

1920 Royal Agricultural Society Show (Sep. 20-21-22-23-24-25)

The Belmont Stud Farm's Bonnie Voyage stood out on his own as the best stallion, and he was awarded first and champion honors by the judge, Mr. D. Taylor, who was an enthusiastic owner and breeder of trotters a few years back. A well-shaped black horse by that good performer First Voyage, Bonnie Voyage was exhibited in perfect condition. A promising trotter in Royal Rufus was awarded the prize for three-year-old colt, and Metal Bells, a shapely youngster by Gospel Bells, was adjudged the best for colt two years old and under. Metal Bells secured the reserve stallion championship, and first for brood mare, foaled or in foal, went to Mr. J. Siebel's Melba Direct, a neat grey, by Directway. Another of good quality was Lady All Style, who secured first and champion honors for mare driven in a sulky or buggy.

1921 Royal Agricultural Society Jubilee Show (Sep. 19-20-21-22-23-24)

Among the trotters, first prize and the championship were secured by Admiral Wood by Wildwood Junior. He is a magnificent horse of dark brown colour, and the judge Mr. Alexander Robertson of Nagarre (NSW) expressed the opinion that no horse of better quality had ever been shown at a Melbourne Royal Show. In New Zealand he put up the world's record of 4m 23 3/5s for two miles. Marcus by Mauritius who gained second prize is smaller than Admiral Wood but he, too, shows nice quality. Metal Bells a fine bodied promising colt by Gospel Bells won first prize for three-year-old colt and he was awarded the reserve championship for trotting stallion.

First prize and champion ribbon for trotting mare won by A. G. Hunter's Bess Alto, by Dixie Alto, a good performer on the racetrack, and the same owner's Princess Chimes by Delavan Chimes secured first prize for brood mare and the reserve championship.



1923 Royal Agricultural Society Show (September 20 - 29)

The 1923 Royal Agricultural Society Show was significant in that it is the first Show that allowed the public and exhibitors to be involved on the Sabbath.

The judge of the trotters, Mr. A. Playfair, was particularly pleased with the stallions shown yesterday. He stated that they were a very good, even class, that would compare favourably with any in Australia. He had never seen a better lot. In the section for trotting stallions, driven in sulky or buggy, the black stallion Grand Voyage, by First Voyage out of Blonde Grattan, and bred on the Belmont Stud Farm, was successful. Grand Voyage who was foaled in October 1912. and who is the holder of the Australian trotting record for one mile, is a splendid type of trotter, with a beautiful bold action. Mr. J Rousch's bay stallion Don Marvin was placed second. and Mr. A. G. Hunter's Admiral Wood third.

The winning three year colt was Mr. J. P. Mulfahey's Donvin Chimes, a chestnut by Belmont Chimes, out of Vin Don. Donvin Chimes is a candidate for the 1924 Derby, a race of which he has already produced a winner in Vin Direct. Second place was filled by Mr. W. B. Harris' black colt Typical Voyage, and third by Mr. J. Rousch's King Marvin.

The class for trotters driven in sulky or buggy went to Queen Pirate, a bay mare by Norminston from Wild Pirate. In the championship events Grand Voyage was declared to be the champion stallion with Don Marvin reserve champion. The champion trotting mare was Queen Pirate and the reserve champion Lillie Style.

Competition was not as keen as usual in the trotting section, several of the classes not filling as well as last year. The judge (Mr. A. D. Playfair, of Randwick, N.S.W.) awarded Mrs. A. E. Pump's Wilkes Harold, a well-proportioned bay, first honors for two-year-old colt, with A. G. Hunter's chestnut Harcourt second. L. A. Harper took first prize with Delavan Tom, a son of Delavan, for yearling colt. A likely looking daughter of Dagmar Style - Lillie Style was adjudged the best of the three two-year-old fillies exhibited.




The death occurred to-day at the age of 5th years of Sir. A pall was cast over the 1928 Royal Show caused by the death on 5th August 1928 at age 65 of the revered Will Whitbourn. Will was not only a talented horseman but also a famous comedian and actor and appeared at the old Opera House, under which management he played in Melbourne, Sydney, and Adelaide for eight years. In 1911 he retired from the stage, and did not reappear till the revival of the nigger minstrels at the Tivoli at the end of 1925 and performing still in 1927.

Will Whitbourn won six (6) Melbourne Drivers' Titles and won more races (125) at Richmond than any other horseman. He handled many champion trotters including Calista and Emulator and won the Victoria Trotters Derby with First Trip. In 1925 Will achieved his crowning success by winning the Richmond Thousand with pacer Eulinya Bells, who later won the Royal Show Time Test in 1926.

Many racing officials and former theatrical artists were present at the burial of Mr. Will Whitbourn and the funeral cortege, which was about three quarters of a mile in length, left Mr. Whitbourn's late residence in Dandenong road, Murrumbidgee, for the necropolis, Springvale.

