

To the Members.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Council has much pleasure in presenting the following report of proceedings of the Society for the year 1946.

Resumption of Normal Activities.

Mention was made in last year's report of your Council's resolution to hold a Show in 1946 as a major step towards a resumption of the normal activities of the Society.

Encouraged by the promise of assistance from the State Government and with the good wishes of supporters of the Society throughout the State, preparations were made to commence as soon as possible that minimum amount of work essential to the running of a Show.

Zero hour proved to be 1st April, and there were many who, having a knowledge of the extent to which the Show Grounds and buildings had been altered to adapt them to R.A.A.F. requirements, commended your Council on its effort, yet held the opinion that no 1946 Show could be held.

However month by month the work gained in momentum and a veritable transformation was achieved within a matter of hours before the opening of the Show on 19th September.

In accordance with the original arrangement the R.A.A.F. progressively made portions of the grounds available until eventually—with the exception of two relatively small sections—the whole area reverted to the Society's control.

On the sections above referred to—the Amusement area and the Young Farmer's Camp area—R.A.A.F. had erected buildings which the Minister for Housing deemed suitable for use in relieving the shortage of houses and they were therefore retained for that purpose.


Whilst the work of restoring grounds and buildings to Show condition was in progress, negotiations were maintained with the Hirings authorities regarding claims for compensation, and there was great activity in connection with the preparation and publication of the prize schedule, and the mass of other printing essential to the running of a Show.

Altogether the revival of a "Royal" Show after a lapse of years under the prevailing conditions of shortages of labour and materials of all kinds proved such a formidable task, that your Council expresses the hope that sister societies in other States will be more fortunate in their rehabilitation experiences.

Your Council especially records its appreciation of the encouragement and assistance it received from the State Government in preparing for the Show, and subsequent Cabinet decisions to permit the lighting of the Grounds for night sessions, and not only not to permit the formidable competition of a specially arranged race meeting with £12,000 in prizes, which it was proposed to hold in the metropolitan area on the Show public holiday, but to protect the Society against the possibility of such competition in future years.

First Post-War Show.

The wonderful support accorded the Society's 69th exhibition by exhibitors, business firms, and the general public, fully justified your

Council's perseverance with its self imposed task, instead of deferring a resumption of show activities until 1947.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor (Sir Edmund Herring) performed the official opening ceremony on Friday, 20th September, whilst a grand parade of stock—representative of prominent studs in four States—which had been judged on the previous day was in progress in the Arena.

Your Council was pleased to welcome many prominent visitors to the Show from overseas, and every State of the Commonwealth. All were impressed with the comprehensiveness of the Society's first post-war Show and the quality of the exhibits.

The number of entries in some sections such as farm produce was adversely affected owing to insufficiently long notice that the Show was to be held, and also to drought conditions, whilst scarcity of materials and lack of time to prepare exhibits led to a big reduction in the section for Women's Industries. In other sections entries established new records.

Particularly was this the case with the light horses and ponies entered in the saddle classes, riding competitions and other arena events. The numbers proved embarrassing from an accommodation point of view, and taxed the ingenuity and endurance of the Stewards-in-chief to carry out the Arena programme, which, in addition to the numerous Hunting, Trotting and other events for horses, included many special displays—spectacular Night Polo matches; the popular musical rides by Mounted Police and the pupils of the Waverley Riding School; demonstrations by members of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade; Highland Pipe Bands; and well worthy of special mention a march and demonstration by some seven thousand members of Youth organisations in the metropolitan area.

The co-operation of business firms was clearly shown in the non-competitive displays of agricultural and dairy machinery, motor cars and manufactured goods.

The Department of Agriculture staged a comprehensive display in the Government Pavilion, and in lieu of the District Exhibits by country Agricultural Societies—which were a feature of pre-war shows but could not be organised this year, in the time available—most interesting and informative displays were staged by the Flax Industry and the "Save the Forests" Campaign Council. Other displays which commanded attention were arranged by the Postmaster General's Department and the Munitions Department, which specialised on its activities in its equivalent of turning swords into plough shares.

Visitors took a great interest in the exhibits in the Halls of Horticulture and Women's Industries; the re-fitted pavilions for dogs, poultry, pigeons, pigs, sheep (shown in cyclone pens) and cattle which were accommodated in groups from the various stud farms, irrespective of age or sex, it having been impossible to provide individual stalls as in pre-war years.

With the membership increased by 2,000 and public patronage mounting each day, your Council's recollections of its many anxieties regarding shortages of time, labour and materials, affecting restoration of the Grounds and buildings; coal shortages; strikes and threats of strikes affecting transport first of stock and then of visitors; electricity restrictions threatening night sessions; and catering difficulties on account of food rationing; tended to fade in appreciation of the fact that a total attendance of 652,666 persons—more than 50% greater than the previous record—meant a financial result most welcome, in view of the work that lies ahead of the Society in developing facilities to meet modern requirements.

Mention should here be made of the fact that your Council will authorise no work of a permanent nature unless and until it is convinced that it accords with a comprehensive plan of development which

is now receiving close consideration in readiness for the time when, materials being available, it will be possible to commence building operations.

Associated Bodies.

In accordance with annual practice paragraphs are included in this report relating to the activities of Stud Stock Societies, and other organisations of primary producers, the secretarial and administrative work of which is carried out by the staff of this Society.

It is felt that members will be interested in the progress being made.

Your Council acknowledges with appreciation the co-operation of these various bodies in ensuring the success of the 1946 Royal Show.

Reference was made in last year's report to proposals to establish Victorian Branches of the Aberdeen-Angus Society of Australia and the Goat Society of Australia.

Negotiations to that end are well in hand, the Victorian breeders having met from time to time during the year and arranged to put their views before their respective Societies, and it is anticipated that finality will be reached at meetings to be held at the time of the Royal Easter Show in Sydney.

It is interesting to report that all Stud Stock Breeder's Societies have given consideration to the subject of Artificial Insemination and several of them have already adopted regulations governing the registration of stock bred in this way. Fortunately the regulations adopted have been uniform in character.

The Commonwealth Clydesdale Horse Society. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

Greater interest has been manifest in the horse breeding industry during the year, and it is confidently expected that the revival of Royal Shows throughout the Commonwealth will have a stimulating effect in stud breeding circles.

The display of Clydesdales at the Royal Melbourne Show this year, clearly demonstrated that breeders had paid careful attention to breeding during the war years, as though slightly down in numbers the type and quality of the exhibits generally was high.

The Branch Committee is gratified that such is the case, because it is convinced that, in view of their efficiency and economy, horses are definitely a great asset to the primary producers of Australia, and there is urgent need to stimulate interest in their breeding, owing to the big reduction in numbers which was occasioned by drought and other difficulties encountered in recent years.

In this connection the schemes introduced by the Governments of Victoria and South Australia to encourage the breeding of horses of good type and conformation will doubtless have a beneficial effect, and it would be advantageous if similar plans were adopted by the authorities in the remaining States.

The breed is making very satisfactory progress in Tasmania, and the enthusiasm among breeders is such that a Branch of this Society was recently established in that State.

The publication of Volume 14 of the Commonwealth Clydesdale Stud Book was recently completed, and copies have been distributed to all members and kindred bodies overseas.

