Annual Report of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria

To the Members.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Council has much pleasure in presenting the following report of proceedings of the Society for the year ended 31st December, 1950.

The Royal Show.

The Royal Melbourne Diamond Jubilee Show, held from 21st to 30th September (inclusive) was an unqualified success.

His Excellency, the Governor of Victoria (Sir Dallas Brooks), accompanied by Lady Brooks and Miss Jeanette Brooks, visited the Show on Friday, 22nd September, and after inspection of a military guard of honour, His Excellency officially opened the Show from a dais in the centre of the arena.

Subsequently he inspected the comprehensive display staged by officers of the Department of Agriculture in the Government Pavilion, and his questioning of those in charge of the different sections revealed his interest in all phases of agriculture.

On the public holiday His Excellency and party again visited the Show and made an extended tour of the grounds, meeting exhibitors and inspecting the champion animals in the several pavilions.

His Excellency showed great interest in the display in the Young Farmers' Pavilion, and in the remarks of Club Supervisors who described the healthy growth of the Young Farmer movement throughout the State.

Named to commemorate the fact that in 1890 Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, was graciously pleased to grant the then National Agricultural Society permission to use the prefix "Royal," the Show was splendidly supported by exhibitors and standholders and was attended by 519,408 patrons during the nine day and eight night sessions, despite adverse weather conditions on several occasions.

The Society has held Shows in years when costs were not so high as those now ruling, which have shown better financial returns, but none that have run more smoothly or given such satisfaction to exhibitors and patrons alike.

The very stringent regulations found necessary in recent years to keep entries within reasonable proportions were continued, and in addition, so far as cattle were concerned, exhibits had to be certified T.B. free.

Though no new buildings could be erected, it was found possible to so re-organise the internal fittings in the No. 3 Cattle Pavilion as to permit the accommodation of some 200 extra animals. This facilitated an outstanding display of beef and dual purpose cattle all under the one roof, and the transfer of the Red Polls to this building relieved the position in other pavilions in which dairy cattle were accommodated.

A heavy responsibility was again placed on the Horse Committee to reduce entries after examination of the performances of each animal in keeping with the Society's policy of quality rather than quantity; and to determine priorities regarding accommodation.

Interest in light horses and ponies is annually increasing and your Council is anxious as soon as possible to provide increased amenities on the Show Grounds, more particularly for the ever-growing number of lady competitors who, because of the shortage of labour, have per force to tend their own horses.

No difficulty was experienced in accommodating the sheep and pigs entered for the Show, and provision was made for the goats along the southern wall of the Nicholas pavilion.

To comply with the request of poultry fanciers, extra coops were provided and all birds exhibited in one display, instead of two on different days as in 1949.

Though double banking had to be resorted to in portion of the poultry pavilion, the whole display was very favourably commented on by exhibitors, the public, and by Mr. H. S. Anthony, who came from England to perform the onerous task of adjudicating in all classes for Standard breeds.

In the pigeon pavilion, the display of pigeons and cage birds well maintained the high standard set in previous years.

Because of the increase from 1,776 to 1,989 in the number of individual dogs entered, it was again necessary to judge a different group of breeds on each day of the Show.

The number and quality of exhibits in the Home Crafts section was such as to tax the ingenuity of the Stewardesses to display to advantage in the limited space available, and but emphasised the claim of this section for a new building of adequate proportions as soon as it can be provided.

A new and outstanding feature of the Show was accommodated in the Centenary Hall where, as in the past, the exhibits of farm and dairy produce, fruits and apiculture, were set out, and the Whittlesea Agricultural Society and "Save the Forests" Campaign Council staged their well-known displays. This was a large plate glass refrigerated case extending across the building just inside the main entrance and in which carcasses and cuts of meat were exhibited under ideal conditions.

The outcome of co-operation of the Australian Meat Board with the Society, this case met a long felt want in that it permitted display on the Show Grounds of the carcasses of animals entered in several competitions subsidised by the Society, which in previous years could only be seen by attendance at the abattoirs or visits to the shops of the purchasing butchers.

It was particularly gratifying to have the case available, because this year, for the first

time, provision was made for the judging of beef carcasses on an appraisal system similar to that used in recent years in judging carcasses of pigs.

The co-operation of judges, stewards and officers of the Department of Commerce and Agriculture, who were in attendance to demonstrate to those viewing the carcasses, made this an outstanding educational feature of the Show. Steps for development have already been taken by your Council.

In conjunction with this report a table is published to facilitate ready comparison of entries received in the various sections with those of previous years.

In the arena, which on judging day presented a picture with the high quality stock parading in newly painted judging rings, equipped with gaily-striped judges' tents, the Programme and

Arena Control Committee conducted a series of events and displays which made the whole Show programme memorable in the annals of the Society.

The marshalling of competitors, the timing of events, and the competence with which the necessary gear was handled was very favourably commented on by patrons throughout the seventeen day and night sessions of the Show.

New features in the programme included Camp Drafting Competitions; one for the ladies and another for gentlemen, who had the honour of competing for the "Gloucester Cup," made available for competition throughout Australia by H.R.H. Duke of Gloucester.

A yard was specially constructed on the arena to facilitate the running of these competitions and Buckjumping contests, which proved to be so popular with patrons as to ensure their continuance.

Other items which stood out in public favour were the well-presented Grand Parades, the Interstate Polo Matches, demonstrations by one man working six sheep dogs simultaneously, Musical Rides by mounted police, Military Tattoo, Massed Highland Bands, Youth Club demonstration and Fireworks Displays.

Perhaps not so spectacular as those just mentioned, but of considerable value and not inconsiderable interest—in view of the 1956 Olympic Games—was the Novice Dressage test included in the programme for the first time.

Not only will such tests be continued, but other arena events will at future Shows be progressively developed to enable both competitors and public to become accustomed to the style and standard of horsemanship seen in equestrian events at Olympic Games.

At a special luncheon arranged in their honour, the President conveyed to Judges, Stewards and Stewardesses an expression of Council's keen appreciation of their honorary services, which had so largely contributed to the success of the Show.

His cordial welcome to the Judges from overseas—Messrs. W. Hogg (Aberdeen Angus cattle), John Carrington (Guernsey cattle), H. S. Anthony (Poultry), F. Warner Hill (Dogs), from England; and Messrs. Duncan Holden and W. W. Sherratt (Light Horses) and E. M. North (Friesian cattle), from New Zealand—was enthusiastically endorsed by those present, who included Judges from all over the Commonwealth.

In accordance with the expressed wish of the Government, your Council has joined this Society in the widespread celebrations to commemorate, during 1951, the centenary of responsible government in Victoria, the centenary of the discovery of gold in this State, and the jubilee of Commonwealth Government.

Your Council has decided that the next Show be named the Royal Melbourne 1951 Commemoration Show, and that commemorative medallions be issued with the awards.

ASSOCIATE BODIES.

The Society's staff has continued throughout the year to do secretarial and administrative work for the many Stud Stock Breeders' Societies and other associated bodies referred to in this report.

Your Council and the committees of these organisations are fully aware of the difficulty in these times to maintain a staff adequate to perform the ever-increasing volume of work resulting from increased memberships and registrations, and expanding activities.

This opportunity is taken to again express your Council's appreciation of the continued harmonious relations between the Society and these organisations and particularly of their co-operation and support in connection with the Royal Show.

The Commonwealth Clydesdale Horse Society.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The affairs of the Society have now been consolidated in accordance with the decision of the Federal Council, and all entries for the Stud Book have, during the greater part of the year, been received by the Federal Secretary direct from breeders in all States of the Commonwealth.

Interest in the Society has been maintained, and the display at the Melbourne Royal Show was again one of the outstanding features of the exhibition and quite up to average both in regard to quality and numbers.

During the year the Fairymead Sugar Co. Ltd., of Bundaberg, Queensland, demonstrated its confidence in the breeding and use of horses by importing the rising 3-year-old colt, "Craigie Reality," from the famous stud of James Kilpatrick, Craigie Mains, Kilmarnock, Ayrshire, Scotland.

"Craigie Reality" won 1st Prize in a strong class of yearlings at the Glasgow Stallion Show and was champion at the Royal Agricultural Society of England's Show at Shrewsbury in 1949. He was sired by "Craigie Chieftain," a son of the renowned "Craigie Beau Ideal," and should, therefore, prove a decided asset to the stud.

It is worthy of note that the Company uses some 500 horses on its property in addition to mechanised equipment of all types, which in itself is a tribute to the economy of horse usage.

The compilation of Volume 15 of the Commonwealth Clydesdale Stud Book is now completed, and will be printed and circulated as early as possible in the new year.

The Volume will contain the pedigrees of 279 stallions and 1,033 mares in addition to information concerning the transfer of animals registered in previous Volumes.

To further encourage the breeding of good quality draught horses, the Victorian Government has again renewed the Foal Bonus Scheme under which a bonus of £4 is paid on all foals by certificated stallions from approved mares, and this very concrete evidence of faith in the future of the horse breeding industry is greatly appreciated by all concerned.

The Australian Pony Stud Book Society. (Victorian Branch).

As indicated in last year's report, the Victorian Provisional Committee recommended that the Constitution be amended to provide for a Federal Council to govern the Society on similar lines to other Breed Societies; such Federal Council to be made up of delegates elected by the various Branches on a pro-rata basis according to membership.

The Council of the Society recently met in Sydney and drafted, for submission to the next Annual General Meeting of Members, a revised Constitution which embodies the recommendations made by this Branch.

During the year, regulations governing registration of mares in the Australian Section of the Stud Book were again amended. The Foundation Division has been deleted and a mare may now be registered (numbered) provided her sire is pony bred and her dam to the satisfaction of the Council, did not exceed 14 hands in height at the time of foaling, and has been passed for type and height. "Pony bred" is defined as a pony, the sire of which is not of the Thoroughbred, Arab, Trotter, English Hackney, or other breed of horses over 14 hands in height, or the direct male offspring of such.

Membership of the Victorian Branch has continued to increase and the total number on the Roll is now 99.

Keen interest was shown in pony breeding circles during the year, and good ponies have been eagerly sought after.

R.A.S. Light Horse Control Council.

As indicated in previous reports, any extension of activity by the Executive of the Light Horse Control Council has been deferred pending the outcome of the movement to establish throughout Australia a body to deal with equestrian matters on a national basis.

In the meantime the registration of dates of metropolitan and country gymkhanas, and the light horse section of several Agricultural Shows, and the maintenance of an official panel of judges, etc., has been continued; but such services will, in future, be included in the much wider sphere of activity of the national organisation above referred to.

