

1910 Royal Agricultural Society Show (Aug. 30-31; Sep. 1-2-3)

The trotters showed a great falling off this year both in the matter of quality and quantity. A number of Victorian studs of trotters have been dispersed, and many of the leading breeders were not represented and some sent in fewer representatives than usual. A fine lot of stallions, however, put in on appearance but honours again rested with the Imported horse Owyhee whose stock also achieved distinction in the ring. Owyhee who has been a great success as a sire both in Callforma and Victoria, was imported to Victoria together with the brood mare Sihamba by the late Mr. J. Robertson, and he is a fine specimen of a high class trotter He is now owned by Mr Dougald Taylor, the proprietor of the Truganina stud farm. Another imported horse in Mauritius belonging to Mr. J. B. Zander, took second prize and the reserve champion and he is a very fine individual of excellent quality.

Mr Dougald Taylor won the ribbon for a brood mare with Sihamba but she was beaten for the championship by Ruby M, nicely turned filly who was also successful in the class for three-year old fillies. She has a slight skin disease but she is such a nice filly that she could afford to give away that small defect. It, however, was a touch and go with her in the filly class as she did not show such good action as Christmas Belle, but the latter had not such fine conformation and had to be content with second honours.

Oakwood, a son of Owyhee, was the best three year old colt. He possesses plenty of substance and his conformation would be hard to fault. He is a very fine colt. Admiral Sperry, who carried off the honours in the two-year-old section is ia good sort. He was sired by Owyhee Junior, a horse Mr. Brodribb bred. Mr. Brodribb gave 800 guineas for Lucretia, a mare who won a lot of prizes in the Melbourne show ring and, in mating her with Owyhee bred Owyhee Junior. Admiral Sperry is a pretty good advertisement for him. Alice T had no opposition in the two-year-old filly class.

On the whole the trotting colls were a poor lot but Charles D (by Owyhee), the winner was a well-grown good looking colt. Miss Owyhee was without an opponent in the yearling filly class. Mr. E. Batson intended showing Little Mary, but she was badly injured in the truck coming up from Buckley's road and is now in the hands of a veterinary surgeon. She injured her spine and legs. Mr. Batson only recently refused an offer of 200 guineas for the filly.





The trotting stallions, which fell off in number last year, recovered in that respect, and the quality was well maintained, the entrants including Mr. Dougald Taylor's imported American stallion Owyhee, who took first prize last year, and whose progeny then swept the board in the younger classes. The same owner's imported mare Sihamba (last year's first prize winner) was again entered, and the three-year-olds were a good even lot. On the whole the display of trotting stock forms a prominent feature of the show, and the emulation amongst breeders and owners has evidently been intensified by Mr. J. Wren's institution of valuable prizes and produce stakes for this class of horses, whose gentleman utility is unquestionable. It was therefore, an appropriate coincidence that the three-year-old John Wren won the championship for trotting stallions. Owyhee, who was not in such approved show condition as he was last year, had on this occasion to be content with second place, the first prize for stallions being won by the famous performer Emulator, whose style and pace in getting over the ground made a favorable impression. Mr. J. B. Zander, the owner of Emulator, also took third prize with Mauritius, an imported horse, whose action was also good. Mr. R. C. Hannah, showed a beautifully shaped imported American stallion, W. W. Estell, by Red Chute - Katie Bells. This horse, in the accomplished hands of Will Whitbourn, gave a fine level display of trotting, and on the score of shape and action most of the experts. At the ringside were astounded at his failure to secure a place in the awards. Sihamba being the only brood mare shown won first prize and championship, and although this grand old mare was unopposed, it would have taken an exceptionally good one to have beaten her.

Mr. Zander scored again in the class for three-year-old colts with John Wren, by Mauritius - Black Venus (imp.) and so highly was this handsome colt esteemed by the judges that they subsequently awarded him the championship over Emulator, who won the reserve championship. Mr. J. A. Dundas's three-year-old filly Inez D., by Owyhee, beat her only opponent, Aleck T., by the same sire. The Oakwood Stud Farm took first prize for two-year-old colts with Ribbonwood's Pride, a useful looking colt, by the famous Ribbonwood, but he had a formidable opponent in Charles Derby, by Owyhee - Rose Tracy, a big upstanding colt, who was awarded second-prize. Mr. Zander took third prize in this class with Pietre Botte, by Mauritius. Of the two yearling colts shown Harold R. was preferred to Bundor.



Of recent years the sport of trotting has progressed by leaps and bounds, and the trotters have, as a natural result, firmly established themselves as one of the attractions of the equine section of the show. The improvement effected in the sport of trotting and its consequent beneficial influence on the breeding industry was reflected on yesterday's show, when the display of trotters was a fairly good one taken as a lot. The number of entrants was, however, a bit disappointing, and is attributed, to two causes, namely, the principal stallions being at this period actively engaged in stud duties, and others in active training for the valuable prizes offered for competition at the periodical meetings of the Melbourne Trotting Club at Richmond.

