalf and that of the members of the Society in general, unswerving loyalty to the person of His Majesty the King, and keenest regret that, because of the ill-health of His Majesty, the proposed tour of Australia had to be cancelled.

The contents of the bulletins issued have been noted with pleasure, and the hope is fervently expressed that the progress already reported will be maintained, and His Majesty will be fully restored to health at an early date.







The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria

RULES

1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Stock Raising and Industrial Resources of the State—

- (1) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
- (2) By holding meetings for the purpose of popularising rural life and disseminating knowledge of improved methods and new ideas in relation thereto.
- (3) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies, and collecting information for the furtherance of the objects of the Society.
- (4) By promoting the discovery, investigation and introduction of improved kinds of agricultural implements and machinery, the better equipment and construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (5) By promoting the discovery, investigation and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (6) By collecting and distributing information on all subjects concerned with the objects of the Society, including the preparation and publication of Flock Books, Herd Books, Stud Books, Pamphlets, Essays and Papers, and by the establishment and maintenance of a Library and Reading Room for the use of Members.
- (7) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants and taking measures to encourage the prevention or eradication of such diseases.
- (8) By remunerating any person for original research work leading to the advancement of the objects of the Society.
- (9) By the purchase of live stock for breeding purposes and allowing farmers and other rural workers the use thereof for improving the standard of live stock.
- (10) By promoting or assisting any scheme for herd testing and remunerating any person for his services in connection therewith.

(11) By promoting or assisting competitions in regard to farm crops and other primary production, implements of husbandry and improvement of the conditions and methods of rural work.

(12) By promoting or assisting any other work which may be regarded by the Council of the Society as being beneficial to primary production or the improvement of live stock.

(13) By borrowing monies at interest on "short call" or otherwise from bankers or any other source for the purposes of the Society, and particularly for repaying in whole or in part monies owing or which may become owing by the Society either on current account or otherwise.

(14) By establishing and supporting or aiding in the establishment and support of funds, trusts and conveniences calculated to benefit employees or ex-employees of the Society, or the dependents or connections of such persons, and by granting pensions and allowances, and by making contributions towards Insurance Premiums.

(15) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, four Trustees (three of whom shall be appointed as hereinafter provided, and one shall be appointed by the State Governor), Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members. The term "Member" shall (unless the context otherwise requires) be deemed to include a Life Member, Life Governor and Governor.

4. Subject to the provisions of Rule 27, every applicant for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company such firm or company shall nominate in writing one of the members thereof, who shall, on the receipt by the Secretary of such nomination, be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges of membership, and be bound by the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Society, and may be elected to any office.

5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds three shillings and Members one pound ten shillings annually. Life Governors shall pay

a subscription of fifty pounds, and Life Members a subscription of twenty-five pounds.

6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-three Members (elected from amongst the Members of the Society as hereinafter provided) and the Trustees, who shall be ex officio Members of the Council.

7. One-third of the Council (the Trustees excepted) shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

8. Land acquired, or to be acquired, for the Society shall be held by and be vested in the Trustees for the time being of the Society for and on behalf of the Society. The Trustees appointed as provided by these rules shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due course at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society. Any new Trustee or Trustees shall be appointed at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society, or in accordance with Rule 14. The Trustees shall deal with the lands of the Society as directed by resolution of the Council of the Society (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence), and they shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of the Society's property. If the office of Trustee, appointed by the State Governor, shall become vacant by reason of death, resignation or otherwise, a new Trustee shall be appointed by the State Governor.

9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees) a President and three Vice-Presidents.

10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof, and for these purposes the Members of the Society for the time being shall be deemed to have constituted the Council of the Society for the time being their agents.

11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific and Corresponding Members, nominations therefor having been submitted at a previous meeting and a notice of such nominations having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may, except as to the Trustee appointed by the State Governor, fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been

given at a previous meeting and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The financial year of the Society shall end on the 31st day of December of each year, to which day the accounts of the Society shall be balanced. At the monthly meeting of the Council, to be held in January in each year, the Council shall prepare a list of Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies in the Council. Nominations (other than those made by the Council) of Members who may be candidates for such vacancies must be in the hands of the Secretary prior to such meeting. Every nomination other than those made by the Council shall be signed by at least two Members other than the candidate, and shall have endorsed thereon the consent of such candidate, duly signed by him. The election to fill the vacancies on the Council shall be held on the day immediately prior to the day fixed for the Annual General Meeting, as provided by Rule 18.

18. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the last Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, successful candidates for the vacancies in the Council declared elected, two paid Auditors appointed, and any other business transacted of which due notice in writing shall have been given before the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of the second Tuesday in January immediately preceding.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his Deputy shall send to all Members of the Society a ballot paper, numbered, and initialled by the President or his Deputy, or the Secretary, with the names of all the candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Member desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more or less than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President (who shall be Returning Officer) or his Deputy at the election. Every such ballot paper shall be returned before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Fourteen days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every Member of the Society.