The volume contains the pedigrees of 219 stallions, 923 numbered mares, together with 85 new Appendix mares and particulars of additional progeny from 1983 numbered mares, 254 Appendix B and 123 Appendix A females registered in previous volumes.

It has been possible to build up reserves of fodder at low cost particularly where self sown crops made such prolific growth; and secure in the knowledge of abundant supplies, breeding plans in Victoria for this season will be expanded, whilst the demand for all classes of horses should also improve.

The Australian Pony Stud Book Society.

Whilst no actual Branch of this Society has been formed in Victoria, the secretarial work in connection with the reception of entries and inspection of ponies owned by Victorian breeders is still being carried out in this office.

The resumption of the Royal Melbourne Show resulted in an increase in interest in the Society, as a section is provided in the Prize Schedule for registered ponies. Several breeders who allowed their registrations to lapse during the war years, re-joined the Society.

Entries for Volume 3 of the Pony Stud Book closed during the year, and publication has now been taken in hand by the Federal Council. A good representation of the studs of Victorian breeders will appear therein.

Good type ponies are still being eagerly sought after, and several breeders have stated their intention to import stock from England as soon as possible.

Your Council nominated Mr. S. A. Greaves for re-appointment as Victorian representative on the Council of the Society.

R.A.S. Light Horse Control Council.

As was anticipated, with the cessation of hostilities, came a reduction in the number of gymkhanas which were held in aid of patriotic funds during war years.

There are, however, quite a number of gymkhanas still being held—indeed, except in the depth of winter, one or more gymkhanas are held on every Saturday and public holiday in aid of some worthy object.

Several have been organised by the Committees of Branches of the Returned Servicemen's League, whilst others are run by Progress Associations and country Agricultural Societies.

Two notable events are those in which City Councils are interested, the proceeds being devoted respectively to the South Melbourne Community Chest and the Heidelberg Civic Fund.

Early in the New Year the Executive purposes developing its recommendations to the Royal Agricultural Society regarding a thorough revision of the classification provided for Light Horses and Ponies, Riding Competitions, etc. at the Royal Melbourne Show.

The Executive has also noted with satisfaction the growing interest by Country Agricultural Societies, and is hopeful of developing schemes which will enable these societies more easily and fully to cater for the ever increasing number of Light Horse enthusiasts throughout the State.

The Shorthorn Society of Australia. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

This has indeed been a most satisfactory year for Shorthorns, as at the Perth (Scotland) sales last February they established a world record price for a bull of any breed, "Pittodrie Upright" realising £15,225, whilst another of the same breeder's draft made £14,700.

Naturally this notable event was widely publicised, and it considerably stimulated interest in the breed everywhere.

The enthusiasm of breeders throughout the Commonwealth remains keen, and already several importations of stock from Great Britain, the first for quite a number of years, have been made, and the formation of Branches of the Society in Queensland and Western Australia is under discussion.

Quite a strong and representative display of Shorthorns was made at the Royal Melbourne Show, at which a considerably increased classification was provided as a step towards uniformity in at least the three Eastern States. Breeders naturally welcomed the restoration of these annual fixtures, which provide facilities for keen competition and are decidedly beneficial to stud breeding interests.

Entries for Volume 13 of the Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia closed with Branch Secretaries on the 31st December, and those already received by the Federal Council include 198 bulls, 861 cows, 1940 calves and 1522 transfers.

Several new Studs have been established during the year, and as indicated by the number of transfers lodged, this old and popular breed is making very satisfactory progress.

As the demand for beef continues unabated, prospects for the beef raising industry are bright, and prices for cattle of all types have remained firm.

It is particularly pleasing to the Federal Council and Branch Committees to note the ever increasing number of graziers who are purchasing registered bulls for their herds. This practice is commended, as it must definitely raise the general standard of the cattle and place the industry in good stead when normal conditions return and it becomes necessary for our export beef to compete with the other beef raising countries of the world.

The Dairy Shorthorn Association of Australia.

A further substantial increase during the past year has brought the total membership of the Association to 170.

There has been a considerable enquiry for stock of this breed by prospective members in Victoria and other States, and indications are that the increase in membership will continue. A limiting factor at present is the comparatively small number of Dairy Shorthorns available to breeders desirous of founding new Studs. There is ample scope in this country for a number of imported males and females of the highest quality, and those breeders who have already arranged for the importation of bulls from England are to be congratulated on their enterprise.

Entries for Volume 4 of the Association's Herd Book are coming in steadily, and to date over 1,400 have been received, together with particulars of their produce. This already shows a considerable increase when compared with the number of registrations published in Volume 3. The publication of the new Volume will shortly be taken in hand, and will contain particulars of animals born prior to 1st January, 1947.

A new regulation passed at the last annual General Meeting of Members is of interest. This provides that before an animal, which is descended from stock not already registered in this Association's Herd Book, can be accepted for registration, the pedigree must show four subsequent and separate crosses of bulls registered in this Association's Herd Book, the Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia, or Coates's Herd Book.

The final figures in respect of the 1945/46 Standard Herd Test released by the Department of Agriculture once again prove the consistency of Dairy Shorthorns as milk and butter-fat producers. Now that restrictions on entry for that test have been lifted, members are being urged by the Committee to submit their herds for test, and thus assist in proving to the public that the stud masters of this breed have "got the goods."

The Red Poll Cattle Breeder's Association of Australia. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

The demand for Red Polls has been in excess of the supply, and this no doubt, has had a limiting effect on the number of new members enrolled during the year. However, a slight increase in the membership can again be reported.

Two meetings of the Federal Council were held during the year, and amongst the matters dealt with was the question of Artificial Insemination. Realising the inevitability of its progress, regulations were adopted to ensure the proper governance of this new method of breeding.

Another matter discussed which is of vital importance to Red Poll breeders, was a recommendation regarding the amalgamation in the Association's Herd Book of the AA and A classes. Serious thought was given to the suggestion, but it was finally decided that no action be taken.

Entries for Volume 13 of the Herd Book closed during the year, and publication has now been taken in hand. The new Volume will contain the pedigrees of animals born prior to 1st July, 1946.

It is of interest to record that the first tour by the Classification Board, appointed to inspect herds nominated for inclusion in the Voluntary Classification Scheme adopted by the Victorian Branch, took place during the latter part of the year. Whilst the response from Members was poor, indications are that before the next tour of inspection takes place many more breeders will apply to have their herds classified. Voluntary Classification sets a very modern standard, for it places a seal of excellence on good type animals. Such information, combined with milk and butter-fat records, results of fat steer competitions and breeding lines of the various animals, combine to assist purchasers to select those animals from which the best results may be expected.

The Association is gratified that throughout the various States, many members are still submitting their herds for test for milk and butter-fat production. The results attained are claimed as further evidence that the compact, even-fleshed Red Poll of the true-breed type will give all the milk that any reasonable dairyman may desire, while preserving good constitution, with the added advantage of being able to produce the good stores which the country so greatly needs.

The Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch)

At its meeting held during the currency of the Royal Melbourne Show the Federal Council for the first time since 1941 had an attendance of representatives from each Branch of the Society.

Among the many important items dealt with at this meeting was the contentious matter of artificial insemination, and after full consideration a set of conditions which are uniform with those adopted by other Breed Societies was incorporated in the Rules.

Volume 37 of the Ayrshire Herd Book was issued during the year, and Volume 38, which contains the pedigrees of 229 males and 1,007 females, is now almost ready for distribution to members.