Two of the mare sections failed to elicit competitions, and it remained with the stallion standard bred class to form the attraction par excellence, of the trotting show. The championship and gold medal were captured by Mr. K. N. Scott's imported 5-year-old brown horse Firestone, by Silver Wings - The Bride, who stood right out from the other competitors. He is a horse of fine type and character. Owyhee, owned by Mr. Dougald Taylor, gained second place. He is an American importation, and is an aged horse, by Charles Derby from Ada Wood. Owyhee is a familiar figure in the show ring, and last year he occupied third place to Mr. J. B. Zander's Emulator, who had to put up with the third position yesterday.



There has been a steady decline in the quality and number of trotters exhibited during the past couple of seasons. Evidently the section is going out of favour with exhibitors. Class was but poorly represented this year, and competition was really limited to the stallions. The two-year-old fillies were so poor that the judges declined to award a first prize. The stallions, however, were a fairly representative lot, but, as was the case last year, they had to strike their colours to Firestone who carried off the senior award in his class, and later on secured the championship. He is a fine specimen of the high-class trotter, showing quality and character above the average, and he is a very smooth mover. He should make a reputation as a sire if he is given reasonable chances.

Winnie B, who was the champion brood mare, is a good, roomy sort and a nice qualified one, but she had very little to beat. Ribbonlead, who won in his class - that for three year old colts - is a very level-made, good-looking colt; but the fillies of the same age were a very indifferent trio, and Glenellie had only two very leggy moderates to beat. The three two-year-old colts were much better, and the winner, Blue Wilkes, would hold his own in any company, and he was well worthy of the reserve championship which came his way. The two two-year-old fillies were such poor specimens that neither was deemed worth a first prize.



Of recent years there has been an absence of class in the trotters shown, but this year there was a very decided improvement in that direction, and quality was much better represented. The competition in the stallion class was very keen indeed, and the winner, First Voyage, would hold his own in any company. He stands over a fair amount of ground, but he is one of the level made sort, and when in action shows excellent pace. He is owned by the Belmont Stud Farm at Bendigo, and the same establishment was to the fore in the class for three-year-old colts, as they won with Belmont Chimes, a speedy-looking, well-grown son of Abbey Bells. He was bred by his owners, but First Voyage, who was afterwards awarded the championship, was bred at the Allendale Stock Farm. First Voyage is by Bon Voyage from Elsie Downs, by Boodle. Owyhee, who is a well-known ring identity, was not disgraced in having to take second place to First Voyage.

Only three brood mares were shown, and Devincenne, owned by the Glenpalfrey Stud Farm, stood out from her two rivals, but not to the same extent as Nervie did in the class for mares driven in a sulky or buggy. Nervie is a lovely mare with every line suggesting speed, and she displayed perfect action and plenty of pace in a spin on the track round the arena. She is the best trotting mare seen in the ring for very many years, and there was never any doubt regarding the destination of the championship award for mares.

Only two three-year-old fillies were shown, and the winner, Graceful Bells, is a very nice mare indeed. The two-year-old colts were a good even lot, and the competition was keen. Merrimu, the winner, is a nicely turned, well-grown colt by Mauritius, but the winner of the 2YO filly class was not so good - Firelock, by Firestone, and she was a rather good sort.







CROWD ERUPTS AS LADY RIDER DEFEATS THE MEN IN TROTTING RACE

"The splendid exhibition of horsemanship given by Mrs. Pearl Kelly on winning the preliminary and final for the Royal Handicap at the Melbourne Show on Friday, September 28, was a treat to witness. In the preliminary Creole McKinney, squeezed home from the pacer The Nut, due only to superb riding by Mrs Kelly. The popular demonstration awarded the fair rider has never been equalled on the grounds, for there was a roar of continued cheering and hand-clapping that continued for several minutes.

In the final heat Creole McKinney (30yds) was opposed to Miss Shandon (scratch), and Welcome Chimes (50yds), the latter dwelt on the mark. Miss Shandon defied Creole McKinney until a furlong from home when the black gathered her in, but when at this point Creole McKinney was seen to leave her feet, a roar of disappointment went around the track.. However, this was soon changed, for Mrs Kelly got her back in three strides, and the finish she put in to defeat Miss Shandon by a neck was worthy of the late Gus Millsom at his best. Well, the people just went mad, and cheered the little lady in the green and white stars livery until she left the arena." - **Australian Trotting Record, Oct 4, 1917**

AMUSEMENT PARK AND FERRIS WHEEL - At No. 3 Sheep shed the ground has been raised 3ft. 6in., while in front of this shed the ground level has been raised 7ft. 4in., and an area which was often a quagmire will be used at the forthcoming show as an amusement reserve for a Ferris wheel, merry-go-round, and other side shows.

With one exception there was only a fair entry numerically in the trotting section, and among the younger competitors particularly some very promising animals were shown. Of the twelve stallions catalogued ten entered an appearance, the mantle falling on the speedy Bonnie Voyage, a winner of several important trotting events at metropolitan and country racecourses. Bonnie Voyage is by First Voyage, and was exhibited by the Belmont Stud Farm. He was also awarded the championship, while the reserve championship fell to Mr. J. Siebel's Fashion Plate, who won in the section for three-year-old colts.

Mr. Ralph Hutton's Nancy Patchen, an attractive mover, annexed the prize for mare driven in a sulky or buggy, and Oakwood Direct, a neat chestnut by Oakwood from Queen Direct, by Directway, was selected for the honors in the class for two-year-old colt. 