This organisation is, of course, the Equestrian Federation of Australia, which has recently been advised of the success of its application for affiliation with the Federation Equestre Internationale—the world authority in equestrian affairs.

It is necessary to have in Australia a national body, recognised by F.E.I., to ensure the inclusion of equestrian events in the programme of the 1956 Olympic Games.

With a properly constituted Branch in each State, assured of the full co-operation of Hunt, Polo, Horse, Pony and Riding Clubs and Agricultural Societies, including the "Royal," as well as similar support from horse lovers throughout Australia, the E.F.A. is fully authorised and equipped to proceed towards the attainment of the objects with which it was established—to at all times assist in every possible way to further the interests of equestrianism, to facilitate the training of riders and horses up to international standards, and to ensure that Australia will be worthily represented at Olympic Games. The Committee of the Victorian Branch of the Federation is already actively engaged in arrangements for the E.F.A. Commemoration Horse Show on 29th January.

This Show, the programme of which includes some events new to Australia, will be held on the Royal Show Grounds, and will, it is confidently anticipated, set a standard which will be followed throughout Victoria.

The Shorthorn Society of Australia.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

For the first time in its history, the Scottish Shorthorn Breeders' Association conferred on this Society the great honour of nominating gentlemen deemed competent to adjudicate at the 1951 Perth (Scotland) Show and Sale, and as a result, Mr. John C. Taylor, of Harrow, Cambooya, Queensland, has been appointed to judge Shorthorns exhibited there on 12th February, 1951.

The breed has made very satisfactory progress during the year, and the demand for stud stock continues to increase in all States of the Commonwealth.

At all Stud Sales competition has been exceedingly keen, and the average prices obtained have been consistently high.

Twenty-three new studs have been established, and it is certain that if females were more readily obtainable, that number would have been greatly increased.

This year 26 fashionably bred animals have been imported from Great Britain and added to studs in New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland and Victoria, and as these include Prize winners at leading Shows, their introduction should prove of great benefit to the breed.

It is known that several other animals have already been acquired and are awaiting shipment. Among these are six high priced females and a bull, which were secured at Messrs. J. and D. P. MacGillivray's, Calrossie Sale in October, when 61 head realised £41,548 and averaged £681.

Volume 14 of the Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia which contains the pedigrees of 502 bulls and 1,385 cows together with additional progeny from 2,396 cows registered in previous Volumes, was completed during the year and distributed to members and kindred bodies overseas, and the fact that it is the largest Volume published by the Society, indicates the growing popularity of the breed.

Entries received to date for inclusion in Volume 15 total 465 bulls, 1,222 cows, 2,865 calves and 1,835 transfers.

It is pleasing to record that competition in the Shorthorn Section at all Royal Shows throughout Australia, has been exceedingly keen, and the general standard of the exhibits high. This fact not only reflects great credit on the breeders concerned, but also demonstrates that their interest and enthusiasm is centered upon the improvement of the breed.

The Dairy Shorthorn Association of Australia.

Volume 5 of the Dairy Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia, now in the course of publication, covers a three-year period, and will include the registration of animals born up to 31st December, 1949. The number of entries to be featured in the new Volume shows a considerable increase when compared with Volume 4.

The new Foundation Section for females is proving popular. Up to date 168 cows, examined and passed on Dairy Shorthorn type by inspectors appointed by the Committee, have been accepted for entry therein. Female progeny of these cows, by a registered Dairy Shorthorn bull, are eligible for registration in Class E of the Herd Book.

The second annual Autumn Sale held at the Royal Melbourne Show Grounds in May last, proved to be an encouraging success. The stock generally were representative of the breed and showed a marked improvement on the

1949 offering, both in quality and condition. Prices, however, fluctuated and averages were a little below expectations.

It was gratifying to see a number of new exhibitors in the Dairy Shorthorn section at the 1950 Royal Melbourne Show. Reports received indicate that Country Agricultural Shows held throughout the year were also well supported by Dairy Shorthorn breeders.

At present the Royal Melbourne Show is the only Royal Show in Australia to provide classes for stock registered in this Association's Herd Book. However, it would appear that steps taken by the Committee to correct this anomaly are now bearing fruit, as reports received indicate that classes for Dairy Shorthorns will be provided at the 1951 Royal Adelaide Show and possibly at the Royal Sydney Show in 1952.

Such was the success of the dinner arranged by the Association to mark the occasion of the visit of Mr. R. W. Hobbs, of England, to judge at the 1949 Royal Show, that the Association decided to make the dinner an annual fixture. The one held during the last Show also proved very successful.

The Red Poll Cattle Breeders' Association of Australia.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The membership has shown a slight increase in all States during the past year. There has been a consistent demand for females, which still appear to be in short supply, and this, no doubt, is having a retarding effect on the membership.

Federal Council met on two occasions during the year and dealt with many matters of interest to breeders. One decision reached was to publish in the Herd Book a "Standard of Merit" for bulls. To qualify for entry, bulls must be from dams that have produced a required standard of butter-fat or have sired six daughters that have produced the standard.

Federal Council also decided to take a census of Red Polls in Australia. Census cards have already been circulated and the result is awaited with interest, as there have, from time to time, been published some very varied estimates of the number of Red Polls in Australia.

The Red Poll colour film obtained from England last year has been shown to a great number of people throughout Australia, and the Federal Council has expressed its appreciation of the co-operation of the various State Departments of Agriculture in making this possible.

Entries for Volume 15 of the Association's Herd Book recently closed, and compilation will be taken in hand early in the new year.

The first post-war sale of registered Red Polls, conducted under the auspices of the Victorian Branch, was held at the Royal Melbourne Show Grounds in April last, when females met with a steady demand to effect a total clearance. Arrangements are in hand for another such sale to be held in the coming year. The Association has expressed appreciation of the action of your Council in making the Show Grounds available for this purpose.

The Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

It is pleasing to note that all Branches have reported increases in membership, the total now being 435.

Volume 41 of the Ayrshire Herd Book of Australasia, has been distributed to all financial members. Volume 42, which will contain the pedigrees of 305 bulls and 1,463 cows, is now in the course of publication, and will be the largest Volume published since Volume 32.

During the year 17 Ayrshires were exported to Kenya, which indicates that a keen demand from overseas sources still prevails for Australian bred Ayrshires with the necessary type and production backing.

In accordance with a decision of the Committee of the Victorian Branch, a coloured photograph showing the parts of an Ayrshire cow was published with a view to advertising the breed and at the same time assisting the Young Farmer Movement. Judging from reports being received, the project has more than fulfilled expectations.

The owners of this year's highest producing Ayrshire herd under Victorian Standard Herd Test were Messrs. G. A. Fraser and Son whose 15 cows of various ages gave an average of 453.3 lbs. butter-fat with allowances for junior animals, and thereby won the Victorian Branch test prize of £10/10/-.

For the fourth consecutive year the £10/10/- test prize for the highest producing Ayrshire cow under Victorian Standard Herd Test was won by Messrs. J. H. Goddard and Sons, whose junior 3-year-old cow, "Inverurie Maid 2nd," produced 12,645 lbs. milk, 4.22 average test, and 533.3 lbs. butter-fat, the equivalent of 613.3 lbs. butter-fat with allowances.

Although expenditure was greater than revenue during the year, the Victorian Branch is still in a sound financial position with £1,244/8/5 to its credit.

Mr. H. Sparrow, an Ayrshire breeder from York, England, after visiting various Ayrshire studs in this State, stated that he had seen some cattle which he considered compared very favourably with those in leading studs in Great

Britain. Such comments should be most heartening to breeders of Ayrshires in this country.

The Friesian Cattle Club of Australia.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The growing popularity of the Friesian breed throughout Australia is evidenced by the fact that each of the Club's six State Branches has reported an increase in membership.

The Victorian Branch—the strongest in the Club—reported a 25% increase, despite the continued shortage of females occasioned by the successes achieved by the Friesian breeders who enter their herds in the Government Standard Test for milk and butter-fat production.

Messrs. P. Goodfellow and Sons' herd of sixteen Friesians gained the Herd Championship with an average actual yield of 566.1 lbs. butter-fat and 610.4 lbs. with allowances for junior animals.

For the second year in succession the highest producer was "Ingolston Gwen," with 21,882 lbs. milk and 795.9 lbs. butter-fat, following the 26,601 lbs. milk and 917.3 lbs. butter-fat she produced last year.

Encouraging reports are to hand from Branches in other States where excellent production records have been established under test.

At the annual meeting of the Federal Council, Mr. P. C. Giles, of South Australia, was elected President, following the retirement of Mr. E. H. K. Downes, who was warmly thanked for his valuable services to the Club during his many years in that position.

At its forthcoming meeting in Sydney the Federal Council will be furnished with a report regarding the publication of a volume of the Club's Herd Book during 1951.

Breeders presented a very representative exhibit of Friesians for the adjudication of Mr. E. M. North, from New Zealand, at the Royal Melbourne Diamond Jubilee Show in September last.

The Branch Committee has been active throughout the year in publicising the breed through the press and radio.

The Guernsey Cattle Society of Australia.

(Victorian Branch).

Entries for Volume 17 of the Guernsey Herd Book approximate 6,000, and the Federal Council anticipates that copies will be forwarded to members about June, 1951. The list of members to be published in this volume will reveal that more than one third are attached to the Branch in this State in which the growing popularity of the breed, previously reported, has been maintained during the year under review.

With the unanimous support of Branches and the co-operation of the Societies concerned, the Federal Council sought, and was indeed fortunate, in securing the services of Mr. J. Carrington, of Guernsey Island, as judge at several of the principal shows in Australia.

After Mr. Carrington had adjudicated at the Royal Melbourne Diamond Jubilee Show, he presented to the representative of the successful exhibitor — Capt. A. E. T. Payne — a trophy donated by the Royal Guernsey A. and H. Society (Guernsey Island) for the best group — one male and two females by the same sire.

The enthusiasm of breeders in Victoria to keep their cattle prominently before the public, and to demonstrate the productive capacity of the breed, is revealed in the number of herds tested for milk and butter-fat production, and also in the well-turned out teams exhibited at the "Royal" and those country shows at which championship sashes are donated by the Branch.

The last annual report on the Victorian Government Herd Test showed that Capt. Payne's "Yarraview Golden Daffodil," a senior four-year-old, won the Reserve Champion award with a production record of 10,917 lbs. milk and 766.3 lbs. butter-fat, thus bringing her aggregate yield to that time up to 2,623 lbs. butter-fat. (Since then, in her latest lactation, she produced a further 14,529 lbs. milk.)