The membership of every Branch of the Society showed a steady increase during the year, particularly in Victoria where an increase of twenty members was recorded.

The Victorian Branch was particularly unfortunate to lose the services of its patron, Mr. Andrew Buchanan, during the year. Mr. Buchanan was one of the earliest breeders of Ayrshires in the State, and through his kindly nature endeared himself to all who knew him.

The loss was keenly felt by the many breeders in the State who had benefited through association with him, and their heartfelt sympathy was extended to his relatives.

The Friesian Cattle Club of Australia. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

The year was a profitable one for Victorian members. The sustained demand for Friesians was relieved to some small extent by the existence of more breeders, but it was not overcome entirely.

Members purchased stock from South Australia and New Zealand. In the latter case a bull bought originally from the internationally famous Carnation Milk Farms in Canada was included.

There was an increase in the total membership of the Club, including an individual increase in the case of the Victorian Branch, despite the transfer of seven of its members to a Branch formed in Tasmania.

Volume 15 of the Friesian Herd Book was issued by the Federal Council.

To encourage members to bring the excellence of the Friesian breed before the public, the Victorian Branch again offered special cash prizes, sashes and trophies for competition at the first post-war Royal Melbourne Show.

The practice of providing Championship sashes for competition at country agricultural shows where the section for Friesians is confined to registered stock was re-introduced. To assist these societies, panels of competent judges were drawn up and revised from time to time.

In place of the unpopular photographic and sketching systems, the Federal Council adopted tattoo branding at the only recognised means of identification of animals.

At their last Annual General Meeting members of the Victorian Branch decided to hold a dinner annually during the currency of the Royal Melbourne Show, and to invite as their guests the officiating judge of Friesians, also visiting members of the Club from other States.

The Guernsey Cattle Society of Australia. (Victorian Branch.)

During the year the membership of the Victorian Branch showed an increase of 27 per cent. To some extent this now long sustained and steady increase overtook the unsatisfied demand for stock.

A sub-branch of the Victorian group was formed in Tasmania, and it is expected that the number of Tasmanian members will soon increase to the extent necessary before a separate Branch may be formed.

An entirely new and complete constitution and a set of rules were introduced by the Federal Council with the co-operation of the Victorian and other Branches. Perhaps the most important change was to introduce rules providing for a Birth Report File, in which it is necessary to record details of all calves within 60 days of their birth.

It was decided to again make available for competition at agricultural shows, sashes for the champion Guernsey bull and the champion Guernsey cow, provided the section is confined to registered stock.

Panels of competent judges were drawn up and made available to country agricultural societies.

Special prizes were provided by the Branch for competition at the Royal Melbourne Show, and these no doubt contributed to the large number of entries received in the Guernsey section.

The breed experienced another noteworthy year under State Government test. Guernseys from the herd of Captain A. E. T. Payne filled first, second and third places against all ages and breeds, and his herd of 24 head won the reserve championship with an actual average of 491 lb. butter-fat, the equivalent of 533 lb. when adjusted for age.

The Australian Illawarra Shorthorn Society. (Victorian Branch.)

Interest in the A.I.S. breed has been well maintained, and this branch can once again report an increase in the membership which now stands at 93. There has been a consistent enquiry for stock of this breed, and good type animals were introduced into Victoria from leading studs in New South Wales and Queensland.

The number of adult registrations, birth notifications and transfers recorded by members of the Branch, shows a considerable increase when compared with previous years. Entries for Volume 10 of the A.I.S. Herd Book closed early in the year, and compilation by the Federal Council is now well advanced. The studs of Victorian breeders will be well represented therein.

As usual, the Branch took an active part in the affairs of the Federal Council which, during the year, announced its intention of conducting another Commonwealth-wide Herd Test Lactation Competition. The present conditions governing the competition practically preclude the entry of Victorian breeders, owing to the necessity of cows having to be "stripped out" under supervision prior to the commencement of each test. It is however, hoped, following recommendations made by the Committee of this Branch, that arrangements will be made to enable Victorian members to compete—particularly those who have their herds under the Standard Herd Test conducted by the State Government.

A new regulation which came into force during the year was that every calf born after 30th June, 1946, must bear the tattoo brand of its breeder or owner before being entered in the Calf Register. The old rule provided for the use of a fire or tattoo brand at the discretion of the member.

During the year, attention was directed by this Branch to the advisability of having entries for the Royal Show restricted to T.B.-tested stock. It was noted that, whilst your Council had found it impracticable for the 1946 Royal Show, it had not lost sight of the desirability of having entries so restricted.

The Australian Jersey Herd Society. (Victorian Branch.)

The membership of this branch which has steadily progressed year by year has now passed the 1000 mark and is still advancing.

Once more the breed provided the Champion Herd under Government Test, when Mr. Russell Chirnside's herd for the ninth time won the coveted award. Although the Reserve Championship went to another breed, Jersey herds filled 9 of the 10 positions for herds of 15 or more cows; and for herds of from 10 to 14 cows Jerseys filled the first seven and the ninth and tenth positions.

The type classification system increased in popularity, and in the past year 256 applications for classification were received. The various Classification Boards awarded 74 Highly Commended and 550 Commended ratings and in addition raised 49 C. cows to the H.C. class.

After a trial of two years, the Committee of the Branch decided to suspend the operation of its scheme for the inspection of all females prior to registration, and therefore from now until further notice registrations will depend on pedigree only.

During the year the Committee accepted with regret the resignation of Mr. B. A. Barr, who had acted as Field and Publicity Officer for many years. During his association with the Society Mr. Barr had done very valuable work, and the success of the Classification System was almost entirely due to his enthusiasm and untiring efforts. He was welcomed by members wherever he went and his advice was eagerly sought. Although ill health prevents Mr. Barr from carrying out the whole of his former duties, the Society has not entirely lost his services, as he is still able to act as Publicity Officer and to keep the members abreast of Jersey activities through his press articles.

The Committee appointed Mr. W. T. Kennedy, a former officer of the Department of Agriculture, to carry out the field work which Mr. Barr was no longer able to contend with, and this officer has already shown that he has the right knowledge and temperament to make a success of the work.

The Victorian United Cow Test Association.

The Council of the V.U.C.T.A. is gratified to be in a position to announce a material increase in the number of Herd Testing Associations which have been able to resume operations; also the formation of several new units. Progress would have been greater but for the

still serious shortage of herd testers, despite the efforts of the Department of Agriculture to train sufficient to meet requirements.

During the year, through the co-operation of the N.Z. Dairy Board, it was possible to secure reprints of the Foreword to the Sire Survey and Merit Register published by that Board. These were distributed amongst members of affiliated Herd Testing Associations throughout Victoria with literature issued by the Department of Agriculture.

The resumption of the Annual V.U.C.T.A. Field Day was greatly appreciated by the many members and their friends who participated in an enjoyable and instructive tour of the Korumburra-Loch area on 26th September last, when three outstanding farms were visited. A new feature in the nature of a "Quiz" was introduced during the journey, and there was keen competition for the prizes donated by the "Weekly Times."

The congratulations of Council were extended to Mr. G. C. Howey, a past President, on his appointment as a delegation member to go overseas in order to investigate production and marketing of dairy products.