In 2013 Will Whitbourn was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.



Will Whitbourn who was a rare individual revered in two different worlds - Racing and the Theatre - was chosen to host Governor General Lord Northcote at the Royal Show.

“Dolly” Jacobs Tragically Killed

FATAL ACCIDENT - WOMAN RIDER KILLED

“An accident, which resulted in the death of Miss Dolly Jacobs, aged 20 years, of Sale, marred the arena programme. Miss Dolly Jacobs was riding Mr G. Stow’s Hue Wind, in the Women’s Handicap Trot, had just passed the stone wall and was in the process of passing Delma Huon, ridden by Mrs. P. Kelly, when Hue Wind tripped and fell opposite the Chirnside Stand.

Miss Jacobs was thrown heavily, and lay on the ground without moving. It was seen that her face was covered with blood. She was taken from the ground on a stretcher, and, after having been examined by a doctor, was hurried to the Melbourne Hospital in an ambulance, but on arrival at the Hospital she was dead.

Immediately after the accident Mr. Stow scratched his horses for all the events in which they were entered. Mr. Stow, who lives in Wright street, Prahran, said last night that Mrs Jacobs was an expert horsewoman, and had been handling horses almost all her life. She had written to him a few days before the Show asking for the mount on Hue Wind. “The accident appeared to be so simple,” added Mr. Stow, “that it is impossible to say how it happened. I do not think that the horse stumbled. It is more likely that it tried to jump its own shadow or struck something on the track. Several horses appeared to waver at the same spot, and I intend to inspect the track to-morrow morning.”

When she fell, Miss Jacobs rolled clear of the horse, but struck her head on the ground. She was wearing a skull cap. Hue Wind was just taking the lead when the accident happened, and appeared certain to win the race easily. Miss Jacobs’s parents are farmers, and live in Stratford road, Sale.

Society’s Regret. - Referring to the accident, Mr. Schwieger said, “Personally and on the half of the Royal Agricultural Society, I wish to express sincere regret at the sad accident which resulted in the death of Miss Jacobs. It cast a gloom over all of the officials in the arena and those who were informed of the fatality. This is the first fatal accident which I can remember having occurred in the arena in 21 years’ association with this society.”

The accident that caused the death of the 26 year-old Christina Rose “Dolly” Jacobs occurred on Wednesday 26th September 1928 and the funeral took place two days later at Sale.

An inquest into the death was held on the 2nd October and evidence was taken from several witnesses including a RAS official George Irons, plainclothes Constable Rosewarne, and Lillian Walsh who competed in the race.

George Irons said that he was on duty at the Show at the time the race was being run. Miss Jacobs was riding Hue Wind, and there were two other entrants. George said that he had rung the bell for the last round, and Hue Wind was taking the lead. He said, “The horse appeared to get caught in his harness, and he fell, the rider was thrown in a heap with the horse underneath her, she rolled over onto her stomach, 6 to 8 feet in front of the horse. I rushed over to her and picked her up. Her face was covered in blood and she appeared to be unconscious and I saw she was scarred on her face. She was face downwards and she was taken from the ground. The horse remained on the ground and when I got to the horse he tried to get up, but the harness was tangled around his off hind leg, something that would throw him. There was no interference by anyone else.

Constable Edwin William Rosewarne, made the following observations in his report - (1) I was standing 50 yards away when the accident occurred. (2) There were three horses competing in the race, the horse which the deceased was riding went twice around the ground successfully, and was on the third round and was about to pass a horse in front of it when it stumbled and fell throwing the rider over its head on the ground. (3) The deceased was attended to on the ground by Dr. McKenna, who ordered her immediate removal to the Melbourne Hospital where she was taken by Civil Ambulance. (4) The deceased did not regain consciousness and died prior to her arrival at the Hospital.

Further evidence was taken from fellow competitor Lillian Walsh, who said she had ridden over the course several times and considered it to be safe. In fact every witness concurred that there was no depression in the track that may have caused the accident.

Hue Wind’s owner George Stow said, “Miss Jacobs was an excellent horsewoman and had been used to horses all her life. I saw the horse fall. I do not know what caused it to fall, it is a sure-footed horse. On the 26th September at the City Morgue I identified the body of the deceased. She was a single woman, aged 26 years, and lived with her parents. She was a sober person. I do not know what caused the horse to fall.”

A verdict of accidental death was entered.



Attempts will also be made to lower the official mile record of 2min. 13secs. put up last year by Vin Direct.

Not a seat was vacant around the arena yesterday (September 26). Many thousands sat all day. It was delightful in the sunshine. The arena programme included some interesting events in the morning the sheepdog trial was seen, and a long programme of trotting and jumping with some novelty events occupied the afternoon.