"Yarraview Carol" was second in the mature cow class; "Yarraview Admiration" first junior three-year-old; and Mr. Colin Scott's "Foremost Popular Melody" first in the class for junior two-year-olds.

The Victorian Branch Committee has decided to organise, annually, a sale of Guernsey cattle. The first of such sales will take place at the Royal Show Grounds on 1st March next, and will be restricted to registered animals which have been passed by official inspectors for type, condition and tattoo brands.

Members have expressed their pleasure at the election to the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria of Dr. F. G. Stephens, who at the respective annual meetings, was re-elected Federal President and also Chairman of the Victorian Branch, a position he has occupied for many years.

With Mr. Carrington, the judge from overseas as guest of honour, the annual dinner, held during the Royal Show, proved a most enjoyable function.

The Australian Illawarra Shorthorn Society.

(Victorian Branch).

The year has been a memorable one in-so-far as the A.I.S. breed in Victoria is concerned. The award of Champion Cow under the Government Standard Herd Test for the year 1949-50,

was won by the senior 2-year-old Australian Illawarra Shorthorn, "Brocka Becky 21st," owned by Messrs. G. Tandberg and Son.

This is the first time on record that a 2-year-old has gained the Championship award.

"Brocka Becky 21st" produced 15,366 lbs. of milk, testing 5.10 per cent., giving a butter-fat yield of 783 lbs. and set an all-time high for the senior 2-year-old class. She eclipsed the previous best yield of the breed in the Standard Herd Test. After winning 16 Championships at Country Agricultural Shows, "Brocka Becky 21st" capped her performance by being awarded the female championship at the 1950 Royal Melbourne Show.

The demand for A.I.S. cattle in Victoria far exceeds the supply, and breeders have been receiving high prices, both at auctions and private sales. The breed is becoming widely spread throughout Victoria and the Branch membership is increasing.

Quite a number of new exhibitors of A.I.S. cattle were seen at 1950 Royal Show. This indicates that members are realising that there is no better method of advertising a breed than by the exhibition of good type animals at shows.

In this connection it is of interest to note that the Federal Council of the Society has recommended that animals entered for Royal Shows be only permitted to be exhibited if passed on inspection.

The Federal Council also recommended discontinuance of the appointment of Associate Judges at Royal Shows.

It is anticipated that the Federal Council will be in a position to circulate to members copies of Volume 12 of the A.I.S. Herd Book early in the new year. Entries for Volume 13 will close in July, 1951.

The Australian Jersey Herd Society.

(Victorian Branch).

Although the increase in membership of this Branch of the Society during the year under review was not as great as in recent years, the names of no fewer than 1,378 members appear on the Roll, an increase of 26 on the preceding year and a new record in membership.

The financial position of the Branch is still sound but, owing to steep increases in cost of printing, wages, etc., the Federal Council was compelled to seek some means of increasing its revenue. To that end it decided at its September meeting that henceforth all fees received by the Branches be paid intact to the Council. This means that Branches lose the 10 per cent. rebate on entry fees, thus causing a decrease of approximately £600 per annum in the income of this Branch.

The Federal Council also decided that on and after 1st January, 1951, the Stud Book entry fees for bulls be increased from 15/- to £1, cows from 5/- to 7/6, transfers and leases from 1/- to 2/-, and that calf registration fees remain at 1/-.

The Type Classification Scheme conducted by the Branch is retaining its popularity, over 240 herds having been classified during the normal tours throughout the spring, and approximately 40 herds by special visits of the Board during the remainder of the year. To enable "out of season calving" cows to be classified, the Committee has adopted a scheme whereby such cows can be classified without heavy expense to the owners. Members residing within a reasonable radius of each other, who have cows which calve "out of season" may apply, preferably as a group, for a special visit of the Board, such application to be made at least 30 days prior to the desired date of classification. The expenses incurred by the Board on such visits to be borne equally by the participants. The Committee also decided in March last, that henceforth, bulls classified shall be over the age of 3 years, and one rating only to be granted, viz., "Classified."

The mobile publicity unit adopted by the Branch last year has proved successful, and its appearance at country shows is much sought after.

Although the Standard Herd Test championship went to another breed this year, Jerseys provided the Reserve Championship herd, and in all have secured the championship 30 times in 34 years.

The top Jersey herd was that of Mr. C. J. Jennings, of "Milangil," Rye, and comprised 34 cows of various ages. The average yield per cow was 502.1 lbs. butter-fat or, with allowances for junior animals, 555.7 lbs.

The second highest producing Jersey herd was that of Mr. J. Stedman, of "Surrey," Appin. This herd, which gained the championship in 1948 and 1949, secured third position this year. The average for the 31 cows of various ages was 468.6 lbs. butter-fat or, with allowance for age, 544.4 lbs.

During the year copies of Volume 35 of the Jersey Stud Book were issued to members, and the Federal Secretary is well advanced with the publication of Volume 36 and the compilation of Volume 37. Entries for inclusion in Volume 38 will close on 30th June next.

The Committee confidently anticipates that, in the ensuing year, the Branch will make still further progress.

The Victorian Herd Improvement Association.

This year has seen a continuance of the expansion of the Herd Test movement, until now, with 155 units functioning and 105,866 cows under test, an all time record has been achieved—which is a clear indication that dairymen are appreciative of the value of herd testing.

The State and Commonwealth Governments continue to foster the movement, and the recent increase in subsidy payments made by the State Government, together with the efforts of the Department of Agriculture resulting in prompt payments thereof, were greatly appreciated.

During the period under review, copies of the revised Constitution and Rules were forwarded to all affiliated Herd Testing Associations.

Two new members of Council were welcomed during the past twelve months—Messrs. W. R. Selzer and T. E. Thorsen.

Whilst extending hearty congratulations to Mr. G. C. Howey on his election as a Vice-President of the International Dairy Federation, Council has accepted with great regret his resignation as a Member of Council, it being recognised that inestimable service to the Association and the dairying industry generally had been rendered during his many years of association with the movement, and his loss will be keenly felt.

It is with gratification that the Council is able to report increased support for the Dairy Farm Management Competitions, financed by Commonwealth Government grant and conducted by the Association in conjunction with the Department of Agriculture. Seventy-four units are represented in the competitions being conducted this year, compared with 23 in 1949. This result is due to the publicity given through the press, the exhibition of a film and the enthusiasm of officers of the Department of Agriculture who acted as judges.

The Herd Testers' Competition was this year divided into three sections, and the cash prizes and trophies donated were keenly contested.

R.A.S. of V. Certificates were again made available to owners of herds which reached a specified standard of production of butter-fat under Association test.

The Goat Society of Australia.

(Victorian Branch).

The Branch Committee reports that throughout the year, interest in goat breeding has been maintained. The demand for goats has increased as have also enquiries as to where goats' milk can be purchased.

Further enrolments during the year have brought the Branch membership up to a total of 145. It is also of interest to record that the

number of goats owned by individual members has risen from the ones and twos of past years to eight or ten head to-day, and a better understanding of feeding and handling is showing pleasing results, both at the pail and at shows.

Importations, direct from England, during the year are expected to result in the ultimate improvement of Victorian herds. Mrs. E. H. Allen imported Saanens for her herd at Wonga Park, whilst Dr. A. G. Scholes and Dr. Clive Sandy made the first direct importation of Toggenburgs to this State.

A field day was held on the property of Mrs. Allen, at which the guest speaker was Mr. G. Frankland, a visitor from England, where his wife is a noted breeder of Toggenburgs. At a similar function at "Aritunga," the property of the Federal President of the Society (Mr. O. Grayson), members had the opportunity to hear speakers cover a wide field of information relating to breeding and management. There were good attendances on both occasions.

The Committee of the Branch has met frequently during the year to further the interests of members, and has recorded its appreciation of the assistance given by publicity—both press and radio. Mrs. V. E. L. Cutter, who was elected as President of the Branch at the last annual meeting, is a keen enthusiast who has taken a very active interest in the Society.

An increased number of Agricultural Societies provided classes for goats, and members responded with fine displays, which, in some cases, equalled that at the Royal Melbourne Diamond Jubilee Show.

In the Federal sphere, it is pleasing to report the formation of a Branch of the Society in South Australia, and that for the first time, provision was made for the exhibition of goats at the Royal Show in that State.

Branches of the Society are already firmly established in Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria, and the indications are that ere long breeders will organise Branches in the remaining two States.

The Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

Included in Volume 42 of the Flock Book, which was published during the year, are the histories of 2,276 flocks and the individual pedigrees of 2,198 rams and 1,022 ewes.

The present membership of this Society is 1,906 and of this total 835 reside in Victoria. Both of these totals are somewhat less than at the corresponding period last year, indicating that greater attention is at present being devoted to the production of wool, but there are already indications that the pendulum is on the return swing.

At the September meeting of the Federal Council, it was agreed to increase the annual subscription to £3/3/-. The added revenue from this increase should enable Federal Council to maintain the present high standard of the annual publication of the Flock Book and should also give State Branch Committees the opportunity of continuing with publicity for British Breeds.

At the 1950 Royal Show breeders of British Breeds presented a fine display of sheep, and your Council has already expressed appreciation of the donation made by the Victorian Branch towards the prize fund.

The Victorian Branch of the Society considers that its most important activities are the Registered Show Sales which it conducts in Melbourne and in various country centres during the year. Over 6,000 rams were yarded at the 1950 Show Sales held at Echuca, Wodonga, Shepparton, Kerang, Bendigo, Ballarat and Melbourne. Probably the most pleasing feature of the series was the increased price paid for Longwool breeds.

To ensure that buyers are fully protected, a careful inspection is made of all sheep prior to sale. The Official Inspectors who act on behalf of the Branch, contribute greatly to the improved standard of sheep presented for auction at these annual fixtures.

The Australian Corriedale Association.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The membership of this Association has been maintained at the very satisfactory total of 740, and the number of registered sheep owned by these members now exceeds 300,000.

Although it is difficult to arrange shipment, some Corriedales have been exported during the past year. Much interest was taken in a consignment of Victorian bred rams shipped to South America for exhibition and sale at the Palermo Show (Argentina). These sheep were awarded first, second and two equal fifth prizes in classes of up to 200 rams. When sold the rams met with keen competition and made the highest average for the sale.

At a World Conference of Corriedale breeders, held in New Zealand in November last, representatives were present from Uruguay, Argentina, Chile, Australia and New Zealand. One of the objects of the Conference was to consider the establishment of an international standard of breed type in order that the Corriedale could be identified throughout the world. The two delegates from this Association, Messrs. A. G. Wallman and A. B. Carroll, have expressed keen appreciation of the hospitality of the New Zealand breeders during their visit and the success of the Conference.