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of the Council next after the Annual Meeting the Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President or on the requisition of twenty Members of the Society, of which meeting there must be given ten clear days' notice stating the business to be transacted, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President or of three members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed

by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

24. At the Annual Meeting twenty Members, including Members of Council, or at a Special General Meeting ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council, shall form a quorum.

25. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of Members of Council appointed by the Society, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room and Lectures, and, (with two ladies if the member be a Life Governor, whenever so constituted, or a Life Member, so constituted before the 2nd February, 1939, but with one lady only as regards all other Members) to the Society's exhibitions, grounds and grandstands (subject to such regulations as the Council may make) on production of the Member's ticket for the current year. And while the Society issues a monthly journal a copy shall, on receipt of a request in writing, be posted free to every Member.

26. Any member neglecting or refusing to comply with these Rules, or any or either of them, or any lawful directions or requirements by the Council made in pursuance or under the authority thereof, or being guilty either before or after becoming a Member of the Society of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be summoned before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may also be disqualified from exhibiting and may be disallowed from again becoming a Member during the pleasure of the Council. A Member expelled under this Rule shall forfeit all right in and claim upon the Society and its property.

27. Any person being expelled from Membership or disqualified from exhibiting, riding, or competing by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a Member or to exhibit, ride or compete at this Society's Exhibitions until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

28. The Council shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules, and of the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder; and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Society or the administration of its affairs, whether provided for by these Rules or by the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder or otherwise, shall be final and binding on the Members.

29. Every Member shall communicate from time to time to the Secretary his address; and all notices required by these Rules to be sent or given to Members shall be deemed to have been duly sent or given if posted or sent to such address.

30. Every person becoming a Member of the Society thereby undertakes, if at any time required to do so by the Council, to give evidence by statutory declaration or otherwise of any

facts within his knowledge or information relating to the subject matter of any inquiry by the Council.

31. Every person becoming a Member of the Society shall thereby undertake to indemnify and shall with every other Member thereof be bound to indemnify the Council, and the individual Members thereof, any Committee of the Council and any Members of any such Committee, against any action or damages in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in accordance with these Rules, or the By-laws or Regulations made thereunder, during the continuance of his Membership.

32. The Council and the Members thereof shall be indemnified out of the Society's property against risk and expense which may occur through borrowing monies in accordance with paragraph 13 of Rule 2; and Members of the Society, notwithstanding Rule 31 hereof, shall not by reason only of their membership be or become personally liable through, by reason, or on account of any such borrowings.

33. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting.

BY - LAWS

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Notice of the Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the Members of Council at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for by at least three Members present. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given in accordance with Rule 18.

2. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the Annual Election. Two or more Scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his Deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

THE PRESIDENT.

3. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Members, and shall take the chair when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks and other documents as the Council may decide.

THE COUNCIL.

4. The Council shall hold a meeting at least quarterly, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

5. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide by a majority of votes on a show of hands all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that, if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

7. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

8. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

9. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council or of any Committee shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some person present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

10. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants at the Society's Exhibitions.

11. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees when they shall think proper.

12. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

13. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

14. If any Member of Council, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

15. The Secretary shall notify to the Council any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or other members of the Council, at the meeting of the Council at which or next after such vacancy occurred, and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice, provided that if any such vacancy occur after the ordinary monthly Council meeting in November such vacancy shall not be filled except at the next Annual Meeting.

16. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by the senior Vice-President then present; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes. (The senior Vice-President shall be deemed to mean the Vice-President who has been a Member of Council for the greatest number of years in the aggregate.)

17. The quorum of a monthly or special meeting of Council shall be five.

18. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2) Business arising from minutes.
- (3) Election of officers and nominations for vacancies.
- (4) Committee's Reports.
- (5) Motions.
- (6) Correspondence.
- (7) Postponed business.
- (8) General business.
- (9) Notices of motions.

19. All minutes and reports read to and adopted by the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

20. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

21. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the monthly Council meeting in March as they think fit, and such Committees shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two members of Committee to form a quorum.

22. The President shall be ex officio a member of all committees.

23. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

24. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the last Thursday in February next after their appointment,

their powers shall then cease, providing that standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

THE STAFF.

25. The Manager shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council and of Committees.

26. The Secretary shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society and keep copies of all letters on the business of the Society.

27. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, the Secretary shall be responsible for all monies received, paying such sums into the Society's Bank, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bank. He shall have the charge of the expenditure for petty cash.

28. The Secretary shall have the custody of all books and property of the Society. All books, pamphlets, etc., becoming the property of the Society shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

29. The Manager shall have the immediate superintendence over all of the servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he may think of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

30. The Manager and the Secretary shall each find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

31. Neither the Manager nor the Secretary shall exercise any of the privileges of a Member of the Society.

FINANCE.


32. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet as, and when required. Before each meeting of the Council the Finance Committee will meet in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds which they shall present to each meeting, as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

33. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

34. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

35. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

36. The accounts of the Society shall be audited as may be required by the Council by two professional accountants, to whom a balance sheet shall be submitted by the Secretary immediately after the close of the financial year, and such, when audited, shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