Just prior to leaving for America Mr. Howey gave an interesting and informative address on his observations concerning herd testing and relevant matters during a tour of New Zealand. Mr. E. E. Bond, of the Soldier's Settlers' Commission, addressed delegates to the Annual V.U.C.T.A. Conference and gave a complete explanation of the scheme to encourage the rearing of heifer calves to ensure that the right class of stock would be available for returned servicemen who desired to become dairy farmers.

During the year under review a statement was issued by the Minister of Agriculture, to the effect that conditions in connection with the payment of Government subsidy had been amended. Under the new arrangement the State and Commonwealth Governments and the farmers through their Herd Testing Associations, will each bear one third of the cost of testing. This information was welcomed by the V.U.C.T.A. as justification of its efforts to encourage herd testing throughout the State.

R.A.S. of V. Production Certificates were again issued to owners of herds which reached a specified standard under test, and the prizes and medals issued in connection with the Herd Testers' Competition—which was resumed after a lapse during the war years—were keenly contested.

The Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

The membership of this Society is at present 2,275, of which 945 members reside in Victoria. The keen demand for British Breeds of sheep indicates that, during the next twelve months, all Branches will show a substantial increase in membership.

The work being carried out by the various Branch Committees ensures that the outstanding features of the different breeds are continually brought under notice.

The 38th Volume of the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia, published during the year, contains 2433 histories of flocks distributed throughout the Commonwealth. The Volume also contains 3588 individual pedigrees of rams and ewes.

Now that additional shipping space is available, members in all States have taken advantage of the opportunity to import both rams and ewes from the United Kingdom. These importations include almost every breed of sheep at present provided for in the Society's Flock Book, and it is confidently anticipated that these sheep, which have been acquired at great expense, will facilitate a further improvement in the general standard of Australian flocks.

During the past year the Society has issued over 200 export certificates for sheep shipped to South Africa and New Zealand. In

many cases these shipments have been repeat orders, indicating that Australian bred sheep do well overseas. To ensure that exportations are of a high standard, a rigid inspection of all sheep is made prior to shipment.

Early in the year a new export avenue was opened when a representative of the U.S.A. Government purchased a number of Border Leicester rams bred by Victorian and N.S.W. breeders, at the Sydney Sheep Sales. It is reported that these rams, which were purchased for experimental purposes, are doing well.

The 1946 Annual Shows and Sales of Sheep bred in Registered Flocks conducted by the Victorian Branch Committee were without doubt the most successful ever held in Victoria. The quality of the sheep yarded was a credit to their breeders, and record prices were paid for flock rams.

The Branch Committee has every reason to be proud of these Show Sales, which have attracted buyers from all lamb raising districts in Victoria and neighbouring States.

In addition to the usual country Show Sales held at Horsham, Shepparton and Bendigo, a new centre was opened at Kerang, where the Victorian Branch Committee held a registered sale in November last. This event proved very satisfactory, and will no doubt be an annual fixture.

The continued improvement in the standard of the sheep penned at these Registered Show Sales is largely attributable to the outstanding work of the official inspectors appointed by the Branch Committee. These inspections are not always the most pleasant of tasks, but the officials have acted in the interest of the breeds concerned, and have thus earned the respect of both breeders and purchasers. An indication of the extent of the work of the inspectors is the fact that 5400 rams and 1200 ewes were yarded at the 1946 Show Sales.

Your Council has expressed appreciation of the contribution made by the Victorian Branch to the Prize fund in the sheep classes at the 1946 Royal Melbourne Show, where an excellent display of stud sheep was placed before the public.

The Australian Corriedale Association. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

The Federal Council at its last meeting changed the name of the Association from "The Australian Corriedale Sheepbreeders' Association" to "The Australian Corriedale Association."

During the year a new Branch, with an enthusiastic committee, was formed in Queensland. There is now a Branch in each State of the Commonwealth. Membership is being maintained and approximates 750 members.

The dual purpose qualities of the Corriedale have made the breed very popular overseas. During 1946 many sheep were exported—principally to South Africa. No doubt the action of the Federal Council in advertising in overseas journals has contributed to the volume of export trade.

With the resumption of shows in capital cities and at country centres, breeders have had many opportunities of displaying the breed. During the year the Association presented trophies and championship sashes for competition at various shows.

As the result of a resolution of the Federal Council, Corriedale breeders are now permitted to tattoo and cull their own sheep. An Official Inspector, however, will visit each flock at least once in every three years to report thereon.

The Committees of the various Branches still continue to do excellent work in furthering the interests of the Association.

Just prior to the end of the year this Association lost one of its stalwarts, through the death at 77 years of age of Mr. R. W. Peacock.

who for some years presided over the N.S.W. Branch Committee, and was President of the Federal Council in 1942 and 1943.

The Australian Pig Society. (Federal Council and Victorian Branch.)

Interest in the Society has been well maintained despite the difficulties and set-backs experienced during the year.

The necessity for unity amongst pig producers has never been greater, and realising this, the Federal Council at its meeting held in Melbourne in March last, altered the Constitution of the Society to permit breeders and feeders of commercial pigs to be enrolled as members. Whilst no assurance has yet been given, it is confidently anticipated that the newly constituted Society, being thoroughly organised throughout the Commonwealth, with Branches in all States, will be recognised by the Federal Government as the body representing the production side of the Pig Industry.

The year has seen a further serious decline in pig production. The downward trend, which has occurred in all States of the Commonwealth, is due mainly to the fact that since 1944, producers have not been able to obtain an adequate supply of cereal foods. Although the price of feed wheat increased by 26% in November, 1945, no relative increase was made in the price of pig meat. No opportunity has been lost by this Society in placing before the Government the problems facing the pig producer, and urging proper recognition of the industry.

The most enthusiastic and representative gathering of its kind ever to take place in Victoria was held in Melbourne in July last, when some 150 pig producers, representing all districts of Victoria and the Riverina, Bacon Curers and Pork Exporters, together with representatives of both Federal and State Departments; the Chamber of Agriculture, the Victorian Dairy Farmers' Association and the Victorian Wheat and Wool Growers' Association, attended the Pig Industry Conference convened by the Victorian Branch of this Society, to discuss the problems of the pig industry and particularly the causes of and remedies for the fall in pig production.


Full and frank exchange of views took place between all sections of the industry, and producers heard at first hand the views of Government and Board officials concerned with the control of the industry and its food supplies. Mr. W. S. Kelly, Advisor to the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner on Primary Production prices, who addressed the Conference, promised to look into the relationship of pig prices to grain prices, but warned breeders that, owing to the serious world shortage of wheat, the prospects for pig raisers were not good.

The Victorian Branch subsidised Bacon and Pork carcase competitions in conjunction with the Royal Melbourne Show in September, and the Federal Council is discussing an All-Australia Carcase Competition to be conducted during 1948. Finality will be reached at next meeting of the Federal Council to be held in Sydney at Easter.

The Kennel Control Council.

These reports have long included references to record years experienced by the Kennel Control Council, nevertheless the year 1946 probably was the most successful Victorian breeders and exhibitors of pedigreed dogs have ever experienced. Membership showed an increase of 639 to the all-time record total of 2401. There was a 39 per cent. increase in transfers of ownership recorded, and an equally big increase in the public demand for pedigreed puppies.

The "K.C.C. Gazette," which is sent monthly to all members, commensurately increased in circulation, and the demand for space for advertisements in it improved so much that many applications had to be rejected.