The Victorian Branch of the Association has a membership of 260. Members gave good support to the Registered Show Sales held in conjunction with the Australian Society of Breeders

of British Sheep. Breeders who yarded sheep at these sales were well rewarded, as prices obtained were many guineas in advance of those obtained in past years.

Corriedales exhibited at the 1950 Australian Sheepbreeders' and Royal Melbourne Shows made attractive displays. The Victorian Branch contributed to the funds of both these Shows, and your Council has thanked the Branch for its donation to the "Royal" prize fund.

With good prices for Corriedale type wool and fat sheep, this Association looks forward, with confidence, to the coming year.

The Australian Pig Society.

(Federal Council and Victorian Branch).

The Society's main objective during the year has been to secure a payable export price for pig meats.

During the currency of the 1950 Sydney Royal Easter Show the Federal Executive met the Minister for Commerce and Agriculture (Hon. J. McEwen) and placed before him the many problems facing the industry. After hearing the Executive's report, the Federal Council expressed appreciation of the manner in which the Minister had received the representations, particularly his invitation to submit direct to him all matters concerning the industry, including that of the price for pig meats.

The Federal Executive subsequently met in Melbourne in June last and prepared a case in support of a recommendation that for the rehabilitation of the pig industry, including its export trade with the United Kingdom, the price of pig meats in the contract between the Australian and the United Kingdom Governments be increased to return pig producers not less than 1/6 per lb. It was further recommended to the Minister that a contract for the sale of Australia's exportable surplus of pig meat to the United Kingdom be arranged for several years, with provision in the contract for price adjustments when necessary to retain the pig grain ratio at its then position.

On 14th November last, the Minister announced that negotiations had been completed under which the British Ministry of Food had agreed to pay increased prices in the United Kingdom Government contract and that the overall return to the producer for first quality carcasses under the new schedule would be approximately 1/6 per lb.

Following this announcement the Federal Executive again met in Melbourne and decided that when expressing thanks to the Minister and the Australian Meat Board, for their assistance in securing the increased price, attention also be drawn to the fact that when the Society used its most strenuous efforts to indicate that 1/6 was the minimum producers should receive, it at the same time asked that the contract be for

a period of several years, and also stressed the necessity for a clause under which the price could be varied according to any rise in costs of production.

The necessity for such provision was emphasised by the fact that since the representations were made, wages had been materially increased as had also the price of wheat for stock feed, so although the price of 1/6 was allowed under the new contract, producers were again facing loss.

The Federal Executive conferred with the Australian Meat Board at its meeting in Melbourne during December, and also made renewed representations to the Minister for Commerce and Agriculture to ensure stability in the industry on a basis which would not only encourage continued production but an increase in the quantity of pig meats available to consumers at home and for export to Great Britain.

Over a long period pig producers have had several bitter experiences which have caused many to cease their activities and others to reduce the quantity of output in pig meats. If the Society's recommendations were adopted, a steady increase in production could be confidently anticipated.

In confident anticipation of success attending its efforts, breeders have continued their support of the Society, indeed the membership shows an increase in some States, including Victoria, where the Branch Committee again co-operated with the Australian Meat Board and the Department of Agriculture in the conduct of pig carcass competitions at the Dandenong Bacon Factory.

There was an increase in the number of pigs entered for the 1950 Royal Melbourne Show and the general standard was high.

Copies of Volume 37 of the Australian Pig Herd Book were circulated to members late in the year. Volume 38 is nearing completion, and the matter for Volume 39 will be ready for the printer early in the new year.

The Kennel Control Council.

To fill the vacancies referred to in last report, your Council appointed Messrs. George R. Burton and Gifford H. Grant to the K.C.C. Committee, which is charged with the responsibility of governing the canine fancy in this State. Its continued success is clearly revealed in the following report.

There was a considerable increase in the number of dog owners taking an active interest in breeding and exhibiting. Membership figures maintained their long sustained upward trend, and an all-time record was established with 4,608 financial members on the roll.

Two additional Agricultural Societies and six new Kennel Clubs were affiliated. They were the Australian Heeler and Kelpie Club of Victoria, Ballarat and District Terrier Club, Benalla Kennel Club, Bendigo Smooth Fox Terrier Club, Frankston and Peninsula Kennel Club, Warragul and District Kennel Club, Tatura Agricultural Society and Trafalgar and Central Gippsland Agricultural Society.

The Annual Championship Field Trials for Pointers and Setters and Spaniels and Retrievers were held at Werribee and Bolinda respectively. Entries were satisfactory, and there was a large gallery at each trial. Appreciation was expressed of the Committee's action in bringing a judge from New South Wales to adjudicate on the Pointer and Setter Stake.

When allocating the dates for Shows and Parades, the clashing of fixtures was avoided, and where possible the show dates spread evenly over the year.

In view of the fact that the maximum classification allowed in 1950 had provided satisfactory competition, the Committee resolved to make no alteration for 1951.

In all, the title of "K.C.C. Champion" was granted to 170 dogs and bitches during the year. As 3,923 dogs and bitches were registered during this period, the gaining of the title by these exhibitors is to be commended.

The usual annual conference with Presidents and Secretaries of affiliates was held, and matters of interest to all were discussed freely in a spirit of co-operation.

The "K.C.C. Kennel Gazette" again proved to be the most effective means of distributing schedules at a most reasonable cost to affiliates, also other matters of interest to members. The size of the Gazette was 15 per cent. greater than in the previous year, but the Committee considered it well worthwhile to spend the extra money required, thereby benefiting affiliates and members.

Publication by the K.C.C. of a book entitled "Standards of the Breeds" was acclaimed throughout Australia because it met a long-felt need in the dog world. With the kind permission of the Kennel Club (England) these standards were reproduced to give owners, breeders, exhibitors and judges the opportunity of increasing their knowledge of the standards to which all recognised show breeds should conform. The standards are of great educational value, and the books are being sold at the lowest possible price so as to be within the reach of all.

Quite in keeping with the increases in other spheres of activity above referred to, 1989 individual dogs—representative of five States and

New Zealand—were entered for the Royal Melbourne Diamond Jubilee Show, compared with 1,776 in 1949. A different group of breeds was judged on each of the nine days.

A conference of representatives of Interstate canine governing bodies was held during the Show. It was found that it was not possible to reach finality in all respects, as certain working arrangements are applicable only to individual States. Among the resolutions carried was one providing that no title above that of Champion be granted, also that similar forms of clearance from one State to another be adopted. One of the most important resolutions was that a central stud prefix register be established in either Victoria or New South Wales for the purpose of eliminating the duplication of prefixes in different States.

At the conclusion of the Show the Annual Dinner for members of the K.C.C. was held in the Council Luncheon Rooms on the Show Grounds. Your President, who is also President of the Kennel Control Council, attended with Mrs. McKay. The Royal Show judges, Mr. F. Warner Hill, of England, Mr. J. W. Maude, of New South Wales, and Mr. W. C. Duckworth, of Queensland, were the guests of honour.

The Victorian Working Sheep Dog Association.

The Association experienced another satisfactory year and further increased its membership.

The number of Affiliated Clubs has also increased, and there are now 40 bodies throughout Victoria conducting trials under the Rules of the Association. These trials proved popular, many large and enthusiastic attendances being reported.

The Association arranged for the conduct of the annual competitions for the "Capt. Payne Field" and "Cooper Utility" Trials. During the conduct of this latter trial some constructive criticism was offered regarding certain phases. Chief criticism revolved around the drafting yard and the driving away of sheep, which many considered were not practical tests.

Council appointed a Sub-Committee to go into the matter, and on its recommendation approved a revised plan of the course, which now provides for work of a nature more in keeping with that usually done under normal working conditions in Australia.

During the year the Association expressed appreciation of the secretarial services provided by your Society and indicated that the prestige attained by the Association in Sheep Dog circles can be mainly attributed to the efficient manner in which the secretarial work has been carried out over the years.

Poultry Control Council.

This Council has retained the full support of all Metropolitan showing bodies, and in addition to affiliations of two country Poultry Societies, has received promises of further country support.

Your Council, on the recommendation of the Committee, agreed to invite an English judge to adjudicate in all standard classes at the 1950 Royal Show.

Mr. H. Anthony, of Lancashire, accepted the invitation and his appointment proved an outstanding success.

Fanciers in this country were very appreciative of his readiness to discuss their problems, and at an evening arranged during the currency of the Show—which was largely attended by fanciers—Mr. Anthony gave an interesting address and answered many enquiries which were submitted to him by those present.

In his comments, Mr. Anthony stated that many of the birds brought before him were equal to the best he had seen overseas and generally the standard was very high.

He was particularly impressed with the magnificent pavilion in which the birds were exhibited. This, he stated, was far superior to anything he had seen elsewhere, and he complimented the Society on the whole of the organisation which was responsible for the smooth running of the section.

Owing to the fact that only one judge was engaged, it was necessary for birds to be staged earlier than usual and to spread the judging over several days.

When this was known, fears were expressed that the birds would suffer from their long confinement, but it was proved that many finished the Show in better condition than at the commencement. This was because of the care and attention given to exhibits by the Superintendent, Mr. J. C. McQuarie, and staff, and following the Show many appreciative letters were received from Societies and individual exhibitors.

The Committee having gained this knowledge and being convinced that the longest possible showing period is desirable, has now recommended to your Council that for 1951, birds be required to be delivered by Wednesday, 19th September, judged on Thursday, 20th, and be on exhibition for the remainder of the Show.

In the last report mention was made of the offer of two trophies for each affiliated club. These were keenly sought, and it has been decided to make similar trophies available again in 1951.

The Committee completed its work of revision of the book of standards, but decided that pub-

lication would not be undertaken until it was possible to study the new English book which, it is understood, is almost ready for distribution. Our English judge, Mr. Anthony, has promised to forward a copy as soon as they are available.

It is with regret that the Committee reports that through continued illness, one of its members, Mr. W. Tyzack, was unable to attend any meetings during the year. Mr. Tyzack was one of the keenest supporters of the Council in the formation of which he took a leading part. As there appears to be no possibility of Mr. Tyzack's health improving sufficiently for him to again take his place on the Committee, a recommendation that another member should be appointed in his stead has been made to your Council.

The Victorian Young Farmers' Clubs Association.

Whilst gratified at the progress made under the circumstances prevailing during the year, the Association Executive regrets that its continued inability to secure the services of sufficient competent Club Supervisors has retarded the further development of the Young Farmer movement that could have been achieved with a full staff.

Mesrs. T. J. McEvoy and P. W. Webb were appointed to fill vacancies caused by the resignation for personal reasons, of Messrs. H. Henry and K. V. Weppner, whose services to the Association for many years had won the respect of all concerned.

Thus the number of Supervisors remained at four, whilst six is regarded as the minimum necessary to effectively carry on the work of the Association. The absence on leave of Supervisor Hedley Jones for the greater part of the year during an extensive tour abroad, made the work still more difficult, but much value should accrue to the movement as a result of the close study he was able to make of young farmer organisation overseas, and on which he has already submitted a full report.

The financial year closed with a total of 365 junior and 59 senior clubs—a reduction in the former and a healthy increase in the latter.

The number of junior clubs is being affected by the establishment of Consolidated Schools and the transfer of pupils at the sixth grade to Secondary Schools. This is making it difficult for many primary schools to continue club activities. It is, however, pleasing to report that the interest of head teachers in the boys and girls who will be remaining on farms, has led to the formation of very active clubs at Consolidated Schools, because the urgent need for increased production of food, and the alarming drift of our population to the cities, makes it imperative that those who have the direction of our educational services should seriously consider definite action to interest as many as possible of our young people in rural life. Those who have decided to make farming their life's occupation should certainly be given every chance to gain all the knowledge they can of the

science of agriculture, with its correlated studies in geography, mathematics, farm machinery, electricity and farm handcrafts. In this connection it is of interest to record that there has been an educational revolution in England concerning the importance of agricultural education in the curriculum of the schools.

Club activities can be greatly extended because of the provision at Consolidated Schools for classes in woodwork, sheetmetal work, and domestic science. The Clubs in Consolidated Schools can link up very smoothly with the curriculum that is being developed. Some Secondary and Technical Schools have taken advantage of an opportunity to develop courses in rural science, and have devoted a period for club work for young farmers. The results achieved, and the interest created is already being acclaimed. The training of teachers at Agricultural Colleges, if governed by the selection of teachers interested in agriculture and imbued with a desire to assist agricultural development, will make an opportunity for extending Clubs in Secondary and Consolidated Schools. The support of the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools in the establishment of clubs in such schools, wherever possible, is greatly appreciated.

The Association has provided many interesting circulars on the correlation of agricultural projects with the subjects of the curriculum, and has presented many new approaches to the development of Club activities. As well as circulars on Sheep, Pasture, and Wheat projects, a new Orchard Project Book has been published. These aids have been greatly appreciated and have been prepared in a simple manner that makes them valuable guides to project development. They are compiled from the experience of teacher Club leaders and Supervisors, and set out sufficient information for a course extending over two years.

At the Vacation School for young farmer teacher Club leaders, the use of these publications in developing a school curriculum has been illustrated in a series of lectures by the Supervisors. These lectures have been made practical by the interest and support of Mr. J. Hall, Club leader at Bell School, who provided many interesting and well-executed charts showing clearly the development from regional geography to the establishment of primary industries, and the linking of primary and secondary industries. Mr. Hall assisted at the lectures, and has made the charts available for demonstrations at Field Days for young farmers in many rural centres. The lessons conveyed have been of great value, and teacher Club leaders have developed similar methods in their Clubs.

The Vacation School this year was one of the most fruitful yet held. Mr. A. J. Law, M.A., granted the use of the Teachers' College for lectures, and gave a most inspiring address on the part education must play in the life of our people. He commended the reality that had been brought into rural education by Clubs linking the interest of the community with the

School. The Association had as guests two officers of the Department of Agriculture in Tasmania. These officers were preparing a plan for the development of Young Farmers' Clubs in Tasmania, and attended the school as observers. It is a compliment to the Association that enquiries and investigations have been made by other States into the organisation of Victorian Clubs, and that they have adopted many ideas, especially with regard to the Senior Sections.

Club Field Days have been very successful. Officers of the Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Societies, leaders in civic life, parents and young farmers are absorbed in a common purpose of developing a community interest in educational and agricultural pursuits. Many Field Days have become district rallies where all Clubs unite in carrying out well organised programmes.

The thirteenth annual three years' scholarship provided by the Agricultural Education Division of the Department of Agriculture, was won this year by Russell Hodge, of the Kyneton Senior Section, who commenced his studies at Longerenong Agricultural College.

The "Sun" Cattle Judging Competitions again provided keen competition at the Royal Show, and are directing young farmers to an extended study of breeds of cattle. The Association is indebted to the proprietors of the Sun News Pictorial for the donation of trophies annually for senior and junior sections.

The splendid display staged in the Young Farmers' Pavilion by members of junior and senior section Clubs was inspected and commended by His Excellency the Governor and many other notable visitors during the Show. In addition to art, crafts, project and correlated studies, the display included cured carcasses of pigs, and dressed table poultry entered in Young Farmer Competitions, sponsored by the Australian Broadcasting Commission, which has done a great deal in various ways to encourage development of the Young Farmer movement in this and other States.

A Young Farmer Leadership Competition for girls—also sponsored by the A.B.C.—was keenly contested, and in the broadcasting studio on the Show Grounds, the final was won by Miss Alison Honey, a member of the Geelong Senior Section Club.

During the Senior Section Clubs annual conference, delegates were delighted to receive a visit from Hon. Colin Sinclair, President of the Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W., who accompanied Mr. C. N. McKay, President of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria and the Victorian Young Farmers' Clubs Association. Both addressed the conference and congratulated members and supervisors on the progress made

Five members of Senior Section Clubs visited the Royal Easter Show in Sydney as guests of the Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W.

Graham Shelton, one of the team, competed creditably in the Leadership Competition conducted by the Australian Broadcasting Commission. Supervisor W. H. Simpson, who accompanied the boys, reported that they maintained the high standard of conduct which has always characterised representatives from this State.

Two camps were successfully conducted during the year, one at Point Lonsdale, arranged in conjunction with the Geelong Seniors and led by Mr. Ken Wilson, and another at Warrnambool, in conjunction with the Chamber of Agriculture Convention, and led by Mr. Charles Rogers. Both camps received full co-operation from the citizens of the district and of the Agricultural Societies. The morning discussion groups were a feature of great educational value. At future camps public speaking competitions and a sports programme will be included.

The Association was pleased to receive a visit from two English Young Farmers who accompanied Supervisors on trips to several Clubs where they were entertained. They were impressed with the many community projects in hand. Similar hospitality was extended to a party of 27 Young Farmers from New Zealand under the leadership of Mr. W. Guy, who, since his return, has conveyed an invitation for a party of Victorian Young Farmers to be the guests of Clubs in the Auckland district.

The Executive of the Association has expressed keen appreciation of the co-operation received

from the press and broadcasting stations, publication of programmes, details of new activities, and articles of interest to young farmers has been of great assistance. Club leaders have, through the courtesy of the Australian Broadcasting Commission, been given opportunity to speak about the work of their Clubs. Regional Stations of the A.B.C. are devoting many sessions to young farmer broadcasts, and several Commercial Stations in rural areas have made definite weekly periods available for Club talks.

The Chamber of Agriculture of Victoria.

As indicated in last report the 1950 Convention of the Chamber was held at Warrnambool. It was well attended and was regarded as one of the most successful conferences of delegates from affiliated bodies throughout the State. Professor S. M. Wadham, as President, conducted the proceedings in such manner as to ensure success.

The arrangements made for and the hospitality extended to delegates by the Warrnambool Agricultural Society and the Mayor and citizens of that city were much appreciated and gratefully acknowledged by resolution of the Convention.

His Excellency the High Commissioner for Great Britain in Australia (Hon. E. J. Williams) officially opened the Convention and subsequently addressed the delegates on Britain's farming and her overseas food supplies.

Several other addresses on subjects of vital interest to primary producers were delivered to very appreciative audiences at the different sessions and there were keen discussions on the items of business listed in the agenda.

The addresses together with a full report on the Convention were subsequently published in the Chamber Year Book, copies of which were forwarded to affiliated organisations, libraries and kindred bodies in other States and overseas.

Mr. W. F. a'B. Weigall was elected President and at his suggestion a grateful tribute was paid to Prof. Wadham for his outstanding services to the Chamber in that capacity during the past two years.

The Chamber has consistently supported the Young Farmer Movement since its establishment in this State, but, of course, is more particularly interested in the Senior Section Clubs, which were officially sponsored at its Colac Convention in 1947. A well-equipped camp was provided on the Warrnambool Show Grounds for young men and women members of Clubs in different parts of Victoria. They attended the Convention and the State President of the Senior Section Clubs, when addressing the delegates, expressed appreciation of the interest shown by Agricultural Societies in founding Clubs and appointing advisory committees to assist their development.

Since the Convention, the Executive has been very active, not only in its efforts to have implemented the resolutions adopted at Warrnambool, but in dealing with other problems of "the man on the land" as they arose. The activities of the Chamber have been widened by its affiliation with the National Farmers' Union, through which body its views are heard in national and inter-national circles.

Meetings of the full Council have been held quarterly in Melbourne, and arrangements are now in hand for the 1951 Commemoration Convention which is to be held at Mildura during the week commencing 9th April.

Australian Council of Agricultural Societies.

As previously announced, this Society is a constituent member of the Australian Council of Agricultural Societies.

A special feature at the 1951 Royal Easter Show in Sydney will be an All-Australian (non-competitive) Agricultural Court, sponsored by the Commonwealth Government in connection with the Jubilee Celebrations and also with a view to determining the value to Australia if such an exhibit was sent overseas in 1952.

Your Council readily acceded to the request to co-operate by arranging for certain specified exhibits to be sent from Victoria.

To assist in securing the exhibits and in staging, servicing and dismantling the display, your Council was fortunate in that Cr. A. V. Wood—well-known organiser of the Whittlesea District Exhibit at our Show—was willing to accept the position of Liaison Officer for Victoria. He will have as his assistant in Sydney a representative of the Victorian Young Farmers' Clubs Associa-

tion in the person of Robert Wallis, President of the Senior Section Clubs.

Victorian Pasture Improvement League.

Being convinced of the value of the work of the Victorian Pasture Improvement League your Council renewed its annual contribution to the funds of that body.

Wheat Crop Championship Competitions.

The subsidisation of four Wheat Crop Championship Competitions conducted by the Farm Competitions Association of Victoria proved so successful that your Council decided to again allocate £200 to be equally divided as prize money in competitions in the Northern Wimmera, Southern Wimmera, Mallee and Northern Districts.

Interest in, and support of these competitions has been gratifying and the results of the judging will be available early in the new year.

Fodder Conservation Campaign.