The fine total of 871 individual dogs made a good display at the Royal Melbourne Show, but, unfortunately, it could not be seen by many of our patrons because of the congestion in the Dog Pavilion.

All the shows of the K.C.C.'s affiliates were well supported, and the total entry of 760 dogs received when all affiliates combined for one big effort to aid the Children's Hospital, made a fitting climax to an excellent year. It is expected the profit from this Show will reach £750. Apart from the fixtures of affiliates many little competitions were arranged by Gymkhana Committees and the like with the sanction of the K.C.C. Through these competitions it was possible for breeders and exhibitors to display the merits of pedigreed dogs to a section of the public which probably would not attend a dog show.

Two new Clubs were admitted to affiliation—the Victorian Cairn Terrier Club and the Great Dane Club of Victoria.

Acting upon recommendations from its Field Trial Advisory Panel, the Committee adopted an entirely new and comprehensive set of rules to cover the increasingly popular events, at which Spaniels and Retrievers are tested publicly in the field work for which they are bred, more especially retrieving from water.

Under a new system, whereby an agenda is compiled by affiliates and distributed among them by the K.C.C., so that all may have full opportunity to discuss the various items, the annual conference of the club executives with the Committee of the K.C.C. was held. The conference was one at which the usual spirit of co-operation was evident. Many of the recommendations made were adopted by the Committee.

Towards the close of the year agreements of association were being concluded with the controlling bodies in Western Australia (which body functions from the office of the Royal Agricultural Society in that State), also South Australia and Queensland. Such an agreement was finalised in 1945 with the Kennel Club, which is situated in the offices of the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales.

Again, to assist the agricultural societies and other country bodies which are affiliated with the K.C.C., sashes for best local dog and best local bitch will be provided in future.

The much-sought-after title of "K.C.C. Champion" was awarded to 79 dogs and bitches. This was an increase of almost 100 per cent. over the figure for the previous year. The increase was due, to some extent, to the fact that entries at Shows have increased so considerably.

The Challenge Certificates, which are won by these exhibits as a pre-requisite to gaining the title, vary in point-value according to the number of entries.

So sound a foundation has been built upon the pledge of support made to the K.C.C. by your Council 17 years ago, that the Committee cannot but be optimistic for the future of Victoria's dog world.

The Victorian Working Sheep Dog Association.

Further proof of the growing popularity of the Sheep Dog is the fact that the membership of the Association has reached a new record. No fewer than 60 new members were enrolled during the year under review, and the total membership now stands at 191. Several new bodies have affiliated with the Association, and quite a number of the clubs which suspended their trials during the war years have again resumed their activities.

Affiliated trials conducted throughout the State again proved popular, and the thanks of competitors are due to the officials of the various trial committees for their sterling work in organising these contests.

The 1946 competition for the "Captain Payne" 50-Guinea Trophy was conducted at Kerang in April last, and Mr. J. M. McIntosh is to be congratulated on his excellent performance in filling the first three places. This is the second year in succession in which Mr. McIntosh

has gained highest points in the competition for this trophy, which has to be won three times in succession, or five times in all, before being won outright. The "Captain Payne" Trial is looked upon as the "Melbourne Cup" of the Sheep Dog world, and only once before has the performance of Mr. McIntosh been equalled. Mr. J. Moses was successful in both 1936 and 1937.

Two new trial rules were introduced during the year—one relating to the length of the stick which a worker may carry when competing in a trial, and the other to the control of distemper. In this latter connection the Council of the Association is investigating the possibilities of arranging for some collective scheme for the inoculation of all dogs owned by members.

Since this Association was established, in 1927, it has made steady progress, and is now universally recognised as the best organisation of its kind in the Commonwealth. Further evidence of its standing is an arrangement now being concluded for control of the "Cooper Trophy" to be vested in, and future competitions for this well-known trophy to be conducted by, this Association.

It is well worthy of mention that "Sheep Dog Trials" were nominated as a sport in the "Sportsmen's Million" section of the Fourth Victory Loan in September-October, 1945, and Mr. James L. Moore, one of the foundation members of the Association, was appointed as its official representative on the Loan Council. £130,110, the third highest amount raised in the section, brought the Association an Honour Pennant. Another Honour Pennant was awarded in recognition of £77,910 for the Security Loan, in March-April, 1946, and a special award—a four-star pennant—is now in possession of the Association in recognition of £158,570, the highest amount raised in the section for the Second Security Loan, in October-November, 1946. Naturally, this Association is very appreciative of Mr. Moore's untiring services in this connection.

The Victorian Young Farmers' Clubs Association.

In the Young Farmer world the year was notable for the success of a deputation from the Association to the Honourable the Minister of Public Instruction, seeking the granting of requests which Council and the Executive Committee believed would help considerably to further the Young Farmer movement. Among the requests granted was the provision of finance necessary to permit the appointment of a fifth supervisor to travel among the Clubs. At the close of the year steps were being taken by the Executive Committee to choose a suitable person. Another decision of the Government provided for fourteen scholarships annually at the University or the Dookie Agricultural College, for teachers of the Education Department to be trained in agricultural science, so that, as the scheme progresses, there will be available annually more and more young men and women with the knowledge necessary to make them competent leaders in the Young Farmer movement.

Valuable contributions were made to the education of other teachers in Young Farmer Club activities when plans were finalised for the Association's supervisors to address the students at the Teachers' Training College, and for those at the Bell Training School to receive tuition in the work.

During the year the Association made one addition to the literature it provides for the guidance of Clubs. This covered the wheat project. It was of a rather temporary nature, pending the conclusion of work on a complete booklet by experts from the Department of Agriculture.

At the close of the year the Association had accepted an invitation from the Chamber of Agriculture of Victoria to arrange for Young Farmers to take an active part in connection with its annual convention at Colac in March.

The ninth of the annual three-year scholarships at an Agricultural College, provided by the Agricultural Education Division of the Department of Agriculture, was awarded to a young farmer nominated by this Association.

Following a long gap over the war years, a School of Agriculture was organised by the Association for the benefit of teachers. Demonstrations in the management of projects were led by experts from the Department of Agriculture and elsewhere. The school was an undoubted success. It stressed the practical by the taking of the pupils to places like the State Research Farm at Werribee.

Given a continuance of the now long maintained financial assistance of the State Government, and the co-operation of the Royal Agricultural Society, the Association is confident it can successfully carry on a nationally important work among the rural youth of this State.

The Chamber of Agriculture of Victoria.

In accordance with the decision referred to in last report, this Chamber held its 41st Convention in the South Melbourne Town Hall early in April last.

The Convention was well attended, and delegates from all over the State listened with interest to addresses given by Dr. A. E. V. Richardson, the Chief Executive Officer of the Commonwealth Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (C.S.I.R. Research in connection with Primary Industries); Mr. A. H. Gaze, General Manager, the British Phosphate Commissioners (Restoration of Island Supplies of Phosphate); Mr. Frank M. George (A District Fire Prevention and Control System); Mr. G. V. Lawrence, Organising Secretary, Murray Valley Development League (Plans to Develop the Murray Valley); and Mr. A. V. Galbraith, Chairman of the Forests Commission of Victoria (Victorian Forests—Post-War Policy).

A lengthy agenda was gone through, and many interesting discussions took place on the items therein.