This annual campaign is regarded by Council as one of the most valuable of the Society's activities apart from the Show, as it focuses State-wide attention on the importance of fodder conservation, not only for feeding in the winter months, but what is more important, establishing reserves for use in lean or drought years, and present indications are that such reserves may be required in the coming year in this State.

The Department of Agriculture having agreed to continue its much appreciated co-operation with this Society by financial support and the services of its officers as Judges, your Council announced its 1950-51 campaign and received a large number of applications from Agricultural Societies, Herd Testing Associations, etc., throughout the State for subsidies of £15 as prize money in local district fodder conservation competitions, every competitor in which is automatically an entrant in the State Championship Competition.

Entries in these district competitions will close with local Secretaries on 31st January, and your Council has already been assured of very satisfactory entries in several districts.

Use of Grounds Between Shows.

The rising cost of maintaining this Society's activities, already referred to, makes doubly welcome the revenue received for use of the Show Grounds and buildings between Shows.

The major portion of such revenue in recent years has been derived from the Trotting Control Board, which has not only conducted Night Trotting races at the Show Grounds, but since its establishment in 1946 has by wise government placed the sport of trotting on a sound basis throughout the State.

The Board very successfully conducted the Inter-Dominion Championship Trotting Carnival early in the year with total stake money that would not have been dreamt of in former years.

Next year, in addition to its ordinary meetings, the Board will conduct two special trotting

carnivals in connection with the 1951 Commemoration celebrations already referred to.

Your Council acknowledges, with appreciation, the manner in which the Trotting Control Board has co-operated with the Society during its tenancy at the Show Grounds, and with the Board looks forward to the time when it will be possible to improve facilities for patrons of the Board and the Society.

As evidence of its desire to co-operate in every way to ensure the success of the Commemoration Celebrations, your Council readily agreed to make the grounds available to the 1951 Centenary Committee for the finals of Statewide competitions in various branches of sport.

It has also complied with the request of the Victorian Branch of the Equestrian Federation of Australia for permission to conduct at the Show Grounds, as another feature of the celebrations, the E.F.A. Commemoration Horse Show at which will be introduced for the first time in Australia, competitions akin to those at international horse shows and Olympic Games.

In common with its sister Societies in other States, this Society has assured the Federation of its full co-operation and support in the formidable task it has undertaken to ensure that Australia will be worthily represented in the equestrian events at the 1956 Olympic Games.

Negotiations for the use of the Show Grounds arena for Night Football are expected to be satisfactorily concluded early in the new year.

Olympics.

It was in May, 1949, that the International Olympic Federation, at its meeting in Rome, resolved that the 1956 Olympic Games would be held in Melbourne.

At that meeting, plans to provide for the games on this Society's Show Grounds were perused, and although as stated in last year's report, it was anticipated that the Show Grounds would be selected and work commenced early in 1950, finality has not yet been reached, and much valuable time has been lost.

Your Council is, however, confident that no better proposal than that of this Society has been submitted, and that the final decision, when reached, will be in favour of the Show Grounds.

Acknowledgements.

Your Council desires to place on record its grateful appreciation of the interest displayed in this Society's activities by His Excellency the Governor, who shortly after his arrival in this State was pleased to become Patron of the Society. His Excellency was the guest of the Society at its pre-Show dinner at the Town Hall, and as already reported, he officially opened our Diamond Jubilee Show and subsequently made an extended tour of the grounds viewing the exhibits and meeting exhibitors.

Your Council noted with pleasure His Excellency's congratulatory remarks on the value of the work of this Society over more than a century of service to this State and Commonwealth.

This opportunity is also taken to express your Council's best thanks to Government Depart-

ments, public bodies, Stud Stock Breeders' Societies, the Press and Broadcasting Stations (both metropolitan and country) for their co-operation throughout the year, but especially at Show time; to the Judges, Stewards and Stewardesses for the onerous services rendered in an honorary capacity, and the many other supporters of the Society who, in different ways, contributed to the success of the Show.

The Council.

Though several changes have taken place in the Council during the year, with one exception they were changes in status.

Advantage was taken of the revised Constitution and Rules adopted late in 1949, to appoint as Honorary Councillors the following members, who had rendered more than twenty years' service on the Council:—Messrs. J. E. Robertson (who was first elected to the Council in 1908); J. A. Beattie (1911); R. N. Scott (1915), and J. F. Guthrie (1916).

These vacancies were filled by the election of Dr. Frank Stephens; Messrs. Geoffrey Howell, K. G. Luke, and G. P. H. Wilson.

In May last, Mr. W. A. Winter-Irving resigned because, in view of his activities, he found it increasingly difficult to give the necessary time to assist in the work of the Society. The resignation was received with regret, and the vacancy thus caused was filled by the election of Mr. H. T. C. Woodfull.

Extended leave was granted to Mr. M. A. Nicholas whose business interests necessitated a lengthy sojourn in England; also to our President (Mr. C. N. McKay) and Vice-President (Mr. T. N. Mitchell) who were warmly welcomed on their return from tours abroad.

Finance.

The audited financial statements are set out in customary detail for members' perusal and are self-explanatory.

The necessity for increased revenue to meet the spiraling costs will be apparent to all, so having made a beginning this year with the fees for membership, your Council has appointed a special committee to consider and report on other avenues for increased revenue, with a view to taking the necessary action prior to the Show.

Your Council will, of course, have also to view requests entailing added expenditure, as, for instance, the recommendations already received for increased prize money.

However, it is confidently anticipated that whatever Council's decisions may be, members and supporters will respond in the knowledge that changes have to be made if the work of the Society is to be conducted in accordance with the objects with which it was established.





The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria

RULES

1. The name of the Society is "The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria."

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of all phases of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Stock Raising, Manufacturing and Industrial Resources of the State of Victoria, and in connection therewith:

- (a) To hold, promote, assist or subsidise exhibitions, displays or shows of any nature or kind at any time or place, and to offer any kind of awards or prizes thereat if deemed desirable so to do.
- (b) To hold meetings for the purpose of fostering or popularising rural life and disseminating knowledge of methods of agriculture, and for the purpose of discussing and determining methods whereby the interests of persons engaged in any class of primary industry may be best protected or enhanced.
- (c) To collect, distribute, publicise and advertise any information or details connected with or akin to the Society's objects.
- (d) To encourage, promote, establish, form or appoint clubs, bodies, councils or committees for the control or betterment of showing conditions or the exhibition of any class of live stock and also for the promotion of any particular breed or breeds of live stock or any section or part of the primary industry, and further to appoint representatives to any body on which it is deemed desirable to have representatives.
- (e) To establish, form or appoint bodies, councils or committees for the protection of primary industry or any particular class thereof, and to take action either separately or through such councils, committees or bodies to protect or promote the interests of any part or parts of the primary industry or any person or class of persons connected therewith.
- (f) To promote or assist in any way whatsoever in the improvement or development of any kind of machinery or process, whether connected with the primary or secondary industries of the State.
- (g) To promote or assist the discovery, investigation or development of equipment for agricultural purposes, construction of farm buildings, improved methods of agriculture and produce thereof, methods for the destruction of pests, methods for the eradication or utilization of weeds, methods for the improvement of stock or animals of any kind or the suitability thereof for any particular purpose, and methods for the prevention or curing of diseases in animals or plants.

- (h) To assist in the promotion of soil and water conservation, and to take such action as may be deemed desirable in connection therewith.
- (i) To prepare and publish Flock Books, Herd Books, Stud Books, Journals, Magazines, Pamphlets, Essays or Papers containing information on any matters connected with any of the objects of the Society, and to establish a library or reading room.
- (j) To purchase any live stock for breeding purposes and allowing farmers or any person engaged in pastoral pursuits the use thereof.
- (k) To assist or subsidise competitions, exhibitions or shows in any way relating to the primary production or secondary industry of the State.
- (l) To borrow or raise or secure the payment of money in any manner whatsoever, including by mortgage or overdraft or charge or by the issue of bills of exchange or promissory notes or by borrowing money on "short call."
- (m) Generally to purchase, take or lease or licence (including building lease) or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property and any rights or privileges which may be necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Society, and in particular any land, buildings, farms, easements, chattels, machinery, plant or stock.
- (n) To construct, repair, maintain, alter or demolish any buildings or works for the purposes of the Society.
- (o) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Society not immediately required in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (p) To lend money to such persons or bodies and on such terms as may seem expedient for the benefit of the Society, and in particular to such bodies or organisations having objects or purposes similar to those of the Society.
- (q) To sell, improve, develop, exchange, lease, mortgage, encumber, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property of the Society.
- (r) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

INTERPRETATION.

3. In these presents, unless there be something in the subject matter inconsistent therewith:

"Society" means the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.

"Year" means calendar year.

"The Council" means the whole or any number of the Council of the Society for the time being assembled at a meeting of the Council in accordance with the rules of the Society not being less than a quorum.

"Member" or "Members" means a member or members for the time being of the Society and where used without qualification shall be deemed to include Honorary Members, Life Governors, Life Members, Ordinary Members and Associate Members.

"Month" means calendar month.

"In writing" and "Written" means and includes printing, lithography and other modes of representing or reproducing words in visible form.

"Auditors" means the auditors for the time being of the Society.

"Secretary" includes acting Secretary.

Words importing the singular number include the plural number, and words importing the plural number include the singular. Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine gender.

THE SOCIETY.

4. The property, assets and income of the Society whencesoever derived shall be applied towards the promotion of the objects of the Society, and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise, howsoever by way of profit to members of the Society. Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good faith of remuneration to any officers or servants of the Society or to any member of the Society or other person in return for any services actually rendered to the Society nor prevent the payment of interest on money borrowed from any member of the Society.

5. The Society shall consist of Honorary Members, Life Governors, Life Members, Ordinary Members and Associate Members.

MEMBERSHIP.

6. Every applicant for membership of the Society shall, when making such application, state whether he desires to become a Life Governor, Life Member, Ordinary Member or Associate Member, and shall at such time pay the appropriate member's subscription and (except in the case of associate members), the name of such applicant shall be submitted to the Council for election or otherwise. The Council may refuse any application for membership without assigning any reason therefor.

7. (a) The subscription for a Life Governor shall be One Hundred Pounds.

(b) The subscription for a Life Member shall be Fifty Pounds.

(c) The subscription for each financial year for ordinary and associate members shall as from the first day of January, 1950. be:
For Ordinary Members the sum of
Three Guineas.

For Associate Members the sum of One Pound ten shillings.

(d) Annual subscriptions shall be due and payable on the first day of January in each year.

(e) The Council may at any time and from time to time vary the amount of any of the subscriptions for any class of member.