After having occupied the Presidential chair for a period of five years, Mr. Keith McGarvie announced his retirement, and on his nomination Mr. John McIntosh was unanimously elected President for the ensuing year.

Professor S. M. Wadham was re-elected as a Vice-President, and Mr. R. D. Bakewell was elected to the Vice-Presidency previously occupied by Mr. McIntosh.

A general report on the Convention, together with the text of the addresses delivered thereat, statistics and other information of interest, was published in the ninth volume of the Chamber's Year Book, a publication which has commanded wide interest since it was first established in 1938.

It was unanimously resolved that the 1947 Convention should be held in the country, and at the invitation of the local Agricultural Society, it was decided that the Convention be held at Colac, where the first country Convention of the Chamber was held in 1903.

As is the case with this Society, the Chamber is looking forward with pleasurable anticipation to the visit of Lord Bledisloe early in 1947.

Its special interest in this notable visitor from Great Britain is occasioned by the fact that he presided over the Central Chamber of Agriculture in England in 1915, its Jubilee Year.

The Journal.

Through the medium of the "Australian Farm and Home," in which this Society's official journal is incorporated, publicity has been given to the activities of this Society throughout the Commonwealth.

In addition to reports on the monthly meetings of your Council, considerable space has been devoted in this journal to many matters in which this Society is particularly interested.

Victorian Pasture Improvement League.

In April last your Council was very interested to receive a report which sketched the activities of the Victorian Pasture Improvement League since its establishment in 1932; the thoroughness of its pre-war work; the extraordinary extension in acreage top-dressed, and consequent increased production; the necessity to drastically curtail the activities of the League during the war years, and its decision—in confident anticipation of continued support of contributors to its funds—to implement a post-war five-year plan, providing for intensive experimentation, including manurial trials on a wider range of soil types, pasture establishment trials in certain areas not yet within the range of the League's activities, and surveys of pastures and dairy farms, which are to be conducted in order to determine the factors most likely to lead to greater production and prosperity.

It was unanimously resolved to indicate that this Society would maintain its customary contribution to the funds of the League for at least another five years.

Australian Cattle Research Association.

Your Council was pleased to receive a letter, in which appreciation was expressed of the renewal of this Society's annual contribution to the funds of the Australian Cattle Research Association, which has for many years financed scientific investigations into Bovine Mastitis and Bang's Disease—twin scourges of dairying throughout the world—by arrangement with the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research in Victoria, and at the Glenfield Research Station in New South Wales.

Wheat Crop Championship Competitions.

In accordance with an invitation from the Farm Competitions Association of Victoria, your Council was pleased to identify this Society with a resumption of the District Wheat Crop Championship Competitions so successfully conducted by that Association until their necessary suspension in 1941.

It was unanimously resolved to donate prize money amounting to £50 in each of three Championship Competitions—in the Wimmera, the Mallee, and Northern District (including the North East).

Your Council further resolved to notify the Association that all competitors in local competitions conducted by Border Societies such as Yarrawonga, Cobram and Echuca, embracing crops grown on both sides of the Murray, would be eligible for the District Championship, attention being drawn to the fact that only Societies affiliated with the Farm Competitions Association of Victoria would be eligible to conduct competitions for the Championship.

Fodder Conservation.

In connection with the R.A.S. 1945-46 Fodder Conservation Campaign, very gratifying co-operation by Agricultural Societies and Herd Testing Associations in different parts of the State resulted in no less than twenty-five local district competitions, for each of which this Society, as in former years, provided a subsidy of £15 as prize money.

Your Council expresses its keen appreciation, not only of the financial assistance received from the Department of Agriculture, but of the arrangement under which the services of officers of that Department were made available to judge these competitions, thus enabling this Society to overcome a great difficulty to fulfil its promise to arrange for the adjudication of all subsidised competitions.

Keen appreciation has also been expressed of the manner in which these officers carried out the duties entrusted to them.

In accordance with the annual practice, an open invitation was extended to Agricultural Societies, Herd Testing Associations and other approved primary producers' organisations in Victoria, to apply for

subsidies of £15 each as prize money in local competitions to be conducted in connection with this Society's 1946/47 Fodder Conservation Campaign.

When applications for subsidies closed at the end of the year no less than forty subsidies had been allocated, and whilst it is realised that it will not be possible in all districts to secure the minimum number of entries to warrant collection of the subsidy, it is confidently anticipated that the number of competitions actually conducted will constitute a record.

Entries for these competitions will not close with local secretaries until the end of February, and it is hoped that well before that time it will be possible to renew the arrangement with the Department of Agriculture regarding judges, and make a start with the actual judging much earlier than was the case this year.

Associate Judges.

In view of the increasing difficulty experienced by Show Committees in securing the services of competent Judges—particularly of Light Horses—your Council recently invited the co-operation of Agricultural Societies throughout the State in ensuring that an adequate number of such Judges will be available in the future, by appointing as Associate Judges competent young men, who will thus be encouraged to gain experience and confidence, and subsequently assume the full responsibility of judging.

Your Council also took the opportunity to draw attention to the fact that Agricultural Societies generally were prone to overwork those who were willing to adjudicate at their Shows by giving them an unduly large number of classes to judge, and it further expressed the opinion that co-operative action by Agricultural Societies was necessary to stamp out the prevailing tendency on the part of exhibitors to adversely criticise Judges—in many cases amounting to abuse—as this undoubtedly affected their willingness to act on future occasions.

Since publicity was given to your Council's discussions on this matter many letters of commendation have come to hand from country Agricultural Societies, nominating young men who are regarded as suitable for appointment as Associate Judges; so that their names and addresses may be included in a list which it is proposed that this Society will publish and make available to each Agricultural Society in the State.

Use of Grounds between Shows.

Your Council has always had prominently in mind the desirability of some arrangement under which worthwhile revenue could be derived from the use of Show Grounds between Shows.

In last year's report prominence was given to the movement initiated with the approval of your Council to bring about such alteration of existing legislation as would enable this Society to assume control of trotting in Victoria, and enable it to conduct Trotting Races at the Show Grounds at night.

Half-way through the year your Council declined an offer from the body controlling trotting in this State, to hire its Show Grounds for a period of years and to spend a considerable sum in improving facilities thereat.

As a result of the continued activities of the Metropolitan and Country Trotting Association on behalf of those interested in trotting who desired a change of control, and the negotiations conducted on behalf of this Society by Mr. A. G. Hunter, with the valuable assistance of Mr. Eugene Gorman, the Government introduced a bill to Parliament, and the Trotting Races Act 1946 was finally passed just prior to the end of last session.

This Act provides for a Trotting Control Board of five persons, three of whom shall be nominated by this Society, one by the Metro-

politan and Country Trotting Association, and one by the State Government.

It also makes possible the conducting of Trotting Races at night on the Show Grounds, and therefore it now becomes the duty of your Council at its first meeting in the new year to authorise such work at the Grounds and to take such other necessary steps as will enable it, in accordance with the statement made by the President at last Annual Meeting, to ensure that the Society will faithfully carry out the duties involved, and in so doing pay due regard to the interests of those in country districts.

Your Council will also, at its January meeting, take the opportunity to record its appreciation of the action of the Government in so acknowledging the prestige of this Society in the community as it has done in the Act above referred to.

Acknowledgements.

Your Council formally acknowledges the honour conferred by H.R.H. the Duke of Gloucester in consenting to become a Patron of this Society for the period during which he is Governor-General of Australia

Its grateful appreciation is expressed of the interest displayed in the activities of the Society by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Lady Herring; the High Commissioner for the United Kingdom (Rt. Hon. E. J. Williams) and the Consul General for U.S.A. (Mr. Richard Boyce).

To the Premier (Hon. John Cain) and the members of his Cabinet your Council tenders its grateful thanks for the encouraging assistance referred to elsewhere in this report.

As an important factor in the success of the Show, your Council expressed appreciation of the publicity given by the metropolitan and country press and the various broadcasting stations to the activities of the Society throughout the year, and particularly in the weeks preceding the Show.

The co-operation of the Departments of Agriculture and Railways, the Metropolitan Tramways Board, Police Department, Metropolitan Fire Brigade; the Victorian Polo Association; and the various Stud Stock Breeders' Societies is gratefully acknowledged, as is also the valuable service given in an honorary capacity by judges, stewards and stewardesses, whilst none the less appreciated is the co-operation of standholders, exhibitors and a host of other valued supporters of the Society, who in one way or another took part in ensuring the success of the Show.

The Council.

Though the eleven members of Council who retired through effluxion of time, and offered themselves for re-election, were opposed, all were re-elected as a result of the postal ballot conducted in accordance with the rules.

At its first meeting after the election, your Council unanimously re-elected Sir Charles E. Merrett as President, and assured him that every member would be delighted to see him at the head of the Society at its first post-war Show.

In January last members of Council expressed their great pleasure at the honour which His Majesty the King had conferred on their colleague, Mr. J. F. Guthrie, C.B.E.

At its meeting in June your Council learned with deep regret of the death of Mr. Duncan McLennan, who was first elected to the Council

in 1916, and had occupied the position of Vice-President in 1924. Council recorded its appreciation of the services rendered to the Society, and conveyed an expression of sincere sympathy to Mrs. McLennan and members of the bereaved family.

The vacancy was filled at the July meeting by the unanimous election of Mr. Lawrence M. Dugdale, of "Staughton Vale," Balliang.

At the August meeting members heartily congratulated their colleague, His Honour Judge Mitchell, on his recent appointment as a County Court Judge.

Mr. Dugdale was cordially welcomed as a member of Council, and also Mr. M. A. Nicholas, on his return to the Council table after a long absence, during his service with the R.A.A.F. and a subsequent tour abroad.

At the October meeting the President stated that it was the unanimous desire of members of the Council that he should congratulate the Secretary on his efforts in connection with the Society's first post-war Show, and to present him with a memento of the occasion, subscribed for amongst themselves. The President then presented to the Secretary a handsome gold watch and chain, which he accepted with an expression of his deep appreciation.

Finance.

The audited financial statements published with this report are shown in such detail as to be readily followed by members.

Negotiations regarding the Society's claim on the Commonwealth in connection with the restoration of the Show Grounds were not completed until just prior to the end of the financial year, and therefore the final payment will be shown in next year's accounts. Your Council has pleasure in reporting that, if payment is made in accordance with the final determination of the Central Hirings Committee, the settlement will, in its opinion, be fair to the Society.

Your Council is further of opinion that, with the continued co-operation of members, and with the additional revenue which will in future be derived from the use of the grounds between Shows, it will be possible to widen the activities of this Society and accelerate the attainment of the objects with which it was established.

In concluding this report, your Council records its pleasure that, early in the New Year, the opportunity will be given this Society to extend a cordial welcome to the President of the Royal Agricultural Society of England, who has already left on a good-will mission from the farmers of Great Britain to the farmers of Australia and New Zealand. Lord Bledisloe purposes conferring with the President and members of each Royal Agricultural Society as he travels through the several States, and hopes thus to initiate regular visits of representatives of Dominion "Royals" to the "Royal" of the Mother Country, and vice versa, with a view to co-ordinating their efforts in the best interests of all—a sentiment with which your Council is in entire agreement.

THE EGG & EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD OF VICTORIA SUBMITS SOME INTERESTING FACTS FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION.

At the time of the last Royal Agricultural Show the Board quoted statistics showing the increase in egg production from the time of its inception to the close of the financial year 1939/40, and gave a brief summary of its activities in Producers' interests to that date. Further statistical information is now printed, giving an indication of the industry's development over the war years.

On 1st July, 1943, the Commonwealth Government, by virtue of powers acquired under National Security Regulations, set up an organisation under the Controller of Egg Supplies to control the industry and market the ever-increasing supplies. The Controller of Egg Supplies, therefore, has functioned in relation to marketing the surplus production on a nation-wide basis exactly as the Board did on a State-wide basis. The Prices Commissioner made a uniform price for the whole of Australia.

The advantages of this wider control are obvious, but the future of the Victorian Board, which has acted as Agent for the Controller in Victoria, depends on the organisation which will take the place of the Controller of Egg Supplies.

It is considered desirable that the beneficial features of the present control should be retained, for a study of the figures quoted above, plus the knowledge that only 60 per cent, of Victoria's production is consumed locally, makes it obvious to the reasoning man that organised marketing is even more vital than in the pre-war years.



RULES

1. The Society shall be called **The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.**

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Stock Raising and Industrial Resources of the State—

- (1) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
- (2) By holding meetings for the purpose of popularising rural life and disseminating knowledge of improved methods and new ideas in relation thereto.
- (3) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies, and collecting information for the furtherance of the objects of the Society.
- (4) By promoting the discovery, investigation and introduction of improved kinds of agricultural implements and machinery, the better equipment and construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (5) By promoting the discovery, investigation and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (6) By collecting and distributing information on all subjects concerned with the objects of the Society, including the preparation and publication of Flock Books, Herd Books, Stud Books, Pamphlets, Essays and Papers, and by the establishment and maintenance of a Library and Reading Room for the use of Members.
- (7) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants and taking measures to encourage the prevention or eradication of such diseases.
- (8) By remunerating any person for original research work leading to the advancement of the objects of the Society.
- (9) By the purchase of live stock for breeding purposes and allowing farmers and other rural workers the use thereof for improving the standard of live stock.
- (10) By promoting or assisting any scheme for herd testing and remunerating any person for his services in connection therewith.
- (11) By promoting or assisting competitions in regard to farm crops and other primary production, implements of husbandry and improvement of the conditions and methods of rural work.
- (12) By promoting or assisting any other work which may be regarded by the Council of the Society as being beneficial to primary production or the improvement of live stock.

- (13) By borrowing monies at interest on "short call" or otherwise from bankers or any other source for the purposes of the Society, and particularly for repaying in whole or in part monies owing or which may become owing by the Society either on current account or otherwise.
- (14) By establishing and supporting or aiding in the establishment and support of funds, trusts and conveniences calculated to benefit employees or ex-employees of the Society, or the dependents or connections of such persons, and by granting pensions and allowances, and by making contributions towards Insurance Premiums.
- (15) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, four Trustees (three of whom shall be appointed as hereinafter provided, and one shall be appointed by the State Governor), Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members. The term "Member" shall (unless the context otherwise requires) be deemed to include a Life Member, Life Governor and Governor.