(f) The Council may at any time appoint any person to be an Honorary Member of the Society in recognition of services rendered in promoting the objects for which the Society was established.

8. (a) Only an individual person shall be eligible to be a Life Governor or a Life Member.

(b) Any person, firm, corporation, society or company shall be eligible to become an ordinary member or associate member.

9. In case any firm, corporation, society, company or other body (hereinafter called a "body") desires to become an ordinary member, such body may nominate in writing a person who shall be entitled to act as a proxy for the body at all meetings of and in all dealings with the Society. The body may change such nominee from time to time but the Society shall be deemed to have fulfilled all requirements if it addresses notices, ballot papers or communications to the nominee for the time being, care of the body at its address in the members' roll. Unless the instrument appointing such nominee is deposited at the office of the Society not less than one month before the date of the meeting, which the nominee attends, or one month prior to the closing of any ballot the body concerned shall not be entitled to vote. The instrument shall remain in force until the same is changed by the body unless such instrument specifically limits the time of operation thereof. A vote or act done in accordance with or in pursuance of such instrument of nomination, shall be valid notwithstanding the previous revocation of the nomination provided that no written intimation of the revocation has been received at the office of the Society. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the decision of the President of the Society or of any other person or persons appointed by the Council for that purpose as to the validity of any instrument appointing a nominee or proxy, and the right of the nominee or proxy to vote thereunder shall be final and conclusive.

PRIVILEGES OF MEMBERSHIP.

10. The privileges of an Honorary Member of the Society shall be the right to free admission to the Society's Grounds and grand stands during shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society and also such other rights as may be determined by the Council from time to time, and such rights may vary in regard to different persons.

11. The privileges of a Life Governor, Life Member and Ordinary Member, shall be:—

(i) Free admission to the Society's grounds and grand stands during Shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society, and such ladies' tickets as the Council may from time to time decide upon provided always that a person who became a Life Governor or Life Member prior to 2nd February, 1939, shall be entitled to two ladies' tickets.

- (ii) The right to purchase up to two additional ladies' tickets at the price fixed from time to time by the Council.
- (iii) The benefits of any reciprocal arrangement which the Society has with any kindred Society.
- (iv) Such reduced entry fees at shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society as the Council may from time to time determine upon.
- (v) The right to vote at general meetings of the Society subject to any rules herein contained, which deal with the right to vote at meetings of the Society.
- (vi) The right to a copy of the Society's Journal free of charge.

12. The privileges of an Associate Member shall be:—

- (i) Free admission to the Society's grounds and grand stands during shows or other exhibitions conducted by the Society.
- (ii) Such reduced entry fees at Shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society as the Council may from time to time determine.
- (iii) The right to purchase up to two ladies' tickets at the price fixed from time to time by the Council.
- (iv) If a firm, corporation, society, company or other body, then it shall have the right to pay more than one associate member's subscription in which event it shall be entitled to as many associate members' tickets as subscriptions paid.

13. The Council may at any time, and from time to time add to or vary any of the privileges of membership herein set out.

14. A member shall not be entitled to any of the privileges of membership whilst his subscription remains unpaid, provided always that the right granted to Ordinary members by Rule 33 is not hereby prejudiced.

MEETINGS OF MEMBERS.

15. The Annual General Meeting of the Society shall normally be held on the last Thursday of February in each year. Every other general meeting shall be called a "Special General Meeting."

16. The business of an annual general meeting shall be to receive and consider the annual report of the Council on the past year's operations and the Balance Sheet, to receive the declaration of the result of the election of Councillors, and to appoint two auditors. No other business shall be transacted at any annual meeting unless notice in writing shall have been given before the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of the Monday before the second Tuesday in January, immediately preceding such meeting or before such other time as may be determined by the Council.

17. The Secretary shall convene a special general meeting upon receipt of a request made to him by the President or by two Vice-Presidents or by the Council or upon receipt of a request made to him in writing, and signed by fifty members other than Honorary or Associate members.

18. Every such request shall express the purpose for which it is required that such meeting be convened.

19. No business shall be considered at any special general meeting of the Society except the particular business notified in the notice paper convening the meeting.

20. Notice of every general meeting of the Society setting forth the purpose for which it is convened, and the time and place at which it is to be held shall be forwarded to every Life Governor, Life Member and every Ordinary Member of the Society at his address in the Members' Roll. In the case of a firm, corporation, society, company or other body being an ordinary member the provisions of Rule 9 in regard to notices shall be observed.

21. The accidental omission to give any such notice mentioned in the last preceding rule shall not invalidate any resolutions passed at such meeting.

22. Twenty persons qualified to vote at a ballot present personally shall form a quorum for any general meeting of the Society, and no business shall be transacted unless a quorum be present.

23. If within fifteen minutes from the time appointed for a general meeting a quorum is not present the meeting if convened upon such requisition as referred to in Rule 17 shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place, or to such other day, time and place as the President or council may by notice published in at least one Melbourne daily paper appoint.

24. The President of the Society shall take the Chair at every general meeting but if there be no President or if at any general meeting he shall not be present within ten minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting the Senior Vice-President then present shall take the chair, and if there be no Vice-President present, the members present shall choose another member of the Council to take the chair.

25. The Chairman shall have control of any general meeting, and his declaration of the result of any show of hands or ballot shall be conclusive.

26. (a) No member other than the Chairman shall speak for a longer period than ten minutes except with the consent of the meeting.

(b) The meeting may at any time resolve that a speaker be no further heard.

(c) The meeting may resolve at any time that the "Question be now put." If such resolution be carried the debate shall thereupon be closed except that the mover of the resolution before the meeting shall have a right of reply.

27. At every general meeting of the Society a ballot may be demanded by the Chairman or by at least 20 persons qualified to vote at a ballot and present.

28. The Chairman of a general meeting may with the consent of the meeting adjourn the same from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

29. At all general meetings when questions of order, procedure or interpretation of the Rules or By-laws of the Society shall arise, the ruling of the Chairman shall be accepted as final.

30. If a ballot be demanded as aforesaid it shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman of the meeting may direct. The demand of a ballot may be withdrawn.

31. The demand of a ballot shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business of that meeting other than the question on which the ballot was demanded.

VOTES BY MEMBERS.

32. On the determination of any question whether by ballot or show of hands or otherwise life governors, life members, and financial ordinary members present at a meeting shall have one vote each. Associate members shall not be entitled to be present or vote at any meetings of the Society.

33. Every ordinary member, who was a financial member for the year preceding the annual meeting, shall be entitled to one vote at such annual general meeting.

34. No person, firm, company, corporation or other body may, by becoming a member after the 31st December in any year and before the next annual meeting exercise any of the rights of membership at such next annual meeting.

35. Except in the case of a firm, corporation, society, company or other similar body, votes must be cast personally. In the case of a firm, corporation, society, company or other body, votes shall be cast by proxy as hereinbefore set out.

36. In all cases of equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

TRUSTEES.

37. All the real and personal property of the Society now or hereafter acquired shall be, and is hereby vested in the Trustees for the time being on behalf of the Society.

38. There shall be four Trustees, one of whom shall be appointed by the Governor of the State of Victoria, and the other three shall be appointed by the Council.

39. The Trustees holding office at the date of adoption of these rules shall continue to hold office as Trustees until their office has been vacated under the provisions of these Rules.

40. The office of trustee shall ipso facto be vacated:

- (a) if he becomes bankrupt;
- (b) if he be declared lunatic;
- (c) if in the opinion of the Council he becomes from any cause incapable of attending to his duties or unfit to hold office;

(d) if he resigns his office;

(e) if his membership subscription remains unpaid for more than twelve months;

(f) if he dies.

41. The Trustees shall deal with the property of the Society as directed by resolution of the Council (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence) and they shall be indemnified against any liability, loss, expense or risk out of the funds and property of the Society.

COUNCILLORS.

42. The members of the Council as constituted as at the date of the adoption of these rules shall continue in office as Councillors until their respective offices be vacated in accordance with the rules.

43. Councillors shall hold office for three years, one-third retiring annually in rotation, but those retiring shall be eligible for re-election.

44. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, a Councillor shall ipso facto cease to hold office as such if he:

- (a) becomes bankrupt;
- (b) be declared lunatic;
- (c) in the opinion of the Council becomes from any cause incapable or unfit to hold office;
- (d) resigns his office;
- (e) absents himself from three or more consecutive meetings of the Council without leave of absence from the Council;
- (f) allows his membership subscription to remain unpaid for more than twelve months;
- (g) dies.

45. Should any vacancy occur in the office of Councillor between annual meetings through death, resignation or otherwise, such vacancy shall be filled by the Council and the substituted Councillor so elected shall hold office for the unexpired period of his predecessor's term of office.

46. At each annual meeting of the Society the eleven councillors, who have been longest in office shall retire.

For the purpose of this rule the length of time a Councillor has been in office shall be computed from the date of his last election or appointment, except as provided in the last preceding clause.

47. At the monthly meeting of the Council held in January or at some other convenient time the Council shall prepare a list of persons nominated by them to fill the vacancies in the Council occurring at the next annual meeting. Every candidate for the office of Councillor (other than those nominated by the Council as aforesaid) shall be nominated in writing by two members other than Honorary or Associate Members, and the full name of every such candidate, together with the names of his two nominators, and his own written consent to stand as a candidate, shall be lodged with the Secretary before two o'clock in the afternoon of the Monday immediately preceding the second Tuesday in January prior to the Annual General Meeting. Every candidate must be either a Life Governor or a Life Member or a financial Ordinary member at the time of nomination.

48. Unless otherwise determined by a three-fourths majority at a meeting of the Council, an election shall, when the nominations exceed the vacancies be by ballot, and the following provisions shall have effect:

At least 14 days prior to the annual general meeting the Secretary or his deputy shall send to all Life Governors, Life and ordinary members at their address in the members' roll of the Society a ballot paper containing in alphabetical order the names of the candidates. With such ballot paper shall be enclosed an envelope addressed to "The Returning Officer," care of the Secretary, and a smaller envelope marked "Ballot Paper." The accidental or inadvertent omission to forward such ballot paper and envelopes to any or some of the aforesaid persons shall not invalidate the ballot. Where a firm, corporation, society, company or other body is an ordinary member the provisions of Rule 9 shall be observed in regard to the posting of ballot papers.

49. Votes shall be recorded by striking out on the ballot paper the names of candidates for whom it is not wished to vote. Every member voting shall vote for as many candidates as there are vacancies to be filled and no more or less.

50. Ballot papers shall be placed in the smaller envelopes sent out by the Secretary and marked "Ballot Paper," and such envelopes, when sealed, shall be placed in the larger envelope addressed to "The Returning Officer." The member voting shall sign his name in the space provided on the larger envelope when a vote is cast by the nominee of a firm, corporation, society, company or other body, the nominee shall sign his own name in addition to the member's name.

51. A Ballot Box shall be placed at the Society's offices at least fourteen days before the annual general meeting, and members or nominees entitled to vote may deposit therein the envelopes addressed to the returning officer and containing their ballot papers at any time prior to the close of the poll. The envelopes addressed to the Returning officer and containing the ballot paper may be sent by post or other means, but they must arrive at the office of the Society prior to the close of the poll. All votes so sent to the Returning Officer shall be placed in the ballot box as soon as received.

52. The poll shall close at five o'clock on the Tuesday before the day on which the annual general meeting is to be held or some other convenient date fixed by the Council.

53. The President, or should he fail so to do, then the Council, shall appoint a returning officer for the purpose of conducting the ballot, taking charge of the voting papers and counting the votes cast. The returning officer shall, on the completion of the counting of the votes, communicate to the President or his deputy, the result of the poll. The Chairman of the Annual Meeting shall declare the result of the ballot at such meeting, and the declaration by the Chairman of the result of the ballot shall be final and conclusive.

54. Each candidate for election may at his own expense appoint another person to be present at the examination of the voting and the counting of the votes.

55. In the case of two or more candidates receiving an equal number of votes the President or his deputy shall have a second or casting vote.

56. The validity of any vote or votes shall be determined by the returning officer whose decision in this regard shall be final and conclusive.

57. Except as herein provided each Councillor shall hold office until the dissolution of the annual general meeting at which his successor is appointed.

HONORARY COUNCILLORS.

58. After a person has been a Councillor of the Society for a period of twenty years the Council shall have the power to appoint him an Honorary Councillor of the Society, and upon the Council so doing, such person shall thereupon cease to be an elected Councillor, and his office as such shall become vacant.

59. All Honorary Councillors of the Society shall be permanent members of the Council, and subject only to termination of their office as provided by the next succeeding rule, and they shall be entitled to all the privileges of a Councillor.

60. An Honorary Councillor shall ipso facto cease to hold office if he:

- (a) becomes bankrupt;
- (b) be declared lunatic;
- (c) in the opinion of the Council becomes from any cause incapable or unfit to hold office;
- (d) resigns his office;
- (e) allows his membership subscription to remain unpaid for more than twelve months;
- (f) dies.

COUNCIL.

61. The business and affairs of the Society shall be under the management and control of a council. The Council may exercise all the powers of the Society and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Society or which, it considers is necessary or expedient to carry out the objects of the Society.

62. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society and all other affairs thereof, and the members of the Society shall for these purposes be deemed to have constituted the Council their duly authorised agents.

63. The Council shall have power from time to time to make, amend, enlarge or revoke such by-laws as they deem necessary for effectively carrying out the objects of the Society or any of them.

64. The Council shall consist of:

- (a) Thirty-three members, who shall be elected to the Council from life governors, the life members and ordinary members of the Society in the manner herein provided, and who are in these rules referred to as "Councillors."
- (b) The four trustees hereinbefore mentioned.
- (c) The Honorary Councillors appointed to such positions in the manner herein provided.

PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL.

65. The Council shall hold periodical meetings for the despatch of business and may adjourn and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit.

66. The quorum for all meetings of the Council shall be ten. If within half-an-hour after the time for which any meeting of the Council is called a quorum is not present, then the members present or the majority of them or the Secretary if no member be present, may adjourn such meeting to a time not longer than 14 days.

67. The Council shall at their first meeting after the annual meeting in each year or as occasion may require, elect out of their own number (which includes Trustees and Honorary Councillors if any), a President and three Vice-Presidents.

68. In the absence of the President the Chair shall be taken by the Senior Vice-President then present, and should none of these officers be present, then by such member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman. The Senior Vice-President shall be deemed to mean the Vice-president, who has been a member of the Council for the greatest number of years in the aggregate.

69. The President or any four members of the Council may request that a meeting of the Council be called to consider any particular matter or matters and the Secretary, upon receipt of such request shall convene a meeting of the Council.

70. Questions arising at any meeting of the Council shall be decided by a majority of votes of those present at such meeting. In case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

COMMITTEES.

71. The Council may delegate any of its powers to a committee or committees consisting of such members of the Council as it thinks fit, and may, from time to time, alter or revoke any such delegation or alter, add to or vary the members of any such committee. Any committee so formed shall, in the exercise of the powers delegated, conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed upon it by the Council, and shall report to the Council as soon as possible any action it has taken or decision it has made in the exercise of such powers. All acts done at any meeting of any such committee shall be valid notwithstanding any defect in the appointment or qualification of any member or any defect in the procedure adopted at any such meeting. Any casual vacancy occurring in any committee may be filled by the Council.

72. Without limiting the generality of the power contained in the last preceding rule the Council may appoint a Special Committee, which shall have power *inter alia* to investigate and determine any question or matter relating to the conduct of a member or members and in particular to exercise the power of expulsion of members or to impose any other penalty on any person.

73. The Special Committee may expel from the Society or otherwise punish or penalise any member whose conduct, in the opinion of such committee, is discreditable or injurious to the character or interests of the Society or renders him unfit to associate with members of the Society

or who fails to comply with any direction or request of the Council within a reasonable time or who fails to comply with any rules governing any show or exhibition conducted by the Society or disregards or fails to observe any direction or decision of any official or judge appointed by the Society.

74. Before any member is expelled or otherwise punished or penalised his conduct shall be inquired into by the Special Committee, and he shall be given an opportunity to defend himself and to justify or explain his conduct. If a majority of the Special Committee present when the matter is enquired into are of the opinion that the member has been guilty of such conduct or action as aforesaid then such Committee may expel or suspend him from membership or disqualify, fine or otherwise punish or penalise him. In the event of the member being expelled from membership, or in the event of any member not obeying or complying with any other penalty imposed by the said Committee, then his name shall be removed from the roll of members and he shall thereupon cease to be a member.

75. The Special Committee shall have power to enquire into and determine all questions relating to protests or disputes arising at or in connection with any show or other exhibition conducted by the Society, and to determine the eligibility of any particular person or exhibit for any particular event, class or competition.

76. The Special Committee shall have power to enquire into all matters concerning the conduct of any exhibitor or competitor at any show or exhibition, and after enquiring into such conduct to impose such penalty, suspension or disqualification as to it seems just.

77. Any person being expelled from membership or disqualified from exhibiting or competing by any kindred Society shall, if such expulsion or disqualification is confirmed by the Council, not be allowed to become or remain a member of this Society or to exhibit or compete at any of the Society's shows or exhibitions until such expulsion has been rescinded or such disqualification removed.

78. Any person affected by any decision of the Special Committee may appeal therefrom to the Council of the Society. Any such person desiring to appeal shall within fourteen days after the decision of the Special Committee lodge with the Secretary of the Society notice of his intention to appeal together with a deposit of £5.

79. On hearing such appeal the Council may vary, alter, increase, reverse or otherwise amend the decision come to by the Special Committee, and the decision of the Council upon the matter shall be final and conclusive. The Council may give such direction as to the disposal of the deposit of £5 as it deems fit.

80. Without limiting the generality of the provisions of Rule 71 the Council may appoint a Finance Committee which shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall have the power (in addition to any other duties or powers delegated to it by the Council) to pass accounts for payment and to deal with urgent or special matters requiring attention between meetings of the Council. The Finance Committee shall make

a report to each meeting of the Council of the action taken by it between Council meetings.

81. Unless otherwise herein provided the Council shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these rules and any By-laws or Regulations made thereunder, and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Society or the administration of its affairs or of the procedure to be adopted in reference to any particular matter shall be final and binding on all members.

FINANCE AND AUDIT.

82. The financial year of the Society shall commence on the first day of January in each year and end on the thirty-first day of December following.

83. At least once in every year the accounts of the Society shall be examined and the correctness of the accounts and balance sheet ascertained and certified by two auditors.

84. The Society at the annual general meeting in each year shall appoint two auditors to hold office until the annual general meeting in the following year. The Council may fill any casual vacancy in the office of auditor, but while any such vacancy continues the surviving or continuing auditor may act. Every auditor appointed shall hold a licence as auditor issued in accordance with the Victorian Companies Act.

85. The remuneration of the auditors shall be fixed by the Council.

86. No person, other than a retiring auditor, shall be appointed at a general meeting unless a nomination signed by two life and/or ordinary members, together with a notice in writing, signed by the person so nominated, expressing his willingness to act as auditor, shall have been left with the Secretary of the Society at least 14 days before the holding of the meeting.

87. Every Auditor of the Society shall have a right of access at all times to the books, accounts and vouchers of the Society, and shall be entitled to require from the Council officers and servants of the Society such information and explanations as may be necessary for the performance of the duties of auditor.

MEMBERS' ROLL AND NOTICES.

88. There shall be kept in the office of the Society a roll containing the names and address of all Honorary Members, Life Governors, Life and Ordinary Members, and Associate Members.

89. A notice may be served by the Society upon any member either personally or by sending it through the post, addressed to such member at his address entered in the members' roll. Notices to firms, corporations, societies, companies or other bodies, who are members, may be served in accordance with Rule 9.

90. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day following that on which it was posted.

91. Where a given number of days' notice or notice extending over any other period is required to be given, the day of service shall, unless otherwise provided, be counted in such number of days or other period.

INDEMNITY.

92. Every member of the Council, Trustee, Secretary, Manager or other officer of the Society, shall be indemnified out of the funds and assets of the Society against any risk, expense or liability incurred by him as a member of the Council Trustee, or as an officer of the Society.

93. Every person becoming a member of the Society shall thereby indemnify and shall, with every other member be bound to indemnify the Council and the individual members thereof and the Trustees against any action in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in the exercise or purported exercise of their powers or duties hereunder.

MISCELLANEOUS.

94. Every person becoming a member of the Society and the nominee of every firm, society, company or other body, which is a member of the Society shall, when required so to do by the Council or Secretary, give evidence by statutory declaration or otherwise of any facts within his knowledge or information relating to any particular subject matter before the Council or the Special Committee or any other Committee.

95. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of members present at a General Meeting.

96. Wherever in these Rules the time, day or date is fixed for the doing of any act matter or thing or a time or day is fixed within any act is to be done, then the Council may, without assigning any reason therefor, enlarge, abridge or alter such time, day or date.

97. Where no time or date is fixed in these rules for the doing of any particular act, matter or thing, the Council may fix such time or date as to it is considered convenient.