4. Subject to the provisions of Rule 27, every applicant for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company such firm or company shall nominate in writing one of the members thereof, who shall, on the receipt by the Secretary of such nomination, be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges of membership, and be bound by the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Society, and may be elected to any office.

5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds three shillings and Members one pound ten shillings annually. Life Governors shall pay a subscription of fifty pounds, and Life Members a subscription of twenty-five pounds.

6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-three Members (elected from amongst the Members of the Society as hereinafter provided) and the Trustees, who shall be *ex officio* Members of the Council.

7. One-third of the Council (the Trustees excepted) shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

8. Land acquired, or to be acquired, for the Society shall be held by and be vested in the Trustees for the time being of the Society for and on behalf of the Society. The Trustees appointed as provided by these rules shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due course at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society. Any new Trustee or Trustees shall be appointed at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society, or in accordance with Rule 14. The Trustees shall deal with the lands of the Society as directed by resolution of the Council of the Society (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence), and they shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of the Society's property. If the office of Trustee,

appointed by the State Governor, shall become vacant by reason of death, resignation or otherwise, a new Trustee shall be appointed by the State Governor.

9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees) a President and three Vice-Presidents.

10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof, and for these purposes the Members of the Society for the time being shall be deemed to have constituted the Council of the Society for the time being their agents.

11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific and Corresponding Members, nominations therefor having been submitted at a previous meeting and a notice of such nominations having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may, except as to the Trustee appointed by the State Governor, fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The financial year of the Society shall end on the 31st day of December of each year, to which day the accounts of the Society shall be balanced. At the monthly meeting of the Council, to be held in January in each year, the Council shall prepare a list of Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies in the Council. Nominations (other than those made by the Council) of Members who may be candidates for such vacancies must be in the hands of the Secretary prior to such meeting. Every nomination other than those made by the Council shall be signed by at least two Members other than the candidate, and shall have endorsed thereon the consent of such candidate, duly signed by him. The election to fill the vacancies on the Council shall be held on the day immediately prior to the day fixed for the Annual General Meeting, as provided by Rule 18.

18. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the last Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, successful candidates for the vacancies in the Council declared elected, two paid Auditors appointed, and any other business transacted of which due notice in writing shall have been given before the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of the second Tuesday in January immediately preceding.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his Deputy shall send to all Members of the Society a ballot paper, numbered, and initialled by the President or his Deputy, or the Secretary, with the names of all the candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Member desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more or less than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President (who shall be Returning Officer) or his Deputy at the election. Every such ballot paper shall be returned before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Fourteen days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every Member of the Society.

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of the Council next after the Annual Meeting the Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President or on the requisition of twenty Members of the Society, of which meeting there must be given ten clear days' notice stating the business to be transacted, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President or of three members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.

24. At the Annual Meeting twenty Members, including Members of Council, or at a Special General Meeting ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council, shall form a quorum.

25. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of Members of Council appointed by the Society, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room and Lectures, and, (with two ladies if the member be a Life Governor, whenever so constituted, or a Life Member, so constituted before the 2nd February, 1939, but with one lady only as regards all other Members) to the Society's exhibitions, grounds and grandstands (subject to such regulations as the Council may make) on production of the Member's ticket for the current year. And while the Society issues a monthly journal a copy shall, on receipt of a request in writing, be posted free to every Member.

26. Any Member neglecting or refusing to comply with these Rules, or any or either of them, or any lawful directions or requirements by the Council made in pursuance or under the authority thereof, or being guilty either before or after becoming a Member of the Society of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be summoned before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may also be disqualified from exhibiting and may be disallowed from again becoming a Member during the pleasure of the Council. A Member expelled under this Rule shall forfeit all right in and claim upon the Society and its property.

27. Any person being expelled from Membership or disqualified from exhibiting, riding or competing by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a Member or to exhibit, ride or compete at this Society's Exhibitions until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

28. The Council shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules, and of the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder; and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Society or the administration of its affairs, whether provided for by these Rules or by the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder or otherwise, shall be final and binding on the Members.

29. Every Member shall communicate from time to time to the Secretary his address; and all notices required by these Rules to be sent or given to Members shall be deemed to have been duly sent or given if posted or sent to such address.

30. Every person becoming a Member of the Society thereby undertakes, if at any time required to do so by the Council, to give evidence by statutory declaration or otherwise of any facts within his knowledge or information relating to the subject matter of any inquiry by the Council.

31. Every person becoming a Member of the Society shall thereby undertake to indemnify and shall with every other Member thereof be bound to indemnify the Council, and the individual Members thereof, any Committee of the Council and any Members of any such Committee, against any action or damages in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in accordance with these Rules, or the By-laws or Regulations made thereunder, during the continuance of his Membership.

32. The Council and the Members thereof shall be indemnified out of the Society's property against risk and expense which may occur through borrowing monies in accordance with paragraph 13 of Rule 2; and Members of the Society, notwithstanding Rule 31 hereof, shall not by reason only of their membership be or become personally liable through, by reason, or on account of any such borrowings.

33. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting.

BY-LAWS

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Notice of the Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the Members of Council at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for by at least three Members present. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given in accordance with Rule 18.

2. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his Deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

THE PRESIDENT.

3. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Members, and shall take the chair when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks and other documents as the Council may decide.

THE COUNCIL.

4. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

5. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide by a majority of votes on a show of hands all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that, if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

7. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

8. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called a quorum of Members be not present, the

Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

9. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council or of any Committee shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some person present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

10. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants at the Society's Exhibitions.

11. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees when they shall think proper.

12. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

13. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.

14. If any Member of Council, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

15. The Secretary shall notify to the Council any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or other members of the Council, at the meeting of the Council at which or next after such vacancy occurred, and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice, provided that if any such vacancy occur after the ordinary monthly Council meeting in November such vacancy shall not be filled except at the next Annual Meeting.

16. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by the senior Vice-President then present; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes. (The senior Vice-President shall be deemed to mean the Vice-President who has been a Member of Council for the greatest number of years in the aggregate.)

17. The quorum of a monthly or special meeting of Council shall be five.

18. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
- (2) Business arising from minutes.
- (3) Election of officers and nominations for vacancies.
- (4) Committee's Reports.
- (5) Motions.
- (6) Correspondence.
- (7) Postponed business.
- (8) General business.
- (9) Notices of motions.

19. All minutes and reports read to and adopted by the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

20. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

21. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the monthly Council meeting in February as they think fit, and such Committees shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two members of Committee to form a quorum.

22. The President shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees.

23. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

24. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the last Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

THE STAFF.

25. The Manager shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council and of Committees.

26. The Secretary shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society and keep copies of all letters on the business of the Society.

27. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, the Secretary shall be responsible for all monies received, paying such sums into the Society's Bank, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bank. He shall have the charge of the expenditure for petty cash.

28. The Secretary shall have the custody of all books and property of the Society. All books, pamphlets, etc., becoming the property of the Society shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

29. The Manager shall have the immediate superintendence over all of the servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he may

think of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

30. The Manager and the Secretary shall each find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

31. Neither the Manager nor the Secretary shall exercise any of the privileges of a Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

32. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet before the ordinary Council meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each monthly meeting, as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

33. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

34. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

35. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

36. The accounts of the Society shall be audited as may be required by the Council by two professional accountants, to whom a balance sheet shall be submitted by the Secretary immediately after the close of the financial year, and such, when audited, shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
